DETAILS: AT WASHINGTON, D. C.

Reference report of the writer contained the results of the constant physical surveillance being conducted on the subject through the night of August 13, 1943, and subsequent constant physical surveillance is being reported as follows:

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents A. J. DICKINSON and S. D. KARPER on August 11, 1943, the subject was known to have remained in his room until 10 a.m., at which time he entered the hotel lobby. At 10:30 a.m., subject was met by Lieutenant Colonel RODRIGO and at 10:45 a.m., subject returned to his room. Subject remained in his hotel until 11:30 a.m., at which time he left going by taxi to the Spanish Embassy. He left the Spanish Embassy at 12:30 p.m., returning to his hotel. At 12:40 p.m., subject left the Statler by taxi going to the Mayflower Hotel where he was met by Lieutenant Colonel RODRIGO and an unidentified man for lunch. At 3 p.m., subject returned to his hotel.

Further surveillance of the subject revealed that in the evening he was met by army personnel and attended a party in the company of Lieutenant Colonel RODRIGO and other army personnel. No further activity was noted on this date.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agent A. J. DICKINSON on August 15, 1943, it was ascertained that subject remained in his room until 12:45 p.m., at which time he entered the lobby accompanied by the Marquis de AGUIAR. Subject and the Marquis proceeded by taxi to the Hotel 2400 where both entered, ultimately going to the apartment of the Marquis in suite 401. Subject remained in Hotel 2400 for twenty minutes and then left going by taxi to the residence of Mrs. CHURCHILL STONEBOROUGH. Shortly thereafter the subject emerged with Mrs. STONEBOROUGH and a woman identified as EDNA RANDOLPH of New York City. The subject and the two ladies had lunch at the Statler Hotel at 2 p.m., and at 4 p.m., entered subject's room W-916.

Through informant C-305, it was learned that subject and the two ladies were later joined by ALDACE WALKER, brother of Mrs. CHIP ROBERTS, prominent Washington socialite, and CHARLIE FRAZER, former newspaperman who is presently with OEM. Both WALKER and FRAZER appeared to be friends of Mrs. EDNA RANDOLPH.

At 5:30 p.m., the subject's party left the Statler Hotel going to the residence of FRAZER located at 27th Flace and Military Road for cocktails, and the party was later known to have dined together. Subject remained with this group until later in the evening, and no further activity was noted on this date.





Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents LOGAN J. LANE and THOMAS C. BURKE on August 16, 1913, the subject was known to have remained in his room until 11:145 a.m., at which time subject entered the lobby, making his usual morning purchases and later entered the men's bar. Subject had lunch alone in the colony room of the Statler Hotel and later went to the men's bar. Subject retired to his room at 3:50 p.m.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents S. D. KARPER and J. V. EEALE on this date, it was learned that subject remained in his hotel until 6 p.m., at which time he walked to the Carlton Hotel where he was joined by a woman believed to be Mrs. CHURCHILL STONEBOROUGH. Subject had dinner with this woman and spent the remainder of the evening in her company returning to his hotel shortly after midnight.

While under surveillance of Special Agents L. J. LANE and DANIEL L. O'CONNOR on August 17, 19h3, subject first appeared in the lobby at 11:10 a.m., when he made his usual morning purchases and returned to his room at 11:30 a.m. At 12:55 p.m., subject left the hotel by taxi driving to 310 6th Street, the building which is occupied by the Office of Strategic Services, where he met an unidentified woman believed to be ANNE HUXLEY. Subject and his companion lunched in the embassy room of the Statler and at 2:30 p.m., subject returned his companion to 310 6th Street by taxi. Subject immediately returned to the Statler Hotel and entered the cocktail lounge and shortly thereafter retired to his room.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents A. J. DICKINSON and S. D. KARPER on this date, it was ascertained that subject remained in his hotel until 7:45 p.m., at which time he walked to the Carlton Hotel. Subject was observed apparently attempting to contact someone in the Carlton and was later known to have left by taxi going to the residence of LADYE LAW. At 8:40 p.m., subject and LADYE LAW had dinner in the Carlton and then went to the Cosmos Room. They left the Cosmos room at 1:15 a.m., and subject returned LADYE LAW to her residence. Subject returned to his hotel at 1:45 a.m., and retired for the evening.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents LOGAN J. IANE and DANIEL L. O'CONNOR on August 18, 1943, subject was known to have remained in his hotel until 12:52 p.m., at which time he left by taxi driving to the Spanish Embassy. Subject remained in the Embassy until 3:45 p.m., at which time he returned to the Statler.

While under surveillance of Special Agents A. J. DICKINSON and S. D. KARPER on this date, subject was known to have remained in his hotel until 7:30 p.m., at which time he left by taxi driving to the apartment of Mrs. CHURCHILL STONEBOROUGH. Subject and Mrs. STONEBOROUGH had dinner at the Carlton Hotel, and returned to Mrs. STONEBOROUGH's apartment at 9 p.m. At 10:30

p.m., subject left the STONEBOROUGH apartment returning to the Statler Hotel where he entered the embassy room. At 10:45 p.m., subject left the Statler and walked to the Cosmos Room of the Carlton Hotel. At 12 midnight, subject left the Carlton and returned to the embassy room in the Statler where he remained until 12:30 a.m., at which time he retired for the evening.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents LOGAN J. LANE and DANIEL L. O'CONNOR on August 19, 1943, subject was known to have remained in the hotel until 10:30 a.m., at which time he left by taxi going to the Spanish Embassy. Subject returned to his hotel at 11:50 a.m., where he entered the men's bar. At 1:10 p.m., subject walked to the Carlton Hotel where he lunched alone returning to his hotel at 2 p.m.

While under surveillance of Special Agents A. J. DICKINSON and S. D. KARPER on this date, subject was known to have remained in his room until 4:50 p.m., at which time he left by taxi driving to 2129 S Street where he was not by Mrs. CHURCHILL STONEBOROUGH. Subject and Mrs. STONEBOROUGH drove to her apartment on Q Street and subject returned to his hotel at 5:40 p.m. At 7:40 p.m., subject left by taxi driving to 1400 29th Street, N. W., where he met an unidentified woman described as follows:

Subject and the unidentified lady drove to the Carlton Hotel for dinner and at 9:55 p.m., entered the Cosmos Room. At 11:40 p.m., subject and his companion left the Carlton Hotel returning to 1400 29th Street. Subject returned to the Statler Hotel at 11:50 p.m. He was known to have retired at 12:30 a.m.

An examination of the Washington address telephone directory reveals that the following people reside at 1400 29th Street, N. W.: BARBARA CAGIATI, GLORIA HARRIS, HELEN NAST, LOUISE GRIFFITH, and Mrs. REBECCA MALLORY. The telephone for this address is Michigan 2815.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents LOGAN J. LANE and DANIEL L. O'CONNOR on August 20, 1943, the subject was known to have first appeared in the lobby at 11:10 a.m., accompanied by the Marquis de AGUIAR. Both men entered the men's bar returning to the subject's room at 11:20 a.m. The two men again entered the lobby at 12:35 p.m., and shortly thereafter left by taxi driving to Hotel 2400 where the Marquis left the subject. Subject drove to the residence of LADYE LAW. Subject and LADYE LAW had lunch at the





La Salle du Bois Restaurant and at 2:25 p.m., both returned to the Statler on foot. On entering the Hotel LADYE LAW entered the hotel office where she is employed and subject retired to his room.

While under surveillance of Special Agents S. D. KARPER and A. J. DICKINSON on this date, subject was known to have left his hotel at 5:15 p.m., going to the residence of Lieutenant Colonel RODRIGO in Arlington County, 3016 South 16th Street. Subject left this residence at 7 p.m., and returned to his hotel. At 8 p.m., subject had dinner alone in the coffee shop and on completion of same walked to the Gayety Theater on 9th Street. Subject remained in the show thirty minutes and then left returning on foot to his hotel. At 10:30 p.m., subject left his hotel and walked to the Treasure Island Restaurant on K Street where he remained for twenty minutes, then returning to the Statler. Subject entered the embassy room of the Statler and at 11:30 p.m., entered his room and retired for the evening.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents DANIEL L. O'CONNOR and LOGAN J. LANE on August 21, 1943, subject was known to have first appeared in the lobby at 10:35 a.m., at which time he made his usual morning purchases of newspapers, magazines, and tobacco. He entered the men's bar and later sat in the hotel lobby until 11:15 a.m., at which time he returned to his room. At 2:15 p.m., subject left by taxi going to the La Salle du Bois Restaurant where he was met by Mrs. CHURCHILL STONEBOROUGH. Subject and Mrs. STONEBOROUGH left the restaurant at 2:25 p.m., driving to 1801 I Street, N. W., where Mrs. STONEBOROUGH entered the medical building. Shortly thereafter they walked to the Columbia Medical Building at 1835 I Street, N. W., and entered. Subject and Mrs. STONEBOROUGH left the Columbia Medical Building at 3 p.m., and returned to 1801 I Street, where both entered. At 3:10 p.m., subject and Mrs. STONE-BOROUGH left 1801 I Street and walked to 1711 K Street, N. W., which is the office of an optician, as well as radio station WWDC. At 3:30 p.m., subject and Mrs. STOMEBOROUGH returned to her residence on Q Street. Shortly after entering, subject left and returned to his hotel.

While under surveillance of Special Agents A. J. DICKINSON and S. D. KARPER on this date, subject was known to have remained in his hotel until 8:10 p.m., at which time he left and walked to the Mayflower Hotel. On entering the lobby, he was met by LAURIE SHARFE. Subject and Mrs. SHARPE left by taxi driving to the Shoreham Hotel where they had dinner. At 10:45 p.m., subject returned Mrs. SHARPE to the Mayflower Hotel where he was observed bidding her good night in the lobby. Mrs. SHARPE retired to her room and subject returned to the Statler Hotel on foot. Subject retired for the evening at 11:30 p.m.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents WALLACE REAMY and MILTON SINGMAN on August 22, 1943, subject was known to have remained in his room until 12 noon at which time he entered the lobby and made his usual morning purchases. At 1:30 p.m., subject had lunch alone in the embassy room and at 3:30 p.m., he was joined by LADYE IAW., Subject and LADYE LAW spent the

afternoon together and subject returned to his hotel alone at 7 p.m. At 7:20 p.m., subject was joined by an unidentified woman being the same individual previously reported as residing at 1400 29th Street, and the two walked to the Garlton Hotel where they loitered in the lobby until 8:05 p.m. At this time subject and his companion returned to the Statler and had dinner in the embassy room. At 10 p.m., subject and the unidentified lady left the Statler going to 1400 29th Street by taxi. Subject remained at this address for fifteen minutes and then left by taxi driving to the Mayflower Hotel. On entering subject was overheard attempting to reach room 317 which was occupied by LAURIE SHARPE by the house telephone. Subject remained in the hotel lobby until 11:50 p.m., being unsuccessful in his attempts to reach Mrs. SHARPE. He returned to his hotel and retired for the evening.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents DANIEL L. O'CONNOR and EDGAR A. JONES on August 23, 1943, subject was known to have remained in his hotel room until 11:20 a.m., at which time he entered the lobby, made his usual morning purchases, and retired to the men's bar for a drink. At 12 noon he was joined by an army officer believed to be Lieutenant Colonel RODRIGO and the two left entering a gray Plymouth sedan bearing Virginia license 113-921. driving to the Munitions Building at 19th and Constitution Avenue where BEIGEE-DER left the car. At this point subject caught a taxi and returned to the Statler Hotel. At 12:50 p.m., subject left his hotel by taxi driving to the La Salle du Bois Restaurant at 18th and M Streets where he remained only a short while and left by taxi driving to the Mayflower Hotel. Here he was joined by a woman believed to be LAURIE SHARPE. At 1:05 p.m., subject and his companion were observed in the cocktail lounge and at 1:30 p.m., they left going by taxi to the La Salle du Bois Restaurant. At 2:20 p.m., subject and his companion returned to the Mayflower Hotel and later walked to the Canadian Legation annex, 18th and R Streets, where the woman entered. Subject returned to his hotel. At 3 p.m., subject left his hotel by taxi driving to the residence of LADYE LAW at 1906 Florida Avenue, N. W. Subject and LADYE LAW later left her residence and drove to the Shoreham Hotel where they entered the cocktail lounge.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents THOMAS BURKE and LOGAN J. LANE on this date the subject and LADYE LAW were known to have remained at the Shoreham Hotel until 5:20 p.m., when they left by taxi going to Miss LAW'S residence at 1906 Florida Avenue. Subject returned to his hotel where at 6 p.m., he was met by an unidentified woman. Subject and his companion left the hotel and walked to the apartment house at 1726 M Street, N. W.; both entered. At 7 p.m., subject and his companion left the above address and walked to the Mayflower Hotel. On reaching the Mayflower subject was observed telephoning on the house phone and shortly thereafter was observed entering the elevator and later the room of LAURIE SHARPE. Subject's unidentified companion left subject in the lobby of the hotel and entered the elevator and later entered

room 456 which, according to the hotel records, was occupied by Mrs. W. NEW-BOLD WAINSLEY, Jr., of 2301 Connecticut Avenue, N. W. Mrs. WALMSLEY had occupied this room since August 19, 1943, and had agreed to vacate same on August 24, 1943. At 8:30 p.m., subject left Mrs. SHARPE's room returning to his hotel. He had dinner alone in the colony room and retired to his room at 11:15 p.m. No further activity was noted on this date.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents DANIEL L. O'CONNOR and E. S. BLAKESLEY on August 24, 1943, subject first appeared in the lobby at 11:50 a.m., at which time he made his usual morning purchases. At 12:30 p.m., subject was joined by WALTER G. ROSS and the two walked to the Army Navy Club at 17th and I Streets for lunch. At 2:05 p.m., subject and Mr. ROSS and a group of unidentified naval officers left the club and subject returned shortly thereafter to the Statler Hotel. At 2:20 p.m., subject left the hotel going to the Hotel 2400 where he entered apartment of the Marquis de AGUIAR. At 3:40 p.m., subject left Hotel 2400 and returned to the Statler Hotel on foot.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents LOGAN J. LANE and THOMAS BURKE on this date, subject was known to have left the Statler at 4:45 p.m., accompanied by LADYE LAW and they walked to the Lafayette Hotel where they entered the cocktail lounge. At 6:25 p.m., they returned to the Statler. At 7:10 p.m., subject had dinner alone in the Carlton Hotel returning to the Statler at 9 p.m. Subject spent the remainder of the evening either in the hotel lobby or in his room.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents DANIEL L. O'CONNOR and E. S. BLAKESLEY on August 25, 1943, subject was known to have remained in his hotel until 10:25 a.m., at which time he left by taxi going to the Spanish Embassy. Subject left the Embassy at 11:30 a.m., and returned to the Statler. At 12:45 p.m., subject was joined in the lobby by an unidentified Polish army officer and Lieutenant Colonel RODRIGO and another unidentified army officer. Subject and this group had lunch in the colony room. At 2:45 p.m., subject left his hotel by taxi going to the Shoreham Hotel where he was overheard on the house phone attempting to reach Colonel ANDRES SORRIANO. Failing to reach SORRIANO, who was absent from the city, subject returned to his hotel.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents THOMAS BURKE and LOGAN J. LANE on this date, subject was known to have remained in his hotel until 7:45 p.m., at which time he left by taxi driving to 1919 Massachusetts Avenue, N. W., where he was met by an unidentified woman believed to be ANNE HUXLEY. Subject and his companion had dinner at the Shoreham Hotel where they remained until 1:05 a.m., at which time subject returned his companion to 1919 Massachusetts Avenue and he himself returned to the hotel at 1:15 a.m.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents DANTEL L. O'CONNOR and the writer on August 26, 1943, it was ascertained that subject appeared in the lobby first at 10:55 a.m., at which time he made his usual morning purchases. He entered the embassy room for a drink at 11:15 a.m., and at 11:35 a.m., retired to his room. At 12:10 p.m., subject was joined by Lieutenant Colonel RODRIGO and the two left by taxi going directly to the Spanish Embassy. Subject left the Spanish Embassy alone and returned to the Statler where he was met by LADYE LAW in the hotel mezzanine. Subject and LADYE LAW had lunch in the veranda room and later retired to the mezzanine.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents THOMAS BURKE and LOGAN J. LANE on this date, it was learned that subject again met LADYE LAW on the mezzanine at 7:35 p.m., at which time they conversed for ten minutes. At 8 p.m., subject again met LADYE LAW and they entered the cocktail lounge. At 8:55 p.m., subject and LADYE LAW left the Statler Hotel going to the La Salle du Bois Restaurant for dinner. Subject returned LADYE LAW to her residence at 10:45 p.m., returning immediately to his hotel and retired at ll:15 p.m.

Through surveillance conducted by the writer on August 27, 1943, it was ascertained that subject entered the lobby at 10:20 a.m., and made his usual morning purchases and later entered the men's bar. At 11 a.m., subject left by taxi for the Bond Building at 14th and New York Avenue where he entered room 514 which is occupied by W. G. ROSS, a munitions broker. Subject remained in ROSS's office until noon at which time he left and walked aimlessly about in the downtown section returning to the hotel at 1:15 p.m., where he lunched alone. In the afternoon subject visited the Marquis de AGUIAR in his suite at Hotel 2400 returning to his hotel at 6 p.m. In the evening subject had dinner with LADYE LAW at the Mayflower and later went to the Troika. Subject returned LADYE LAW to her residence at 11:30 p.m., and subject returned to his hotel immediately thereafter.

Through surveillance conducted by the writer on August 28, 19k3, subject was known to have left the hotel at 11:30 a.m., going by taxi to the office of W. G. ROSS in the Bond Building. Subject returned to his hotel at 12:30 p.m., and had lunch with IADYE IAW. At 2:30 p.m., subject left his hotel driving immediately to the Spanish Embassy where he remained for forty-five minutes returning to his hotel thereafter about 3:30 p.m.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents LOGAN J. LANE and THOMAS BURKE on this date, subject was known to have met LADYE LAW in the evening for dinner at the La Salle du Bois and spent the remainder of that evening in her presence returning to his hotel at 1 a.m.,

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents NICHARD LEVY and EARL A. HALVORSON on August 29, 1943, subject was known to have entered the lobby at 11:50 a.m., and made his usual morning purchases. At 1 p.m., subject met LADYE LAW in the lobby and conversed briefly with her retiring to his room thereafter, and at 1:40 p.m., subject had lunch alone in the hotel. At 2:30

p.m., subject left the hotel and walked several blocks on K Street apparently for the exercise. He returned to his hotel at 3:20 p.m.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents J. V. BEALE and E. A. JONES, on the same date, subject was known to have left his hotel at 4:10 p.m., and to have walked to the Roosevelt Theater, 9th and E Streets, N. W., and entered and remained fifteen minutes. On leaving the show, subject windowshopped enroute to his hotel arriving at 5:15 p.m. At 8:10 p.m., subject left his hotel and walked to the Mayflower Hotel where he entered the coffee shop and ate alone. He returned to his hotel at 10 p.m., where he remained for five minutes and then walked to the Gayety Theater on 9th Street. He entered at 10:30 p.m., and remained only thirty minutes and then left returning on foot to his hotel. On entering, the subject was met by the Marquis de AGUIAR and his wife, the former IVONNE ALEERTI, and all three entered the subject's room. At 12 midnight subject and AGUIAR and his wife returned to the lobby and spent thirty minutes walking through the lobby and engaging in conversation. Shortly thereafter, AGUIAR and his wife left by taxi returning to Hotel 2400 and subject returned to his room.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents LOGAN J. Subject had lunch alone in the colony room and retired to his room.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents C. F. ALDEN and CHARLES FISCHER on this date, it was ascertained that subject left the hotel at 7:30 p.m., driving to the apartment of Mrs. STONEBOROUGH by taxi. At 7:50 p.m., the subject and Mrs. STONEBOROUGH left by taxi going to the Shoreham Hotel for dinner. Subject and Mrs. STONEBOROUGH remained in the Shoreham until 12:20 a.m., at which time they returned to her apartment. At 12:40 a.m., subject returned to the Statler and at 1 a.m., retired for the evening.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents EARL A. HALVORSON and LOGAN J. LANE on August 31, 1943, it was ascertained that subject first appeared in the lobby at 10:40 a.m., at which time he made his usual morning purchases. At 11:15 a.m., subject left by taxi going to the Spanish Embassy. At 12 noon subject left the Embassy and returned to his hotel. At 1 p.m., subject was joined by Lieutenant Colonel RODRIGO in the lobby and the two had lunch in the hotel. At 2:15 p.m., subject left the hotel in the company of Lieutenant Colonel RODRIGO returning alone at 3 p.m.

Through surveillance conducted by Special Agents C. F. ALDEN and W. H. WHALEY on this date, it was ascertained that at 5:45 p.m., subject left the hotel by taxi going to Mrs. STONEBOROUGH's apartment where he remained until 6:40 p.m., and then returned to his hotel. At 7 p.m., subject again left




