Synopsis: Request for investigative assistance by Merseyside Police.

Details: Victim was murdered in the Liverpool, England, area on 11/19/97. The cause of death was multiple gunshot wounds.

The Merseyside Police have recovered a VHS video tape (as opposed to the European PAL or SECAM format) which shows in detail how to make a silencer/sound eliminator for various caliber weapons. At the beginning of this video the narrator points out the legal position of the video in the United States, and notes that certain portions of the tape were made outside the jurisdiction of the United States.

The address shown on this video is Paladin Press, PO Box 1307, Boulder, Colorado 80306. There is another address contained within the video which advertises muzzle couplings for .22 caliber rifles and pistols. This address is DAQ, RR 1 Box 56B, Goodson, Missouri 85650.

The Merseyside Police have requested any information available regarding these two companies. They have also requested that appropriate company officials be contacted, and details obtained, regarding the sale of any company products to individuals residing within the Liverpool area of England.

London notes that inasmuch as the introduction of firearms, gun parts, attachments, and accessories into the United Kingdom is illegal, it is doubtful that company officials will voluntarily provide details of sales to British residents. In this event, Merseyside officials will be advised to submit a Letter of Request for relevant documents under the US/UK MLAT Treaty.

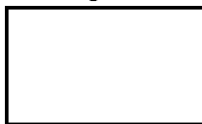

I spoke yesterday with the agent in our Boulder, Colorado, office who is handling your request regarding Paladin Press. He advised that officials from Paladin Press are unwilling to provide details of all their customers from the Merseyside area. However, they will search their customer database for specific names, and provide details of all transactions with regard to these specific customers.

The agent advised he has dealt with Paladin Press regarding similar requests in the past (e.g., the Oklahoma City bombing). They are generally cooperative, and will gladly search their records against a list of names provided by the police. However, they are uncomfortable about handing over geographical customer lists for fear that the information will be used against individuals who have no involvement with the matter being investigated.

If you can provide me with a list of suspects, or associates, who are suspected of dealing with Paladin Press, I'll gladly forward the names to our Boulder office. It is my understanding that Paladin Press sells books and videos, but not actual firearms accessories or attachments.

Paladin Press takes the legal position that any carte blanche disclosure of such shipment or customer list would be a violation of its customers' privacy rights. However, if the FBI provides a list of specific names, addresses, etc., then Paladin Press is willing to query its databases and provide information regarding such.

[REDACTED] initially told SA [REDACTED] that Paladin Press may be willing to provide the FBI with simply the number of customers in the Liverpool, England area. However, after consulting the Paladin Press [REDACTED] recanted, and told SA [REDACTED] such disclosure would also violate Paladin Press' legal policy.

Therefore, Paladin Press will only provide information to the FBI as a result of specific inquiries regarding names, addresses, etc.

As discussed in the referenced telcal, SA [REDACTED] will obtain a list of specific names, addresses, etc. from the Merseyside Police, which they desire Paladin Press to query. - Warfare Devices and Techniques - Incendiaries), TM 31-200-1 (Unconventional Warfare Devices and Techniques - References), and TM 31-210 (Improvised Munitions Handbook), as well as Army Field Manual FM 5-31 (Boobytraps), are not available to the general public, as they are classified "Confidential".

If a copy of these manuals is stamped "Confidential" and is in the possession of one who does not have a need to know or does not have the proper authorization to possess the manuals, it can be seized. Also, since it is marked "Confidential", it cannot be reproduced without the proper authorization. However, if a copy is not stamped "Confidential" because it was obtained legally prior to July, 1970, there is currently no known law to require it be returned to the Government or to prohibit it from being reproduced. (There is no known law against reproducing unclassified material.) Paladin Press was formerly known as Panther Publications, Incorporated. [redacted]

[redacted] testified before the Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations of the Committee on Government Operations, United States Senate, July 31; August 4, 5, and 6, 1970. He stated the firm publishes as well as distributes through the mails, a wide range of books which include military science, as well as various works dealing with unconventional warfare and counterinsurgency, as well as what he called associated copy, i.e., books on weapons, camping and explosives. He testified [redacted]

[redacted] with the idea of distributing and selling guerilla warfare material because at that time it became apparent to him that there were a large group of people who were interested in guerilla warfare in a similar manner as there are many people who are military buffs as past wars go. He said there is no intention on his part to cater to the radical or the extremist on either side of the political spectrum.

The current catalog distributed by Paladin Press, Box 1307, Boulder, Colorado, 80302, describes "OSS-Sabotage and Demolition Manual" as covering military, commercial and foreign explosives, incendiaries accessories; preparation of explosive charges; calculating and placement of charges, mines, bombs, and projectiles as demolition charges; home made explosives; shape charges, firing systems, incendiaries and their uses; harmful additives and techniques of sabotage. It describes the book as the most comprehensive book available for the ordnance technician.

[redacted] said he is very careful not to violate any copyright laws and does considerable research before reprinting any material to make sure he is not in violation of any law. He stated among the customers of Paladin Press are the various branches of the Armed Forces who order large quantities of Paladin Press publications for use in training military personnel. He said also among his customers are police departments throughout the U. S.

Further, Alexandria advised that of the documents identified as Group #2 documents, only TM 23-200 remained classified and was leaving further investigation, relative to that document, to the discretion of Phoenix. Inasmuch as Los Angeles had received no information from other Offices that TM 23-200 had been published in Los Angeles, the case was administratively closed, since it had received no leads up to that time.

Referenced Phoenix letter indicates that Los Angeles is office or origin for TM 23-200. A review of the file reflects that document was purchased in Yuma, Arizona from an unidentified seller. Therefore, Los Angeles is not clear as to its office of origin status. ✓

Los Angeles notes that in an airtel of 10/11/72, Phoenix enclosed for Los Angeles copies of covers of military manuals TM 31-201-1, TM 31-200-1, and FM 5-31, and order blanks from INCO and Angriff Press, from which the above manuals had been purchased. It is noted the file contains copies of the above mentioned manuals and a two-page order blank from INCO and a copy of the first page of a pamphlet entitled, "The Chemistry of Powder and Explosives" by TENNEY L. DAVIS, Ph.D. At the bottom of that page is the legend, "PRICE \$5. ANGRIFFF PRESS, BOX 2726, HOLLYWOOD, CALIFORNIA, 90028". Initially, Los Angeles felt this was the "order blank" from Angriff, but based on referenced Phoenix letter of 10/17/73, now feels Phoenix may have inadvertently enclosed this page rather than the true order blank. In that case, it is possible the blank contained a reference to TM 23-200, although Phoenix did not indicate that to be the case.

In order to facilitate investigation and eliminate unnecessary investigation, Phoenix requested to advise the basis of office of origin status for Los Angeles for TM 23-200 and indicate which publisher, INCO or Angriff, is suspected of being the publisher of the document.

Desert Publications is known as a printing clearinghouse for radical and military oriented publications and is in the business of providing books, catalogs, and pamphlets dealing with such subjects as lock picking, safe and vault manipulation, electronic surveillance, weapons, and explosives.

Desert Publications does not deal with any illegal items, only publications. As a result, these publications are protected by the First Amendment of the Constitution, even though subsequent manufacture and production of some of the items listed in the publications could be deemed illegal.

Desert Publications is also known as the Normount Publishing Company and the Paladin Press. These firms publish military film manuals and other documents of an overt nature, sometimes advertising them as CIA publications. Most of these publications are phony, and on at least one occasion, an old CIA training manual was published which was not classified.

Bureau indices contain no additional references for Desert Publications.

With regard to Bill Morg Publication, Bureau indices were negative.

This responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of September 15, 2010, to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), for all FBI files pertaining to Paladin Press. On March 15, 2011, the FBI forwarded your request along with Army-originated records retrieved from their files, for a releasability determination. This correspondence was received in this office on March 18, 2011.

We have completed a mandatory declassification review of the referred records in accordance with Executive Order 13526. As a result of the review, it has been determined that the Army-originated records no longer warrant security classification protection and are partially releasable to you. A copy of the records are enclosed for your use.

Information has been sanitized that would result in an unwarranted invasion of the privacy rights of the individuals concerned. This information is exempt from public disclosure provisions of the FOIA pursuant to Title 5 U.S. Code 552 (b)(6).

The withholding of the information described above is a partial denial of your request. This denial is made on behalf of Major General Mary A. Legere, Commanding, U.S. Army Intelligence and Security Command, who is the Initial Denial Authority for Army intelligence investigative and security records under the FOIA. You have the right to appeal this decision to the Secretary of the Army. If you wish to file an appeal, you should forward it to this office. Your appeal must be postmarked no later than 60 calendar days from the date of this letter. After the 60-day period, the case may be considered closed; however, such closure does not preclude you from filing litigation in the courts.



1. It is believed that the sidelined publications offered for sale on page 3 of Reference A could indicate unauthorized copying and release in part or whole, of References B, C and D, which are classified Australian Army publications. The classification "Restricted" equates approximately to the US term "For official use only" although it is realised that US Army procedures require "restricted" documents to be handled as "confidential".

2. The well known Chinese Communist technique of subscribing to official and demi-official publications under plausible but fictitious titles leads the Australian Army Intelligence Directorate to be curious as to the manner in which Palladin Press came to possess these manuals.

3. Such documents could have been obtained from many sources, including Australia. Australian Military Intelligence however asks if the US Army could investigate what appears to be incidents of low classified Australian material being released to unauthorized persons.
