This is in response to your request dated December 23, 2016, under the Freedom of Information Act seeking access to a copy of each FTC Daily for the time period November 1, 2016 to December 23, 2016. In accordance with the FOIA and agency policy, we have searched our records as of December 27, 2016, the date we received your request in our FOIA office.

We have located approximately 202 pages of responsive records. I am granting partial access to the accessible records. Portions of these pages fall within one or more of the exemptions to the FOIA's disclosure requirements, as explained below.

Portions of some responsive records constitute confidential commercial or financial information, which is exempt from disclosure under FOIA Exemption 4, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(4). *See Critical Mass Energy Project v. NRC*, 975 F.2d 871, 879 (D.C. Cir. 1992). Moreover, because Section 6(f) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 46(f), prohibits public disclosure of this type of information, it is also exempt under FOIA Exemption 3, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(3), which, as noted above, exempts from disclosure any information that is protected from disclosure under another federal statute.

I am also denying access to any personal identifying information found in the records. This information is exempt from release under FOIA Exemption 6, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(6), because individuals' right to privacy outweighs the general public's interest in seeing personal identifying information. *See The Lakin Law Firm v. FTC*, 352 F.3d 1122 (7th Cir. 2003).

If you are not satisfied with this response to your request, you may appeal by writing to Freedom of Information Act Appeal, Office of the General Counsel, Federal Trade Commission, 600 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20580, within 90 days of the date of this letter. Please enclose a copy of your original request and a copy of this response.

Random Factoid

There have already been some pretty major upsets in college hoops, but when people talk major major upset (note no plural), look to the Chaminade Silverswords, of Chaminade University of Honolulu, located in Honolulu, Hawaii. Chaminade hosts the annual men's tournament, the Maui Invitational Tournament. They are the only team that competes in the tournament that is not a NCAA Division I basketball program.

In 1982, Chaminade, then a member of the NAIA, defeated Virginia in what is considered the biggest upset in college basketball history (like said – MAJOR). Virginia, which featured Ralph Sampson and Rick Carlisle, was the top-ranked team in NCAA Division I basketball entering the game after posting victories against Georgetown (with Patrick Ewing) and Houston (with Hakeem Olajuwon). But in the Blaisdell Arena, the 3,500 fans in attendance — most of whom had come to see the nation's #1 team — witnessed the historic 77–72 upset. Many newspapers reportedly checked sources several times to make sure the story was right — that 800-student NAIA Chaminade had actually defeated the NCAA's top-ranked Cavaliers. *(from wikipedia)*

Feedback Needed: OED Customer Satisfaction Survey

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OTech Seminar - Dial One for Scam: A Large-Scale Analysis of Technical Support Scams

All staff Dr. Nick Nikiforakis (Department of Computer Science, Stony Brook University) will give a talk on technical support scams on Wednesday, January 4, at noon in CC-5116. In technical support scams, cybercriminals seek to convince users that their machines are infected with malware and require technical support. Victims are asked to provide remote computer access to scammers, who "diagnose the problem" before offering expensive support. These scams are responsible for yearly losses of tens of millions of dollars. Dr. Nikiforakis will discuss a systematic study of technical support scams and the call centers hidden behind them. His team identified malvertising as a major culprit exposing users to these scams, using it to build an automated system to discover phone numbers and domains operated by scammers. Over more than eight months, they collected a large corpus of technical support scams and used it to provide insights on their prevalence, abused infrastructure, illicit profits, and scammers' evasion attempts. Finally, they interacted with sixty different scammers, experiencing their social engineering tactics and collecting detailed statistics. Dr. Nikiforakis will explain how law-enforcement agencies can use their findings and propose technical and educational countermeasures for users. To improve your fuel economy and reduce greenhouse gas emissions, go easy on the brakes and gas pedal, avoid hard accelerations, reduce your time spent idling (no more than 30 seconds), and unload unnecessary items in your trunk to reduce weight. If you have a removable roof rack and you are not using it, take it off to improve your fuel economy. Use cruise control if you have it, and for vehicles with selectable four-wheel drive, consider operating in two-wheel drive mode when road conditions make it safe to do so. For more information from the EPA, take a look at these tips for driving more efficiently.

Fall Technology Series: Smart TV

The FTC is hosting a half-day workshop on Wednesday, December 7, at 1 pm to All Staff explore smart televisions. Consumers enjoy recommendations based on their television viewing habits ("viewers who watched Mr. Robot... may enjoy Fight Club"), but who else knows what you're watching? The golden age of television has arrived with the golden age of television tracking. These collaborations are allowing advertisers to precisely target consumers and better understand what ads are working. The first panel will explore the roles of hardware manufacturers and software developers in creating tracking technologies, how entertainment preferences may be linked to individuals or to individuals' device graphs, and how the advertising industry is using this information. The second panel will cover what consumers understand about how their entertainment preferences are being tracked, disclosed, and used, privacy issues these practices raise, and related best practices.

The OIG also completed a significant investigation of violations of the federal employee Standards of Ethical Conduct regulations and issued a related Management Advisory with

recommendations. The report also recounts the OIG's outreach visits to three regional offices and acknowledges management progress on implementing open OIG recommendations.

Corrections* --- 2017 Thrift Savings Plan Contributions

All Staff Employee contributions to the Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) are considered to be elective deferrals. The IRS elective deferral limit for 2017 remains. \$18,000. Employees who will be age 50 or older during 2017 may also contribute up to \$6,000 in additional (catch-up) contributions if their regular contributions for the year will reach the \$18,000 limit. Employees may start, stop, or change catch-up contributions at any time. Catch-up elections do not automatically continue, therefore new elections must be made for each calendar year. Employees wishing to contribute the maximum in 2017, in equal installments, should elect to contribute \$693 per pay period for regular contributions, and \$231 for catch up contributions, starting in **pay period 01***.

To make changes to your TSP contributions, please log into Employee Express and select Thrift Savings Plan/Roth: <u>https://www.employeeexpress.gov/</u>. Select the type of contribution you wish to make, and then enter the dollar amount or percentage and **12/11/2016***, to make the election effective for **pay period 01***. The change must be entered in Employee Express between **by Friday**, **December 9**, **2016***, to become effective on **12/11/2016***. In the event that Employee Express is not working, please complete the forms for the <u>TSP-1</u> and <u>TSP-1c</u> and submit them to HCMO at H-723 or <u>HRMOworklife-benefits@ftc.gov</u>. Random Factoid

Today is *National Sachertorte Day*; a Sacher torte is a specific type of chocolate cake, or torte, invented by Austrian Franz Sacher in 1832 for Prince Wenzel von Metternich in Vienna, Austria. It also became the subject of a legal battle.

Differences arose with the use of the label *The Original Sacher Torte* between the Hotel Sacher and the Demel bakery. Eduard Sacher completed his recipe for Sacher Torte while working at Demel, which was the first establishment to offer the Original Sachertorte cake. The hotel owners sued Demel in 1954, with the hotel asserting its trademark rights and the bakery claiming it had bought the rights to the name.

Over the next seven years, both parties waged an intense legal war over several of the dessert's specific characteristics, including the change of the name, the second layer of jam in the middle of the cake (not a layer of jam, but the second layer was a point of contention), and the substitution of margarine for butter in the baking of the cake. In 1963 both parties agreed on an out of court settlement that gave the Hotel Sacher the rights to the phrase *The Original Sachertorte* and gave the Demel the rights to decorate its tortes with a triangular seal that reads *Eduard-Sacher-Torte. Random Factoid

In typography, *leading* (actually rhymes with 'wedding') refers to the distance between the baselines of successive lines of type. The term originated in the days of hand-typesetting, when thin strips of lead were inserted into the forms to increase the vertical distance between lines of type. The term is still used in modern page layout software such as QuarkXPress and Adobe InDesign.

The word comes from lead strips that were put between set lines of lead type, hence the pronunciation "ledding" and not "leeding". When type was set by hand in printing presses, slugs or strips of lead of appropriate thicknesses were inserted between the lines of type to add vertical space, improving legibility.

Leading can be used to enhance the readability of a page or block of text. The standard leading used in printing is usually +2 points for mechanically set body text, or +20% in digital typesetting. In both cases, with a 10 point font the usual leading is 12 point, creating a 10/12 ratio, which is considered single spacing. Some type designers recommend a leading between 120% and 145% of the font size. (from Wikipedia)

Granting Excused Absence for Voting Supervisors and Managers may grant a limited amount of excused absence in areas where the polls are not open at least three hours either before or after an employee's regular work hours. For example, if an employee is scheduled to work from 8 am to 4:30 pm and the employee's polling place is open from 7 am to 7 pm, the employee may be granted one half-hour of excused absence from 4 pm to 4:30 pm, if requested. Also, if an employee's voting place is beyond normal commuting distance and vote by absentee ballot is not permitted, Supervisors may grant excused absence not to exceed one day to travel to the polling place. An employee is required to request annual leave or leave without pay if any additional time is needed to make that trip. An increasing number of jurisdictions offer a period prior to the day of the election during which voters may cast ballots early. Some employeees may find it necessary to vote during this early period because of work requirements on the day of the election. Others, such as those on Alternative Work Schedules, may find it convenient to vote during these early voting periods. Typically, polling places throughout the United States are open for extended periods, and an increasing number of jurisdictions are offering early voting options. Therefore, excused absence should rarely be needed but we are making you aware of these options in the event that any of these issues arise. Employees on Alternative Work Schedules whose regular day off is scheduled for the day polls are open are not permitted to change their regular day off solely for the purpose of gaining excused absence for voting. Please be sure to check your local polling areas for more information. If you have questions, please contact Paula Chandler in HCMO.

Random Factoid Lots of talk is being made of the *supermoon*, which is happening today. A supermoon is the coincidence of a full moon with the closest approach the Moon makes to the Earth on its elliptical orbit, resulting in the largest apparent size of the lunar disk as seen from Earth. The technical name (warning: not as cool as supermoon) is the *perigee-syzygy of the Earth-Moon-Sun system*. The term *supermoon* is not astronomical, but actually originated in

modern astrology. The opposite phenomenon, an apogee-syzygy, has been called a micromoon, though this term is not as widespread as supermoon, maybe because it's so far away and not as cool. Occasionally, a supermoon coincides with a total lunar eclipse. The most recent occurrence of this was in September 2015, while the next time will be in October 2033. The most recent occurred on October 16, 2016, and the closest supermoon of the century will occur on December 6, 2052. The Moon's distance varies each month between approximately 222,000 and 252,000 miles due to its elliptical orbit around the Earth (distances given are center-to-center). A full moon at perigee is visually larger up to 14% in diameter (or about 30% in area) and shines 30% more light than one at its farthest point, or apogee. (from wikipedia)

"Use or Lose" Leave

All Staff This is a reminder that "use or lose" annual leave must be scheduled and approved or denied in webTA no later than Saturday, November 26. Leave that is originally approved may subsequently be denied after November 26. An agency may consider for restoration annual leave that was forfeited due to an exigency of the public business or sickness of the employee only if the annual leave was scheduled before the start of the third biweekly pay period prior to the end of the leave year (5 C.F.R.§ 308(a)). This year, that date is November 26, 2016. Getting the leave scheduled is the first criteria toward restoration. Guidance on restoration of forfeited annual leave may be found on the HCMO website.

2017 Thrift Savings Plan Contributions

All Staff Employee contributions to the Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) are considered to be elective deferrals. The IRS elective deferral limit for 2017 remains \$18,000. Employees who will be age 50 or older during 2017 may also contribute up to \$6,000 in additional (catch-up) contributions if their regular contributions for the year will reach the \$18,000 limit. Employees may start, stop, or change catch-up contributions at any time. Catch-up elections **do not** automatically continue, therefore **new elections must be made for each calendar year**. Employees wishing to contribute the maximum in 2017, in equal installments, should elect to contribute \$693 per pay period for regular contributions, and \$231 for catch up contributions, starting in pay period 02. To make changes to your TSP contributions, please log into Employee Express and select Thrift Savings Plan/Roth: https://www.employeeexpress.gov/. Select the type of contribution you wish to

make, and then enter the dollar amount or percentage and 12/25/2016, to make the election effective for pay period 02. The change must be entered in Employee Express between 12/11/2016 and 12/24/2016, to become effective on 12/25/2016. In the event that Employee Express is not working, please complete the forms for the <u>TSP-1</u> and <u>TSP-1c</u> and submit them to HCMO at H-723 or <u>HRMOworklife-benefits@ftc.gov</u>. Random Factoid

It was on this day in 1961 that the *La Ronde* opened in Honolulu, Hawaii. It was pretty famous at the time as it was the first revolving restaurant in the United States (preceding the *Eye of the Needle* restaurant in Seattle).

The restaurant is situated at 1441 Kapi'olani Boulevard in the Ala Moana district at the 23rd floor of the Ala Moana Building. The restaurant's revolving part has a diameter of about 16 feet with a seating capacity for 162 guests, the office building has a total height of 25 floors and 298 feet, including an observation deck at the top. The rotational speed was one rotation per hour.

The building was completed in 1960, and opened 55 years ago today. At that time, it was the highest building in Honolulu. The designer later received a patent for the revolving design in 1964. Later, the restaurant changed the name to *Windows of Hawaii* but closed completely in the mid-1990s. The premises were converted to office space and the floor was welded into place (so no more revolving food service there anymore). *(from wikipedia)*

Important Message for Those Who Attended FTCU Reception

Yesterday we received notice from Costco that the Sabra Hummus that we served at the FTCU reception on November 7th was subject to recall for possible

listeria. http://www.costco.com/wcsstore/CostcoUSBCCatalogAssetStore/Attachment/recalls/161121-FDA-Recall-Sabra-Hummus.pdf. Listeria is a bacteria, which, when it contaminates food and is ingested, can cause serious health effects or even result in death in high risk individuals. The disease primarily affects older adults, pregnant women, newborns, and adults with weakened immune systems. However, rarely, persons without these risk factors can also be affected. The Center for Disease Control (CDC) states that a person in a higher-risk category (pregnant woman, older adults, and people with weakened immune systems) who experiences fever and other nonspecific symptoms, such as fatigue and aches, within 2 months of eating contaminated food should seek medical care and tell the physician or health care provider about eating the contaminated food. If a person has eaten food contaminated with Listeria and does not have any symptoms, most experts believe that no tests or treatment are needed, even for persons at higher risk for listeriosis. Inspector General's FY 2016 FTC Top Management Challenges

The Office of Inspector General's FY 2016 FTC Management Challenges are now available on the OIG's web site and in the FY 2016 Agency Financial Report. This year the OIG identified four management challenges for the FTC: (1) securing the agency's information systems and networks from destruction, data loss, or compromise, (2) accelerating maturity of the agency's information technology governance process, (3) improving acquisition planning and contract management, and (4) acquiring employee suitability determinations. Management's ongoing efforts to address these challenges are also included in the OIG report. Congress directs agency inspectors general each year to identify the top management challenges in their agencies. Many of the management challenges identified by inspectors general are enduring challenges that require sustained leadership over time to address.

Random Factoid On this day in 1701, Celsius was born (literally). Swedish astronomer, physicist and mathematician Anders Celsius would go on to develop the metric unit of measurement and scale for temperature. But he didn't do it so perfectly (it had to be changed later on). In 1742, he created the temperature scale, which was the reverse of the scale that we now know: 0 represented the boiling point of water, while 100 represented the freezing point of water. Go figure. It got fixed pretty quick. In 1743, the Lyonnais physicist Jean-Pierre Christin, working independently of Celsius, developed a scale where zero represented the freezing point of water and 100 represented the boiling point of water. In May 1743, he published the design of a mercury thermometer, the *Thermometer of Lyon*, built by the craftsman Pierre Casati that used this scale. (from wikipedia)

Granting Excused Absence for Voting

Supervisors and Managers may grant a limited amount of excused absence in areas where the polls are not open at least three hours either before or after an employee's regular work hours. For example, if an employee is scheduled to work from 8 am to 4:30 pm and the employee's polling place is open from 7 am to 7 pm, the employee may be granted one half-hour of excused absence from 4 pm to 4:30 pm, if requested. Also, if an employee's voting place is beyond normal commuting distance and vote by absentee ballot is not permitted, Supervisors may grant excused absence not to exceed one day to travel to the polling place. An employee is required to request annual leave or leave without pay if any additional time is needed to make that trip.

An increasing number of jurisdictions offer a period prior to the day of the election during which voters may cast ballots early. Some employees may find it necessary to vote during this early period because of work requirements on the day of the election. Others, such as those on Alternative Work Schedules, may find it convenient to vote during these early voting periods. Typically, polling places throughout the United States are open for extended periods, and an increasing number of jurisdictions are offering early voting options. Therefore, excused absence should rarely be needed but we are making you aware of these options in the event that any of these issues arise. Employees on Alternative Work Schedules whose regular day off is scheduled for the day polls are open are not permitted to change their regular day off solely for the purpose of gaining excused absence for voting.

Random Factoid

A *fid* (odd name) is a conical tool traditionally made of wood or bone. It is used to work with rope and canvas in marlinespike seamanship. A fid differs from a marlinspike in material and purpose. A marlinespike is used in working with wire rope, may be used to open shackles, and is made of metal. A fid is used to hold open knots and holes in canvas, and to separate the 'lays' (or strands) of synthetic or natural rope for splicing. A variation of the fid, the gripfid, is used for ply-split braiding. It adds a jamming cleat to pull a cord back through the cord split by the fid's point.

Modern fids are typically made of aluminum, steel, or plastic. In addition to holding rope open to assist the creation of a rope splice, modern push fids have markings for precise measurements in a variety of sizes of rope. The length of these fids is typically 21 or 22 times the diameter of rope to be spliced. A half-inch diameter rope would have any accompanying fid 10.5" to 11" in length with hash-marks denoting the long and short fid measurements.

Modern major rope manufacturers each have full sets of published splicing directions available on their websites. Typically, all splice directions measurements use fid-length as the unit of measurement. (from wikipedia)

"Use or Lose" Leave

This is a reminder that "use or lose" annual leave must be scheduled and approved or denied in webTA no later than Saturday, November 26. Leave that is originally approved may subsequently be denied after November 26. An agency may consider for restoration annual leave that was forfeited due to an exigency of the public business or sickness of the employee only if the annual leave was scheduled before the start of the third biweekly pay period prior to the end of the leave year (5 C.F.R.§ 308(a)). This year, that date is November 26, 2016. Getting the leave scheduled is the first criteria toward restoration. Guidance on restoration of forfeited annual leave may be found on the HCMO website.

2017 Thrift Savings Plan Contributions

Employee contributions to the Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) are considered to be elective deferrals. The IRS elective deferral limit for 2017 remains \$18,000. Employees who will be age 50 or older during 2017 may also contribute up to \$6,000 in additional (catch-up) contributions if their regular contributions for the year will reach the \$18,000 limit. Employees may start, stop, or change catch-up contributions at any time. Catch-up elections do not automatically continue, therefore new elections must be made for each calendar year. Employees wishing to contribute the maximum in 2017, in equal installments, should elect to contribute \$693 per pay period for regular contributions, and \$231 for catch up contributions, starting in pay period 02. To make changes to your TSP contributions, please log into Employee Express and select Thrift Savings Plan/Roth: https://www.employeeexpress.gov/. Select the type of contribution you wish to make, and then enter the dollar amount or percentage and 12/25/2016, to make the election effective for pay period 02. The change must be entered in Employee Express between 12/11/2016 and 12/24/2016, to become effective on 12/25/2016. In the event that Employee Express is not working, please complete the forms for the TSP-1 and TSP-1c and submit them to HCMO at H-723 or HRMOworklife-benefits@ftc.gov. Planning to E-Cycle?

In honor of America Recycles Day, the Constitutional Center has scheduled an E-Cycling event from Monday, November 14, through Friday, November 18. If you wish to participate by recycling any unused personal electronic items (e.g., laptops, hard drives, phones, CDs, etc.), be sure to take the following precautions:

- Review the electronic item for any existing files or folders that may contain PII or sensitive information
- Extract any information from the device that you wish to retain by copying it onto another media (thumb drive, external hard drive, CDs)
- Make sure to delete any PII or sensitive information from the device you wish to recycle
- · Empty the "Recycle Bin" to ensure files/folders are permanently deleted from the device/media
- DO NOT recycle FTC-owned devices; if you are no longer using an FTC-issued device, please contact OCIO to return the device

Beware Phishing Attempts Targeting OPM Breach Victims

Recently, cyber thieves have been targeting victims of the OPM data breaches and attempting to trick them into downloading ransomware. Victims receive an email which claims to be from OPM, warning of suspicious movements in their bank account, with a ZIP file attached. The ZIP file contains a hostile JavaScript application which, when run, will download and install ransomware demanding that the victim pay a Bitcoin ransom or lose all their files.

As a reminder, OPM will never send specific details regarding your personal or financial information via email. If you believe you have been affected by either breach, please visit OPM's <u>Cybersecurity Resource</u> <u>Center</u> to view a sample notification letter, verify if you were a victim of one or both breaches, or enroll in the OPM-sponsored identity monitoring services. To protect yourself from this and similar phishing emails, be skeptical about unexpected or unusual emails, even if they appear to come from a person you know or an organization with which you do business. Before clicking on links or opening files in an email that seems to be from, for example, a friend, your bank, or UPS, contact the sender at a phone number, email address, or URL that you know to be correct and confirm that the email is legitimate. Random Factoid

Today is *National Eat a Red Apple Day*. The honeycrisp is a red apple, and it's also patented (we're not sure how cool that is). Anywho, the honeycrisp is an apple cultivar (cultivated variety) developed at the Minnesota Agricultural Experiment Station's Horticultural Research Center at the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities.

U.S. Plant Patent 7197 and Report 225-1992 (AD-MR-5877-B) from the Horticultural Research Center indicated that the Honeycrisp was a hybrid of two apple cultivars; however, genetic fingerprinting conducted by a group of researchers in 2004, which included those who were attributed on the US plant patent, determined that neither of those cultivars is a parent of the honeycrisp, but that the Keepsake (another apple developed by the University of Minnesota program) is one of the parents.

The US patent for the honeycrisp cultivar expired in 2008, though patent protection in some countries continues until as late as 2031. Patent royalties had generated more than \$10 million by 2011, split three ways by the University of Minnesota between its inventors, the college and department in which the research was conducted, and a fund for other research. *(from Wikipedia)*

Corrections*: 2017 Thrift Savings Plan Contributions

All Staff Employee contributions to the Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) are considered to be elective deferrals. The IRS elective deferral limit for 2017 remains \$18,000. Employees who will be age 50 or older during 2017 may also contribute up to \$6,000 in additional (catch-up) contributions if their regular contributions for the year will reach the \$18,000 limit. Employees may start, stop, or change catch-up contributions at any time. Catch-up elections do not automatically continue, therefore new elections must be made for each calendar year. Employees wishing to contribute the maximum in 2017, in equal installments, should elect to contribute \$693 per pay period for regular contributions, and \$231

for catch up contributions, starting in pay period 01*.

To make changes to your TSP contributions, please log into Employee Express and select Thrift Savings Plan/Roth: <u>https://www.employeeexpress.gov/</u>. Select the type of contribution you wish to make, and then enter the dollar amount or percentage and 12/11/2016*, to make the election effective for pay period 01*. The change must be entered in Employee Express by Friday, December 9, 2016*, to become effective on 12/11/2016*. In the event that Employee Express is not working, please complete the forms for the <u>TSP-1</u> and <u>TSP-1c</u> and submit them to HCMO at H-723 or <u>HRMOworklife-benefits@ftc.gov</u>.

Holiday Emails: Big Files = Slow Connection

All Staff During this holiday season, we know that everyone will be emailing out Holiday greetings and invites too many of your colleagues. Please be mindful and compress any large files or images before sending. Large files suck up significant storage space in several ways: (1) In the recipient's inbox, (2) In the sender's Sent folder, and (3) In Trash/Deleted folders. Large files mean slow systems: Email servers are not designed to handle large file transfers, and the process of delivering those files slows down network traffic. From bounced-back emails to storage issues, just about everyone in the agency is affected when large files are emailed. If you are planning to send an email with a large attachment or image and need help compressing the files to a reasonable size for email, please contact OCIOTouchServices@ftc.gov for assistance.

OTech Seminar - Dial One for Scam: A Large-Scale Analysis of Technical Support Scams

Dr. Nick Nikiforakis (Department of Computer Science, Stony Brook University) All Staff will give a talk on technical support scams on Wednesday, January 4, at noon in CC-5116. In technical support scams, cybercriminals seek to convince users that their machines are infected with malware and require technical support. Victims are asked to provide remote computer access to scammers, who "diagnose the problem" before offering expensive support. These scams are responsible for yearly losses of tens of millions of dollars. Dr. Nikiforakis will discuss a systematic study of technical support scams and the call centers hidden behind them. His team identified malvertising as a major culprit exposing users to these scams, using it to build an automated system to discover phone numbers and domains operated by scammers. Over more than eight months, they collected a large corpus of technical support scams and used it to provide insights on their prevalence, abused infrastructure, illicit profits, and scammers' evasion attempts. Finally, they interacted with sixty different scammers, experiencing their social engineering tactics and collecting detailed statistics. Dr. Nikiforakis will explain how law-enforcement agencies can use their findings and propose technical and educational countermeasures for users. Random Factoid

Silly Putty is a toy based on silicone polymers that have unusual physical properties. It bounces, but breaks when given a sharp blow, can also flow like a liquid (just very slowly), and can even float in a liquid. It contains a viscoelastic liquid silicone, a type of non-Newtonian fluid, which makes it act as a viscous liquid over a long time period but as an elastic solid over a short time period.

So here's what it's made of: the original coral-colored Silly Putty is composed of 65% dimethyl siloxane (hydroxy-terminated polymers with boric acid), 17% silica (crystalline quartz), 9% Thixatrol ST (castor oil derivative), 4% polydimethylsiloxane, 1% decamethyl cyclopentasiloxane, 1% glycerine, and 1% titanium dioxide.

And then there was the copying of newspaper comics. When newspaper ink was petroleum based, Silly Putty could be used to transfer newspaper images to other surfaces, possibly after introducing distortion. Newer papers with soy-based inks are more resistant to this process.

Granting Excused Absence for Voting Supervisors and Managers may grant a limited amount of excused absence in areas where the polls are not open at least three hours either before or after an employee's regular work hours. For example, if an employee is scheduled to work from 8 am to 4:30 pm and the employee's polling place is open from 7 am to 7 pm, the employee may be granted one half-hour of excused absence from 4 pm to 4:30 pm, if requested. Also, if an employee's voting place is beyond normal commuting distance and vote by absentee ballot is not permitted, Supervisors may grant excused absence not to exceed one day to travel to the polling place. An employee is required to request annual leave or leave without pay if any additional time is needed to make that trip. An increasing number of jurisdictions offer a period prior to the day of the election during which voters may cast ballots early. Some employeees may find it necessary to vote during this early period because of work requirements on the day of the election. Others, such as those on Alternative Work Schedules, may find it convenient to vote during these early voting periods. Typically, polling places throughout the United States are open for extended periods, and an increasing number of jurisdictions are offering early voting options. Therefore, excused absence should rarely be needed but we are making you aware of these options in the event that any of these issues arise. Employees on Alternative Work Schedules whose regular day off is scheduled for the day polls are open are not permitted to change their regular day off solely for the purpose of gaining excused absence for voting. Random Factoid Mercury is the smallest and innermost planet in the Solar System. Its orbital period (about 88 Earth days) is less than any other planet in the Solar System. Seen from Earth, it appears to move around its orbit in about 116 days. It has no known natural satellites. You like massive temperature swings? Mercury's got 'em. Partly because it has almost no atmosphere to retain heat, Mercury's surface temperature varies diurnally more than any other planet in the Solar System, ranging from -280 °F (reeeeallly cold) at night to 800 °F (reeeeallly hot) during the day in some equatorial regions. Mercury is tidally or gravitationally locked with the Sun in a 3:2 resonance, and rotates in a way that is unique in the Solar System. As seen relative to the fixed stars, it rotates on its axis exactly three times for every two revolutions it makes around the Sun. As seen from the Sun, in a frame of reference that rotates with the orbital motion, it appears to rotate only once every two Mercura years. An observer on Mercury would therefore see only one day, every two years. Because Mercury orbits the Sun within Earth's orbit (as does Venus), it can appear in Earth's sky in the morning or the evening, but not in the middle of the night. Also, like Venus and the Moon, it displays a complete range of phases as it moves around its orbit relative to the Sun. Athough Mercury can appear as a bright object when viewed from Earth, its proximity to the Sun makes it more difficult to see than Venus. (from Wikipedia)

Random Factoid Of all the grammar concepts we have, "plural" seems to be one of the most straightforward. You got one thing? It's singular. Got more than one thing? It's plural. But alas, language is always less straightforward than we expect. The way we conceptualize somethingas one thing or many things—doesn't always match up with the way our word for it behaves. There are some nouns that only have a plural form, regardless of how we think of them. They are known as *pluralia tantum*, Latin for "plural only." For example, *scissors* has a plural verb agreement. We say, "the scissors are over there," not "the scissors is over there." Scissors, likes to hang on to its "s." We can say "give me a pair of scissors," but not "give me a scissor." True, there is a sense in which scissors are two objects, two blades, being used as one tool, and many similar tools are also pluralia tantum: pliers, tongs, tweezers, forceps. But not all such tools are plural. A clamp and a flat iron are also tools made of two joined parts, and they are singular (yes, there is a scissor kick, but then it's not a noun, is it?). Suds is a strange one. Usually a word for a mass of stuff made of teeny, tiny individuated parts will be a mass noun. For example, rice, sand, sugar, and salt are all mass nouns. Mass nouns have singular verb agreement ("the rice is cooked"). Suds is a plural noun and has plural agreement ("the suds are everywhere"). Does this mean we care more about individual soap bubbles than individual grains of rice? Probably not. Is that what a "sud" even is? A bubble? It doesn't matter anyway, because we can know what suds are without knowing what a sud is. (from mental floss)

To protect yourself from this and similar phishing emails, be skeptical about unexpected or unusual emails even if they appear to come from a person you know or an organization with which you do business. Before clicking on links or opening files in an email that seems to be from, for example, a friend, your bank, or UPS, contact the sender at a phone number, email address, or URL that you know to be correct and confirm that the email is legitimate. Corrections*: 2017 Thrift Savings Plan Contributions

All Staff Employee contributions to the Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) are considered to be elective deferrals. The IRS elective deferral limit for 2017 remains

\$18,000. Employees who will be age 50 or older during 2017 may also contribute up to \$6,000 in additional (catch-up) contributions if their regular contributions for the year will reach the \$18,000 limit. Employees may start, stop, or change catch-up contributions at any time. Catch-up elections do not automatically continue, therefore new elections must be made for each calendar year. Employees wishing to contribute the maximum in 2017, in equal installments, should elect to contribute \$693 per pay period for regular contributions, and \$231 for catch up contributions, starting in **pay period 01***.

To make changes to your TSP contributions, please log into Employee Express and select Thrift Savings Plan/Roth: <u>https://www.employeeexpress.gov/</u>. Select the type of contribution you wish to make, and then enter the dollar amount or percentage and **12/11/2016***, to make the election effective for **pay period 01***. The change must be entered in Employee Express between **TODAY*** and **Friday**, **December 9**, **2016***, to become effective on **12/11/2016***. In the event that Employee Express is not working, please complete the forms for the <u>TSP-1</u> and <u>TSP-1c</u> and submit them to HCMO at H-723 or <u>HRMOworklife-benefits@ftc.gov</u>. Holiday Emails: Big Files = Slow Connection

During this holiday season, we know that everyone will be emailing out Holiday All Staff greetings and invites too many of your colleagues. Please be mindful and compress any large files or images before sending. Large files suck up significant storage space in several ways: (1) In the recipient's inbox, (2) In the sender's Sent folder, and (3) In Trash/Deleted folders. Large files mean slow systems: Email servers are not designed to handle large file transfers, and the process of delivering those files slows down network traffic. From bounced-back emails to storage issues, just about everyone in the agency is affected when large files are emailed. If you are planning to send an email with a large attachment or image and need help compressing the files to a reasonable size for email, please contact OCIOTouchServices@ftc.gov for assistance.

Random Factoid

Today is *National Violin Day*, so it bears mentioning the Stradivarius, which is one of the violins, violas, cellos and other string instruments built by members of the Italian family Stradivari (Stradivarius), particularly Antonio Stradivari, during the 17th and 18th centuries. According to their reputation, the quality of their sound has defied attempts to explain or equal it, though this belief is disputed. The name "Stradivarius" has become a superlative often

associated with excellence; to be called "the Stradivari" of any field is to be deemed the finest there is.

These instruments were not carved out of one piece of wood, and the actual fabrication appears pretty complicated (even using egg whites). The wood used included spruce for the top, willow for the internal blocks and linings, and maple for the back, ribs, and neck. There has been conjecture that this wood was treated with several types of minerals, including potassium borate (borax), sodium and potassium silicate, and vernice bianca, a varnish composed of gum arabic, honey, and egg white (see!). Stradivari made his instruments using an inner form, unlike the French copyists, such as Vuillaume, who employed an outer form. It is clear from the number of forms throughout his career that he experimented with some of the dimensions of his instruments. *(from Wikipedia)*

Random Factoid It was on this day in 1941 that American photographer Ansel Adams took a picture of a moonrise over the town of Hernandez, New Mexico that would become one of the most famous images in the history of photography. He took it from a shoulder of U.S. Route 84-285. The photograph became so popular and collectible that Adams personally made over 1,300 photographic prints of it during his long career. On October 17, 2006, a print was auctioned for \$609,600. Art historian H. W. Janson called this photo "a perfect marriage of straight and pure photography". Adams wasn't that impressed, himself: "It was made after sundown, there was a twilight glow on the distant peaks and clouds. The average light values of the foreground were placed on the 'U' of the Weston Master meter; apparently the values of the moon and distant peaks did not lie higher than the 'A' of the meter ... Some may consider this photograph a 'tour de force' but I think of it as a rather normal photograph of a typical New Mexican landscape. Twilight photography is unfortunately neglected; what may be drab and uninteresting by daylight may assume a magnificent quality in the halflight between sunset and dark." (from wikipedia)

Granting Excused Absence for Voting Supervisors and Managers may grant a limited amount of excused absence in areas where the polls are not open at least three hours either before or after an employee's regular work hours. For example, if an employee is scheduled to work from 8 am to 4:30 pm and the employee's polling place is open from 7 am to 7 pm, the employee may be granted one half-hour of excused absence from 4 pm to 4:30 pm, if requested. Also, if an employee's voting place is beyond normal commuting distance and vote by absentee ballot is not permitted, Supervisors may grant excused absence not to exceed one day to travel to the polling place. An employee is required to request annual leave or leave without pay if any additional time is needed to make that trip. An increasing number of jurisdictions offer a period prior to the day of the election during which voters may cast ballots early. Some employees may find it necessary to vote during this early period because of work requirements on the day of the election. Others, such as those on Alternative Work Schedules, may find it convenient to vote during these early voting periods. Typically, polling places throughout the United States are open for extended periods, and an increasing number of jurisdictions are offering early oting options. Therefore, excused absence should rarely be needed but we are making you aware of these options in the event that any of these issues arise. Employees on Alternative Work Schedules whose regular day off is scheduled for the day polls are open are not permitted to change their regular day off solely for the purpose of gaining excused absence for voting. Random Factoid Annealing, in metallurgy and materials science, is a heat treatment that alters the physical and sometimes chemical properties of a material to increase its ductility and reduce its hardness, making it more workable. It involves heating a material to above its recrystallization temperature, maintaining a suitable temperature, and then cooling. In annealing (funny sounding word, btw), atoms migrate in the crystal lattice and the number of dislocations decreases, leading to the change in ductility and hardness. In the cases of copper, steel, silver, and brass, this process is performed by heating the material (generally until glowing) for a while and then slowly letting it cool to room temperature in still air. Copper, silver and brass can be cooled slowly in air, or quickly by quenching in water, unlike ferrous metals, such as steel, which must be cooled slowly to anneal. In this fashion, the metal is softened and prepared for further work—such as shaping, stamping, or forming. Annealing occurs by the diffusion of atoms within a solid material, so that the material progresses towards its equilibrium state. Heat increases the rate of diffusion by providing the energy needed to break bonds. The movement of atoms has the effect of redistributing and eradicating the dislocations in metals and (to a lesser extent) in ceramics. This alteration to existing dislocations allows a metal object to deform more easily, increasing its ductility. *(from Wikipedia)*

Beware Phishing Attempts Targeting OPM Breach Victims Recently, cyber thieves have been targeting victims of the OPM data breaches and attempting to trick them into downloading ransomware. Victims receive an email which claims to be from OPM, warning of suspicious movements in their bank account, with a ZIP file attached. The ZIP file contains a hostile JavaScript application which, when run, will download and install ransomware demanding that the victim pay a Bitcoin ransom or lose all their files.

As a reminder, OPM will never send specific details regarding your personal or financial information via email. If you believe you have been affected by either breach, please visit OPM's Cybersecurity Resource Center to view a sample notification letter, verify if you were a victim of one or both breaches, or enroll in the OPM-sponsored identity monitoring services. To protect yourself from this and similar phishing emails, be skeptical about unexpected or unusual emails, even if they appear to come from a person you know or an organization with which you do. business. Before clicking on links or opening files in an email that seems to be from, for example, a friend, your bank, or UPS, contact the sender at a phone number, email address, or URL that you know to be correct and confirm that the email is legitimate. Listeria is a bacteria, which, when it contaminates food and is ingested, can cause serious health effects or even result in death in high risk individuals. The disease primarily affects older adults, pregnant women, newborns, and adults with weakened immune systems. However, rarely, persons without these risk factors can also be affected. The Center for Disease Control (CDC) states that a person in a higher-risk category (pregnant woman, older adults, and people with weakened immune systems) who experiences fever and other non-specific symptoms, such as fatigue and aches, within 2 months of eating contaminated food should seek medical care and tell the physician or health care provider about eating the contaminated food. If a person has eaten food contaminated with Listeria and does not have any symptoms, most experts believe that no tests or treatment are needed, even for persons at higher risk for listeriosis. Select the type of contribution you wish to make, and then enter the dollar amount or percentage and 12/25/2016, to make the election effective for pay period 02. The change must be entered in Employee Express between 12/11/2016 and 12/24/2016, to become effective on 12/25/2016. 2017 Thrift Savings Plan Contributions

All Staff Employee contributions to the Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) are considered to be elective deferrals. The IRS elective deferral limit for 2017 remains

\$18,000. Employees who will be age 50 or older during 2017 may also contribute up to \$6,000 in additional (catch-up) contributions if their regular contributions for the year will reach the \$18,000 limit. Employees may start, stop, or change catch-up contributions at any time. Catch-up elections **do not** automatically continue, therefore new elections must be made for each calendar year. Employees wishing to contribute the maximum in 2017, in equal installments, should elect to contribute \$693 per pay period for regular contributions, and \$231 for catch up contributions, starting in pay period 02. To make changes to your TSP contributions, please log into Employee Express and select Thrift Savings Plan/Roth: <u>https://www.employeeexpress.gov/</u>. Select the type of contribution you wish to make, and then enter the dollar amount or percentage and 12/25/2016, to make the election effective for pay period 02. The change must be entered in Employee Express between 12/11/2016 and 12/24/2016, to become effective on 12/25/2016. In the event that Employee Express is not working, please complete the forms for the <u>TSP-1</u> and <u>TSP-1c</u> and submit them to HCMO at H-723 or <u>HRMOworklife-benefits@ftc.gov</u>. Fall Technology Series: Smart TV – TODAY!

Privacy Tip of the Week

Recently, there has been an uptick in Facebook friend requests from people impersonating FTC employees. While the FTC uses official social media accounts to engage with the public and to convey information about FTC activities, FTC staff cannot use any social media account (including investigatory or undercover accounts) to directly contact an individual or entity without prior approval from OGC and the Privacy Office. Using social media and webbased tools and applications for FTC-related activities can raise privacy and data security concerns, and can also potentially raise legal, ethical, and public relations issues. When using Facebook or other social media tools, follow these steps to avoid enabling fraudulent activity:

- · Verify the senders of any messages or requests you receive.
- Delete any social media accounts registered with your FTC e-mail address, if not authorized.
- If you spot an FTC social media account that you know to be fraudulent, report it to the website, CyberSec and the <u>Social Media Task Force</u>.
- If you receive any e-mail messages from social media websites or anything associated with a social media account that you did not request, send them to <u>cybersec@ftc.gov</u>.

Random Factoid

It was on this day in 1911 that Roald Amundsen's team became the first to reach the South Pole. The South Pole, also known as the Geographic South Pole or Terrestrial South Pole, is one of the two points where the Earth's axis of rotation intersects its surface. It is the southernmost point on the surface of the Earth.

Amundsen still has a tent way down below. The tent was placed by his expedition upon their arrival. It is currently buried beneath the snow and ice in the vicinity of the Pole. It has been designated a Historic Site or Monument (HSM 80), following a proposal by Norway to the Antarctic Treaty Consultative Meeting. The precise location of the tent is unknown, but based on calculations of the rate of movement of the ice and the accumulation of snow, it is believed, as of 2010, to lie between 1.8 and 2.5 km (1.1 and 1.6 miles) from the Pole at a depth of 17 m (56 ft) below the present surface. *(from Wikipedia)*

Brrrrr. Working remotely over the holidays? Here are some tips for protecting privacy while you're away from the office.

- Keep your FTC laptop and anything containing PII or Sensitive PII (electronic or paper) with you at all times.
- Store FTC files on the FTC network in your personal network storage folder or in an appropriate shared folder - NOT on your computer's hard drive.

Ethics Training: Welcome to Fwitter! Are you a GS-13 or below who wants to brush up on federal ethics knowledge? Now you can! The Ethics team is pleased to announce that *Fwitter* – the FTC's first online ethics training program for employees at GS-13 and below - is available on the Intranet. *Fwitter* is a whimsical alternative to Twitter (aka fake Twitter). It provides an optional refresher course on federal ethics principles for staff who may not have received formal federal ethics training is geared towards a certain level of employee, GS-14's and above are also encouraged to test their knowledge and see if they can *fweet* like a pro!

Granting Excused Absence for Voting Supervisors and Managers may grant a limited amount of excused absence in areas where the polls are not open at least three hours either before or after an employee's regular work hours. For example, if an employee is scheduled to work from 8 am to 4:30 pm and the employee's polling place is open from 7 am to 7 pm, the employee may be granted one half-hour of excused absence from 4 pm to 4:30 pm, if requested. Also, if an employee's voting place is beyond normal commuting distance and vote by absentee ballot is not permitted, Supervisors may grant excused absence not to exceed one day to travel to the polling place. An employee is required to request annual leave or leave without pay if any additional time is needed to make that trip.An increasing number of jurisdictions offer a period prior to the day of the election during which voters may cast ballots early. Some employees may find it necessary to vote during this early period because of work requirements on the day of the election. Others, such as those on Alternative Work Schedules, may find it convenient to vote during these early voting periods. Typically, polling places throughout the United States are open for extended periods, and an increasing number of jurisdictions are offering early voting options. Therefore, excused absence should rarely be needed but we are making you aware of these options in the event that any of these issues arise. Employees on Alternative Work Schedules whose regular day off is scheduled for the day polls are open are not permitted to change their regular day off solely for the purpose of gaining excused absence for voting.Please be sure to check your local polling areas for more information. Random Factoid On computer keyboards, the *Esc key* (named *Escape key* in the international standard series ISO/IEC 9995) is a key used to generate the Escape character. The escape character, when sent from the keyboard to a computer, often is interpreted by software as "stop", and when sent from the computer to an external device (including many printers since the 1980s, computer terminals and Linux consoles, for example) marks the beginning of an escape sequence to specify operating modes or characteristics generally. It is now generally placed at the top left corner of the keyboard, a convention dating at least to the original IBM PC keyboard, though the key itself originated decades earlier with teletypewriters. The Escape key's creation is credited to Bob Bemer, a computer programmer who worked for IBM. He created the Escape key in 1960 to allow programmers working with diverse machines to switch from one type of code to another. The name of the equivalent key on some early Teletype Model 33 keyboards was labeled Alt Mode...the alternative mode of operation causing the escapement to treat the following one character in a special way. Much later printers and Computer terminals that would use Escape sequences often would take more than one following byte as part of a special sequence. On machines running Microsoft Windows, prior to the implementation of the Windows key on keyboards, the typical practice for invoking the "start" button was to hold down the Control key and press escape. This key combination still works as of Windows 10. (And yes, we tried it, and yes, it still works.) (from Wikipedia)

Collecting and using (or reusing) information from individuals potentially raises privacy issues that are best addressed sooner rather than later. The Privacy Office uses the PTA form to assess whether the system has privacy risks that need to be addressed, and to determine whether a full Privacy Impact Assessment is required. Random Factoid The *first documented football match* was a practice game played on this day in 1861, at University College, University of Toronto (approximately 400 yards west of Queen's. Park). One of the participants in the game involving University of Toronto students was Sir William Mulock, later Chancellor of the school. A football club was formed at the university soon afterward, although its rules of play at this stage are unclear (based on scoring, you'll see why). The first written account of a game played was on October 15, 1862, on the Montreal Cricket Grounds. It was between the First Battalion Grenadier Guards and the Second Battalion Scots Fusilier Guards resulting in a win by the Grenadier Guards 3 goals, 2 rouges to nothing (like we said, scoring seems odd now). In 1864, at Trinity College, Toronto, F. Barlow. Cumberland, Frederick A. Bethune, and Christopher Gwynn, one of the founders of Milton, Massachusetts, devised rules based on rugby football. The game gradually gained a following, with the Hamilton Football Club formed on November 3, 1869 (the oldest football club in Canada). Montreal formed a team April 8, 1872, Toronto was formed on October 4, 1873, and the Ottawa FBC on September 20, 1876. This rugby-football scon became popular at Montreal's McGill University. McGill Challenged Harvard University to a game, in 1874 using a hybrid game of English rugby devised by the University of McGill. (*from Wikipedia*)

Beware Phishing Attempts Targeting OPM Breach Victims Recently, cyber thieves have been targeting victims of the OPM data breaches and attempting to trick them into downloading ransomware. Victims receive an email which claims to be from OPM, warning of suspicious movements in their bank account, with a ZIP file attached. The ZIP file contains a hostile JavaScript application which, when run, will download and install ransomware demanding that the victim pay a Bitcoin ransom or lose all their files.

As a reminder, OPM will never send specific details regarding your personal or financial information via email. If you believe you have been affected by either breach, please visit OPM's Cybersecurity Resource Center to view a sample notification letter, verify if you were a victim of one or both breaches, or enroll in the OPM-sponsored identity monitoring services. To protect yourself from this and similar phishing emails, be skeptical about unexpected or unusual emails, even if they appear to come from a person you know or an organization with which you do business. Before clicking on links or opening files in an email that seems to be from, for example, a friend, your bank, or UPS, contact the sender at a phone number, email address, or URL that you know to be correct and confirm that the email is legitimate. Random Factoid Today is National Button Day, because, as we like to say, why not. Buttons used to be just ornamental - functional buttons with buttonholes for fastening or closing clothes appeared first in Germany in the 13th century. They soon became widespread with the rise of snug-fitting garments in 13th- and 14th-century Europe. Some museums and art galleries hold culturally, historically, politically, and/or artistically significant buttons in their collections. The Victoria & Albert Museum has many buttons, particularly in its jewelry collection, as does the Smithsonian Institution. One type of button that you have to be careful with is the snap fastener. Snap fasteners are metal (usually brass) round discs pinched through the fabric. They are often found on clothing, in particular on denim pieces such as pants and jackets. They are more securely fastened to the material. As they rely on a metal rivet attached securely to the fabric, pressure buttons are difficult to remove without compromising the fabric's integrity. Important Message for Those Who Attended FTCU Reception

Yesterday we received notice from Costco that the Sabra Hummus that we served at the All Staff FTCU reception on November 7th was subject to recall for possible listeria. http://www.costco.com/wcsstore/CostcoUSBCCatalogAssetStore/Attachment/recalls/161121-FDA-Recall-Sabra-Hummus.pdf. Listeria is a bacteria, which, when it contaminates food and is ingested, can cause serious health effects or even result in death in high risk individuals. The disease primarily affects older adults, pregnant women, newborns, and adults with weakened immune systems. However, rarely, persons without these risk factors can also be affected. The Center for Disease Control (CDC) states that a person in a higher-risk category (pregnant woman, older adults, and people with weakened immune systems) who experiences fever and other nonspecific symptoms, such as fatigue and aches, within 2 months of eating contaminated food should seek medical care and tell the physician or health care provider about eating the contaminated food. If a person has eaten food contaminated with Listeria and does not have any symptoms, most experts believe that no tests or treatment are needed, even for persons at higher risk for listeriosis. Please read the follow link to the CDC on listeria at https://www.cdc.gov/listeria/ and consult your physician and/or Costco if you have concerns.

2017 Thrift Savings Plan Contributions

All Staff Employee contributions to the Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) are considered to be elective deferrals. The IRS elective deferral limit for 2017 remains \$18,000. Employees who will be age 50 or older during 2017 may also contribute up to \$6,000 in additional (catch-up) contributions if their regular contributions for the year will reach the \$18,000 limit. Employees may start, stop, or change catch-up contributions at any time. Catch-up elections do not automatically continue, therefore new elections must be made for each calendar year. Employees wishing to contribute the maximum in 2017, in equal installments, should elect to contribute \$693 per pay period for regular contributions, and \$231 for catch up contributions, starting in pay period 02.

To make changes to your TSP contributions, please log into Employee Express and select Thrift Savings Plan/Roth: <u>https://www.employeeexpress.gov/</u>. Select the type of contribution you wish to make, and then enter the dollar amount or percentage and 12/25/2016, to make the election effective for pay period 02. The change must be entered in Employee Express between 12/11/2016 and 12/24/2016, to become effective on 12/25/2016. In the event that Employee Express is not working, please complete the forms for the <u>TSP-1</u> and <u>TSP-1c</u> and submit them to HCMO at H-723 or <u>HRMOworklife-benefits@ftc.gov</u>. 2017 Thrift Savings Plan Contributions



Employee contributions to the Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) are considered to be elective deferrals. The IRS elective deferral limit for 2017 remains

\$18,000. Employees who will be age 50 or older during 2017 may also contribute up to \$6,000 in additional (catch-up) contributions if their regular contributions for the year will reach the \$18,000 limit. Employees may start, stop, or change catch-up contributions at any time. Catch-up elections do not automatically continue, therefore new elections must be made for each calendar year. Employees wishing to contribute the maximum in 2017, in equal installments, should elect to contribute \$693 per pay period for regular contributions, and \$231 for catch up contributions, starting in pay period 02.

To make changes to your TSP contributions, please log into Employee Express and select Thrift Savings Plan/Roth: <u>https://www.employeeexpress.gov/</u>. Select the type of contribution you wish to make, and then enter the dollar amount or percentage and 12/25/2016, to make the election effective for pay period 02. The change must be entered in Employee Express between 12/11/2016 and 12/24/2016, to become effective on 12/25/2016. In the event that Employee Express is not working, please complete the forms for the <u>TSP-1</u> and <u>TSP-1c</u> and submit them to HCMO at H-723 or <u>HRMOworklife-benefits@ftc.gov</u>. Privacy Tip of the Week

All Staff

Less is more! FTC policy requires special handling of materials that contain sensitive PII, such as Social Security numbers (SSNs), credit card numbers, birth

dates, etc. Think hard about whether collecting or using sensitive PII is necessary to accomplish your task. You may be able to avoid the burden of creating an inventory for, tracking, and redacting sensitive PII, and can minimize the risk of a potential data breach involving sensitive information. When in doubt, leave it out. If you must handle sensitive PII, make sure that you've identified processes to avoid disclosing it.

If you think that you have a case-specific need to collect sensitive PII, be sure to discuss that need with your supervisor and the CPO. Remember that, once collected, sensitive PII must be secured and protected. Be careful not to disclose sensitive PII to opposing counsel, third parties, or in court filings. For general information about handling PII during investigations and litigation, see the <u>BCP Best Practices for Handling Sensitive Information in Litigation</u> tip sheet and the <u>Privacy and Information Security FAQs</u> (both also accessible from BCP Lit), or contact the <u>Privacy Office</u>.

Random Factoid

Today is *Computer Security Day*, so it's worth noting some ways that people are out to get your data. Spoofing, in general, is a fraudulent or malicious practice in which communication is sent from an unknown source disguised as a source known to the receiver. Spoofing is most prevalent in communication mechanisms that lack a high level of security.

Then there's *clickjacking*. Clickjacking, also known as *UI redress attack* or *User Interface redress attack*, is a malicious technique in which an attacker tricks a user into clicking on a button or link on another webpage while the user intended to click on the top level page. This is done using multiple transparent or opaque layers. The attacker is basically "hijacking" the clicks meant for the top level page and routing them to some other irrelevant page, most likely owned by someone else.

A similar technique can be used to hijack keystrokes. Carefully drafting a combination of stylesheets, iframes, buttons and text boxes, a user can be led into believing that they are typing the password or other information on some authentic webpage while it is being channeled into an invisible frame controlled by the attacker. *(from wikipedia)*
