

Can The Army Provide Logistic Support For Its Troops In A Conventional Defense Of Free Europe?

Despite their vital importance, key plans for logistic support of U.S. troops in a NATO contingency are not well coordinated, and some are not current. As a result, assurance is lacking that adequate quantities of war reserve stocks and resupply material from the United States can be delivered on time. The planned Army wartime support organization does not provide adequately for a logical and smooth flow of supplies to combat troops, and the Army is relying on some civilian support that host nations may be unable to provide.

The Department of Defense should update and coordinate all plans for logistic support of European troops and encourage NATO Allies to develop multinational supply lines and to better prepare their own war material postures for defending key resupply routes.

On the basis of analyses of selected seizures in 1975, the Drug Enforcement Administration indicated that 89 percent of heroin in the United States was of Mexican origin.

The United States works with the Mexican Government to eliminate the supply at the source. Since previous eradication efforts in Mexico have been unsuccessful in reducing the U.S. supply, the Mexican Government decided in 1975 to use aerially sprayed herbicides to kill opium poppies. This, together with an expanded coverage area and a longer eradication campaign, could considerably increase the number of plants destroyed, which would reduce the amount of Mexican heroin available for smuggling into the United States.

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

Military sales by the United States to foreign buyers have grown to dominate the international arms market. This rapid growth has, on one hand, been at the expense of the U.S. Forces; on the other, it has helped maintain employment and has reduced the costs of some weapon systems.

Of equal importance, these sales have created large inventories of U.S. articles in foreign hands. However, there is no experience to suggest that the future support of both foreign and U.S. inventories can be accomplished with the even handedness necessary to avert a potential drain on the U.S. defense posture.

Improving Warship Survivability--A Billion Dollar Problem

Whese U.S. INlawy warships are not adequately protected against cheap kills such as very longering inuclear efficients, firegments ifrom destroyed aincraft and missiles, and shock. In these situations, a damaged system prevents the ship ifrom completing its mission, even though there is little or no demage to the ship structure. The ship floats, but serves no useful purpose.

The Navy's efficients to organize and coordinatio survivability improvements are just now starting after substantiful delays. Longrange programs to develops unvivability technology and to improve some existing ships are estimated at abount \$2!50 million. Improvements to all existing ships would cost billions of dollars.
