The requests were for video, audio, and/or images from the ground, overhead, satellite or other sources of images and one request sought information or records on pornographic material seized in the raid. 

KEY FOIA ACTIVITY SINCE LAST REPORT

- New FOIA Litigation: None.
- Other FOIA Litigation: *ACLU v. DoD* – Case concerning detainee autopsies. The Army Medical Command released 45 pages on March 18, 2011. The release of OUSD (Policy), CENTCOM and SOUTHCOM documents has been delayed in order to take another look at using Exemption (b)(2).
- Significant Responses:
 - OSD/JS released 4 pages of a heavily redacted passenger manifest for Air Force supported flights to the Copenhagen Climate Change Conference. OSD/JS referred United States Secret Service (USSS) portions of the 4-page manifest to the USSS for processing and direct response to the media requester. This response was coordinated with the White House and received Department Level Review.
 - Defense Finance Accounting Service released, to the media, records related to the costs of flights associated with the Congressional Delegation led by Speaker of the House, Nancy Pelosi to Copenhagen in December 2009. This response received Department Level Review.
- Significant Requests:
 - OSD/JS and Air Force received a request for reports of radiation-emissions data collected in Japan by the Comprehensive Nuclear Test Ban Treaty Organization and provided to member states, including the United States, under the terms of the Comprehensive Nuclear Test Ban Treaty.
 - OSD/JS received a request for information on the F-35 Joint Strike Fighter Program. There are now seven such requests pending in OSD/JS.
 - The DoD Office of the Inspector General received three requests for a copy of the March 15, 2011, report, “Competition Issues and Inherently Governmental Functions Performed by Contractor Employees on Contracts to Supply Fuel to U.S. Troops in Iraq.”

- Other FOIA Activity: In support of President Obama's commitment to transparency and to improve administration of the FOIA, the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) announced last week that it is exploring a new federal job classification series for designated personnel who work on FOIA requests and FOIA-related matters. OPM tasked agencies to provide information to assist them in their efforts. The deadline is April 1, 2011.


- New FOIA Litigation:

 - *American Small Business League (ASBL) v. Department of the Army /ASBL v. Defense Contracting Audit Agency & Department of the Air Force* – Both cases involve lack of final responses from the DoD Components.
- Other FOIA Litigation:
 - *Milner v. The Department of the Navy* – The U.S. Supreme Court rejected the use of Exemption 2 (High) to protect explosive ordinance blast range, or Explosive Safety Quantity Distance, data. This decision effectively negates the use of the High 2 Exemption to protect sensitive unclassified information the release of which would circumvent an agency rule, policy or regulation.
- Significant Responses:
 - OSD/JS released correspondence to and from Congressman Issa since January 1, 2000. This response received Department Level Review.
 - The United States Army Corps of Engineers released documents to a member of the Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee pertaining to correspondence to and from Senator Vitter or any member of his staff between March 17, 2010 and May 19, 2010 regarding the approval of the promotion of General Michael Walsh. This response received Department Level Review.
- Significant Requests:
 - OSD/JS received two requests from the same media requester. One is for emails of Missile Defense Agency senior leadership that mention Senator Shelby. The second request is for a log of OSD/JS Congressional correspondence since January 2008.
 - OSD/JS received a media request for the information provided to the House Committee on Oversight and Government Reform in response to the Committee's recent FOIA inquiry. The OSD/JS FOIA Office will refer the FOIA logs to the DoD Components for review and response to the requester.

The Navy won a “reverse-FOIA” lawsuit filed by a DoD contractor, JCI Metal Products. Initially, The Navy received a FOIA request for a JCI Metal Products (JCI) contract and solicited comments from JCI concerning the release of pricing information within the contract. JCI responded to the Navy that the information (unit prices and totals prices for each contract line item) was exempt from disclosure under FOIA Exemption 4. The Navy disagreed with JCI’s comments and notified JCI of their intention to release the pricing information over their objections. JCI filed for a temporary restraining order in Federal Court to prevent release of the contract. Ultimately, the court determined that the Navy did not act in an “arbitrary and capricious” manner and ruled that the pricing information may be released. This decision was significant because the Department and Government as a whole have been losing these types of cases in Federal courts for over 10 years.

CURRENT/PROJECTED KEY FOIA ACTIVITY

- OSD is scheduled to release, to Judicial Watch, records concerning mission taskings for travel by the Speaker of the House Nancy Pelosi and Former Speaker Dennis Hastert. The Office of Legislative Affairs reviewed the responsive records and had no objection to the release with the exception of the privacy-related information found within the documents. Release of the redacted documents is scheduled for Monday, August 16, 2010.



Of the 143 investigations, 42 determined that the detainee's death was caused by Army personnel or U.S. contractors, and 11 investigations determined that there was probable cause to believe that the detainees were murdered. Of these 11, three resulted in no action taken against the suspects, one was referred to civilian authorities because the suspect was a civilian contractor, and the resulting seven resulted in general courts-martial. Five of the courts-martial resulted in murder convictions. The release is scheduled for Friday, August 6, 2010.
