- **PURPOSE:** The North Dakota Department of Transportation (NDDOT), in section 39-04-10.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is charged with the task of issuing personalized license plates. The Motor Vehicle Division of NDDOT is responsible for the purchase and issuance of these license plates.
- **POLICY:** The Motor Vehicle Division retains the right to refuse to issue any license plates with any combination of letters or numbers, presented in any language, which, when read forward or backwards, may carry connotations that are offensive to good taste and decency, or would be misleading, including but not limited to:
 - 1. A vulgar word or term, including a swear word or term defined in dictionaries as profane, obscene, or having an explicit sexual connotation.
 - 2. A word or term that is offensive to or contemptuous of a racial or ethnic group.
 - 3. A word or term that advocates lawlessness or advocates lawless activities or that refers to illegal drugs.
 - 4. A word or term that could be reasonably expected to provoke a violent response from viewers.
 - 5. A foreign word or term that falls into any of the above categories.
 - 6. A combination that conflicts with the NDDOT's regular license number system.

Any restrictions on issuing personalized license plates must be reasonable and viewpoint neutral. The availability of a personalized license plate selected on the NDDOT website, by mail, or through any other means, is subject to final approval by the Motor Vehicle Division. If a request for a personalized license plate is denied, Motor Vehicle Division will inform the Executive Policy Number II-11-1 Page 2

> Deputy Director for Driver and Vehicle Services prior to the decision being communicated to applicant. A person denied a personalized license plate for any of the reasons listed above may appeal that decision to the NDDOT Director or the Director's designated representative. The decision of the Director is final. Any license plates that are inadvertently issued may be recalled.

This letter is an official appeal of the rejection of my application for a personalized license plate for my North Dakota-registered personal vehicle.

On Monday, May 17, I mailed the application with the required \$25 fee for a plate that reads ISNOGOD. On Wednesday, May 19, I received a call from the formation of the didn't give me a last name) informing me that my application was rejected. I asked her what would be involved in appealing that decision. She informed me that I needed to talk to Linda Sitz, the section direction, and was transferred to her voicemail.

After leaving her a voicemail she was nice enough to call me back quickly and our two subsequent conversations resulted in her telling me that an official written appeal needed to be directed to you.

Over the past few months I have seen and taken pictures of three vehicles with "GOD" included in their personalized plates: PRZZGOD, ILOVGOD, TRI GOD. (I have enclosed copies of the pictures I took.) Because it is obvious that the state has allowed its property (license plates) to be used to proclaim a religious point of view by at least three individuals, I have put in my application, too.

The only reason I was given for the rejection was that it might offend North Dakotans and would be likely to be challenged for that reason and have to be recalled.

I am a member of a growing minority of people who does not believe in deities of any kind. The point of view expressed in the license plates I have seen can be an offense to people like me because it is a government endorsement of a religious point of view, which should never happen. If the state would allow anyone to express their point of view freely through the same government-owned medium, then the endorsement would be removed. However, if the state only allows one point of view on religion to be expressed on its property, then it is an endorsement of that point of view. There is even a panel of people who make that decision, which means it is a deliberate choice being made by the state in favor of one position in regard to this issue.

I am requesting one of two actions:

1) Approve my application for the license plate ISNOGOD, or

2) Recall any of the plates already issued which proclaim a religious point of view of any kind and stop any others from be made.

We have received input from the Police and citizens that the plate you are currently displaying creates confusion with the official Police plateand are thereby we are recalling your plate.
