Synopsis: Request for investigative assistance by Merseyside Police.

Details: Victim was murdered in the Liverpool, England, area on 11/19/97. The cause of death was multiple gunshot wounds.

The Merseyside Police have recovered a VHS video tape (as opposed to the European PAL or SECAM format) which shows in detail how to make a silencer/sound eliminator for various caliber weapons. At the beginning of this video the narrator points out the legal position of the video in the United States, and notes that certain portions of the tape were made outside the jurisdiction of the United States.

The address shown on this video is Paladin Press, PO Box 1307, Boulder, Colorado 80306. There is another address contained within the video which advertises muzzle couplings for .22 caliber rifles and pistols. This address is DAQ, RR 1 Box 56B, Goodson, Missouri 85650.

The Merseyside Police have requested any information available regarding these two companies. They have also requested that appropriate company officials be contacted, and details obtained, regarding the sale of any company products to individuals residing within the Liverpool area of England.

London notes that inasmuch as the introduction of firearms, gun parts, attachments, and accessories into the United Kingdom is illegal, it is doubtful that company officials will voluntarily provide details of sales to British residents. In this event, Merseyside officials will be advised to submit a Letter of Request for relevant documents under the US/UK MLAT Treaty.

I spoke yesterday with the agent in our Boulder, Colorado, office who is handling your request regarding Paladin Press. He advised that officials from Paladin Press are unwilling to provide details of all their customers from the Merseyside area. However, they will search their customer database for specific names, and provide details of all transactions with regard to these specific customers.

The agent advised he has dealt with Paladin Press regarding similar requests in the past (e.g., the Oklahoma City bombing). They are generally cooperative, and will gladly search their records against a list of names provided by the police. However, they are uncomfortable about handing over geographical customer lists for fear that the information will be used against individuals who have no involvement with the matter being investigated.

If you can provide me with a list of suspects, or associates, who are suspected of dealing with Paladin Press, I'll gladly forward the names to our Boulder office. It is my understanding that Paladin Press sells books and videos, but not actual firearms accessories or attachments.

Subsequent to July, 1970, they have been given the classification of confidential.

Army Technical Manual TM-5-280A (Foreign Mine Warfare Equipment) classified confidential was superseded July 15, 1971, by Army TM-5-280 and unclassified document.

Army technical manual TM 23-200 (Capabilities of Nuclear Weapons) classified confidential was superseded on June 1, 1969, by Defense Atomic Support Agency Manual Number 1 classified confidential.

Army pamphlet number 30-52 (Handbook on the North Korean Armed Forces) classified confidential - modified handling authorized was rescinded June 28, 1968, as a classified document.

Army pamphlet number 30-53 (Handbook on the North Vietnamese Armed Forces) classified confidential - modified handling authorized is now classified as confidential.

Army manual "Improvised Munitions Handbook" was original published as an unclassified manual by the Frankford Arsenal, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, but in mid 1970, it was made a confidential technical manual.

furnished the Phoenix division seven documents which can be divided into two groups. Group #1 consisted of FM 5-31 (booby traps) TM 31-201-1 (Unconventional Warfare Devices and Techniques-Incendiaries), and TM 31-200-1 (Unconventional Warfare Devices and Techniques-References). Group #2 consisted of TM 5-280A, TM 23-200, and Army pamphlets #30-52 and 30-53.

Group #1 documents as well as a similar document not obtained (Improvised Munitions Handbook) were reportedly obtainable from the captioned companies. The allegations were they were classified, not available to the general public, and the companies involved were printing classified material.

FD-302 dated 2/26/73, contains the results of investigation concerning these Group #1 type documents. Based on this FD-302, it would appear Denver and Los Angeles have no known violation and no further investigation is needed.

Group #2 consists of four documents obtained at the Yuma Gun Show in Yuma, Arizona, sometime during February, 1972. FD-302 dated 8/22/73, contains the results of investigation concerning these Group #2 documents. Only TM 23-200 remains classified confidential while the other three are now declassified. Any further investigation regarding these Group #2 documents is being left to the discretion of Phoenix.

The current definitions for classified information are as follows:

The "Top Secret" classification is given to information the unauthorized disclosure of which could reasonably be expected to cause exceptionally grave damage to the national security.

The "Secret" classification is given to information the unauthorized disclosure of which could reasonably be expected to cause serious damage to the national security.

The "Confidential" classification is given to information the unauthorized disclosure of which could reasonably be expected to cause damage to the national security.

The "For Official Use Only" classification is given to information requiring protection against unauthorized release for reasons other than security. This is an administrative classification, while the above three are security classifications.

In July, 1970, all unclassified Army technical manuals and field manuals dealing with explosives, incendiary devices, sabotage, and unconventional warfare techniques were upgraded by the Secretary of the Army to "Confidential (not automatically declassified after expiration of period of downgrading)" to keep them out of the hands of militant extremist groups and the public domain, because various groups were utilizing the material in the manuals for reasons detrimental to the interests of the public and the Government.

Warfare Devices and Techniques - Incendiaries), TM 31-200-1 (Unconventional Warfare Devices and Techniques - References), and TM 31-210 (Improvised Munitions Handbook), as well as Army Field Manual FM 5-31 (Boobytraps), are not available to the general public, as they are classified "Confidential".

If a copy of these manuals is stamped "Confidential" and is in the possession of one who does not have a need to know or does not have the proper authorization to possess the manuals, it can be seized. Also, since it is marked "Confidential", it cannot be reproduced without the proper authorization. However, if a copy is not stamped "Confidential" because it was obtained legally prior to July, 1970, there is currently no known law to require it be returned to the Government or to prohibit it from being reproduced. (There is no known law against reproducing unclassified material.) If one of these nonstamped manuals is voluntarily turned over to the Government, it will be destroyed in the proper manner or stamped "Confidential" and placed in the inventory.

Further, Alexandria advised that of the documents identified as Group #2 documents, only TM 23-200 remained classified and was leaving further investigation, relative to that document, to the discretion of Phoenix. Inasmuch as Los Angeles had received no information from other Offices that TM 23-200 had been published in Los Angeles, the case was administratively closed, since it had received no leads up to that time.

Referenced Phoenix letter indicates that Los Angeles is office or origin for TM 23-200. A review of the file reflects that document was purchased in Yuma, Arizona from an unidentified seller. Therefore, Los Angeles is not clear as to its office of origin status.

Los Angeles notes that in an airtel of 10/11/72, Phoenix enclosed for Los Angeles copies of covers of military manuals TM 31-201-1, TM 31-200-1, and FM 5-31, and order blanks from INCO and Angriff Press, from which the above manuals had been purchased. It is noted the file contains copies of the above mentioned manuals and a two-page order blank from INCO and a copy of the first page of a pamphlet entitled, "The Chemistry of Powder and Explosives" by TENNEY L. DAVIS, Ph.D. At the bottom of that page is the legend, "PRICE \$5. ANGRIFF PRESS, BOX 2726, HOLLYWOOD, CALIFORNIA, 90028". Initially, Los Angeles felt this was the "order blank" from Angriff, but based on referenced Phoenix letter of 10/17/73, now feels Phoenix may have inadvertently enclosed this page rather than the true order blank. In that case, it is possible the blank contained a reference to TM 23-200, although Phoenix did not indicate that to be the case.

In order to facilitate investigation and eliminate unnecessary investigation, Phoenix requested to advise the basis of office of origin status for Los Angeles for TM 23-200 and indicate which publisher, INCO or Angriff, is suspected of being the publisher of the document.

Desert Publications is known as a printing clearinghouse for radical and military oriented publications and is in the business of providing books, catalogs, and pauphlets dealing with such subjects as lock picking, safe and vault manipulation, electronic surveillance, weapons, and explosives.

Descrt Publications does not deal with any filegal items, only publications. As a result, these publications are protected by the First Amendment of the Constitution, even though subsequent manufacture and production of some of the items listed in the publications could be deemed illegal.

Desert Publications is also known as the Normount Publishing Company and the Paladin Press. These firms publish military film manuals and other documents of an overt nature, sometimes advertising them as CIA publications. Most of these publications are phony, and on at least one occasion, an old CIA training manual was published which was not classified:

This responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of September 15, 2010, to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), for all FBI files pertaining to Paladin Press. On March 15, 2011, the FBI forwarded your request along with Army-originated records retrieved from their files, for a releasability determination. This correspondence was received in this office on March 18, 2011.

We have completed a mandatory declassification review of the referred records in accordance with Executive Order 13526. As a result of the review, it has been determined that the Army-originated records no longer warrant security classification protection and are partially releasable to you. A copy of the records are enclosed for your use.

Information has been sanitized that would result in an unwarranted invasion of the privacy rights of the individuals concerned. This information is exempt from public disclosure provisions of the FOIA pursuant to Title 5 U.S. Code 552 (b)(6).

The withholding of the information described above is a partial denial of your request. This denial is made on behalf of Major General Mary A. Legere, Commanding, U.S. Army Intelligence and Security Command, who is the Initial Denial Authority for Army intelligence investigative and security records under the FOIA. You have the right to appeal this decision to the Secretary of the Army. If you wish to file an appeal, you should forward it to this office. Your appeal must be postmarked no later than 60 calendar days from the date of this letter. After the 60-day period, the case may be considered closed; however, such closure does not preclude you from filing litigation in the courts.

We are forwarding a copy of this letter to the FBI (FOIA/PA #1154700-000).

There are no assessable FOIA fees for processing this request.



The classification "Restricted" equates approximately to the US term "For official use only" although it is realised that US Army procedures require "restricted" documents to be handled as "confidential".
- 2. The well known Chinese Communist technique of subscribing to official and demi-official publications under plausible but fictitious titles leads the Australian Army Intelligence Directorate to be curious as to the manner in which Palladin Press came to possess these manuals.
- 5. Such documents could have been obtained from many sources, including Australia. Australian Military Intelligence however asks if the US Army could investigate what appears to be incidents of low classified Australian material being released to unauthorized persons.
