This further responds to your February 10, 2016 request seeking investigative reports from Naval Postgraduate School. Reference is also made to our February 29, 2016 letter.

As advised in our letter, (42) closed investigative reports responsive to your request were located. Please note that, upon further review, it was revealed that one of the investigative reports was duplicated – Case Control Number: 24JAN07-SWMY-0001-7LMA pertains. In view of this, only (41) reports have been processed. Our review of these documents reveals that they contain personal identifiers (such as names and social security numbers) of third parties, the release of which would constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. Accordingly, we must partially deny your request and withhold this information pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) provisions 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(6) and (b)(7)(C). All releasable information is provided to you at enclosure (1). We have also provided an enclosure explaining the various exemptions of the FOIA.

As the official responsible for the partial denial of your request, I am advising you of your right to appeal this determination. Your appeal must be postmarked within 60 calendar days from the date of this letter and should be addressed to the Secretary of the Navy's designee: Office of the Judge Advocate General, (Code 14), 1322 Patterson Avenue, S.E., Suite 3000, Washington Navy Yard, D.C. 20374-5066. The envelope and letter must bear the annotation "FOIA Appeal". A copy of your initial request and a copy of this partial denial letter must accompany the appeal.

There are no assessable fees associated with the processing of your request.

Explanation of FOIA/PA Exemptions

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. On 03Feb14 at approximately 2030 hours, NCISRU Monterey received notification of the apparent suicide of CPT Todd Martin KETTERER (V/KETTERER), USA, who was found deceased in his residence aboard the La Mesa military housing community in Monterey, CA, from a suspected self-inflicted gunshot wound to the head. Army CID, Monterey, CA, processed the crime scene on 03Feb14. On 04Feb14, Army CID requested NCISRU Monterey's assistance in obtaining the contents of V/KETTERER's Naval Postgraduate School (NPS) email account and other information related to V/KETTERER's activities and whereabouts during the days and hours preceding his death. NCISRU Monterey provided the requested information to Army CID. No additional investigative assistance has been requested of NCISRU Monterey. This case is closed.

NARRATIVE

1. This reciprocal investigation was opened to document investigative assistance provided by NCISRU Monterey, CA, to Army CID in its investigation of an apparent suicide of an Army officer assigned to the Naval Postgraduate School (NPS), Monterey, CA. No criminal statutes apply.

2. On 03Feb14 at approximately 2030 hours, NCISRU Monterey received notification from Naval Support Activity Monterey (NSAM) police of the apparent suicide of CPT Todd Martin KETTERER (V/KETTERER), USA, who was found deceased from a suspected self-inflicted gunshot wound to the head. V/KETTERER, who began his first quarter of study at NPS in January 2014, was found deceased in his residence aboard the La Mesa military housing community in Monterey, CA.

3. Around 2100 hours on 03Feb14, NCISRU Monterey spoke to (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Army CID Special Agent in Charge, whose team was processing the death scene. NCISRU Monterey offered investigative assistance to (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who indicated

no immediate assistance from NCISRU Monterey was needed to process the scene. V/KETTERER's autopsy is pending completion by the Monterey County Sheriff's Office (MCSO).

4. On 04Feb14, NCISRU Monterey spoke to (b)(6), and Army CID Special Agent (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) who requested assistance (b)(MC) obtaining the contents of V/KETTERER'S NPS email account and other information related to V/KETTERER's activities and whereabouts during the days and hours preceding his death. NCISRU Monterey provided the requested information to Army CID; Exhibits (1) - (2) pertain. No additional investigative assistance has been requested of NCISRU Monterey. This case is closed. On 28Nov12, The Center for Information Dominance Unit (CIDU), Defense Language Institute (DLI), Monterey, CA, reported to NCISRU Monterey [b](6). disclosed on a pre-graduation survey that she was raped while attending DLI. [b](6).(b)(7)(C) refused to provide an initial interview to NCIS and advised she would provide a statement upon her impending transfer to Navy Information Operations Command (NIOC), GA. [b](6). was provided a DoD Victim-Witness Pamphlet. Subsequently, [b](6). [C) Completed a Permanent Change of Station (PCS) and the investigation was transferred to NCISRA Kings Bay, GA. On 23Jan13, NCISRA Kings Bay Special Agents met with[b](6).(b)(7)(C) in Augusta, GA, where she provided a written sworn statement detailing how she was sexually assaulted on 150ct11, by[b](6).(b)(7)(C) in a navy Gateway Inns and Suites hotel room aboard Naval Post Graduate School (NPGS), Monterey, CA. [b](6).(b)(7)(C) detailed how she, [b](6).(b)(7)(C) and three other USN sailors were drinking alcohol in the hotel room following their attendance at the Navy Ball aboard the NPGS. She further described how she became intoxicated, fell asleep on the floor and awoke later in the evening, at an unknown time, with [b](6).(b)(7)(C) explained she was only awake for a few seconds before falling back unconscious. She further explained that when she awoke the next morning, [b](6).(b)(7)(C) was no longer in the room. [b](6).(b)(7)(C) stated she and [b)(6). had engaged in a previous sexual relationship; however, they WHE no longer romantically involved and that night she was unconscious and not consenting to sexual intercourse. [b](6).(b)(7)(C) advised she did not immediately report the incident because she was fearful of being separated from the USN for underage drinking. The three sailors present in the room that night were also |
| interviewed; however, $only^{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)}$ recalled the incident. $(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)$ advised he awoke during the night to use the restroom and observed $(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)$ with his pants down, getting up from between $(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)$ legs. $(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)$ stated he assumed they were engaged in sexual activity and it was consensual because he was aware both had been in a previous relationship. $(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)$ did |

not complete a sexual assault exam. The crime scene, while not active given the delay in notification, was documented. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) chose not to speak with NCIS about the criminal allegations against him when he was interviewed on 23Jan13. Initially, on 28Dec12, a Military Protective Order (MPO) was issued to (b)(6), to have no further contact with (b)(6), however, the MPO has since expired as of 31Mar13, at the direction of the Command. On 12Dec13, (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was found not guilty of all charges at a General Courts Martial convened in Jacksonville, FL. This investigation is closed.

NARRATIVE

1. This reactive investigation was initiated regarding the suspected violation of the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ) Article 120 (Aggravated Sexual Assault).

2. Subsequent to the submissions of References (A) - (F), LN1 (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)USN, Region Legal Services Office (RLSO) Southeast Trial Counsel, Jacksonville, FL, advised the RLSO tried (b)(6), at a General Courts Martial (GCM) on 12Dec13, in Jacksonville, FL. Subsequently, (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was found not guilty of Article 120. This investigation is closed.

1. This investigation was initiated based on a referral from the Naval Postgraduate School (NPS) Monterey, CA Inspector General's (IC) office regarding alleged conflict of interest violations involving $\begin{bmatrix} b \\ (b \\ (6), (b) \\ (7) \\ (C) \end{bmatrix}$ (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) As background, (b)(6), was(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) of the Center for Asymmetric Warfare (CAW), Waval Air Weapons Station (NAWS), Point Mugu, CA until he retired in October 2009. The CAW is a research and training center, which falls under the command of the NPS. (b)(6), retired with the intent of being rehired following a mandatory ninet $\frac{1}{2}$ day leave of absence. The information from the IG alleged (b)(6), not only failed to abide by the leave of absence, but continued (b)(%) work and represent himself as of the CAW. Additionally, it was alleged that used federal funds to pay for a lobbyist to lobby Congress for additional funding for the CAW. Witness interviews confirmed failed to adhere to the 90 day leave of absence and continued to report to the CAW after October 2009; however, it was determined never actually returned to federal government employment following his retirement in Oct09. Witness interviews also indicated the primary purpose of one CAW subcontractor was allegedly to find and secure funding for the CAW and as such obtained Congressional ADDS for the CAW. Three Department of Defense Inspector General (DoDIG) subpoenas were served pursuant to this investigation and were reviewed. During this investigation, third hand information received alleged Commander Navy Installations Command (CNIC) made inquiries about how or where the CAW spent CNIC funds. Investigative efforts revealed CNIC, San Diego, CA believed over \$500,000.00 of CNIC funds were misappropriated by the CAW. A relevant employee of Battelle, a CAW contractor, was interviewed regarding the suspected mismanagement of the CNIC's funds by the CAW, but emails between the CNIC and CAW were noted in captioned investigation which showed the two parties had reached a mutual understanding on the issue. In September 2012, the Defense Contract Audit Agency (DCAA) commenced its investigative audit of the allegations, but DCAA later suspended its review of the documentation as they determined they did not have jurisdiction on this matter, and a DCAA report was never generated. NCIS subsequently reviewed the documents, but no information related to the suspected mismanagement of the CNIC's funds was found nor was any indication noted of criminal activity related to this. On 18Dec14, was interviewed but denied the allegations against him. On 08Jan15, Assistant U.S. Attorney (AUSA) Southern District of California was briefed on the results of this investigation, and she subsequently declined prosecution. This investigation is now closed.

NARRATIVE

1. This reactive investigation is being conducted pursuant to suspected violations of 5 U.S.C. 6306 (Annual leave; refund of lump-sum payment; recredit of annual leave) and 18 U.S.C. 1913 (Anti-Lobbying Act).

2. On 18Dec14, was interviewed but denied the allegations against him; Exhibit (49) pertains.

3. On 08Jan15, Assistant U.S. Attorney (AUSA) Southern District of California was briefed on the results of this investigation, and she subsequently declined prosecution; Exhibit (50) pertains.

However, (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was wearing a USMC uniform with the insignia of Gunnery Sergeant (E-7). When questioned by Naval Support Activity Monterey (NSAM) police, (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated he worked for "CID," but had left his credentials at home. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) then fled the scene in his vehicle. NSAM Detective(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) requested limited NCIS assistance in support of his investigation. Various attempts to locate and contact (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) met with negative results. (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) has been barred from NSAM facilities. The U.S. Army Judge Advocate General (JAG) office, Defense Language Institute (DLI), Monterey, CA, under its Special Assistant United States Attorney (SAUSA) authority, filed various misdemeanor charges against (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) related to the incident at NPS, as well as additional charges stemming from a similar, subsequent incident at DLI. On 07Apr14, (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)pled guilty to one charge of trespassing on federal property and received a \$250 fine and 40 hours of community service. This case is closed.

On or about 06AUG12, Reporting Agent (RA) spoke to a woman who , a former next-door alleged (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) neighbor, and (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (now 17 years old), began engaging in inappropriate sexual activities when (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (the victim) was 15 years old. NSAM police evacuated the NEX building and surrounding areas and established a perimeter. NEX employee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) CIV, reported she answered the telephone and heard the caller say the word "bomb."(b)(6), handed the phone to her coworker, (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (b)(7)(C) CIV, who heard a slow, robotic voice say a bomb was going to be detonated by cell phone at NPS. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) handed the phone back to (b)(6), who heard the caller say, "This is for the Iraqis," before the caller hung up. (b)(6), said she received the call at NEX phone number 831-373-7343, which is used by NPS student services personnel, international students and professors to order textbooks for international students. No data concerning the origin of the incoming call was immediately available via caller ID or other means. NSAM police, at the direction of CAPT (b)(6)b)(6), USN, NSAM Commanding Officer (CO), searched the NEX building for (DV7)(C) Suspicious packages and activities. The results of the search were negative. At the direction of CAPT (b)(6). NSAM police cleared the scene and business at the NEX resumed at approximately 1153 hours. The telephone provider of NEX land line numbers, AT&T, refused to provide NEX telephone logs absent a subpoena. A DODIG subpoena was issued and the phone number from which the bomb threat originated was identified. This phone number pertained to a pay phone located at a CVS drugstore in Monterey, CA. There were no video surveillance cameras on the exterior of the CVS drugstore where the pay phone was located. 1. On 01JUL12, at approximately 2000 hours, Reporting Agent (RA) received a telephone call from CDR(b)(6),(b)(7)(C) USN, Staff Judge Advocate (SJA), Naval Postgraduate School (NPS), Monterey, CA. (b)(6), reported CAPT Alan POINDEXTER, USN, (V/POINDEXTER), NPS Dean of Students, had been killed earlier that day in a jet ski accident in the Pensacola, FL, area. The Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission (FWC) conducted an investigation into the accident, which occurred near Pensacola Beach, FL. Command requested NCIS assistance in obtaining police reports and other information relevant to the line of duty (LOD) investigation. The FWC and Medical Examiner reports were obtained and provided to command. No further assistance was requested by command. This case is closed.

NARRATIVE

1. This details and disposition investigation was initiated to gather information regarding the death of CAPT Alan POINDEXTER, USN, (V/POINDEXTER). No criminal statutes apply.

2. On 01JUL12, Reporting Agent was notified V/POINDEXTER was killed in a jet ski accident. The Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission (FWC) investigated the accident and provided its report to NCIS, Exhibit (1) pertains.

3. An autopsy of V/POINDEXTER was conducted by the Florida Medical Examiner (ME), who reported the cause of death as "blunt impact of chest" and the manner death as "accident," Exhibit (2) pertains. On 030CT08, Branch Dental Clinic (BDC) Department Head, CPT (b)(6) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) USN, reported a theft of thirty-seven (37) electric driven hand piece attachments used in the performance of normal dental procedures. (b)(6), stated the approximate cost of the missing equipment $\frac{1}{3}$ (9) grad marked and MAR09, nine (9) individuals have been interviewed regarding the missing equipment with negative results. On 18MAR09, an attempt to locate and interview the likely suspect, (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) met with a negative result. On 16SEP09, (b)(6), was interviewed at her home in Lawton, OK and denied responsibility for the loss/theft of the reported missing dental equipment. NARRATIVE 1. This investigation pertains to a suspected violation of UCMJ Article 121 (Larceny and Wrongful Appropriation). 2. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. Reference (A) reported Mr. (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) Department of Defense (DoD) Inspector General's Office (IG) Arlington, VA, advised the OPEN MARKET CORRIDOR (OMC) project, which was an internet based procurement system research project, was initiated and sponsored by the Naval Postgraduate School (NPS), Monterey, CA. The Department of Interior (DOI), Fort Huachuca, AZ was utilized to award the contract for the OMC and to provide contract administration for the OMC. NETWORLD EXCHANGE (NETWORLD), Carlsbad, CA was awarded the contract to administer the OMC project. Reportedly, the OMC contains structural flaws and may be vulnerable to fraud and exploitation. This investigation identified questionable contracts awarded by various NPS employees to companies in which their co-workers and family members were suspected of having a personal and/or financial interest.

NARRATIVE

1. This reactive investigation was initiated pursuant to suspected violations of Title 18 United States Code (USC) 208 (Acts Affecting a Personal Financial Interest), 41 USC 421 (Procurement Integrity) and Executive Order 11222 (Standards of Ethical Conduct).

2. As documented in Reference (A), a DoDIG audit of the OMC project revealed information which implicated various NPS employees as being suspected of having violated government ethics regulations. Specifically, the following companies were identified as being owned by various NPS employees who received government contracts which were awarded to them by their co-workers: THE WECKER GROUP, ELKE SCHABO, BLUE TECH INC. (BTI), and(b)(6),(b)(7)(C) NPS Lecturer, was identified as a person of interest in this investigation. As the designated ordering officer for OMC, (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) was responsible for awarding subcontracts to companies registered with OMC and NETWORLD. One such company that received a subcontract was a joint venture known as BTI, also known as TUDOR TECHNOLOGIES, in which (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) was a co-owner.

3. References (B) through (L) document this investigation. Since the submission of Reference (L), Reporting Agent (RA) attempted to interview(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) on 04Feb08. Since (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) ppeared to be (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) out of town, RA left a business card at his residence. has not contacted RA. On 05Feb08, RA met with Assistant United States Attorney (AUSA) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Criminal Division, San Jose, CA and presented the investigative findings to date. After reviewing the information, (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) declined criminal prosecution agreeing that the issues in the case were not criminal but were administrative in nature. (b)(6). forwarded on the information provided to him by RA to AUSA (D)((0),((b)(7)(C) Civil Division, San Francisco, CA, for her review. On 19Mar08 RA spoke with (b)(6), who stated since there was no financial damage to the United States Government and since the issue was administrative in nature, she would decline civil prosecution.

4. To date, this investigation has not uncovered any personal gain by (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) as a result of his actions in awarding contracts through the OMC. The Naval Audit Service is in the process of preparing a report of its audit findings on OMC, in which it determined the project was afflicted with a lack of internal controls and lack of oversight. The findings in this report are not expected to change any of the findings in this investigation. This investigation did not produce any criminal or civil violations. This investigation did <u>uncover a</u> lack of internal control and oversight as it pertained to (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and the overall management of the OMC. This lack of control and oversight allowed (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) to award contracts, without a signed contracting warrant, to companies of questionable ownership, as he deemed appropriate.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. On 30NOV05, V/VENTIMIGLIA's body was located submerged in the hole 3 pond aboard the Monterey Pines Golf Course (MPGC), Monterey, CA. MPGC is Navy property open to the public and under concurrent jurisdiction. Investigation was initiated to assist the Monterey County Sheriff's Department (MCSO), Office of the Coroner, in their death investigation. V/VENTIMIGLIA was last seen on 29NOV05 at approximately 1300 as he checked in at the MPGC proshop to begin golfing. Later that day, MPGC staff members retrieved an unattended golf bag (which was later identified as belonging to V/VENTIMIGLIA) near the banks of the 3rd hole pond but did not think to take any further action. Death scene examination of the pond revealed V/VENTIMIGLIA might have been attempting to retrieve a golf ball out of the pond and fell in. Examination further revealed the wet weather of 29NOV05 made the banks of the pond extremely slippery. Witness interviews revealed V/VENTIMIGLIA usually golfed alone and retrieved balls out of the ponds. Reference (A) pertains. Final autopsy results ruled the cause of death to be asphyxia due to drowning and manner of death to be accidental. MCSO investigation further revealed V/VENTIMIGLIA was a very poor swimmer.

NARRATIVE

1. On 08JAN06, Reporting Agent obtained the final MCSO <u>Coroner's</u> Report and Postmortem examination report from Detective (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)MCSO, Office of the Coroner. Report ruled the cause of death to be asphyxia due to drowning and manner of death to be accidental. Toxicology results were negative. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) also advised RA that V/VENTIMIGLIA's family said V/VENTIMIGLIA was an extremely poor swimmer. Exhibit (13) pertains. No further action is requested by the MCSO.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. On 05Nov09, at 1100 hours, $\binom{b}{6}$, reported she was sexually assaulted by $\binom{b}{6}$, on 12Aug09 in a guest cottage bedroom located at the Naval Postgraduate School (NPS) in Monterey, CA. $\binom{b}{6}$, stated that at the conclusion of a party $\frac{(b)(6)}{(b)(7)(C)}$ forced her onto a bed, reached his hand underneath her brax and grabbed her breasts. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who reportedly consumed two alcoholic beverages during the course of the evening, said she tried to push (b)(6), off her but blacked out in the process. She said she woke up the next morning on 13Aug09 to find (b)(6), digitally penetrating her vagina. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) still dressed in her shirt and jean shorts reportedly got up, grabbed her car keys and drove back to her barracks room. (b)(6), reportedly waited several months to report the incident because she knew she had violated the Command zero tolerance policy regarding underage drinking and feared the consequences. Various witnesses were interviewed but failed to provide direct knowledge of the alleged assault. Case control was transferred to NCISFO Southwest San Diego, CA in light of (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) command location. Since case transfer to San Diego, $\binom{(b)(6)}{(b)(7)(C)}$ was honorably discharged from the United States Navy upon completing his term of service and resides in San Diego, CA. It was also determined (b)(6), was separated from the USN after (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

(b)(6), On 02Jun10, (b)(6), was telephonically contacted, confirmed his civilian status, and agreed to be interviewed during the week of 14Jun10. (b)(6), was interrogated on 30Jun10 and maintained he touched (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) breasts and vagina with her consent before she indicated she did not want to continue or have sexual intercourse. (b)(6), said he was surprised but honored her wish and fell asleep (b)(6), any further activity. Additional efforts to interview

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. On 12SEP08, (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was arrested by the Marina Police Department (MPD), Marina, CA for (b)(6), battery, child endangerment, false imprisonment, and interfupting a 911 emergency telephone call. NARRATIVE

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. This reactive investigation was initiated upon notification that a civilian employee of the Naval Postgraduate School (NPS), (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) allegedly engaged in sexual activities with juvenile males during a trip to Latin America in 2013. The suspected sexual activities were reportedly witnessed by a civilian colleague who observed what was characterized as inappropriate conduct taking place inside (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) hotel room. The alleged witness was interviewed and denied knowledge of any inappropriate sexual activity relating to (b)(6), and further denied traveling with (b)(6), at any point after 2010. (b)(6), was also interviewed and denied the (b)(7)(C) allegations against him. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) foreign travel was reviewed, which documented, among others, multiple travel dates to Brazil from 2011-2014, as well as travel to Argentina in 2012 and 2014 respectively. This investigation failed to uncover any evidence of criminal activity. As a result, this case is closed.

NARRATIVE

1. This reactive investigation was initiated pursuant to a suspected violation of 18 USC 2241(c) (Aggravated Sexual Abuse) and 18 USC 2422 (Coercion and Enticement for Prostitution).

2. This investigation was initiated circa 03Feb15 upon allegations that Naval Postgraduate School (NPS), Remote Sensing Center (RSC), National Capital Region (NCR) possibly engaged in sexual activities with under-age males during a DoD sponsored trip to Latin America in 2013. Scientist, Defense Intelligence Activity (DIA), was interviewed and reported in October 2013, Civilian, Office of the Secretary of Defense (OSD), told him in mid-late 2013, he and traveled to Cartagena, Colombia on official government travel, and while there, witnessed inviting several juvenile males into

3. On 12Feb15, was interviewed and acknowledged he and worked together at OSD prior to employment with NPS. However, denied ever witnessing solicit males for prostitution, and related he never worked or traveled with at any point after 2010. further remarked it was common knowledge among their colleagues that is sexually attracted to men and frequents gay bars during government travel, but he has never suspected of engaging in illicit activity. asserted have had prior conflicts with each other, and explained the allegations concerning may have been "blown out of proportion", Exhibit (2) pertains.

4. On 20Feb15, was interviewed in a non-custodial setting and denied the allegations against him. further noted he and have had conflicts in the past, and that it was not unusual for people to falsely claim certain things about him, Exhibit (3) provides details.

5. s SF-86, along with his foreign travel as reported to NPS, were collected and reviewed. The review indicated conducted government related travel to Brazil in 2011 and 2014, in addition to personal travel in 2013 and 2014. also traveled to Argentina in 2012 and 2014. Of note, purportedly failed to report official foreign travel to the NPS security office on at least one occasion in 2015. Exhibits (4) and (5) provide further details.

6. Various law enforcement queries conducted on did not reveal any derogatory information. However,

7. This investigation failed to confirm the alleged criminal activity associated with as well as uncover any other evidence of criminality. This investigation is closed pending the receipt of additional information pertaining to s alleged offense(s).
