



MEMORANDUM TO ALL SPECIAL AGENTS IN CHARGE

RE: SPECIAL AGENT CAREER BOARDS DESTRUCTION OF RECORDS

Approval has been granted by the National Archives and Records Administration for the destruction of documentation and records of Special Agent career boards. Minimum time for retention of field and FBIHQ career board documentation and recordings is six years after final determination of the career board, with a provision that any documentation and recording of career board action which is the subject of litigation will be retained for the purposes of the litigation, regardless of the passage of time.



Title: TRANSFER OF RECORDS TO THE NATIONAL ARCHIVES AND RECORDS ADMINISTRATION

CLASSIFICATION 176 - ANTI-RIOT LAWS

Synopsis: Concerns raised by the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) regarding early accession of FBI records within Classification 176.

Enclosures: Memorandum from Office of General Counsel to Director Freeh, dated 8/29/95.

Details: In accordance with the provisions of Executive Order (EO) 12958, the enclosed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was prepared and executed by FBI Director Louis J. Freeh on 7/25/95 and Mr. Steven Garfinkel, Director of the Information Security Oversight Office on 7/31/95. The purpose of the MOU was to detail the FBI's efforts to accomplish the goal of the EO of declassification and release of information without compromising national security. An addendum to the MOU sets forth the continuing process by which the FBI will satisfy this effort through the review and early accession of all case files within Classification 176.

On 12/7/95, Acting Unit Chief, Field Services/Information Policy Unit, Field Information Support Section, Information Resources Division (IRD) was telephonically advised, by a representative of NARA, that Deputy Archivist of the United States Mr. Michael Kurtz had expressed some serious

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concerns that the enclosed Memorandum of Understanding, and early

accession of Classification 176, have raised at NARA. Some of the concerns which was made aware of are set forth below with discussion or explanation of each.

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NARA wants to remind the FBI that our agency "loses title" to any records accessioned to NARA. Upon accession, custody of the records belongs to the Archivist of the United States.

Title 44, United States Code, Chapter 21, provides that the Archivist of the United States shall accept custody of records of a Federal agency determined to have sufficient historical value to warrant continued preservation by the United States Government. Upon acceptance of records the Archivist shall provide for the continued preservation of records until such time as it is determined (by the Archivist) that the records no longer warrant continued preservation.

NARA wishes to determine whether or not this early accession of 176 case files is going to establish a precedent? If so, is the FBI going to request a complete "re-work" of the current NARA-approved FBI Records Retention Plan?

The current FBI Records Retention Plan provides for the transfer of a majority of FBI records when the case files have been closed for 50 years; minimal records are transferred to NARA when the case files have been closed for 30 years. No category of FBI record is scheduled for transfer when the age of the closed file is 25 years. The case files within Classification 176 are scheduled for transfer at such time as the files have been closed for a period of 50 years. The MOU reduces this period of transfer to 25 years and in most instances the case files have not been closed for the full period of 25 years. has expressed the opinion that a reduction of transfer time frames for a large portion of FBI records would create a precedent and thus require a complete revision of the FBI Records Retention Plan. Additionally, NARA has expressed concern that the same reductions would cause an influx of "requests" from various contingents, i.e., historical researchers, for other complete case file classifications to be accessioned to NARA early. Several NARA representatives have voiced a concern that the early accession process would be upheld in various Courts.

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It should be pointed out that a number of accessions of FBI records have occurred "ahead of schedule". The majority of these records have been subjected to various Court Orders or Settlement Agreements. The only other records which were accessioned, to NARA, earlier than provisions of the Records Retention Plan allow for are records which pertained to the United States involvement in World War II. These records were transferred in accordance with an agreement between the FBI and NARA which would assist NARA with the establishment of an exhibit designed to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of World War II. These records were received by NARA on 12/6/91.

The inability of NARA to apply provisions of the FOIA in accordance with FBI standards.

Inasmuch as NARA is not an investigatory agency, it lacks authority to apply any of the (b)(7) exemptions of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) to any records accessioned from FBI. The only FOIA exemptions which may be cited by NARA during the process review of any requests for FBI records would be

- (b) (1) Exemption protects any information (if extant) which is properly currently classified, in the interest of national defense or foreign policy pursuant to current EO;
- (b) (2) Exemption protects material related solely to the internal rules and practices of an agency.
 Application of this exemption has been extremely limited by DOJ policies as well as Court decisions;
- (b) (3) Exemption protects material which is specifically exempted from public disclosure by statute. Employees of the Records Disposition/Archival and Micrographics Subunit (RD/AMS), FS/IPU, FISS, IRD, review, remove and seal material of this type from any FBI case file which is accessioned to NARA, i.e., Federal Grand Jury, Federal Income Tax, and Electronic Surveillance (Title III) material. It would be incumbent upon NARA to remove any other (b) (3) type material prior to disclosure to a historical researcher; and,
- (b) (6) Exemption protects personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of

personal privacy. Application of this exemption to FBI records would be extremely narrow inasmuch as the majority of our records do not meet an established definition of a personnel or medical file.

The inability of NARA to apply provisions of the FOIA in accordance with FBI standards would strictly limit the protection which <u>must</u> be afforded to FBI records. NARA is concerned that an early accession of these FBI records could have a major impact on other FBI investigations, particularly with regards to the possibility that "protectable" information such as sources (other than numbered sources), source information, investigative techniques/methods could potentially be released to the general public under the guise of being "historical" information.

It must be noted that the Minneapolis Field Office has expressed concern about the possibility of the case file pertinent to the activities at Wounded Knee being transferred to NARA and becoming available to the general public as "historical" information at this point in time.

Provisions of the Privacy Act of 1974 (Title 5, United States Code, Section 552a) do not appear to be applicable to any historical records accessioned to NARA by any Federal agency. {5 USC 552a (1)(3)}

The MOU states that the "agreement is based upon the parties' determination that the Privacy Act would preclude substantially the automatic release of declassified information". During the telephone conversation with the NARA representative expressed concern that the FBI and DOJ, as "parties" to the MOU, may have assumed that release of Classification 176 material being transferred to NARA would be restricted from release. There may be a legal issue which simply needs clarification but since NARA was not a party to the MOU it was felt by the NARA representative that it did need to be raised. A copy of the referenced subsection of the Privacy Act is attached for reference purposes.

Another area of concern which has arisen is the lack of a "paper trail" documenting the approval (or opportunity to comment) on the MOU by all interested and substantive FBIHQ entities such as IRD, National Security Division (NSD) and

Criminal Investigative Division (CID). This is particularly apparent with regards to the reduction of the transfer time frame for the Classification 176 from 50 years to 25 years. In 1991, during the scheduled update of the FBI Records Retention Plan, a proposed reduction (50 years to 30 years) of transfer time frames for many FBI case file classification was met with extreme resistance by NSD (then the Intelligence Division) and CID. It is improbable that NSD and CID would fail to comment on the reduction of transfer time frame as set forth in the MOU in view of the stance taken by these Divisions in 1991. This coupled with the possible inability of NARA to fully apply the FOIA in accordance with FBI standards demands an open review of the intent of the EO.

b6 b7C Additionally has reviewed EO 12958 and has been unable to find any provisions which obligates the FBI or any other agency to transfer records from the originating agency to NARA simply based on the declassification provision of the EO. In terms of making more information available to historical researchers, the main thrust of the EO, it is submitted, is directed at agency records which are currently in either the custody of NARA or any of the NARA operated Presidential Libraries. To date no effort has been expended by the Document Classification Unit, Freedom Of Information-Privacy Act Section, IRD, to review the FBI material currently resident at NARA (approximately 450 linear feet) or any of the FBI material (original and derivative) located within the Presidential libraries.

In view of the concerns expressed by NARA and IRD management, it is crucial that input be gathered from the Criminal Investigative and National Security Divisions, and that the provisions and impact of the Memorandum of Understanding be re-evaluated.

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The CID has reviewed the referenced Memorandum and enclosed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) (and Addendum)
Regarding Executive Order 12958, by and between Steven Garfinkel, Director of the Information Security Oversight Office, Department of Justice, and Mr. Freeh, dated July 1995. The CID concurs with Field Services/Information Policy Unit, IRD, that the provisions and impact of the MOU be re-evaluated on the basis that the provisions of the Privacy Act of 1974 (Title 5 U.S.C. 552a) may not apply to records under the control of the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA). Should the provisions of the Privacy Act of 1974 not apply, the identity of cooperative witnesses or other non-symboled sources, or information that could be pieced together to determine identity, could be released by NARA.

The use of informants, cooperative witnesses, and non-symboled confidential sources has proven to be one of the most effective tools the FBI has in ensuring the success of its criminal investigations. The length, nature, magnitude of assistance provided by these categories of individuals vary. In every instance, however, the source is accorded an express grant of confidentiality by the FBI; i.e., the FBI will not disclose the source's identity or identifying information unless necessitated by compelling operational, litigative, or prosecutorial considerations. Confidentiality - and the FBI's ability to uphold it - is essential to the formation and viability of the FBI's relationship with sources and, consequently, crucial to the FBI's ability to fulfill its law enforcement mission.

Sources whose identities are subject to being disclosed through the MOU are non-symboled sources. These are generally (and were, historically) individuals who volunteer information to the FBI on a one-time or occasional basis with the understanding that their identities will remain confidential. Regardless of the length of time, or degree of their assistance, these individuals are faced with a real risk to personal safety (retaliation from subjects) and/or harm to their reputation in their community if their assistance to the FBI is disclosed. This risk frequently extends to the sources' family members and may extend for years beyond the time of their assistance.

The disclosure of a source's (both non-symboled an symboled) identity can occur both directly (e.g., by releasing the name of the source) and indirectly by releasing seemingly innocuous pieces of information (e.g., symbol numbers, dates of contact, or place of employment). Such information taken alone or in combination with other information can be so singular in nature that its release can identify the source.

These concerns have been highlighted as a result of the voluminous disclosures of source identities pursuant to the John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection Act of 1992. Following proposed disclosure requests from the Assassination Records Review Board, the FBI contacted numerous individuals or surviving family members who were FBI sources over 30 years ago to determine the continued possibility of risks to their safety or harm to their reputation. In virtually every instance, the sources, or surviving family members, were still fearful of retaliation and public stigma should their identities be disclosed. Some people indicated they would never have assisted the FBI had they known that the promise of confidentiality would not be kept.

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INFORMATION SECURITY OVERSIGHT OFFICE-FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING REGARDING EXECUTIVE ORDER 12958

Steven Garfinkel, Director of the Information Security Oversight Office, and Louis J. Freeh, Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, hereby agree as follows:

WHEREAS, Executive Order 12958 on Classified National Security Information, signed by the President on April 17, 1995, contains a provision for the automatic declassification of certain information; and,

WHEREAS, under this Executive Order agency heads may exempt from automatic declassification any specific file series of records where the release of the information contained in that series would almost invariably violate a statute; and,

WHEREAS, the Federal Bureau of Investigation has published in the Federal Register 16 systems of records which are protected from disclosure under the Privacy Act, Title 5, United States Code, Section 552a; and,

WHEREAS, the release of records of individuals from these systems would therefore violate the Privacy Act;

The parties agree that two of these systems, The Central Records System, as described in 58 Federal Register 51858-51872 (October 5, 1993) and the Electronic Surveillance Indices, as described in 57 Federal Register 8462 (March 10, 1992), are exempt file series from the automatic declassification provisions of the new Executive Order.

This agreement is based upon the parties' determination that the Privacy Act would preclude substantially the automatic release of declassified information contained in these two systems; that due to the nature of these filing systems, there is a relatively small proportion of classified information which is contained throughout voluminous records; that it is impractical to review all such records within the time period specified in the new Order; and that substantial harm to the national security could result from the inadvertent automatic declassification of certain information contained in those systems.

The parties further agree, that to accomplish the goal of the Executive Order of declassification and release of as much information as possible without compromising national security, the Federal Bureau of Investigation will establish an additional unit or team which will be responsible for the systematic review and declassification of information which is determined to be of historical interest; and the Federal Bureau of Investigation will

provide the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) with timely detailed declassification guidelines which will enable NARA to declassify as many accessioned classified FBI records as is possible consistent with the provision of the new Executive Order. An Addendum to this Memorandum of Understanding sets forth the continuing process by which the FBI will satisfy this commitment.

The Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs has reviewed, and concurred in, this Memorandum of Understanding on behalf of the President.

processing such material, the FBI should be able to process at least 100,000 pages of this material by May 1, 1996. We expect, however, that the rate of processing this older material will be achieved at an earlier date. These files will be accessioned to NARA after completion of the classification review for greater access by researchers.

The FBI will maintain close liaison with NARA to determine and prioritize for review those subject matters most important to researchers. HDRT, in coordination with the FBI's Archival Unit, will process these records for immediate accession to NARA.

In the spirit of EO 12958, the FBI is allocating 34 additional paralegal specialists or analysts to review national security information for release to the public through accession to the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA), the Freedom of Information-Privacy Acts (FOIPA), and other mediums. This commitment of additional personnel for declassification review increases both the FBI's efficiency in response to the new EO as well as in providing previously classified information to the public.

Using these additional resources, the FBI is _____ establishing a Historical Declassification Review Team (HDRT). This team will consist of 12 paralegal specialists as well as two other senior paralegal specialists who will serve as a coordinator and supervisor. The Team will be trained and in place by the effective date of EO 12958. HDRT's sole responsibility will be the review of nonexempt FBI classifications or files in accordance with Section 3.4.

HDRT's first major project will be the declassification review of the 176 classification series. This classification was established in 1968 to investigate possible violations of the anti-riot provisions of the Civil Rights Act of 1968. Investigations included individuals or groups believed to have crossed national or state to state boundaries to participate in civil disorder, or groups or individuals who demonstrated the use of firearms or incendiary devices with the knowledge that such might be used in a civil disorder.

Cases or subjects in the 176 classification include persons associated with the New Left of the 1960s, the Black Panther Party, protest demonstrations at the 1968 Democratic Party Convention, anti-war protests, Students for a Democratic Society, and the American Indian Movement.

A NARA study determined that these records possess a high degree of research potential in political, social and ethnic/racial studies.

The 176 classification consists of 105 cubic feet or 236,250 pages of information. This measurement is based upon those files which were opened during and prior to 1975. The files are likely to contain some exempt information within largely nonexempt material. Using the average rate for

processing such material, the FBI should be able to process at least 100,000 pages of this material by May 1, 1996. We expect, however, that the rate of processing this older material will be achieved at an earlier date. These files will be accessioned to NARA after completion of the classification review for greater access by researchers.

The FBI will maintain close liaison with NARA to determine and prioritize for review those subject matters most important to researchers. HDRT, in coordination with the FBI's Archival Unit, will process these records for immediate accession to NARA.

(1X1) Archival records

Each agency record which is accepted by the Archivist if the United States for storage, processing, and servicing in accordance with section 3103 of title 44 shall, for the purposes of this section, be considered to be maintained by the agency which deposited the record and shall be subject to the provisions of this section. The Archivist if the United States shall not disclose the record except to the agency which maintains the record, or under rules established by that agency which are not inconsistent with the provisions of this section.

(2) Each agency record pentaining to an identifiable individual which was transferred to the National Archives of the United States as a record which has sufficient historical or other value to warrant its continued preservation by the United States Government, prior to the effective date of this section, shall, for the purposes of this section, be considered to be maintained by the National Archives and shall not be subject to the provisions of this section, except that a statement generally describing such records (modeled after the requirements relating to records subject to subsections (e)(4)(A) through (G) of this section) shall be published in the Federal Register.

(3) Each agency record pertaining to an identifiable individual which is transferred to the National Archives of the United States as a record which has sufficient historical or other value to warrant its continued preservation by the United States Government, on or after the effective date of this section, shall, for the purposes of this section, be considered to be maintained by the National Archives and shall be exempt from the requirements of this section except subsections (e)(4)(A) through (G) and (e)(9) of this section.
