"I request a copy of the Dept of Transportation Office of Inspector General Investigation report(s) concerning the falsification of quality control tests for concrete manufacturing by Universal Concrete Products. Please limit this request to investigation reports dating between 2016 and 2020."

U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), Office of Inspector General (OIG) initiated a civil and criminal investigation, working jointly with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), and U.S. Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of Virginia (USAO-EDVA). The investigation was initiated because of allegations that Universal Concrete Products (UCP) falsified test records and provided substandard concrete panels for the extension of the Silver Line, also known as Phase II of the Dulles Metrorail Project (Dulles Project).

During the investigation, DOT-OIG and FBI special agents conducted several interviews, executed a search warrant at UCP, and reviewed quality control test data and other records related to the Dulles Project. The investigation revealed that UCP's quality control manager, Andrew Nolan, falsified test records for the Dulles Project to make it appear air content for the concrete was within the required range of air content. Nolan falsified test records knowing that the general contractor for the Dulles Project would reject the concrete had it known the concrete fell below the required air content for the project. Nolan also instructed his subordinates to falsify test records.

On July 9, 2018, USAO-EDVA filed a civil complaint against UCP, Nolan, and Donald Faust Jr., UCP's president and co-owner. They were charged with violating the False Claims Act and the Virginia Fraud Against Taxpayers Act.

On August 3, 2018, Nolan was charged, via criminal information, with conspiring to commit wire fraud, and pleaded guilty in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia.

On October 2, 2018, the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) suspended and proposed to debar Andrew Nolan based on his August 3, 2018 conviction.

On November 26, 2018, through a civil consent judgment, Nolan agreed to pay \$700,567.11.

On December 7, 2018, Nolan was sentenced to 12 months and 1 day of incarceration, 3 years of supervised release, \$700,567.11 restitution, \$30,560 in forfeiture, and a \$100 special assessment.

On December 21, 2018, the FTA debarred Andrew Nolan from participating in federally funded procurement and nonprocurement programs for three years.

On January 22, 2019, UCP and Donald Faust, Jr. agreed to pay \$1 million to settle civil allegations that UCP falsified test records for concrete panels for the Dulles Project.

On October 8, 2020, the FTA debarred UCP from participation in federally funded procurement and nonprocurement programs for a period of three years. UCP's debarment is based on the Nolan's 2018 conviction.

This investigation is closed with no further action anticipated by this office.

In March 2016, a qui tam was filed in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia, which alleged that Universal Concrete Products (UCP) falsified test records and provided substandard concrete panels for the extension of the Silver Line, also known as Phase II of the Dulles Metrorail Project (Dulles Project).

Based on the filing of the qui tam, the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), Office of Inspector General (OIG) initiated a civil and criminal investigation, and worked jointly with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), and U.S. Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of Virginia (USAO-EDVA).

During the investigation, DOT-OIG and FBI special agents conducted several interviews, executed a search warrant at UCP, and reviewed quality control test data and other records related to the Dulles Project.

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
