Anderson tells of FBI file on blacks

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Syndicated columnist Jack Anderson said yesterday that the FBI and the Secret Service kept tabs on virtually every prominent black person in America, even shifting agents to follow Martin Luther King's widow after he was assassinated.

Of the FBI, Anderson said: "...Apparently, anyone with dark skin who dares to open his mouth is viewed as subversive." He added that the Secret Service has gone so far overboard that its list of potential assassins includes virtually every prominent black who has ever spoken out.

Anderson whose column appears in the Star-Ledger and other newspapers, appeared at informal hearings sponsored by the 13 black House members into the alleged lawlessness of the government in the administration of domestic programs, particularly as they apply to blacks.

Anderson said the Secret Service kept the names of about 180,000 persons in its data bank, including such prominent whites as commentator Paul Harvey, comedian Groucho Marx, actor Tony Randall and folk singer-activist Joan Baez.

He said blacks were the only group listed separately by the Secret Service and he said about 5,500 of them constituted what the agency called its "black nationalist" file. Among those on that list, he said, were civil rights leaders Ralph D. Abernathy, Roy Innis, Roy Wilkins and former baseball star Jackie Robinson.

Anderson supplied the hearing with a copy of the computerized list and Rep. Ronald Dellums (D-Calif.), serving as chairman of the Black Caucus' hearing, said his group would consider filing suit on behalf of those included on it.

As for the FBI's surveillance of Coretta King, Anderson told the hearing that it was no secret that the late FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover "hounded the late Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., from Montgomery to Memphis."

He said, "the FBI...zeroed in on his widow" after King's death in 1968. His prepared testimony did not say whether the surveillance of Mrs. King continued after Hoover's death. May 2.

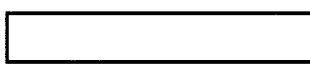

Anderson On the FBI

Washington, Aug. 14 (UPI)

— Columnist Jack Anderson gave the Senate Banking Committee what he said were FBI memos on political activists Jane Fonda, Benjamin Spock and Floyd McKissick today to prove that the FBI "has virtually unlimited access to private bank account records."

The columnist testified that informants inside the FBI have told him that the practice of examining checking accounts of people under surveillance is widespread.

Anderson testified in favor of legislation which would require a subpoena or a customer's consent before a financial institution could disclose records to government investigators.

SYNOPSIS:

Concerning attached Baltimore airtel and letterhead memorandum (LEM) which reported allegations by [Redacted] a Jack Anderson staff writer, of a [Redacted] interview with Mr. Gray and of the existence of an Anderson source in the FBI, Mr. Gray instructed: "1. Check list of my press contacts. I do not recall that [Redacted] has interviewed me. 2. Your comments and recommendations." There is no record of [Redacted] having interviewed the Acting Director and the possibility of [Redacted] having a source in the FBI "secret files section" is extremely remote. [Redacted] claim in his 10/10/72 lecture at Essex Community College, Essex, Maryland, that he talked with Mr. Gray concerning FBI files on prominent people is false. However, as alleged by [Redacted] we have files on and have investigated Marlon Brando, Jane Fonda, Harry Bellafonte, and I. F. Stone. Also, a Xerox copy of Fonda's address book was made, as alleged by [Redacted] after it had been obtained in a 11/3/70 Bureau of Customs search at Cleveland. [Redacted] allegation of a source in the FBI "secret files section" is serious, but investigation of Anderson's compromise of FBI documents last spring indicates the documents came from Secret Service files. Concerning [Redacted] boast of an FBI source, the following observations are presented: (1) it is doubtful that Anderson and [Redacted] would boast of such a source, if it existed, for fear we would detect it; (2) Anderson has not revealed FBI documents dated and disseminated to Secret Service later than January, 1972, and undoubtedly would have revealed later information from a continuing source shortly after receipt; (3) [Redacted] is a primary suspect since he was the only computer data company employee refusing to take a lie detector test about the leak from Secret Service files of FBI and Secret Service documents and since his fingerprints were located on various Secret Service records. WFO still investigating [Redacted].

background and associates while at Secret Service and Secret Service still processing records to detect fingerprints of [redacted] his associates, or Anderson and his staff people; (4) [redacted] boast of a source in the FBI may well be an attempt to bait the FBI into surveillance of Anderson and his associates and into investigation of FBI personnel with an aim of detecting such surveillance and investigation for purposes of publicly harassing the FBI and the Administration. No FBI Agents assigned to cover or were present at [redacted] lecture.

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RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. That until there is stronger evidence of a leak to Anderson through a source in the FBI, we should not initiate any investigation of Anderson or his staff.

2. That we continue to follow Anderson's references to FBI documents in an effort to trace possible origin of the document leaks.

3. That the attached airtel be sent to WFO enclosing a copy of the Baltimore 10/12/72 LHM on the [redacted] lecture and instructing that no investigation or surveillance should be conducted on Anderson or his associates.

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DETAILS:

Concerning attached Baltimore airtel and LHM which reported allegations by [redacted] a Jack Anderson staff writer, of a [redacted] interview with Mr. Gray and of the existence of an Anderson source in the FBI, Mr. Gray instructed: "1. Check list of my press contacts. I do not recall that [redacted] has interviewed me. 2. Your comments and recommendations."

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There is no record of [redacted] having interviewed the Acting Director and the possibility of [redacted] having a source in the FBI "secret files section" is extremely remote.

Regarding point one, Assistant Director Bishop of the Crime Records Division has advised that there is no record that [redacted] has contacted or interviewed Mr. Gray since his appointment as Acting Director, FBI. Thus, [redacted] claim in his 10/10/72 lecture at Essex Community College, Essex, Maryland, that he talked with Mr. Gray concerning FBI files on prominent people is false.

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As to such files, [redacted] mentioned Marlon Brando, Jane Fonda, Harry Bellafonte, and I. F. Stone, as individuals on whom the FBI maintains files. [redacted] is correct. Brando was investigated regarding his support of the Black Panther Party; Fonda was investigated as a possible security threat and for possible sedition; Bellafonte was investigated concerning affiliation with communist-front groups in 1953; and I. F. Stone was investigated regarding alleged Communist Party membership in 1950.

Spear claimed that Jane Fonda was detained by Customs officials in Cleveland on 11/3/70 because the FBI thought she had drugs in her possession. Actually, Bureau of Customs officials searched Fonda's luggage

[redacted] is correct in claiming that the FBI made a Xerox copy of an address book found in Fonda's luggage by Customs officials. At the time we were investigating Fonda to determine if she was a security threat. Information that a Xerox copy of the address book had been made was contained in a Cleveland LHM dated 11/10/70 which was later disseminated on 11/18/70 to Secret Service, Army, State Department, CIA, and Legal Attaches at Bonn, London, Ottawa, Paris, Rome, and Tokyo.

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The most serious charge made by [redacted] concerns an alleged "confidential source" in the FBI "secret files section" that furnishes FBI files to [redacted] and Anderson for copying. However, investigation of Anderson's compromise of FBI documents last spring indicates the documents came from Secret Service files.

While there is cause for concern of [redacted] boast of a source in the FBI, it is believed the following comments, which have the concurrence of Assistant Director Marshall, Files and Communications Division, are pertinent regarding this matter:

1. If Anderson and [redacted] wanted to retain an existing source in the FBI "secret files section," it is doubtful that they would publicly boast of it because of the possibility of losing the source by our counter efforts. Thus, it could be argued that their public claims do not necessarily reflect reality.

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2. The information revealed by Anderson and [redacted] since early May, 1972, about alleged FBI "secret dossiers" is believed to have come from FBI documents dated and disseminated to Secret Service no later than January, 1972. Since there has been no revelation of more recent FBI documents, it is doubtful that Anderson and his staff have continuing sources in the FBI or at Secret Service. This conclusion is based on the belief that documents from such a continuing source undoubtedly would be revealed by Anderson within a short time of receipt.

3. As to the suspected leak to Anderson through Secret Service of both FBI and Secret Service documents, [redacted] is a primary suspect since he was employed by a computer data company on a computerization project of Secret Service records, many of which contained FBI documents. WFO is conducting active investigation of [redacted] While on the project, which began in mid-1971 and ended in May, 1972, [redacted] and other workers for the private firm had access to Secret Service records. When information from Secret Service records was exposed by Anderson in columns in May, 1972, Secret Service came to suspect [redacted] since he was the only project worker refusing to take a lie detector test about the leak and since his fingerprints have been located on various file jackets and records

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involved in the leaked material. Secret Service is still processing its file jackets and records to detect any fingerprints of [redacted] and his associates or Anderson and his staff people. FBI investigation has not substantiated any leak charges against [redacted] however, WFO is still pursuing leads on [redacted] background and associates while at Secret Service.

4. [redacted] boast of a source in the FBI may well be an attempt to bait the FBI into conducting physical surveillance on Anderson and his staff members so that our Agents and cars could be photographed. Such evidence of FBI interest in Anderson and his staff, of course, would be utilized to harass the FBI and the Administration. Also, special efforts to detect a possible source among our personnel could come to the attention of Anderson and his staff, resulting in publicity alleging widespread and improper investigation of FBI personnel.

In connection with [redacted] claim that FBI Agents were undoubtedly in the audience on 10/10/72, the Baltimore Office has advised that no FBI Agents were assigned to cover, or were present, at, [redacted] lecture.

On October 10, 1972 a confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised that [REDACTED] a staff writer for syndicated newspaper columnist Jack Anderson, was going to speak at Essex Community College, Essex, Maryland concerning the F.B.I.

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The source advised that [REDACTED] began speaking at the college field house at 8:10 p.m. and finished at approximately 9:10 p.m. The people in attendance were approximately 70 males, 30 females, with the majority being students under 21 years old.

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[REDACTED] made the following comments during his speech:

"Some people call us muckrakers, but I am an investigative reporter for Jack Anderson and it is my job to let the public know what is going on behind closed doors in Washington and also about the activities of our elected officials."

[REDACTED] said he has confidential sources that get the information out to him because at the secret or closed meetings, the public and the press are excluded. Labor Union activities are also kept from the public and unless you are an important union official, you never know what is going on and that is why he relies on confidential sources.

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[REDACTED] commented that former President Lyndon B. Johnson had a birthday party at his ranch in August,

1964 and it was there that some major issues were decided regarding the U.S. involvement in the Southeast Asian conflict. These were decisions that were made without the knowledge or approval of the American people. [REDACTED] said the press was told what to release to the public but [REDACTED] source gave him all the information. He said when L.B.J. left the White House he took several truck loads of confidential reports with him and it is these reports that were used to write his memoirs. In his memoirs L.B.J. writes about Operation Marigold which deals with the problems in Poland.

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Source advised that [REDACTED] in his speech stated that the Washington Post and New York Times were taken to court by the Nixon Administration. The case was heard by Judge Gazell and the freedom of the press was stopped for the first time in 200 years.

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The decision to move American warships in the Bay of Bengal during the India-Pakistan conflict was also kept from the public. The reason to move the ships was a show of strength to Russia. [REDACTED] stated he received a telegram from his source and the telegram was marked "~~Confidential~~ - Eyes Only."

[REDACTED] commented on an incident that allegedly took place in Kenya in the Treetop Lodge. [REDACTED] stated that he obtained a telegram that was sent from Ambassador Mc Avain to [REDACTED] concerning an incident in which a man named [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was not invited to a party through an oversight but attended. At the party [REDACTED] had a few drinks and allegedly grabbed a secretary and dragged her downstairs so she could see the elephants close-up. [REDACTED] stated when he telephoned [REDACTED] about the incident [REDACTED] stated he took the girl down to see the elephants up close and as they were descending she slipped and [REDACTED] grabbed her hand. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] missed his plane the next day and took one of the Secret Service cars. The Agents had to get a car from 100 miles away.

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[REDACTED] advised in the speech that he had interviewed L. Patrick Gray concerning the confidential files kept on prominent people. L. Patrick Gray advised [REDACTED] that there are no such confidential files but

[REDACTED] stated his confidential sources tell him there are. The files are kept on people who have never committed a crime and especially are kept on black people.

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[REDACTED] stated that his source removes the files from the F.B.I. office on Friday and then takes them to Anderson or [REDACTED] where they are xeroxed. The files are returned to the source and then the source returns them to the F.B.I. Office. [REDACTED] stated he has spent many nights xeroxing F.B.I. reports.

[REDACTED] stated that the F.B.I. has files on moviestars such as Marlon Brando, Jane Fonda and Harry Bellafonte because they have contributed money to the Black Panther Party. The F.B.I. Agents are paid good salaries but they use the tax payers money by going around watching people who are not guilty of any crime.

[REDACTED] advised that Jane Fonda had been stopped by customs officials in Cleveland because the F.B.I. thought she had drugs in her possession. A subsequent search of her luggage disclosed an address book with several hundred names and the book was xeroxed by the F.B.I.

[REDACTED] commented that there is no law which permits the F.B.I. to keep surveillance on the public but that this is assumed by the F.B.I. Jack Anderson's column in the Washington Post 9/18/72, discusses stolen, counterfeit, and worthless securities from the point of view of the Senate Permanent Investigating Subcommittee (McClellan). A copy of this column is attached.

Anderson states the Committee has found over \$10 billion in stolen stocks, bonds, and other securities and \$15 billion in counterfeit or inflated financial paper to be in existence and this has been traced to organized crime figures and confidence men. He stresses the seriousness of the situation affecting the country.

The \$10 billion figure covering stolen stocks and bonds is believed to be a "scare" figure. This admittedly is an estimate based on the very roughest of computations. There is no authoritative figure on the dollar amount of stolen securities unrecovered.

It is considered that the problem is indeed a serious one but the magnitude of the dollar loss is not in the \$10 billion range. For Fiscal Year 1972, the Federal Bureau of Investigation recovered \$48,900,000 in stolen securities and \$555,000 in counterfeit securities and achieved 75 convictions. Several of those convicted were either members of organized crime groups or closely allied to organized crime figures. There does not seem to be any question that organized crime has an interest in stolen and counterfeit securities but our investigative experience does not indicate that they are the motivating force behind all these thefts.

The discussion concerning the counterfeit and criminally inflated financial paper amounting to \$15 billion is not clearly defined. It is believed that Anderson and the

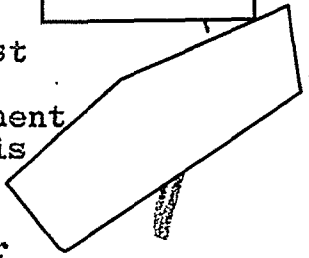

Committee are referring to the use of primarily worthless securities in creating appearances of affluence which enable worthless companies to do business and then ensnare gullible businessmen. This is most commonly found in the Advance Fee Mortgage Loan Commitment swindles which are violations of the Fraud By Wire and ITSP Statutes. The bulk of the violations in this area, however, would probably be handled by the Securities and Exchange Commission who regulate the sale of securities and have jurisdiction over the sale of worthless securities. Because this activity does not come wholly within the FBI's jurisdiction as do stolen and counterfeit stocks and bonds, it is not possible to gauge the accuracy of the \$15 billion figure.

While the Bureau has not had any "confrontations" with the Committee, it would appear from the way testimony was adduced and from the action of the investigators that the Committee is interested in personal publicity as well as effecting the objective of the Committee, which is the study of securities theft problem and the seeking of remedial legislation. Evaluation based on the product of the Committee's investigation and contact with some of the investigators of the Committee clearly establishes naivete and lack of grounding in the subject matter of the Committee inquiries. For example, one of their investigators, William B. Gallinaro, in November, 1971, interviewed a notorious confidence man, [redacted] who fed him fantastic tales of stolen securities manipulations. Gallinaro was thereafter allegedly assaulted and the notes of the interview stolen. There is a very serious question as to the fact of the assault and certainly grave doubt that if the assault did take place the notes were the object of the assault. Committee investigators spent much time and effort for many months attempting to deal with the [redacted] information and apparently have finally abandoned it as a complete fiction. Recently, we arrested an individual in New York in the act of selling stolen securities. He offered as his excuse the fact that he was working as an informant for the McClellan Committee. This is, in fact, true although he allegedly went beyond the scope of his authority. However, the McClellan Committee did not advise us of this criminal activity which was in violation of the ITSP Statute. It would appear that they were attempting to grab a headline.

The Mafia's Paper Explosion

By Jack Anderson

Senator John McClellan, (D-Ark.), the dour old crime fighter who made Cosa Nostra a family byword, is quietly preparing new hearings on a \$25-million worldwide conspiracy in fraudulent securities.

McClellan's battle with the new breed of underworld financiers may be the last in his 18-year investigation of the Mafia. He reportedly is stepping down as head of the Senate Permanent Investigating Subcommittee.

For almost two years now, the staff of the subcommittee has been on the road here, in Canada, in Great Britain and continental Europe. Their files are packed with case histories.

What they have found is well over \$10 billion in stolen stocks, bonds and other securities and another \$15 billion or more in counterfeit and criminally inflated financial paper. The committee has traced the worthless and stolen paper to organized crime figures and their con men allies.

The criminals have learned how to manipulate the lax financial regulations of many lands, especially the United

States, to corrupt whole economies with these "securities" and to destroy confidence in all financial paper.

In vastly over-simplified terms, they convert stolen, counterfeit and inflated stocks, bonds, letters of credit, escrow statements, certificates of deposit and other financial securities into cold cash or genuine assets.

Sometimes the mob's securities are used by mob-controlled business ventures as collateral for bank loans. In other cases, the securities are sold, or "rented" to legitimate corporations in desperate financial straits which use them to artificially improve the appearance of their balance sheet.

The fraudulently inflated balance sheets can then be used to attract investment capital to the corporation, thus turning the phony securities into actual money.

Inevitably, the bogus securities find their way into bank vaults, insurance company portfolios and the investment accounts of ordinary citizens. They are counted as actual assets.

Discovery that such assets are counterfeit or stolen, and thus actually worthless has

already bankrupted some firms and could ruin many more. If an honest accounting were ever done on a national scale, it could cause a massive rejuvenging of corporate arithmetic, or even a Wall Street plunge.

The ultimate effect on stockholders and consumers would be higher interest rates and higher prices, as companies staggered to make up the suddenly lost assets.

Last summer, McClellan held long but preliminary hearings to expose some of the problems. Since then, his sleuths, through questioning of underground informants and other potential witnesses, have proved that a world network of crime is behind the racket.

Shapp's Chiropractor

A Pennsylvania chiropractor, who receives state funds to investigate chiropractic quackery, has himself used deceptive advertising to bolster his private practice.

Monroe Schneier, whose hands have plied the bad back of no less than Pennsylvania's Governor Milt Shapp, heads the Middletown Chiropractic Health Center. Schneier's cen-

ter has a \$10,000 consultant contract with the state Bureau of Medical Assistance to check up on fraudulent invoices submitted to the state by chiropractors.

Schneier admitted to us that he had placed a series of ads in local newspapers during 1969, stating he personally treated patients that, in fact, he never saw. These were ads, he said, prepared by the Parker Chiropractic Research Foundation of Fort Worth.

Schneier claimed he ran the advertising copy "innocently, not to bilk the public, but to tell the chiropractic story."

When asked about citing individual cases that he never treated, the handsome chiropractor argued that the patients mentioned "dovetailed very similarly with cases that I have had."

Footnote: The Texas-based Parker foundation has prepared a personalized advertising package, which is marketed to individual chiropractors across the country. Pennsylvania's Lehigh Valley Committee Against Health Fraud has requested that the Federal Trade Commission stop the Parker ads.

By way of background, as a result of the flood of 6-23-72, in the Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania, area, both the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and the Small Business Administration (SBA) established local offices in that area to facilitate flood relief programs. Our Philadelphia Office established liaison with these Federal agencies and with the U. S. Attorney's Office, and has since handled numerous criminal fraud cases concerning false statements made to HUD and SBA in connection with the various flood relief programs.

The majority of these cases involve false statements to HUD in regard to obtaining mobile homes and false statements to SBA to obtain disaster loans. Investigation of these cases is taking place in the Wilkes-Barre and Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, area, in the Middle District of Pennsylvania, and are assigned to the Resident Agents in both the Scranton and Harrisburg Resident Agencies. Our Philadelphia Office continues to afford these cases preferred attention.

Concerning information regarding captioned column, this memorandum summarizes results of random survey conducted by Messrs. Felt and Walters 12/19/72 of 21 SACs in representative offices. The offices contacted are Albany, Atlanta, Baltimore, Buffalo, Chicago, Cincinnati, Columbia, Denver, Detroit, Kansas City, Knoxville, Las Vegas, Los Angeles, Miami, Milwaukee, New York, Omaha, San Antonio, Springfield, Tampa, and Washington Field. Without exception, the immediate responses made by all SACs to the question regarding general condition of morale among their Agent personnel were extraordinarily favorable. Terse notations of these responses follow:

"Outstanding; never higher; exuberance expressed with frequency by Agents at innovative changes; deep impression of Mr. Gray as a leader upon his visit; Agents working freely on weekend urgent assignments with no grumbling; 99% of Agents highly disposed toward innovative changes made by Mr. Gray; individual production and accomplishments high which is proof of the pudding; Agents giving of their own time with gusto; great teamwork among Agents demonstrating high morale; Agents and clerical personnel alike glowing with comments concerning impression of Mr. Gray and his leadership; never observed morale higher among Agents; morale 100%; high impression of Mr. Gray's acceptance of responsibility for a correct law enforcement decision in aborting skyjacked flight at Orlando, Florida (same expression by local police officials); morale never higher not only among rank and file Agent personnel but supervisory staff as well; unanimous support of innovative changes of Mr. Gray; terrific impact of Mr. Gray's visit and changes wrought; best morale ever observed in any office; high morale throughout field."

Many of the foregoing comments, of course, were repetitive among the SACs' responses. While it may be considered that this report of our survey represents somewhat of a self-serving document, the responses made to the simple question of nature of morale among Agents in the field were so overwhelming, enthusiastic and immediate that they completely belie any contention to the contrary and, accordingly, are being made a matter of record.

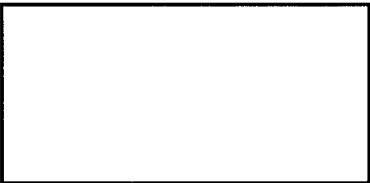

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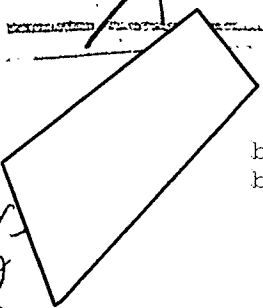

 said that he had determined that Mr. J. Edgar Hoover had frequently written to the Parole Board recommending that no parole be given persons convicted for assault on FBI Agents or injury to FBI Agents. He requested a specific answer as to whether this was true. Secondly, asked if Mr. Gray has written or would write personally to any U. S. Parole Board in a situation where an FBI Agent had been assaulted or injured recommending that a convicted person not receive a parole.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that in Jack Anderson's Office be advised of Mr. Gray's comments as follows:

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After inquiring, it is understood from the general memory of those that worked with Mr. Hoover, that he was staunch in his defense of FBI Agents and would follow closely any parole consideration as to any possible unwarranted leniency of persons convicted of assaulting and injuring an FBI Agent; that if in a given situation the facts so indicated, Mr. Hoover would communicate with the U. S. Board of Parole.

I would handle such matters on a case by case basis; for example, if such a convicted person was known to have sworn vengeance on personnel of the FBI should he ever be released, I would be opposed to any leniency beyond that strictly required by the law and would not hesitate to make my views known to the Board of Parole.

At approximately 3:00 p.m., 1/10/73, [redacted] personally telephoned me, identifying himself as a reporter for JACK ANDERSON, and requested that I verify for him that the FBI was engaging in surveillances and under-cover activity in connection with security planning for the Presidential Inauguration on 1/20/73.

[redacted] was told that, as he is aware, the FBI has the responsibility of conducting investigations concerning the internal security of the United States on a year-round basis and we would continue to execute this responsibility before, during and after the Inauguration as we would on any other day of the year. [redacted] was informed that I had neither the authority nor inclination to discuss with him specifically the functions being performed by the Washington Field Office in connection with the Inauguration, but that he could be assured the Bureau's responsibilities were being fully discharged. [redacted] pressed for details concerning the nature of the Bureau's security investigations as related to the Inauguration, specifically with regard to the possibility of our having Agents operating in an under-cover capacity. He was informed that I would neither confirm nor deny for him this or any other investigative practice of the FBI. He indicated that he understood that my position was consistent with long-standing Bureau policy.

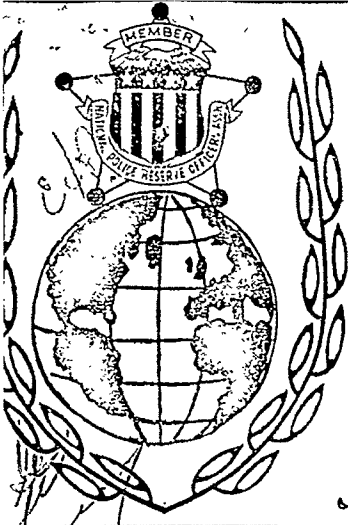

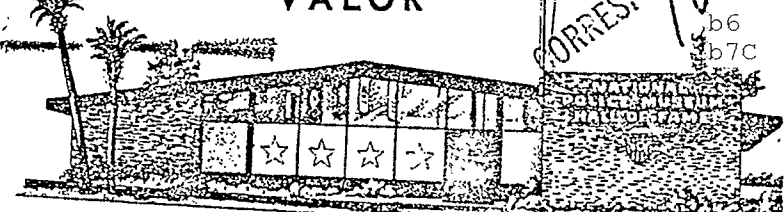

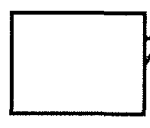

At approximately 10 a. m. today [REDACTED] called and talked to Herington and said they were, of course, going to do some articles and writing about the "activities of the past couple of weeks." He said that in all fairness to us he had a number of specific questions he wanted to ask for our reaction and comment. He was told that we had no comment whatsoever to make about the case. He said that nevertheless he wanted to pose the following questions and to obtain either a statement or our no comment on each of them.

1. Whether Mr. Gray had personally authorized and pressed for the arrest of [REDACTED]. In view of the nature of this question, I gave a flat denial. [REDACTED] asked if I wanted to check with Mr. Gray first and I told him there was no need to, the allegation was simply untrue. **CORRECT**

2. He asked whether the Department and the United States Attorney Office had not expressed doubts prior to the arrest and subsequent to the arrest as to the need for an arrest in this case. I told him I would not comment on any relationship between the FBI and the Department. He said that means you are not denying this and I told him it meant no such thing, it meant simply that I would not comment. *My recollection is that no doubts were expressed. This was a routine matter.*

3. He asked whether the arrest had not actually been made with White House backing and direction. Again, in view of the nature of this question, I gave a flat denial. **CORRECT**

4. He asked whether there was in fact gaps in our investigation and reporting. In other words that our investigation was incompetent and incomplete. I told him I would not comment.

This will confirm conversations on February 1 and 2, 1973, between Mr. Carl W. Belcher of the Criminal Division and Inspector Henry A. Schutz, Jr., of this Bureau relative to an approach made by syndicated columnist Jack Anderson to Special Agent (SA) [redacted] of our Washington Field Office on February 1, 1973.

As you are aware, SA [redacted] was contacted by an individual who identified himself as Jack Anderson at approximately 12:35 p.m., on February 1, 1973, and queried as to whether he had any comment to make relative to the arrest of Anderson's employee, [redacted]. No comment was made by SA [redacted] at which time Anderson informed SA [redacted] that he had violated the First Amendment of the Constitution and his actions were inconsistent with his sworn duty to uphold the Constitution of the United States. SA [redacted] was informed that Anderson intended to conduct a thorough investigation into his background to determine how a person like him came to be employed by the FBI.

SA [] then placed a telephone call to Anderson's office at 1612 K Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., telephone number 347-4325, and asked to speak to Anderson. Anderson, according to a woman answering the telephone, was not in; but at approximately 1:15 p.m., a person identifying himself as Jack Anderson, the columnist, returned SA [] call. SA [] identified the voice as being that of the first caller. During the second conversation Anderson again extended the opportunity for SA [] to discuss the entire case concerning [] arrest. SA [] again declined to comment.

After a review of the facts, Mr. Belcher indicated this type of conduct, although reprehensible and reasonably intimidating in its effect, does not come within the purview of the Obstruction of Justice or Criminal Investigations Statutes, Section 1503 and 1510 respectively, Title 18, United States Code. Specifically, according to Mr. Belcher, SA [] does not fall within the description of individuals covered under Section 1503 (influencing or injuring officer, juror, or witness generally), nor did the communication have the effect on the criminal investigation as required by statute under Section 1510.

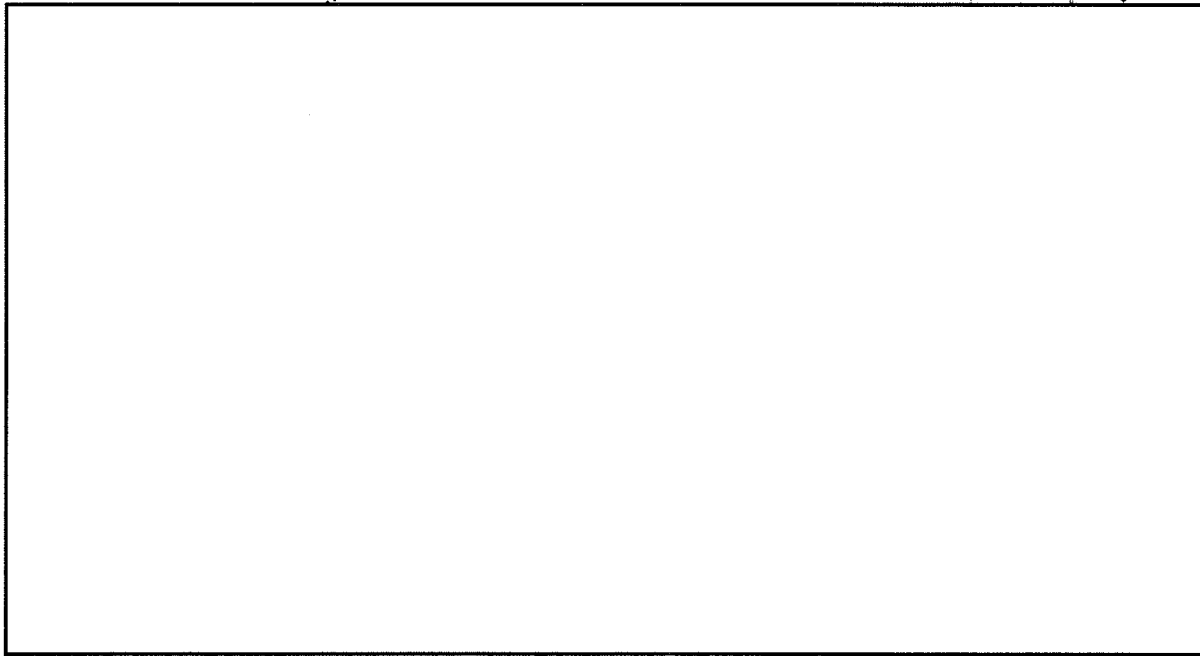

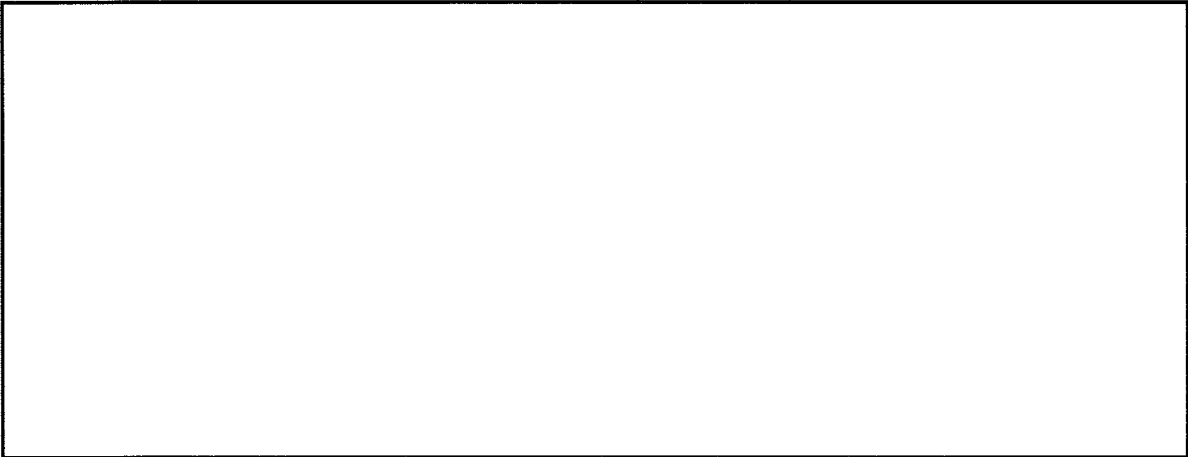

[Redacted] stated that he and others in his area strongly support Mr. Gray for Director of the FBI and advised he is angry with Jack Anderson because of unfair comments he has made recently concerning Mr. Gray. He dictated the following and requested it be made a record in the FBI as being submitted by him.

"Why Not Gray And The FBI"

"In respect to what this country voted for (President Nixon) and what he stands for is a sure sign for Jack Anderson to simmer down to the people's wish everywhere, for every time he knocks the good down he just gives the bad a cause. President Nixon will be in time to pass, greater than the great of greats. Be it known his deeds and signs clearly point to this and I'm sure in his plans the Indian heritage will blossom. The President's decision for L. Patrick Gray, III will be more than equal the pureness of of the golden fleece. I support L. Patrick Gray, III as the official Director of the FBI." [Redacted] was advised that his favorable comments were appreciated and he then terminated the call.

Bureau files indicate [Redacted] wrote the FBI in 1971 recommending two officers of the Gardner, Massachusetts, Police Department for employment by the FBI (62-50887-9). He also submitted a poem to the President of the United States on 5-10-72, which he wrote in memory of the late Director, J. Edgar Hoover, which was referred to the FBI (62-12188-12768). Both of [Redacted] letters were acknowledged by the FBI.

At approximately 10 a. m. today [REDACTED] of Jack Anderson's staff called me in connection with captioned case. He said that he had reviewed news reports on the case and had a couple of questions he would like to resolve.

The first involved the exact location of the ransom drop which we have released as being only somewhere along the Beltway. He said he had information that the drop actually was on 270 and asked if I could give him a specific location. I told him that the drop had been on the Beltway but declined to be more specific.

[REDACTED] then said he had a report that the reason we had not caught the kidnapers was because the "beeper" malfunctioned and we lost track of it. He said that later when the suitcase was found an Agent accidentally kicked the suitcase and the beeper started again. He asked if we had any comment. I told [REDACTED] that I would comment on no investigative technique.

I then told [REDACTED] that I had an observation to make off the record if he would agree and he said he would. I asked him what possible good it could do to run a story regarding the use of an electronic signal in this case. I told him that, of course, devices of this nature were known to the public and stories on television even involve their use, but I also pointed out that if indeed we had used such a device, and I was not confirming that we had, all his story would do would be to alert the next kidnapper to the possibility.

I emphasized to [REDACTED] that I was not discussing any technique used in this case and I would not discuss any such technique but was merely making an observation. He thanked me for the comment but gave no indication as to whether they would use the story or not.
