# Dear Requester:

This is the final response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, originally received by the United States Secret Service (Secret Service) on June 2, 2020, for information pertaining to:

- 1. All records reflecting any order or directive to use force -- including tear gas, concussion grenades, rubber bullets, and physical charges -- on protestors gathered in Lafayette Park in front of the White House on June 1, 2020; and
- 2. All records sufficient to identify the federal government officials that ordered or directed the use of force -- including the use of tear gas, concussion grenades, rubber bullets, and physical charges -- on protestors gathered in Lafayette Park in front of the White House on June 1, 2020.

After a detailed review of all potentially responsive records, 3 page(s) were released and no page(s) were withheld in their entirety. Exemptions under the FOIA Statute, Title 5 U.S.C. § 552 have been applied where deemed appropriate.

Enclosed are the documents responsive to your request, as well as a document that explains the exemptions in more detail. Withheld information is pursuant to the exemptions marked below.

## June 1, 2020

On 06/01/20, social media analysis revealed that members of Black Lives Matter (BLM) planned to demonstrate in Washington, DC, with unknown number of participants. The demonstration was scheduled to start at 1930 hours EDT. Additionally, BLM planned to have supplies available for demonstrators and listed the drop off/pick up point at Lafayette Square from 1100 hours EDT to 2100 EDT.

DC Mayor, Muriel Bowser, imposed a mandatory curfew for Washington, DC beginning at 1900 hours on and extending until 0600 tomorrow.
