GERMANS BARRED FROM CITIZENSHIP FOR WAR

Justice Cropsey Decides Enemy
Aliens Can't Get Final Papers
While It Is in Progress.

Supreme Court Justice Cropsey in Brooklyn yesterday decided that no enemy aliens shall be permitted to make application for naturalization papers while the war is in progress. This exclusion also applies to Germans who have obtained first papers, but had not entered their petition for second papers until on or after April 6, 1917, when the United States declared war against the German Government. In making this ruling Justice Cropsey invoked a law enacted during the war of 1812, and known



NEWARK, N. J., May 13.—Thirty-five years after Frederick W. Wursterbarth, German born, obtained American citizenship papers they were canceled today by the Federal Court here. Wursterbarth, who, according to witnesses, had refused to buy Liberty bonds or contribute to Red Cross or Knights of Columbus funds, was recently removed as postmaster at Lakeview, where he lives, because of alleged pro-German sympathies.





