These records contain redactions pursuant FOIA Exemptions 3(A), 5, and (7)(E). FOIA Exemption 3(A) protects from disclosure information that is specifically exempted from disclosure by statute. See 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(3)(A). Pursuant to the Federal Election Campaign Act, the FEC may not disclose information related to open enforcement matters. 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(12). FOIA Exemption 5 protects from disclosure interor intra-agency memoranda or letters that would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency, including documents covered by the attorney work-product, deliberative process, and attorney-client privileges. See 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(5). And FOIA Exemption 7(E) protects law enforcement information that "would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law." 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(7)(E).

Therefore, your FOIA request has been granted in part.

Status of Compliance - Fiscal Year 2017 - 1st Quarter Highlights (10/1/16 -

12/31/16) & FY Statistical Overview

The Office of Compliance (Compliance) submits this memorandum to provide the Commission with a snapshot of accomplishments and highlights for the first quarter (10/1/16 - 12/31/16) and 2017 fiscal year statistical overview. The intent of this document is to proactively provide an update of the workload and achieved results of the Compliance Office on a quarterly basis. The Status of Compliance and the Directive 68 (Statute of Limitations) documents are scheduled to be discussed during the February 7, 2017 Executive Session.

The attached **Appendix A** provides the Commission with second quarter highlights for each office and also a statistical overview of FY 2017 results and progression towards meeting the 2014-2019 Strategic Performance Goals recently adopted by the Commission. **Appendix B** provides an overview of all open audits and their respective stages within the audit process. **Appendix C** is an Audit Report entitled 'Proposed Final Audit Report – Due Date' which highlights the report manager, stage, phase, pre-audit start date, fieldwork begin date and the date the Proposed Final Audit Report must be approved in order to meet the current Strategic Plan goal. **Appendix D** (ADRO Civil Penalty Report) highlights civil penalties assessed, paid and an overview of non-monetary terms to include date due and completed. **Appendix E** (AF Performance Goals Report) shows FY 2017 statistics for meeting strategic performance goals related to the Administrative Fine Program.

As always, we welcome any feedback or suggestions that could be incorporated to enhance the presentation of the information contained within the overview.

Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO)

In the first quarter of FY 2017, the ADRO received 6 cases (3 from RAD and 3 from OGC). During this time period, the ADRO closed a total of 6 cases, 5 with approved negotiated settlements and 1 case was withdrawn by RAD. (b) (7)(E)

The ADRO continued to work with the Office of Chief Information Officer (OCIO) regarding the upgrade of the case management system (Law Manager), which was implemented last July. The ADRO anticipates that work will begin on integrating automated mail merge technology with the system in the 2017 fiscal year.

The ADRO remained active in providing skill building in conflict management, in large part by providing Conflict Coaching to FEC staff and lunch time mini-seminars on conflict management. Conflict coaching can assist in decreasing the negative effects of conflict in the workplace. The ADRO staff continues interagency conflict coaching discussions to share lessons learned with those federal agencies setting up conflict coaching programs. The ADRO staff continues to serve on the steering committee of the Federal Interagency ADR Working Group. In addition, both the Director and Assistant Director serve on the roster of Sharing Neutrals, an interagency mediation program which provides trained mediators to participating Federal agencies to resolve workplace disputes as workload considerations allow. Sharing Neutrals provides mediation services to resolve workplace disputes at no cost to the Commission in exchange for the ADRO staff's service.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the first quarter of FY 2017, the Commission processed 83 Reason to Believe (RTB) findings. OAR received 15 challenges and processed 11 Reviewing Officer Recommendations (RORs). The Commission made a final determination that the respondents in

31 cases violated 2 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assessed penalties totaling \$70,530. The Commission also collected \$26,843 in fine payments and prepared 31 cases for public release.

As of January 31, 2017 the Commission has approved a total of 3,064 RTB findings and 2,949 final determination recommendations. The AFP has collected \$4.55 million in 2,435 cases, received 735 challenges, and publicly released 2,918 cases. Of the 735 challenges, the Commission upheld 441 of the RTB findings (60%) with no change in the fine, upheld 120 of the RTB findings (16%) with fines changed, and waived 157 fines (21%). As of January 31, the Commission had not yet made a final determination in the 15 remaining cases.

Additionally, the Office of Administrative Review (OAR) forwarded 100% of RORs within 60 days of receipt of each challenge, thus exceeding its strategic goal of processing 75% of RORs within 60 days (Appendix E).

The Reviewing Officer also worked with OCIO and RAD to modify the multiple AF Penalty Calculators pursuant to the Federal Civil Penalties Inflation Adjustment Act Improvements Act of 2015. The annual adjustments will become effective upon publication in the Federal Register.

Audit Division

During the first quarter of FY 2017, the Audit Division processed the following audit reports:

Fieldwork is currently ongoing for five audits (Michigan Democratic State Central Committee, Democratic Party of South Carolina, Democratic Party of Arkansas, Arizona Republican Party and Massachusetts Democratic State Cmte-Fed Funds Acct) and the Audit Division has 20 open audits. One audit hearing was held for the Colorado Republican

Committee. Additionally, the Perdue for Senate committee has filed a Request for Legal Consideration by the Commission, which the Commission has granted. Pre-audit began on both Title 26 audits (Jill Stein for President and O'Malley for President).

With respect to the Presidential Election Campaign Fund, the Audit Division processed the fourth submission from the Jill Stein for President Committee; no further submissions are expected. The Audit Division worked with the Office of General Counsel to provide guidance to the Gary Johnson 2016 Committee regarding general election public funding. The Committee, however, did not qualify for the public funding. Also, the Audit Division received the annual request from the U.S. Treasury for the Estimated Outlay for the fiscal years 2017-2027. The Audit Division completed, and, in early January 2017, the Commission approved, the budgetary calculations which were subsequently forwarded to the U.S. Treasury.

The Audit Division is collaborating with OCIO on deployment of new laptops, which is scheduled for February. Additionally, the Audit Division staff has been conducting user acceptance testing on a website protocol that will allow committees to download documents to an agency server, which will allow for greater protection of PII information.

The Audit Division has also been conducting focus groups seeking staff input on methods to decrease the turnaround time for audits and overall improvements within the audit process. The Audit Division also completed its annual training on the FEC Quality Standards, which sets standards for quality audit work across audit teams. Audit Managers met with auditors to develop individual training plans for the year. Additionally, Audit staff presented an overview of the Audit Division for RAD in an effort to address feedback received from the morale study.

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the first quarter of FY 2017, RAD staff collaborated with OCIO on the development of the Correspondence Tracking System, which will allow Campaign Finance Analysts to assist committees with questions via email through an approval and tracking system. We are near the end of development and expect to begin user testing in early February, with an anticipated roll out in early March. The system will be accessible to the public through the FEC's new website which is also scheduled to go live in March. In addition, RAD staff sought comments from Commission Offices on the proposed 2017-2018 RAD Review and Referral Procedures and met with several offices to go over the proposed changes. The document has been circulated to the Commission for a vote.

RAD staff reviewed a total of 25,635 documents totaling 5,184,086 pages during the first quarter of FY 2017 and 88.40% of the reports have been reviewed within 90 days of receipt for the current election cycle (Appendix A, page 12), exceeding our goal of 75%. RAD generated and sent 5,538 letters to the filing community during the first quarter and for FY 2017, 91% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report review date (Appendix A, page 14). Also during the first quarter, RAD generated 10 referrals (1 OGC, 3 ADRO, 5 AF, 1 Debt Settlement) and sent 3,356 non-filer notices, where the Commission approved recommendations to publish 38 authorized committees for failure to timely file an election-sensitive report. Finally, during the first quarter, Reports Processing Branch staff coded 7,276,270 transactions from 4,220

documents, and processed 451,515 pages from 3,973 documents in the Paper Automation system.

RAD staff continued to assist other divisions when asked with inquiries regarding committee activity or RAD procedures, as well as document review. Specifically, during the first quarter, RAD staff provided assistance to OGC on 27 matters by offering comments on FGCR's, as well as answering questions regarding RAD procedures and disclosure requirements, assisted ADRO with 9 matters, assisted the Press Office with 3 matters, handled 4 inquiries from Audit, and 12 inquiries from Commission offices.

On the personnel front, RAD has experienced several recent staff departures. As a result of internal job postings, two Campaign Finance Analysts (CFA) will be taking positions in the Information Division in February, and another analyst left the agency, resulting in a shortage of three (3) CFAs. We were in the process of reviewing applications to fill a previously approved CFA vacancy and will continue this process. In addition, we saw the departure of a recently hired Secretary for which we were unable to hire a replacement or to conduct applicant interviews to fill two (2) Coding Clerk positions before the hiring freeze was issued.

Finally, during the first quarter, RAD Managers committed a significant amount of time to addressing feedback received from a morale study team exercise conducted at our last division meeting. One of the items implemented, includes issuing a monthly RAD newsletter to highlight division and agency news and to ensure everyone is getting the same information at the same time. We have also scheduled overview sessions with other divisions to address requests to learn more about other functions within the agency, as well as brown bag lunches with Commissioners and staff to allow for a collegial discussion about current issues. In addition, we held an Individual Development Plan (IDP) session for those interested in professional development and are planning a Professional Development week in RAD where training and resources will be offered. Further, all RAD managers received OPM 360 Leadership Assessment results and are in the process of creating Leadership Development Plans.

Status of Compliance – Fiscal Year 2017 – 2nd Quarter Highlights (1/1/17 –

3/31/17) & FY Statistical Overview

The Office of Compliance (Compliance) submits this memorandum to provide the Commission with a snapshot of accomplishments and highlights for the second quarter (1/1/17 -3/31/17) and 2017 fiscal year statistical overview. The intent of this document is to proactively provide an update of the workload and achieved results of the Compliance Office on a quarterly basis. The Status of Compliance and the Directive 68 (Statute of Limitations) documents are scheduled to be discussed during the May 9, 2017 Executive Session.

The attached Appendix A provides the Commission with second quarter highlights for each office and also a statistical overview of FY 2017 results and progression towards meeting the 2014-2019 Strategic Performance Goals recently adopted by the Commission. Appendix B provides an overview of all open audits and their respective stages within the audit process. Appendix C is an Audit Report entitled 'Proposed Final Audit Report — Due Date' which highlights the report manager, stage, phase, pre-audit start date, fieldwork begin date and the date the Proposed Final Audit Report must be approved in order to meet the current Strategic Plan goal. Appendix D (ADRO Civil Penalty Report) highlights civil penalties assessed, paid and an overview of non-monetary terms to include date due and completed. Appendix E (AF Performance Goals Report) shows FY 2017 statistics for meeting strategic performance goals related to the Administrative Fine Program.

As always, we welcome any feedback or suggestions that could be incorporated to enhance the presentation of the information contained within the overview.

Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO)

In the second quarter of FY 2017, the ADRO received 3 cases (2 from RAD and 1 from Audit). During this time period, the ADRO closed a total of 7 cases, 5 with approved negotiated settlements and 2 cases with approved recommendations to dismiss. (b) (7)(E)

The ADRO continued to work with the Office of Chicf Information Officer (OCIO) regarding the upgrade of the case management system (Law Manager), which was implemented last July. The ADRO anticipates that work will begin on integrating automated mail merge technology with the system in the 2017 fiscal year. In addition, the ADRO worked with OCIO on upgrades to the SMUR system and enhancements to the ADRO wehpages.

The ADRO remained active in providing skill building training in conflict management, in large part by providing Conflict Coaching to FEC staff and lunch time mini-seminars on conflict management. Conflict coaching can assist in decreasing the negative effects of conflict in the workplace. The ADRO staff continues interagency conflict coaching discussions to share lessons learned with those federal agencies setting up conflict coaching programs. The ADRO staff continues to serve on the steering committee of the Federal Interagency ADR Working Group. In addition, both the Director and Assistant Director serve on the roster of Sharing Neutrals, an interagency mediation program which provides trained mediators to participating Federal agencies to resolve workplace disputes as workload considerations allow. Sharing Neutrals provides mediation services to resolve workplace disputes at no cost to the Commission in exchange for the ADRO staff's service.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the second quarter of FY 2017, the Commission processed 59 Reason to Believe (RTB) findings. OAR received 3 challenges and processed 7 Reviewing Officer Recommendations (RORs). The Commission made a final determination that the respondents in

34 cases violated 2 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assessed penalties totaling \$94,588. The Commission also collected \$96,452 in fine payments and prepared 9 cases for public release.

As of April 28, 2017 the Commission has approved a total of 3,153 RTB findings and 2,938 final determination recommendations. The AFP has collected \$4.58 million in 2,465 cases, received 736 challenges, and publicly released 2,928 cases. Of the 736 challenges, the Commission upheld 448 of the RTB findings (60%) with no change in the fine, upheld 122 of the RTB findings (16%) with fines changed, and waived 161 fines (21%). As of January 31, the Commission had not yet made a final determination in the 5 remaining cases.

Additionally, the Office of Administrative Review (OAR) forwarded 100% of RORs within 60 days of receipt of each challenge, thus exceeding its strategic goal of processing 75% of RORs within 60 days (Appendix E).

Audit Division

During the second quarter of FY 2017, the Audit Division processed the following audit reports:

Fieldwork is currently on-going for two audits (Michigan Democratic State Central Committee and Massachusetts Democratic State Committee-Fed Funds Account) and the Audit Division has 17 open audits. An audit hearing was granted for one committee, Illinois Republican Party. Pre-audit is on-going for both Title 26 audits (Jill Stein for President and O'Malley for President). Audit will be sending notification letters on the recently approved seven authorized audits next week.

Audit sent three referrals to the Office of General Counsel and one referral was sent to the ADRO.

With respect to the Presidential Election Campaign Fund (PECF), the Audit Division processed the approved payment for the fourth and final submission from the Jill Stein for President Committee. Currently, the Audit Division is updating written procedures pertaining to the PECF administration regarding the long range budget estimates. Likewise, the Audit Division is updating the Commission Directives 23 and 24, as necessary. Finally, the Audit Division continues to post monthly PECF reports to the Commission website.

The Audit Division received new laptops in February. Additionally, the Audit Division staff continues to conduct user acceptance testing on a website protocol that will allow committees to download documents to an agency server, which will allow for greater protection of PH information.

The Audit Division has started a records cleanup project in anticipation of the move. Also Audit Managers are incorporating new timelines for audits to be completed. Multiple staff meetings were held to train and increase morale in the Audit Division.

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the second quarter of FY 2017, RAD staff continued its collaboration with OCIO on the development and testing of the Correspondence Tracking System, which will allow Campaign Finance Analysts to assist committees with questions via email through an approval and tracking system. We are in the final stages of testing and have collaborated with 18F on the system interface for the new website. The system will be accessible to the public through the FEC's new website in May. In addition, during the second quarter RAD worked with Commission Offices to gain approval of the 2017-2018 RAD Review and Referral Procedures.

RAD staff reviewed a total of 27,607 documents totaling 7,570,160 pages during the second quarter of FY 2017 and 78.49% of the reports have been reviewed within 90 days of receipt for the current election cycle (Appendix A, page 12), narrowly exceeding our goal of 75%. The 10% decline in this goal from the last quarter can be attributed to the delay in gaining approval of the 2017-2018 RAD Review & Referral Procedures. RAD generated and sent 4,281 letters to the filing community during the second quarter and for FY 2017, 88% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report review date (Appendix A, page 14). Also during the second quarter, RAD generated 14 referrals (4 OGC, 2 ADRO, 1 Debt Settlement, 7 Audit) and sent 4,884 non-filer notices. Finally, during the second quarter, Reports Processing Branch staff coded 6,929,919 transactions from 2,408 documents, and processed 554,365 pages from 6,172 documents in the Paper Automation system.

On the personnel front, during the second quarter, RAD saw the departure of another Campaign Finance Analyst (CFA), bringing the total vacant CFA positions to four (4). Further, a GS-12 CFA was detailed to an Assistant Branch Chief position that was vacated due to a detail in the Staff Director's Office and a CFA has accepted a detail opportunity in the Office of the Commission Secretary beginning in May. These details result in additional CFA staff shortages. In addition, a Secretary position and (2) Coding Clerk positions remain vacant.

Finally, during the second quarter, RAD Managers dedicated a significant amount of time on staff development and education. We held process overview sessions with OAR, the Audit Division, the Information Division, and ADRO to educate RAD staff on the functions of each of these offices. In addition, we held brown bag lunch sessions with three (3) Commissioners where staff was able to hear different perspectives and ask questions. Finally, we held a Professional Development week where staff was able to choose from and focus on different topics and participate in group discussions, coaching sessions, and/or online training classes/tutorials.

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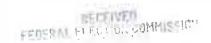

Status of Compliance – Fiscal Year 2017 – 3rd Quarter Highlights (4/1/17 -

6/30/17) & FY Statistical Overview

The Office of Compliance (Compliance) submits this memorandum to provide the Commission with a snapshot of accomplishments and highlights for the third quarter (4/1/17 -6/30/17) and 2017 fiscal year statistical overview. The intent of this document is to proactively provide an update of the workload and achieved results of the Compliance Office on a quarterly basis. The Status of Compliance and the Directive 68 (Statute of Limitations) documents are scheduled to be discussed during an upcoming Executive Session. Please note, we have also added additional slides to address the issue of timeliness within the Audit Division.

The attached **Appendix A** provides the Commission with third quarter highlights for each office and also a statistical overview of FY 2017 results and progression towards meeting the 2014-2019 Strategic Performance Goals adopted by the Commission. **Appendix B** provides an overview of all open audits and their respective stages within the audit process. **Appendix C** is an Audit Report entitled 'Proposed Final Audit Report — Due Date' which highlights the report manager, stage, phase, pre-audit start date, fieldwork begin date and the date the Proposed Final Audit Report must be approved in order to meet the current Strategic Plan goal. **Appendix D** (ADRO Civil Penalty Report) highlights civil penalties assessed, paid and an overview of nonmonetary terms to include date due and completed. **Appendix E** (AF Performance Goals Report) shows FY 2017 statistics for meeting strategic performance goals related to the Administrative Fine Program.

As always, we welcome any feedback or suggestions that could be incorporated to enhance the presentation of the information contained within the overview.

Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO)

In the third quarter of FY 2017, the ADRO received 10 cases (6 from RAD, 3 from OGC, and 1 directly from the Commission). During this time period, the ADRO closed a total of 4 cases, 3 with approved negotiated settlements and 1 case with an approved recommendations to dismiss. (b) (7)(E)

The ADRO continued to work with the Office of Chief Information Officer (OCIO) regarding the upgrade of the case management system (Law Manager), which was implemented last July. The ADRO anticipates that work will begin on integrating automated mail merge technology with the system in the 2017 fiscal year. In addition, the ADRO worked with OCIO on upgrades to the SMUR system to enhance the accuracy and efficiency of publishing ADR matters to the Enforcement Query System.

The ADRO remained active in providing skill building training in conflict management, in large part by providing Conflict Coaching to FEC staff and lunch time mini-seminars on conflict management. Conflict coaching can assist in decreasing the negative effects of conflict in the workplace. The ADRO staff continues interagency conflict coaching discussions to share lessons learned with those federal agencies setting up conflict coaching programs. The ADRO staff continues to serve on the steering committee of the Federal Interagency ADR Working Group. In addition, ADR staff serve on the roster of Sharing Neutrals, an interagency mediation program which provides trained mediators to participating Federal agencies to resolve workplace disputes as workload considerations allow. Sharing Neutrals provides mediation services to resolve workplace disputes at no cost to the Commission in exchange for the ADRO staff's service.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the third quarter of FY 2017, the Commission processed 46 Reason to Believe (RTB) findings. OAR received 8 challenges and processed 7 Reviewing Officer Recommendations (RORs). The Commission reviewed final determination recommendations in 60 cases, and made a final determination that the respondents in 54 cases violated 2 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assessed penalties totaling \$106,251. The Commission also collected \$131,629 in fine payments and prepared 52 cases for public release.

As of July 31, 2017 the Commission has approved a total of 3,164 RTB findings and 3,052 final determination recommendations. The AFP has collected \$4.71 million in 2,507 cases, received 736 challenges, and publicly released 3,068 cases. Of the 744 challenges, the Commission upheld 449 of the RTB findings (60%) with no change in the fine, upheld 124 of the RTB findings (16%) with fines changed, and waived 163 fines (21%). As of July 31, the Commission had not yet made a final determination in the 8 remaining cases.

Additionally, the Office of Administrative Review (OAR) forwarded 100% of RORs within 60 days of receipt of each challenge, thus exceeding its strategic goal of processing 75% of RORs within 60 days (Appendix E).

Fieldwork is currently on-going for two audits (O'Malley for President and Kelly for Congress) and the Audit Division has 21 open audits. An audit hearing was held for one committee, Illinois Republican Party and granted for two other committees, Freedom's Defense

Fund and Conservative Majority Fund. Pre-audit is on-going for one Title 26 audit (Jill Stein for President) and six of the recently approved Title 52 audits of authorized committees. (b) (7)(E)

With respect to the Presidential Election Campaign Fund (PECF), the Audit Division updated written procedures pertaining to the PECF administration regarding the long range budget estimates. Likewise, the Audit Division updated the Commission Directives 23 and 24 and circulated the proposed edits to the Office of General Counsel (OGC). (b) (5)

This document is currently pending before the Commission. Finally, the Audit Division continues to post monthly PECF reports to the Commission website.

On the personnel front, the Audit Division is down six Auditors. We did receive approval to post for an auditor. If qualified candidates are identified, we will submit a request to the Personnel Committee for approval to hire.

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the third quarter of FY 2017, RAD staff completed testing of the Correspondence Tracking System, a system which will allow Campaign Finance Analysts to assist committees with questions via email through an approval and tracking system. The interface for the new website has been completed and we plan to roll out the system through the website in August. In addition, RAD staff collaborated with OCIO on the testing and release of an upgraded FECfile version. RAD staff also collaborated with OGC and the Information Division on revisions to FEC Forms 8 and 9, and participated in a Scam PAC working group with staff from Commission offices, OGC, OCIO, Information Division and Congressional Affairs.

RAD staff reviewed a total of 17,739 documents totaling 13,020,190 pages during the third quarter of FY 2017 and 85.68% of the reports have been reviewed within 90 days of receipt for the current election cycle (Appendix A, page 12). RAD generated and sent 2,065 letters to the filing community during the third quarter and for FY 2017, 93.9% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report review date (Appendix A, page 14). Also during the third quarter, RAD generated 15 referrals (6 OGC, 6 ADRO, 3 Admin. Fine) and sent 218 non-filer notices. Finally, during the third quarter, Reports Processing Branch staff coded 3,742,169 transactions and 1,560 documents and for FY17, processed 647,728 pages from 7,620 documents in the Paper Automation system.

On the personnel front, during the third quarter RAD saw the departure of three Campaign Finance Analysts (CFA), bringing the total vacant CFA positions at this time to four (4). Further, a GS-12 CFA remains detailed to an Assistant Branch Chief position that was vacated due to a detail in the Staff Director's Office and a CFA is also serving a detail in the Office of the Commission Secretary. These details result in additional CFA staff shortages. In addition, a Coding Clerk position remains vacant. We are in the process of filling a previously

approved Secretary position, and a new Coding Clerk began at the end of July and three CFAs to come onboard in early August.

Finally, during the third quarter RAD continued to implement events and ideas in response to the Morale Study. We held a process overview session with OGC to educate RAD staff on its functions. In addition, we held brown bag lunch sessions with two (2) Commissioners and one with the Office of Congressional Affairs where staff was able to hear different perspectives and ask questions. We also have several training opportunities and events planned for RAD staff during the fourth quarter.

Status of Compliance – Fiscal Year 2017 – 4th Quarter Highlights (7/1/17 -

9/30/17) & FY Statistical Overview

The Office of Compliance (Compliance) submits this memorandum to provide the Commission with a snapshot of accomplishments and highlights for the fourth quarter (7/1/17 = 9/30/17) and 2017 fiscal year statistical overview. The intent of this document is to proactively provide an update of the workload and achieved results of the Office of Compliance on a quarterly basis. The Status of Compliance and the Directive 68 (Statute of Limitations) documents are scheduled to be discussed during an upcoming Executive Session.



The attached Appendix A provides the Commission with fourth quarter highlights for each office and also a statistical overview of FY 2017 results and progression towards meeting the 2014-2019 Strategic Performance Goals adopted by the Commission. Appendix B provides an overview of all open audits and their respective stages within the audit process. Appendix C is an Audit Report entitled 'Proposed Final Audit Report – Due Date' which highlights the report manager, stage, phase, pre-audit start date, fieldwork begin date and the date the Proposed Final Audit Report must be approved in order to meet the current Strategic Plan goal. Appendix D (ADRO Civil Penalty Report) highlights civil penalties assessed, paid and an overview of nonmonetary terms to include date due and completed. Appendix E (AF Performance Goals Report) shows FY 2017 statistics for meeting strategic performance goals related to the Administrative Fine Program.

As always, we welcome any feedback or suggestions that could be incorporated to enhance the presentation of the information contained within the overview.

Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO)

In the fourth quarter of FY 2017, the ADRO received 12 cases (8 from RAD and 4 from OGC). During this time period, the ADRO closed a total of 4 cases, 2 with approved negotiated settlements, 1 case transferred to OGC, and 1 case returned to RAD. During FY 2017, the ADRO received a total of 31 matters and closed a total of 21, including 15 approved negotiated settlements. In FY 2017, the Commission assessed \$63,055 in civil penalties through approved negotiated settlements, and the office collected \$61,255.

The ADRO continued to work with the Office of Chief Information Officer (OCIO) regarding the upgrade of the case management system (Law Manager). Work commenced on integrating automated mail merge technology with the system during this quarter. It is anticipated this work will be completed in the first quarter of FY 2018.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the fourth quarter of FY 2017, the Commission processed 15 Reason to Believe (RTB) findings. OAR received 3 challenges and processed 5 Reviewing Officer Recommendations (RORs). The Commission reviewed final determination recommendations in 76 cases, and made a final determination that the respondents in 75 cases violated 2 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assessed penalties totaling \$176,120. The Commission also collected \$20,103 in fine payments and prepared 76 cases for public release.

As of October 31, 2017 the Commission has approved a total of 3,136 RTB findings and 3,065 final determination recommendations. The AFP has collected \$4.74 million in 2,528

cases, received 747 challenges, and publicly released 3,055 cases. Of the 747 challenges, the Commission upheld 451 of the RTB findings (60%) with no change in the fine, upheld 126 of the RTB findings (16%) with fines changed, and waived 164 fines (21%). As of October 31, the Commission had not yet made a final determination in the 5 remaining cases.

Fieldwork is currently on-going for seven audits and the Audit Division has a total of 20 open audits. Two audits were referred to the Office of General Counsel this quarter (Colorado Republican Committee and American Financial Services Association PAC). Two Audit Hearings were held (Conservative Majority Fund and Freedom's Defense Fund) in September 2017. A total of sixteen audit reports were processed in the Audit Division during the 4th quarter.

Audit circulated the Unauthorized RAD Audit Referrals memo for the 2016 cycle on September 20, 2016 which is awaiting Commission approval. The Draft 2016 Unauthorized Audit Program, Materiality Thresholds and Error Definitions were also circulated in September and are also awaiting Commission approval.

With respect to the Presidential Election Campaign Fund (PECF), the Audit Division continues to post the pertinent portion of the monthly PECF reports to the Commission website

and is in process of completing the annual PECF fund balance outlook for the fiscal years 2018 – 2028. The Audit Division anticipates receiving the budgetary calculation request from the U.S. Treasury in early December 2017 and will circulate these calculations to the Commission in early January 2018. Finally, to account for the regulatory changes applicable to public financing, the Audit Division proposed edits to the document 'Proposed Revisions to FEC Directive on Convention and General Election Certification Procedures –LRA 1052'. This document was circulated on June 28, 2017 to the Commission and is awaiting Commission approval.

Audit staff collaborated with OCIO on the testing and design of the Audit Report Search System (ARSS) for the FEC website. Additionally, user acceptance testing was also completed in October for ARSS. Audit also participated in discussions concerning Scam PACs and the LRAT working group for the upcoming move.

Additionally, management met with Commission offices to discuss initiatives for the processing of audits. The initiatives discussed at these meeting were incorporated into the Draft 2016 Unauthorized Audit Program, Materiality Thresholds and Error Definitions which is awaiting approval by the Commission. Audit management is also actively working in updating Directive 70 and will be submitting a recommendation to the Commission by the end of the year.

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the fourth quarter of FY 2017, the RAD Correspondence Tracking System was successfully rolled out the public through a portal on the FEC website. The system allows Campaign Finance Analysts to assist committees with questions via email through an approval and tracking system. RAD staff has responded to approximately 40 inquiries to date and continues to work on enhancing the system. In addition, RAD staff continued to participate in the Scam PAC working group with staff from Commission offices, OGC, OCIO, Information Division and Congressional Affairs. The group is working on composing a recommendation memo for Commission consideration.

RAD staff reviewed a total of 16,881 documents totaling 9,081,131 pages during the fourth quarter of FY 2017 and 88.16% of the reports have been reviewed within 90 days of receipt for the current election cycle (Appendix A, page 16). RAD generated and sent 2,922 letters to the filing community during the fourth quarter and for FY 2017, 88% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report review date (Appendix A, page 18). Also during the fourth quarter, RAD generated 51 referrals (12 OGC, 8 ADRO, 6 Admin, Fine, 1 Debt Settlement, 24 Audit) and sent 1,416 non-filer notices. Finally, during the fourth quarter, the Reports Processing Branch coded 10,833,802 transactions and 69,190 documents and for FY17, processed 684,747 pages from 8,139 documents in the Paper Automation system.

On the personnel front, during the fourth quarter RAD welcomed three (3) new Campaign Finance Analysts (CFA) and a Coding Clerk, and received Commission approval to fill four (4) additional vacant CFA positions. We are in the process of setting up interviews for these positions. In addition, we are in the process of filling two GS-12 CFA positions vacated by staff transfers to OCIO and the Office of the Secretary. Further, a GS-12 CFA remains detailed

to an Assistant Branch Chief position that was vacated due to a staff transfer to the Staff Director's Office. We have a pending request to the Personnel Committee to fill the vacant Assistant Branch Chief position and hope to fill this quickly. Finally, we have completed interviews for a previously approved Secretary position and are in the process of making a selection and the individual should be onboard by the end of November.

Finally, during the fourth quarter RAD continued to implement events and ideas in response to the Morale Study. We held a process overview session with the Press Office to educate RAD staff on its functions. In addition, we held brown bag lunch sessions with one Commissioner and one with the Deputy Staff Director where staff was able to ask questions related to the FEC move and OHR. We also held Division training sessions and a Division meeting where we issued years of service and performance awards, as well as a peer award. In addition, we started professional development months for each RAD branch where the focus is on working towards individual short and long term goals through training sessions and one-on-one coaching.

Status of Compliance - Fiscal Year 2018 - 1st Quarter Highlights (10/1/17 -

12/31/17) & FY Statistical Overview

The Office of Compliance (Compliance) submits this memorandum to provide the Commission with a snapshot of accomplishments and highlights for the first quarter (10/1/17 – 12/31/17) and 2018 fiscal year statistical overview. The intent of this document is to proactively provide an update of the workload and achieved results of the Office of Compliance on a quarterly basis. The Status of Compliance and the Directive 68 (Statute of Limitations) documents are scheduled to be discussed during an upcoming Executive Session.

The attached Appendix A provides the Commission with first quarter highlights for each office and also a statistical overview of FY 2018 results and progression towards meeting the 2014-2019 Strategic Performance Goals adopted by the Commission. Appendix B provides an overview of all open audits and their respective stages within the audit process. Appendix C is an Audit Report entitled 'Proposed Final Audit Report — Due Date' which highlights the report manager, stage, phase, pre-audit start date, fieldwork begin date and the date the Proposed Final Audit Report must be approved in order to meet the current Strategic Plan goal. Appendix D (ADRO Civil Penalty Report) highlights civil penalties assessed, paid and an overview of nonmonetary terms to include date due and completed. Appendix E (AF Performance Goals Report) shows FY 2018 statistics for meeting strategic performance goals related to the Administrative Fine Program.

As always, we welcome any feedback or suggestions that could be incorporated to enhance the presentation of the information contained within the overview.

Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO)

In the first quarter of FY 2018, the ADRO received 16 cases (7 from RAD, 5 from Audit, 3 from the Commission, and 1 from OGC). During this time period, the ADRO closed a total of 10 cases, 9 with approved negotiated settlements and 1 case transferred to OGC. In FY 2018, the Commission assessed \$31,025 in civil penalties through approved negotiated settlements, and the office collected \$28.875. (b) (7)(E) (b) (7)(E)

The ADRO continued to work with the Office of Chief Information Officer (OCIO) regarding the upgrade of the case management system (Law Manager). Work was completed on integrating automated mail merge technology with the system during this quarter.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the first quarter of FY 2018, the Commission processed 6 Reason to Believe (RTB) findings. OAR received 4 challenges and processed 4 Reviewing Officer Recommendations (RORs). The Commission reviewed final determination recommendations in 12 cases, and made a final determination that the respondents in these cases violated 2 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assessed penalties totaling \$53,484. The Commission also collected \$77,002 in fine payments and prepared 10 cases for public release.

As of January 31, 2018 the Commission has approved a total of 3,144 RTB findings and 3,078 final determination recommendations. The AFP has collected \$4.74 million, received 751 challenges, and publicly released 3,061 cases. Of the 751 challenges, the Commission upheld 452 of the RTB findings (60%) with no change in the fine, upheld 128 of the RTB findings (17%) with fines changed, and waived 165 fines (22%). As of January 31, the Commission had not yet made a final determination in the 5 remaining cases.

Additionally, the Office of

Administrative Review (OAR) forwarded 100% of RORs within 60 days of receipt of each challenge, thus exceeding its strategic goal of processing 75% of RORs within 60 days (Appendix E).

During the first quarter, the Reviewing Officer worked with OCIO and OCFO to implement new financial reports to accommodate OCFO reporting requirements and increase efficiency in reconciliation. The Reviewing Officer also worked with OCIO, OGC, and Public Records to implement a Status of Payments Report for publicly released case files. The report contains a snapshot of all payments received and the outstanding balance of a given AF case. The new report has significantly streamlined the process of adding payment documentation to existing case files.

During the first quarter of FY 2018, the Audit Division processed the following audit reports:

The Audit Division has a total of 26 open audits. Two audits were referred to the Office of General Counsel this quarter (Conservative Majority Fund and Illinois Republican Party). One Audit Hearing was requested and granted for February 8, 2018 (McSally for Congress).

Audit circulated and the Commission approved a total of eight Unauthorized Audits for the 2016 cycle. Five of these audits have received the preliminary records for fieldwork and two have recently been notified of the audits. The 2016 Unauthorized Audit Program. Materiality Thresholds and Error Definitions were approved.

With respect to the Presidential Election Campaign Fund (PECF), the Audit Division continues to post the pertinent portion of the monthly PECF reports to the Commission website. Further, in December 2017, the Audit Division prepared the budgetary calculations for the PECF's fiscal years 2018 through 2028. The Commission subsequently approved the

calculations. The Audit Division also updated the list of the Commission's authorized signatories for the calendar year 2018 and provided it to the Secretary of the U.S. Treasury. Finally, to account for the regulatory changes applicable to public financing, the Audit Division proposed edits to the document 'Proposed Revisions to FEC Directive on Convention and General Election Certification Procedures –LRA 1052'. This document was circulated on June 28, 2017 to the Commission and is awaiting Commission approval.

Audit staff continues to collaborate with OCIO on the testing and design of the Audit Report Search System (ARSS) for the FEC website. Audit also participated in discussions concerning the LRAT working group for the upcoming move. All Audit managers completed management training courses to fulfill the 3 year OPM requirement, and also completed the OPM Leadership 360 assessments and briefings.

Additionally, a joint task force has been created with the Office of Compliance Advice in OGC to jointly develop initiatives in the processing of audits.

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the first quarter of FY 2018, RAD focused heavily on training opportunities for staff and managers. All RAD managers completed management training courses to fulfill the 3 year OPM requirement, and several RAD managers attended the in-house Diversity/Engagement training sessions. RAD management coordinated additional professional development opportunities for staff including, a Strength Finders training session which focused on developing individual strengths, and a Rescue Bear Team Event, where team members worked together to solve problems in order to acquire materials to build teddy hears for children who have been through traumatic events. RAD also held two overview sessions for staff with OGC – Compliance Advice Team and the Electronic Filing Office.

RAD staff reviewed a total of 14,322 documents totaling 13,237,752 pages during the first quarter of FY 2018 and 89.02% of the reports were reviewed within 90 days of receipt for the current election cycle (Appendix A, page 15). RAD generated and sent 1,548 letters to the filing community during the first quarter and for FY 2018, 90% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report review date (Appendix A, page 17). Also during the first quarter, RAD generated 13 referrals (5 OGC, 7 ADRO, 1 Deht Settlement) and sent 207 non-filer notices. Finally, during the first quarter, the Reports Processing Branch coded 4,970,919 transactions and 1,527 documents and processed 154,757 pages from 1,450 documents in the Paper Automation system.

RAD welcomed a new Secretary during the first quarter and filled two (2) Senior Campaign Finance & Reviewing Analyst (GS-12) promotion positions. In addition, upon receiving approval, RAD made selections to fill four (4) Campaign Finance Analyst (CFA) positions and we expect these new analysts to begin in February. RAD is working with OHR on the posting to fill the Assistant Branch Chief position on the Authorized Branch that was vacated due to a staff transfer to the Staff Director's Office. We expect to have this position filled internally by mid-Fehruary and will backfill the previously approved GS-12 position vacated as

result, shortly thereafter. Finally, one (1) CFA resigned during the quarter and one (1) Data Disclosure Assistant announced retirement plans. As a result, we will be seeking Commission approval to back fill these positions, as well as three (3) additional GS-7 CFA positions vacated by the GS-12 promotions.

Finally, during the first quarter, RAD collaborated with others within the agency on several projects. RAD staff assisted the Information Division with the review of the 2018 Federal Election Activity timeframes, Record articles, Tips for Treasurers, and the reporting sections for the revised Corporate & Labor Campaign Guide. RAD staff was very active during the first quarter on committees associated with the move, including the Furniture committee, the Clean-up committee, and the Records Management/Clean-up effort. In addition, RAD staff represented the Office of Compliance in negotiations with the Union for seat selection.

Status of Compliance – Fiscal Year 2018 – 2nd Quarter Highlights (1/1/18 –

3/31/18) & FY Statistical Overview

The Office of Compliance (Compliance) submits this memorandum to provide the Commission with a snapshot of accomplishments and highlights for the second quarter (1/1/18 -3/31/18) and 2018 fiscal year statistical overview. The intent of this document is to proactively provide an update of the workload and achieved results of the Office of Compliance on a The Status of Compliance and the Directive 68 (Statute of Limitations) documents are scheduled to be discussed during an upcoming Executive Session.

The attached Appendix A provides the Commission with second quarter highlights for each office and also a statistical overview of FY 2018 results and progression towards meeting the 2014-2019 Strategic Performance Goals adopted by the Commission. Appendix B provides an overview of all open audits and their respective stages within the audit process. Appendix C is an Audit Report entitled 'Proposed Final Audit Report — Due Date' which highlights the report manager, stage, phase, pre-audit start date, fieldwork begin date and the date the Proposed Final Audit Report must be approved in order to meet the current Strategic Plan goal. Appendix D (ADRO Civil Penalty Report) highlights civil penalties assessed, paid and an overview of non-monetary terms to include date due and completed. Appendix E (AF Performance Goals Report) shows FY 2018 statistics for meeting strategic performance goals related to the Administrative Fine Program. Please note, additional audit reports are also available within the (b) (7)(E)

As always, we welcome any feedback or suggestions that could be incorporated to enhance the presentation of the information contained within the overview.

Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO)

In the second quarter of FY 2018, the ADRO received 7 cases (4 from RAD, 1 from Audit, and 2 from OGC). During this time period, the ADRO closed a total of 15 cases, 14 with approved negotiated settlements and 1 case in which the Commission approved dismissal. In the second quarter of FY 2018, the Commission assessed \$83,840 in civil penalties through approved negotiated settlements, and the office collected \$27,577.

(b) (7)(E)

The ADRO continued to work with the Office of Chief Information Officer (OCIO) regarding the upgrade of the case management system (Law Manager). Work was completed on integrating automated mail merge technology with the system during the previous quarter and minor adjustments to documents were made during this quarter.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the second quarter of FY 2018, the Commission processed 2 Reason to Believe (RTB) findings. OAR received 1 challenge and processed 1 Reviewing Officer Recommendations (RORs). The Commission reviewed final determination recommendations in 9 cases, and made a final determination that the respondents in these cases violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assessed penalties totaling \$57,319. The Commission also collected \$44,937.23 in tine payments and prepared 21 cases for public release.

Additionally, the Office of Administrative Review (OAR) forwarded 100% of RORs within 60 days of receipt of each challenge, thus exceeding its strategic goal of processing 75% of RORs within 60 days (Appendix E).

During the second quarter, the Reviewing Officer began working with Pay.gov and OGC to expand the electronic payment option to those respondents involved in OGC enforcement matters. Consistent with what is already available to respondents in AF and ADR matters, the new OGC Electronic Payment System will give respondents the option to pay a civil money penalty by debit or credit card, or automated clearing house (ACH) withdrawal on Pay.gov. The new service is currently in the testing phase and is scheduled to deploy in the third quarter.

The Audit Division has a total of 23 open audits. One Audit Hearing was held in February (McSally for Congress).

The Commission approved a total of eight Unauthorized Audits for the 2016 cycle. Four of these audits have started fieldwork, one is awaiting the committee response to the exit conference and for one, a Final audit report has been approved. The remaining two audits are in the pre-audit phase with fieldwork planned to commence in May and June.

With respect to the Presidential Election Campaign Fund (PECF), the Audit Division continues to post the pertinent portion of the monthly PECF reports to the Commission website. Further, in preparation for the annual budgetary calculations for the PECF's fiscal years 2019 through 2029, the Audit Division reached out to its liaison at the Bureau of Labor Statistics and requested certain statistical information pertaining to the Consumer Price Index. Finally, to account for the regulatory changes applicable to public financing, the Audit Division proposed edits to the document 'Proposed Revisions to FEC Directive on Convention and General Election Certification Procedures –LRA 1052'. This document was circulated on June 28, 2017 to the Commission and is awaiting Commission approval.

Audit staff continues to collaborate with OCIO on the testing and design of the Audit Report Search System (ARSS) for the FEC website. Additionally, a joint task force has been created with the Office of Compliance Advice in OGC to develop initiatives in the processing of audits. The Audit Division is currently working with OHR to update auditor performance standards. Audit currently is down eight FTE's, including a manager position which was vacated on February 2, 2018.

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the second quarter of FY 2018, RAD committed significant resources to preparing the division for the building move. RAD staff worked with the Commission Secretary and other FEC personnel to update RAD's records schedules and to gain permission from the National Archives (NARA) to consider RAD's paper records media neutral, due to the availability of electronic versions. This allowed RAD to dispose of the paper reports/documents from the 2013-2014 election cycle prior to the move and will continue to save the FEC both time and money after each election cycle, no longer requiring documents to be packed up in boxes and archived for a fee.

RAD staff reviewed a total of 17,294 documents totaling 10,645,448 pages during the second quarter of FY 2018 and 93% of the reports were reviewed within 90 days of receipt for the current election cycle. RAD generated and sent 2,109 letters to the filing community during the second quarter and for FY 2018, 92% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report review date. Also during the second quarter, RAD generated 16 referrals (12 OGC, 4 ADRO) and sent 1,434 non-filer notices where the Commission approved recommendations to publish 11 authorized committees for failure to timely file an election-sensitive report. Finally, during the second quarter, the Reports Processing Branch coded 10,772,849 transactions and 2,275 documents and processed 194,069 pages from 2,214 documents in the Paper Automation system.

RAD filled an Assistant Branch Chief position on the Authorized Branch, one (1) Senior Campaign Finance & Reviewing Analyst (GS-12) promotion position, and welcomed four (4) Campaign Finance Analysts (CFA) during the second quarter. We recently received approval to back fill a Data Disclosure Assistant position, three (3) additional GS-7 CFA positions, and a GS-12 promotion and will move to fill these positions as quickly as possible.

Finally, RAD collaborated with OCIO on the development and implementation of a quality of review tracking tool for managers designed to ensure the consistent review of reports and to identify areas where additional training may be needed. In addition, RAD implemented an automated system for identifying and contacting committees eligible for Administrative Termination. This system will save time and money, no longer requiring the process to be conducted manually or the sending of letters via USPS.

6/30/18) & FY Statistical Overview

The Office of Compliance (Compliance) submits this memorandum to provide the Commission with a snapshot of accomplishments and highlights for the third quarter (4/1/18 – 6/30/18) and 2018 fiscal year statistical overview. The intent of this document is to provide an update of the workload and achieved results of the Office of Compliance on a quarterly basis. The Status of Compliance and the Directive 68 (Statute of Limitations) documents are scheduled to be discussed during an upcoming Executive Session.

The attached **Appendix A** provides the Commission with third quarter highlights for each office and also a statistical overview of FY 2018 results and progression towards meeting the 2014-2019 Strategic Performance Goals adopted by the Commission. **Appendix B** provides an overview of all open audits and their respective stages within the audit process. **Appendix C** is an Audit Report entitled 'Proposed Final Audit Report — Due Date' which highlights the report manager, stage, phase, pre-audit start date, fieldwork begin date and the date the Proposed Final Audit Report must be approved in order to meet the current Strategic Plan goal. **Appendix D** (ADRO Civil Penalty Report) highlights civil penalties assessed, paid and an overview of non-monetary terms to include date due and completed. **Appendix E** (AF Performance Goals Report) shows FY 2018 statistics for meeting strategic performance goals related to the Administrative Fine Program. Please note, additional audit materials are also available (b) (7)(E)

As always, we welcome any feedback or suggestions that could be incorporated to enhance the presentation of the information contained within the overview.

Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO)

In the third quarter of FY 2018, the ADRO received 11 cases (3 from RAD, 1 from Audit, 5 from OGC, and 1 from the Commission). During this time period, the ADRO closed a total of 8 cases, 5 with approved negotiated settlements, 2 matters transferred to OGC, and 1 case in which the Commission approved dismissal. In the third quarter of FY 2018, the Commission assessed \$25,075 in civil penalties through approved negotiated settlements, and the office collected \$69,915.

(b) (7)(E)

At the end of the third quarter, during the Executive Session on June 26th, the Commission authorized ADRO to make contact with 6 committees who were the subject of outstanding 2014 election cycle audits and offer an opportunity to participate in the ADR process and terminate the audit process. At the start of the fourth quarter, all 6 committees elected to participate in ADR. Per the direction of the Commission, the ADRO Director is working with staff from RAD, Audit, and Info to develop and implement a new educational program tailored to each committee.

ADRO received approval to post for a GS-13/14 ADR Specialist position to back fill the position previously occupied by the Director.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the third quarter of FY 2018, the Commission processed 46 Reason to Believe (RTB) findings. OAR received 1 challenge and processed 1 Reviewing Officer Recommendations (RORs). The Commission reviewed final determination recommendations in 2 cases, made a final determination that the respondents in 1 case violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assessed no penalties. The Commission also collected \$2,420 in fine payments and prepared 1 case for public release.

(b) (7)(E) Additionally, the Office of Administrative Review (OAR) forwarded R0% of RORs within 60 days of receipt of each challenge, thus exceeding its strategic goal of processing 75% of RORs within 60 days (Appendix E).

During the third quarter, the Reviewing Officer worked with Pay,gov to successfully deploy the OGC Electronic Payment System and also provided assistance to ADRO to handle an increased caseload.

Audit Division

During the third quarter of FY 2018, the Audit Division processed the following audit reports:

The Audit Division has a total of 14 open audits.

The Commission approved a total of eight Unauthorized Audits for the 2016 cycle. Pive of these audits are in the fieldwork stage, one is awaiting the committee response to the exit conference, one is in OGC and one Final audit report has been approved.

With respect to the Presidential Election Campaign Fund (PECF), the Audit Division continues to post the pertinent portion of the monthly PECF reports to the Commission website. Further, in preparation for the annual budgetary calculations for the PECF's fiscal years 2019 through 2029, the Audit Division reached out to its liaison at the Bureau of Labor Statistics and requested statistical information pertaining to the Consumer Price Index. Finally, to account for the regulatory changes applicable to public financing, the Audit Division proposed edits to the document 'Proposed Revisions to FEC Directive on Convention and General Election Certification Procedures (LRA 1052). This document was circulated on June 28, 2017 to the Commission and is awaiting Commission approval.

Audit staff continues to collaborate with OCIO on the testing and design of the Audit Report Search System (ARSS) for the FEC website. Additionally, a joint task force with the Office of Compliance Advice in OGC continues to meet to develop initiatives in the processing of audits. The division also continues to ensure that less tenured staff members are attending training and mentoring sessions so that skill gaps are minimized with the possible retirement of tenured auditors.

The Division has held numerous meetings with the Commission to review internal policies and procedures. (b) (5)

(b) (5) On June

26, 2018, the Commission approved that all open 2014 cases be transferred to the ADRO. This has allowed audit staff to focus exclusively on the 2016 audits to ensure that the strategic goal concerning turnaround time is achieved.

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the third quarter of FY 2018, RAD collaborated with several other divisions within the agency on projects and initiatives. (b) (5)

(b) (5) In addition, RAD offered input and suggestions for revisions to the OGC Enforcement Priority Rating Sheet, and collaborated with the Information Division, Public Disclosure and OCIO on proposed revisions to Directive 1 to be circulated to the Commission for approval during the next quarter.

RAD staff reviewed a total of 24,231 documents totaling 14,255,582 pages during the third quarter of FY 2018 and 95% of the reports were reviewed within 90 days of receipt for the current election cycle. RAD generated and sent 5,298 letters to the filling community during the third quarter and for FY 2018, 86% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report review date. Also during the third quarter, RAD generated 10 referrals (5 OGC, 3 ADRO, 1 AF, 1 Debt Settlement Plan) and sent 900 non-filer notices where the Commission approved recommendations to publish 35 authorized committees for failure to timely file an election-sensitive report. Finally, during the third quarter, the Reports Processing Branch coded 7,877,875 transactions and 2,829 documents and processed 279,177 pages from 2,749 documents in the Paper Automation system.

RAD filled one (1) Senior Campaign Finance & Reviewing Analyst (GS-12) promotion position and has received approval to back fill a Data Disclosure Assistant position and five (5) GS-7 Campaign Finance Analyst (CFA) positions. The vacancy announcement was recently posted for the CFA positions and we intend to fill these positions as quickly as possible after the announcement closes on August 9. In addition, we had two additional CFA resignations during the third quarter and are awaiting Commission approval to fill these positions. We would like to utilize the current posting to fill these positions if approval is granted.

Finally, RAD continued its collaborative relationship with OCIO during the third quarter. A RAD staff member served on the selection panel for the Electronic Filing redesign contract. In addition, a RAD staff member served as a content manager for the FEC website and several staff members assisted with the development of reporting examples for the website.

Status of Compliance – Fiscal Year 2018 – 4th Quarter Highlights (7/1/18 –

9/30/18) & FY Statistical Overview

The Office of Compliance (Compliance) submits this memorandum to provide the Commission with a snapshot of accomplishments and highlights for the fourth quarter (7/1/18 – 9/30/18) and 2018 fiscal year statistical overview. The intent of this document is to provide an update of the workload and achieved results of the Office of Compliance on a quarterly basis. The Status of Compliance and the Directive 68 (Statute of Limitations) documents are scheduled to be discussed during an upcoming Executive Session.

The attached **Appendix A** provides the Commission with fourth quarter highlights for each office and also a statistical overview of FY 2018 results and progression towards meeting the 2014-2019 Strategic Performance Goals adopted by the Commission. **Appendix B** provides an overview of all open audits and their respective stages within the audit process. **Appendix C** is an Audit Report entitled 'Proposed Final Audit Report — Due Date' which highlights the report manager, stage, phase, pre-audit start date, fieldwork begin date and the date the Proposed Final Audit Report must be approved in order to meet the current Strategic Plan goal. **Appendix D** (ADRO Civil Penalty Report) highlights civil penalties assessed, paid and an overview of nonmonetary terms to include date due and completed. **Appendix E** (AF Performance Goals Report) shows FY 2018 statistics for meeting strategic performance goals related to the Administrative Fine Program. Please note, additional audit materials are also available (b) (7)(E)

As always, we welcome any feedback or suggestions that could be incorporated to enhance the presentation of the information contained within the overview.

Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO)

In the fourth quarter of FY 2018, the ADRO received 13 cases (1 from RAD, 1 from Audit, 5 from OGC, and 6 from the Commission). During this time period, the ADRO closed a total of 10 cases, all with approved negotiated settlements. In the fourth quarter of FY 2018, the Commission assessed \$35,475 in civil penalties through approved negotiated settlements, and the office collected \$34,275.

At the start of the fourth quarter, all 6 committees elected to participate in ADR. Per the direction of the Commission, the ADRO Director is working with staff from RAD, Audit, Info and OGC to develop and implement a new educational program tailored to each committee. It is expected that during the first quarter of FY 2019 these agreements will circulate for Commission approval.

During the fourth quarter, ADRO selected an Assistant Director candidate, Ms. Rosa Marshall, to back fill the position previously occupied by the Director. Ms. Marshall transitioned from RAD to ADRO early in FY 2019.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the fourth quarter of FY 2018, the Commission processed 41 Reason to Believe (RTB) findings. OAR received 2 challenges and processed 1 Reviewing Officer Recommendation (ROR). The Commission reviewed final determination recommendations in 6 cases, made a final determination that the respondents in 5 cases violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assessed \$29,739

in civil penalties. The Commission also collected \$24,411 in fine payments, transferred 4 cases to the Department of the Treasury for debt collection, and prepared 6 cases for public release.

(b) (7)(E) Additionally, OAR forwarded 100% of RORs within 60 days of receipt of each challenge, thus exceeding its strategic goal of processing 75% of RORs within 60 days (Appendix E).

During the fourth quarter, the Reviewing Officer worked with the Information Division and Pay.gov to successfully develop and deploy the FEC Training Electronic Payment System, participated on hiring panels, and also provided assistance to ADRO to handle an increased caseload.

The Audit Division has a total of 12 open audits. Eight of these audits are Unauthorized committees, four are authorized and one is a Title 26 presidential committee.

Three of these audits are awaiting committee responses, four are in the report writing stage, four are with OGC, and one is awaiting a Commission vote.

With respect to the Presidential Election Campaign Fund (PECF), the Audit Division continued posting the monthly PECF reports to FEC website. Further, on October 10, 2018, Audit received the yearly request for the PECF budgetary expenditures and collections (FY2019-29) from the U.S. Treasury. Audit coordinated with the Treasury liaison to finalize the calculations and discussed the preliminary results with OGC. This document is scheduled to be

circulated to the Commissioners in mid-November. The proposed revisions to the FEC Directive on Convention and General Election Certification Procedures (LRA 1052) is awaiting Commission approval (circulated on June 28, 2017.)

Audit has assigned staff to several internal projects initiated to improve efficiency and quality of its work product. The Division also continues to focus on turnaround times to ensure that the average time for key stages within the audit process are as efficient as possible. (b) (7)(E)

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the fourth quarter of FY 2018, RAD collaborated with several other divisions within the agency on projects and initiatives. RAD was part of a working group with OGC, OCIO, the Press Office, the Information Division and Congressional Affairs that developed a plan and guidance upon enactment of the law that made the FEC the point of entry for Senate filers. In addition, RAD collaborated with OCIO on phase one of the Electronic Filing Project, providing user stories and system requirements. RAD also collaborated with ADRO, the Audit Division, and the Information Division on the 2014 Audit/ADRO Education initiative, where negotiated settlement agreements are in the process of being developed, as well as corrective action and training plans.

RAD staff reviewed a total of 26,462 documents totaling 10,132,999 pages during the fourth quarter of FY 2018 and 90% of the reports were reviewed within 90 days of receipt for the current election cycle. RAD generated and sent 2,446 letters to the filing community during the fourth quarter and for FY 2018, 91% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report review date. Also during the fourth quarter, RAD generated 7 referrals (6 OGC, 1 ADRO) and sent 931 non-filer notices where the Commission approved recommendations to publish 28 authorized committees for failure to timely file an election-sensitive report. Finally, during the fourth quarter, the Reports Processing Branch coded 7,248,185 transactions, 2,498 documents and processed 274,569 pages from 2,409 documents in the Paper Automation system.

RAD is currently in the process of back filling several positions. Interviews are currently being conducted to fill seven (7) GS-7 Campaign Finance Analyst (CFA) positions, one (1) Senior Campaign Finance & Reviewing Analyst (GS-12) promotion position, and a Data Disclosure

Assistant position (GS-8). In addition, a vacancy announcement was recently posted to fill an Assistant Branch Chief position on the Party/Non-Party branch which was vacated due to a transfer to ADRO. Further, given a recent resignation, we will be seeking approval to backfill additional GS-12 and GS-7 CFA positions.

Finally, RAD developed recommendations for the 2019-2020 RAD Review and Referral Procedures during the fourth quarter. Our proposed recommendations include feedback from OGC, ADRO end the Audit Division. The document has been sent to Commission Offices for review and comment and we plan to request that it he added to the November 14th Executive Session agenda with the goal of Commission approval before the end of the year.

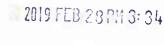

12/31/18) & FY Statistical Overview

The Office of Compliance (Compliance) submits this memorandum to provide the Commission with a snapshot of accomplishments and highlights for the 1st quarter FY 2019 (10/1/18 - 12/31/18) and fiscal year statistical overview. The intent of this document is to provide an update of the workload and achieved results of the Office of Compliance on a quarterly basis. The Status of Compliance and the Directive 68 (Statute of Limitations) documents are scheduled to be discussed during an upcoming Executive Session.

The attached Appendix A provides the Commission with first quarter highlights for each office and also a statistical overview of FY 2019 results and progression towards meeting the 2014-2019 Strategic Performance Goals adopted by the Commission. Appendix B provides an overview of all open audits and their respective stages within the audit process. Appendix C is an Audit Report entitled 'Proposed Final Audit Report - Due Date' which highlights the report manager, stage, phase, pre-audit start date, fieldwork begin date and the date the Proposed Final Audit Report must be approved in order to meet the current Strategic Plan goal. Appendix D (ADRO Civil Penalty Report) highlights civil penalties assessed, paid and an everview of non-monetary terms to include date due and completed. Appendix E (AF Performance Grals Report) shows FY 2019 statistics for meeting strategic performance goals related to the Administrative Fine Program. Appendix F (AF Penalties Assessed and Collected) shows the total amount of penalties assessed and collection rate for FY 2015—2019. Please note, additional audit materials are also available (b) (7)(E)

As always, we welcome any feedback or suggestions that could be incorporated to enhance the presentation of the information contained within the overview.

Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO)

In the first quarter of FY 2019, the ADRO received 7 cases (2 from RAD, 4 from OGC, and 1 from the Commission). During this time period, the ADRO closed a total of 8 cases, all with approved negotiated settlements. In the first quarter of FY 2019, the Commission assessed \$15,550 in civil penalties through approved negotiated settlements, and the office collected \$13,150.

(b) (7)(E)

During FY 2018, the Commission authorized ADRO to make contact with 6 committees who were the subject of outstanding 2014 election cycle audits and effer an opportunity to participate in the ADR process and terminate the audit process. All 6 committees elected to participate in ADR, ADRO worked with staff from RAD, Audit, Info and OGC to develop and implement a new educational program tailored to each committee. During the first quarter of FY 2019 the Negotiated Settlements were circulated to the Commission for approval.

During the first quarter, ADRO filled the position of Assistant Director, to backfill the position previously occupied by the Director, Additionally, ADRO posted for the position of ADR Specialist (GS-11/12) to assist the office in processing its caseload and enhancing its operational efficiency. That position will be filled during the second quarter of FY 2019.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the first quarter of FY 2019, the Commission processed 83 Reason to Believe (RTB) findings. OAR received 6 challenges and processed 5 Reviewing Officer Recommendations (RDR). The Commission reviewed final determination recommendations in 15 cases, made a final determination that the respondents in all 15 cases violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a), and assessed \$61,636 in civil penalties. The Commission also collected \$73,766 in fine payments and prepared 16 cases for public release.

Additionally, OAR forwarded 100%

of RORs within 60 days of receipt of each challenge, thus exceeding its strategic goal of processing. 75% of RORs within 60 days (Appendix E).

During the first quarter, the Reviewing Officer worked with OCIO and OCFO to enhance financial reports to accommodate OCFO reporting requirements and increase efficiency in reconciliation. The Reviewing Officer also participated on biring panels and provided assistance to ADRO to bandle an increased caseload.

Audit Division

During the first quarter of FY 2019, the Audit Division processed the following audit reports:

The Audit Division has a total of 10 open audits. Seven of these audits are unauthorized committees, two are authorized and one is a Title 26 presidential committee. Additionally, during the Γ^{c} quarter the number of reports processed by the audit division doubled from the last quarter.

Two audits are awaiting committee responses, four are in the report writing stage, two are with OGC, and two are awaiting a Commission vote.

As of Tehneary 8, 2019, the Audit Division no longer has an Assistant Staff Director. Management staff is reporting directly to the Chief Compliance Officer until a long term plan is presented and approved by the Commission.

With respect to the Presidential Election Compaign Fund (PECF), the Audit Division continued forwarding the monthly PECF reports received from the 1.S. Treasury, to the Information Technology Division for web placement. Further, in November 2018, the Audit Division prepared the budgetary calculations for the PECF's fiscal years 2019 through 2029. The Commission subsequently approved the calculations and the Audit Division formally responded to the U.S. Treasury on November 27, 2018. The Audit Division updated the list of the

Commission's authorized signatories for the calendar year 2019 and provided it to the Secretary of the U.S. Treasury. The Audit Division is in the process of updating the Federal Register notice regarding the submission dates for the 2020 presidential cycle.

The proposed revisions to the FEC Directive 23 on Convention and General Election Certification Procedures (LRA 1052) is still awaiting Commission approval (circulated on June 28, 2017.)

The Audit Division remains focused on turnaround times to ensure that the average time for key stages within the audit process are as efficient as possible. (b) (7)(E)

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the first quarter of FY 2019, RAD collaborated with OGC and Commission Offices on guidance for the filing community following the *CREW v. FEC* decision. The guidance was issued as a press release and has since been added to the "Other Filers" section of the FEC website. In addition, RAD continued its collaboration with the Information Division on the development of reporting examples for the website, completing reporting examples for various Independent Expenditure scenarios during the quarter. Further, RAD continued to partner with ADRO, the Audit Division, and the Information Division on the 2014 Audit/ADRO Education initiative, assisting with the development of tailored training plans which were included in the Negotiated Settlements for the six committees. The settlements were circulated to the Commission for approval during the first quarter.

RAD staff reviewed a total of 24,267 documents totaling 7,952,625 pages during the first quarter of FY 2019 and 95.6% of the reports were reviewed within 90 days of receipt for the current election cycle. RAD generated and sent 2,155 letters to the filing community during the

thist quarter and 88% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report review date. Also during the first quarter, RAD generated 6 referrals (LOGC, 2 ADRO, 3 Administrative hines) and sent 1,860 non-tiler notices where the Commission approved recommendations to publish 49 authorized committees for failure to timely file an election-sensitive report. Finally, during the first quarter, the Reports Processing Branch coded 9,907,405 transactions, 1,984 documents and processed 19,706 pages from 1,920 documents in the Paper Automation system.

RAD managers spent a substantial amount of time on recruitment during the first quarter. We recently welcomed five new Campaign Finance Analysts (CFA), filled two Senior Campaign Finance & Reviewing Analyst (GS-12) promotion positions, a Data Disclosure Assistant position, an Assistant Branch Chief position on the Party/Non-Party Branch, and a detail for the Supervisory Training and Program Manager position vacated by a detail to another office. Further, due to a recent resignation and a transfer to ADRO, we will be seeking approval to backfill additional GS-12 and GS-7 CFA positions.

Finally, during the first quarter RAD received Commission approval of proposed recommendations for the 2019-2020 RAD Review and Referral Procedures. We are currently in the process of finishing up the review from the 2018 cycle and making audit referral assessments after experiencing a back log due to the sautdown. We anticipate beginning 2019-2020 cycle review in April, if not sooner.

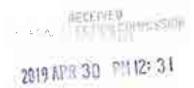

In the second quarter of FY 2019, the ADRO received 13 cases (6 from the Reports Analysis Division (RAD), 4 from the Office of General Counsel (OGC), and 3 from the Audit Division (Audit)). During this time period, the ADRO closed a total of 15 cases, 12 with approved negotiated settlements, 2 with approved recommendations to dismiss, and 1 in which the Commission did not approve the recommendation to dismiss. In the second quarter of FY 2019, the Commission assessed \$125,500 in civil penalties through approved negotiated settlements, and the office collected \$65,450.

During FY 2018, the Commission authorized ADRO to make contact with 6 committees who were the subject of outstanding 2014 election cycle audits and offer an apportunity to participate in the ADR process and terminate the audit process. All 6 committees elected to participate in ADR. ADRO worked with staff from RAD, Audit, Information Division (Information) and OGC to develop and implement a new educational program tailored to each committee. During the second quarter of FY 2019, the Negotiated Settlements were approved by the Commission, and ADR staff began to develop and coordinate tailored educational sessions for each committee.

During the second quarter, ADRO conducted interviews for and filled the position of ADR Specialist (GS-11/12) to assist the office with managing its caseload and enhancing its operational efficiency.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the second quarter of FY 2019, the Commission processed 96 Reason to Believe (RTB) findings. OAR received 14 challenges and processed 12 Reviewing Officer Recommendations (ROR). The Commission reviewed final determination recommendations in 2 cases, made a final determination that the respondents in these cases violated

52 U.S.C. § 50104(a), and assessed \$7,550 in civil penalties. The Commission also collected \$63,662 in fine payments and prepared 2 cases for public release.

Audit has a total of 11 open audits. Seven of these audits are unauthorized committees and four are authorized committees. The four authorized audits are in the pre-audit stage. The Commission approved these committees for audit on April 23, 2019. Audit Notification Letters were sent to the committees on April 25, 2019. The unauthorized committees are pudits from the 2016 election cycle—of these, one audit is in the interim report writing stage, three audits are awaiting committee responses, one audit is the draft final report writing stage, one audit is in the proposed report writing stage and one audit is with the Commission awaiting approval.

Audit remains focused on turnaround times to ensure that the average time for key stages within the aedit process are as efficient as possible. In fact, the division has completed and publically released all 2016 Authorized and fittle 26 Presidential audits. Audit has been able to reduce pre-audit, fieldwork and interim audit report writing turnaround times for the 2016 Title 52.

With respect to the Presidential Election Campaign Fund (PECF), Audit continued forwarding the monthly PECF reports received from the U.S. Treasury, to the Office of Chief Information Officer (OCIO) for web placement. Audit consulted the OGC's Compliance Advice Feam and finalized updates to the Federal Register notice regarding the submission dates for the 2020 presidential cycle.

Audit staff attended annual training for the FEC Audit Division Quality Standards on February 27, 2019. Additionally, Audit management identified core training conspetencies and oversaw training and completion of Continuing Professional Education requirements during the quarter.

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the second quarter of FY 2019, RAD collaborated with OCIO and Information on the development of an "Other Filers" section of the PEC website. We are corrently working on developing reporting securities for nationwide IEs to be posted in the near future. Further, RAD partnered with the Plectronic Filing Office on updates to the Password Assignment System to increase security measures. The updated system was rolled out in April and all electronic filers were notified via granil.

RAD staff reviewed a total of 27,913 documents totaling 4,880,784 pages during the second quarter of FY 2019 and 86,6% of the reports were reviewed within 90 days of receipt for the 2018 election cycle. RAD generated and sent 2,285 letters to the filling community and 80% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report review date. Also during the second quarter, RAD generated 11 referrals (6 ADRO, 5 Administrative Fines) and sent 984 non-filer notices. Finally, during the second quarter, the Reports Processing Branch coded 5,566,577 transactions, 1,429 documents and processed 12,549 pages from 1,359 documents in the Paper Automation system.

RAD welcomed six new Campaign Finance Analysts (CFA) during the second quarters bowever, we currently have six CFA vacancies. In addition, one CFA is on a detail to the OCFO

and another is an administrative leave. We were previously approved to fill four CFA positions, but were unable to fill three of them with our last posting and we lost one candidate due to the shutdown. Further, due to a recent CFA resignation, and a CFA transfer to ADRO, we recently requested approval to fill two additional vacancies. We intend to post again in the near future and would like to be able to fill all of the CFA vacancies so we are fully staffed for the 2020 election cycle.

Finally, despite a staff shortage and losing a month as a result of the shutdown, RAD staff worked hard to meet its goal of sending audit referrals to Audit timely, in order to meet the statutory requirement of commencing the audits within 6 months of the general election. We are in the process of finishing up the review from the 2018 cycle and will be making audit referral assessments for party committees and PACs during the next quarter.

6/30/19) & FY Statistical Overview

The Office of Compliance (Compliance) submits this memorandum to provide the Commission with a snapshot of accomplishments and highlights for the 3rd quarter FY 2019 (4/1/19 - 6/30/19) and fiscal year statistical overview. The intent of this document is to provide an update of the workload and achieved results of the Office of Compliance on a quarterly basis. The Status of Compliance and the Directive 68 (Statute of Limitations) documents are scheduled to be discussed during an upcoming Executive Session.

The attached Appendix A provides the Commission with third quarter highlights for each office and also a statistical overview of FY 2019 results and progression towards meeting the goals outlined within the 2018-2022 Strategic Plan adopted by the Commission. Appendix B provides an overview of all open audits and their respective stages within the audit process. Appendix C is an Audit Report entitled 'Proposed Final Audit Report. – Due Date' which highlights the report manager, stage, phase, pre-audit start date, fieldwork begin date and the date the Proposed Final Audit Report must be approved in order to meet the current Strategic Plan goal. Appendix D (ADRO Civil Penalty Report) highlights civil penalties assessed, paid and an overview of non-monetary terms to include date due and completed. Appendix E (AF Performance Goals Report) shows FY 2019 statisties for meeting strategic performance goals related to the Administrative Fine Program. Appendix F (AF Penalties Assessed and Collected) shows the total amount of penalties assessed and collection rate for FY 2015 – 2019. Please note, additional materials concerning the Audit Division are also available(b) (7)(E)

As always, we welcome any feedback or suggestions that could be incorporated to enhance the presentation of the information contained within the overview.

Afternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO)

in the third quarter of FY 2019, the ADRO received 9 cases (4 from the Reports Analysis Division (RAD) and 5 from the Office of General Counsel (OGC)). During this time period, the ADRO closed a total of 6 cases, 5 with approved negotiated settlements and 1 with an approved recommendation to dismiss. In the third quarter of FY 2019, the Countrission assessed \$31,530 in civil penalties through approved negotiated settlements, and the office collected \$71,480 in penalties.

(b) (7)(E)

During FY 2018, the Commission authorized ADRO to make contact with 6 committees who were the subject of outstanding 2014 election cycle audits and offer an apportunity to participate in the ADR process and terminate the sudit process. All 6 committees elected to participate in the ADR process. ADRO worked with staff from RAD, Audit Division, Information Division (Information) and OGC to develop and implement a new educational program tailored to each committee. During the previous quarter, all Negotiated Settlements were approved by the Commission and ADR staff began to develop and coordinate tailored educational sessions for each committee. During this quarter, Commission staff provided the approved tailored training. Additionally, the Committees completed their corrective action plans. Finally, the civil penaltics were fully paid in 5 matters, with the remaining committee continuing to make payments under an approved payment plan.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the third quarter of FY 2019, the Commission processed 75 Reason to Believe (RTB) findings. OAR received 17 challenges and processed 15 Reviewing Officer Recommendations (ROR). The Commission reviewed final determination recommendations in

58 cases, made a final determination that the respondents in 54 cases violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a), and assessed \$142,519 in civil penalties. The Commission also collected \$147,873 in fine payments and prepared 53 cases for public release.

(b) (7)(E)

Additionally, OAR forwarded 100% of RORs within 60 days of receipt of each challenge, thus exceeding its strategic goal of processing 75% of RORs within 60 days (Appendix E).

During the third quarter of FY 2019, the Audit Division (Audit) processed the following audit reports:

Audit has a total of 9 open audits. Five of these audits are unauthorized committees and four audits are authorized committees. All of the unauthorized committees are from the 2016 election cycle. The authorized committees are from the 2018 election cycle.

Audit received the 2018 unauthorized referrals from RAD on July 12, 2019. A total of twenty committees met the criteria for referral to Audit. Additionally, the Commission approved the 2018 Unauthorized Audit Program, Materiality Thresholds and Error Definitions on July 25, 2019. In mid-August 2019, Audit will circulate a recommendation memo on how to best handle the referred 2018 unauthorized committees.

Of the remaining 2016 unauthorized committees, all but one, (b) (7)(E)

Of the remaining 2016 unauthorized

committees – two are at the DFAR stage; one is at the PFAR stage; one is at the ADRM stage and one is at the IAR stage.

Audit remains focused on turnaround times to ensure that the average time for key stages within the audit process are as efficient as possible. Audit has been able to reduce the overall time within the majority of audit stages.

(b) (7)(E)

With respect to the Presidential Election Campaign Fund (PECF), Audit continued forwarding the monthly PECF reports received from the U.S. Treasury, to the Office of Chief Information Officer (OCIO) for web placement. Audit circulated, and the Commission subsequently approved, the Federal Register notice regarding the submission dates for the 2020 presidential cycle. (b) (5)

Audit management has been working with OPM on updating the GS-12 and GS-13 performance standards for the Auditor position. This process will be completed before the end of the year. Audit was also invited to present at the California Political Treasurers Conference on August 8, 2019 in Washington, DC. Audit will lose one of its most tenured auditors to retirement at the end of August. As such, Audit will be requesting to hire two new auditors to backfill for this position and other forecasted retirements.

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the third quarter of FY 2019, RAD collaborated with OCIO and the Information Division on the development of party committee reporting scenarios and reporting scenarios for nationwide IEs. These reporting examples were posted on the website during the third quarter. We will continue to work on more complicated party committee reporting examples during the fourth quarter. In addition, RAD dedicated significant amount of time during the quarter collaborating with OCIO on the development of the NextGen efiling system, completing the development of Form 99 and currently focusing on the development of Form 3X. Also during the third quarter, the Reports Processing Branch transitioned from the Paper Automation System to an in-house Paper Conversion Process for paper filed reports, with RAD staff involved with both the development and implementation of this process.

RAD staff continued to feel the effects of the shutdown during the third quarter and worked diligently to get through the back log of the 2017-2018 cycle reports. Also during the third quarter, RAD began the review of 2019-2020 cycle reports. RAD staff reviewed a total of 19,638 documents totaling 16,960,873 pages during the third quarter of FY 2019 and 61% of the reports were reviewed within 90 days of receipt (2018 and 2020 election cycle reports). RAD generated and sent 2,099 letters to the filing community and 84% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report review date. Also during the third quarter, RAD generated 17 referrals (3 OGC, 4 ADRO, 6 Administrative Fines, and 4 Audit) and sent 356 non-filer notices. Finally, the Reports Processing Branch coded 2,260,320 transactions, 874 documents and processed 7,229 pages from 800 documents in the Paper Automation system.

RAD currently has six (6) Campaign Finance Analyst (CFA) vacancies, four (4) of which we have approval to fill and have recently posted. In addition, we have two (2) additional CFA vacancies, one CFA on a detail to the OCFO and another on administrative leave. We will be requesting approval to fill the additional CFA vacancies to ensure we are fully staffed for 2020. RAD worked with OPM to develop and finalize performance standards for the Data Disclosure Assistant positions, and to revise performance standards for the Secretary position. We are currently working on revising the Campaign Finance Analyst and Coding

Clerk performance standards with a goal of completing this process by the end of the year. RAD was invited to present at the California Political Treasurers Conference on August 8, 2019 in Washington, DC. RAD staff will conduct a Best Practices session followed by a "Meet Your Analyst" session.

Finally, RAD completed PAC and Party Committee audit referrals for the 2017-2018 election cycle during the third quarter and all referrals were sent to the Audit Division on July 14, 2019.

Status of Compliance – Fiscal Year 2019 – 4th Quarter Highlights (7/1/19 –

9/30/19) & FY Statistical Overview

The Office of Compliance (Compliance) submits this memorandum to provide the Commission with a snapshot of accomplishments and highlights for the 4th quarter FY 2019 (7/1/19 - 9/30/19) and fiscal year statistical overview. The intent of this document is to provide an update of the workload and achieved results of the Office of Compliance on a quarterly basis. The Status of Compliance and the Directive 68 (Statute of Limitations) documents are scheduled to be discussed during an upcoming Executive Session.

The attached **Appendix A** provides the Commission with fourth quarter highlights for each office and also a statistical overview of FY 2019 results and progression towards meeting the goals outlined within the 2018-2022 Strategic Plan adopted by the Commission. **Appendix B** provides an overview of all open audits and their respective stages within the audit process. **Appendix C** is an Audit Report entitled 'Proposed Final Audit Report – Due Date' which highlights the report manager, stage, phase, pre-audit start date, fieldwork begin date and the date the Proposed Final Audit Report must be approved in order to meet the current Strategic Plan goal. **Appendix D** (ADRO Civil Penalty Report) highlights civil penalties assessed, paid and an overview of nonmonetary terms to include date due and completed. **Appendix E** (AF Performance Goals Report) shows FY 2019 statistics for meeting strategic performance goals related to the Administrative Fine Program. **Appendix F** (AF Penalties Assessed and Collected) shows the total amount of penalties assessed and collection rate for FY 2015 – 2019. Please note, additional materials concerning the Audit Division are also available (b) (7)(E)

As always, we welcome any feedback or suggestions that could be incorporated to enhance the presentation of the information contained within the overview.

Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO)

In the fourth quarter of FY 2019, the ADRO received 22 cases (18 from the RAD and 4 from Audit). During this time period, the ADRO closed a total of 20 cases, 19 with approved negotiated settlements, 2 with approved recommendations to dismiss, and 1 that was returned to OGC. In the fourth quarter of FY 2019, the Commission assessed \$93,175 in civil penalties through approved negotiated settlements, and the office collected \$68,825 in penalties.

(b) (7)(E)

As detailed in the statistics provided above, ADRO's caseload is currently high. The 22 cases received in the fourth quarter represent a 212% increase, when compared with recent years. This upward trend continues as the ADRO received 9 new matters in the month of October. Additionally, 10 of the office's 36 active matters are audit eligible cases, which require significant processing time by ADRO staff. Despite the high caseload, the office remains focused on meeting its performance goals.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the fourth quarter of FY 2019, the Commission processed 8 Reason to Believe (RTB) findings. OAR received 1 challenge and processed 5 Reviewing Officer Recommendations (ROR). The Commission reviewed final determination recommendations in 56 cases, made a final determination that the respondents in 51 cases violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a), and assessed \$143,447 in civil penalties. The Commission also collected \$32,622 in fine payments and prepared 54 cases for public release.

(b) (7)(E)

(b) (7)(E) Additionally, OAR forwarded 100% of RORs within 60 days of receipt of each challenge, thus exceeding its strategic goal of processing 75% of RORs within 60 days (Appendix E).

In the fourth quarter, the Reviewing Officer also collaborated with ADRO, OGC, OCFO, and OCIO to design new financial reports for ADRO and OGC civil penalties. The reports meet OCFO and Treasury Report on Receivables requirements and will greatly streamline the monthly financial reporting process. The Reviewing Officer will train ADRO and OGC staff on the new reporting process in the first quarter of FY 2020 and continue to provide assistance as necessary.

Audit Division (Audit)

During the fourth quarter of FY 2019, the Audit Division (Audit) processed the following audit reports:

has a total of 18 open audits. Four of these audits are authorized committees and fourteen audits are unauthorized committees.

Two of the open audits are for the 2016 election cycle. One audit is in the Draft Final Audit Report stage and the second has been circulated to the Commission with a recommendation to transfer to the Alternative Dispute Resolution Office for further processing.

The remaining 16 open audits are for the 2018 election cycle. Four audits are for authorized committees, each of which have completed fieldwork and are now preparing for exit conferences. On September 27, 2019, the Commission approved the audit of 12 unauthorized committees for

the 2018 cycle. Audit Notification Letters were sent to each committee on October 2nd and preaudit work has commenced as auditors have begun reviewing and analyzing preliminary records.

The Audit Division received several inquiries from unauthorized committees regarding the Commission's authorization of the audits on September 27th, after Commissioner-Petersen's September 1st departure and, when requested, Audit provided the committees with a redacted copy of the vote certification. One such committee also submitted a Request for Legal Consideration to the Commission on this issue.

Although the Commission currently lacks the quorum needed to vote on the reports that are prepared in accordance with the various stages of the audit process, the Audit Division remains committed to efficient turnaround times. As such, the division will continue to diligently process each audit up to the point where a Commission vote is required to progress to the next phase.

(b) (7)(E)

With respect to the Presidential Election Campaign Fund (PECF), Audit continued forwarding the monthly PECF reports received from the U.S. Treasury, to the Office of Chief Information Officer (OCIO) for web placement. (b) (5)

Audit management worked with OPM and updated the position descriptions for the Supervisory Auditor and Assistant Staff Director of Audit positions. An Audit Manager will be retiring on January 3, 2026 and one Auditor is also seeking retirement. This brings the total number of vacancies in the Audit Division to eleven, including nine Auditors and two Audit Managers. As such, Audit will be requesting to lare two Auditors and one Audit Manager to handle the workload.

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the fourth quarter of FV 2019, RAD continued its collaboration with OCIO on the development of the NextGen ctiling system. RAD staff conducted extensive user acceptance testing on Form 3X, identifying issues and making suggestions for improvements and enhancements. Development on Forms 3 and 3P is expected to begin next month with the other forms to follow in the Spring of 2030. Also during the fourth quarter, RAD participated in several educational outreach initiatives including reporting and FECTile webingrs for PACs and Party committees, as well as the FEC regional conference in Chicago. In addition, RAD staff conducted a Best Practices session followed by a "Meet Your Analyst" session for the California Political Treasurers Conference held in Washington, DC during the fourth quarter.

During the fourth quarter RAD staff reviewed a total of 16,986 documents totaling 5,106,555 pages and 79% of the reports were reviewed within 90 days of receipt, thus exceeding the strategic goal of 75% of reports reviewed within 90 days of receipt. RAD generated and sent 2,825 letters to the filing community and 84% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report review date. Also during the fourth quarter, RAD generated 48 referrals (3 OGC, 19 ADRO, 3 Administrative Fines, 1 Debt Settlement, and 22 Audit) and sent 1,107 non-filer notices. Finally, the Reports Processing Branch coded 8,727,526 transactions, 1,227 documents and processed 9,182 pages from 883 documents in the Paper Conversion system.

RAD staff completed interviews and made selections for eight Campaign Finance Analysts (CFA), two GS-12 promotions, and an Assistant Branch Chief detail opportunity on the Authorized Branch. In addition, upon receiving approval to backfill a Coding Clerk position, the position was posted, has closed and we are awaiting next steps. We hope to be fully staffed for what is expected to be a busy election year.

Status of Compliance – Fiscal Year 2020 – 1st Quarter Highlights (10/1/19 –

12/31/19)

The Office of Compliance (Compliance) submits this memorandum to provide the Commission with a snapshot of accomplishments and highlights for the 1st quarter FY 2020 (10/1/19 - 12/31/19). The intent of this document is to provide an update of the workload and achieved results of the Office of Compliance on a quarterly basis. The Status of Compliance and the Directive 68 (Statute of Limitations) documents are scheduled to be discussed during an upcoming Executive Session.

The attached **Appendix A** provides the Commission with first quarter highlights for each office and also a statistical overview of FY 2020 results and progression towards meeting the goals outlined within the 2018-2022 Strategic Plan adopted by the Commission. **Appendix B** provides an overview of all open audits and their respective stages within the audit process. **Appendix C** is an Audit Report entitled 'Proposed Final Audit Report — Due Date' which highlights the report manager, stage, phase, pre-audit start date, fieldwork begin date and the date the Proposed Final Audit Report must be approved in order to meet the current Strategic Plan goal. **Appendix D** (ADRO Civil Penalty Report) highlights civil penalties assessed, paid and an overview of nonmonetary terms to include date due and completed. **Appendix E** (AF Performance Goals Report) shows FY 2019 statistics for meeting strategic performance goals related to the Administrative Fine Program. **Appendix F** (AF Penalties Assessed and Collected) shows the total amount of penalties assessed and collection rate for FY 2015 – 2020.

As always, we welcome any feedback or suggestions that could be incorporated to enhance the presentation of the information contained within the overview.

Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO)

In the first quarter of FY 2020, the ADRO received 14 cases. Of these, the Reports Analysis Division (RAD) referred 9 matters and the Office of General Counsel (OGC) transferred 5 matters. During this time period, the ADRO did not close any matters due to the loss of quorum. The Commission collected \$49,400 in civil penalties.

During the fourth quarter, the ADRO circulated 100% of memoranda for a final vote within 140 days, with an average internal processing time of 113 days. There are currently 21 matters pending with the Commission for a vote.

In the first quarter of FY 2020, the ADRO focused on handling a high volume of cases (44 active matters), including 10 audit eligible matters in which Committees will receive tailored training. In addition, ADRO staff proposed enhancements to its case management software, Law Manager. During the second quarter of FY 2020, the ADRO will work with OCIO to implement these proposals in order to increase office efficiency.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the first quarter of FY 2020, RAD processed 4 Reason to Believe (RTB) and 8 Final Determination recommendation memoranda, which are awaiting Commission vote. OAR received 1 challenge and processed 2 Reviewing Officer Recommendations (ROR). OAR also processed 3 final determination recommendation memoranda, which are awaiting Commission vote. The Commission collected \$5,339 in fine payments.

(b) (7)(E) Additionally, OAR forwarded 100% of RORs within 60 days of receipt of each challenge, thus exceeding its strategic goal of processing 75% of RORs within 60 days (Appendix E).

In the first quarter, the Reviewing Officer led the implementation of new financial reports for ADRO and OGC civil penalties. The reports meet OCFO and Treasury Report on Receivables requirements and greatly streamline the monthly financial reporting process. The Reviewing Officer continues to work with ADRO and OGC staff to finalize new procedures and on the new reporting process in the first quarter of FY 2020 and continue to provide assistance as necessary. The Reviewing Officer also began to collaborate with OCIO on the redesign of the Administrative Fine Calculator for the new website.

Audit Division (Audit)

During the first quarter of FY 2020, the Audit Division (Audit) processed the following audit apports:

Audit has a total of **18** open audits. Four of these audits are authorized committees and fourteen audits are unauthorized committees.

Two of the open audits are for the 2016 election cycle. One audit is in the Audit Division Recommendation Memorandum stage and the second has been circulated to the Commission with a recommendation to transfer the matter Alternative Dispute Resolution Office for further processing.

Four of the open audits are for 2018 authorized committees, two of which are Congressional audits for which fieldwork has concluded and the Interim Audit Reports are being prepared. The third Congressional audit is currently on hold given that Audit has not received the records necessary to commence the audit. (b) (5), (b) (7)(A)

(b) (5), (b) (7)(A) In the fourth of the authorized audits, the exit conference for the Senate committee audit will take place in February.

The remaining 12 open audits are for 2018 unauthorized committees. Pre-audit work is underway for each audit, with entrance conferences scheduled to begin in February and fieldwork in March.

(b) (7)(E)

With respect to the Presidential Election Campaign Fund (PECF), the Commission approved the PECF hudget estimates for the fiscal years 2020 - 2030 to the U.S. Treasury. The Commission agreed that under Directive 10. Section I., the PECF estimate is "budget-related" and its provision is not a duty of the Commission under Fitle 26. As such, Audit provided the budget estimates to Treasury on January 8, 2020. Audit has received no inquiries or eligibility submissions for presidential matching funds during the 1° quarter.

Audit management coordinated with OPM to finalize the updated position descriptions for the Supervisory Auditor and Assistant Staff Director of Audit positions. The Audit management team reviewed the 2019 Federal Employee Viewpoint Survey results for the Audit Division to

identify key areas of apportunity for improvement and are developing tangible, practical action items to better the division.

With regard to training, Audit held two division-wide trainings this quarter on Payroß and Levin Funds. Additionally, Audit Managers attended OPM training on Poor Performance versus Poor Conduct.

The Audit Division currently has nine Auditor vacancies and two Audit Manager vacancies. In November the Commission approved the hiring of two Auditors and one Audit Manager. The vacancy announcement for both positions have closed and Audit is awaiting the receipt of applications from HR Solutions to begin the review and interview process. Additionally, one Auditor was recently selected to fill an Auditor vacancy within the agency, resulting in the loss of an additional Auditor, effective February 14th. As such, on January 23th Audit requested permission to backfill this position.

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the first quarter of FY 2020, RAD continued to play a critical role in the development of the NextGen cliling system by conducting extensive user acceptance testing on Form 3X, and identifying issues and making suggestions for improvements and enhancements. Development of Forms 3 and 3P is expected to begin next month with the other forms to follow in the Spring of 2020. Also during the first quarter, RAD collaborated with the Information Division on Party committee reporting examples and on the review of FEA timeframes for posting on the website. In addition, RAD worked with OGC and OCIO on the development and deployment of a web page for closed Administrative Termination and Debt Settlement Plan cases.

During the first quarter RAD staff reviewed a total of 16,040 documents totaling 11,325,441 pages and 88% of the reports were reviewed within 90 days of receipt, thus exceeding the strategic goal of 75% of reports reviewed within 90 days of receipt. RAD generated and sent 1,704 letters to the filling community and 86% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report review date. Also during the first quarter, RAD generated 9 referrals to ADRO and sent 371 non-filler notices. Finally, the Reports Processing Branch coded 6,067,333 transactions, 787 documents and processed 4,955 pages from 472 documents in the Paper Conversion system.

RAD recently welcomed seven (7) Campaign Finance Analysis (CFA) and a Coding Clerk to the RAD team. We are in the process of filling an additional CFA position internally and due to recent resignations, we received approval to fill two (2) additional CFA positions and have begun the backfill process. In addition, RAD continued its focus on professional development by providing 12 Senior CFA's the opportunity to participate in a 360 Leadership Assessment and by offering a Meyers Briggs training session to all RAD staff.

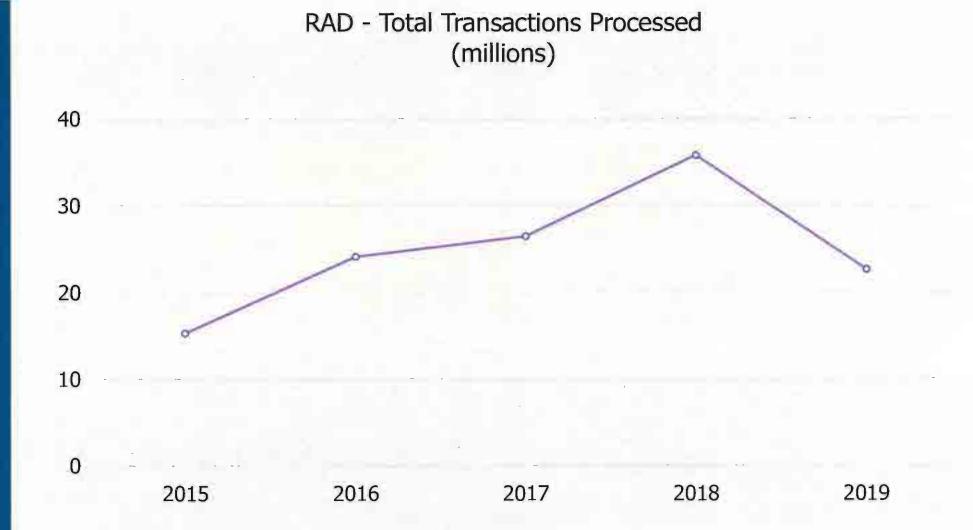

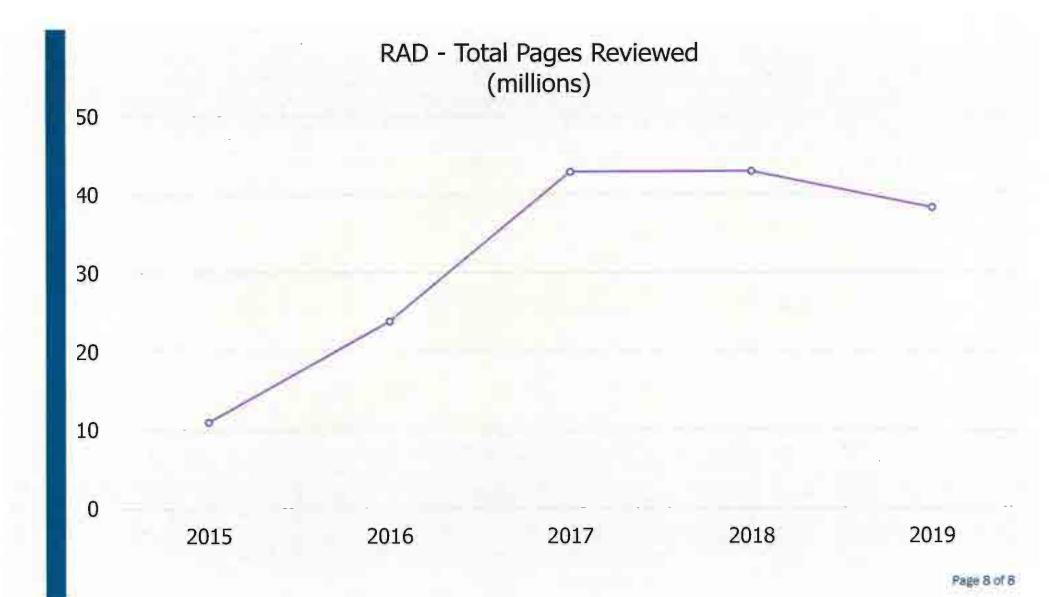

The Office of Compliance (Compliance) submits this memorandum to provide the Commission with a snapshot of accomplishments and highlights for the 2nd quarter FY 2020 (1/1/20 - 3/31/20). The intent of this document is to provide an update of the workload and achieved results of the Office of Compliance on a quarterly basis. In the second quarter of FY 2020, the ADRO received 7 cases. Of these, the Reports Analysis Division (RAD) referred 4 matters and the Office of General Counsel (OGC) transferred 3 matters. During this time period, the ADRO did not close any matters due to the loss of quorum. The Commission collected \$7,100 in civil penalties.

There are currently **41** matters pending with the Commission

In the second quarter of FY 2020, the ADRO focused on handling a high volume of cases (47 active matters), including 10 audit eligible matters in which Committees will receive tailored training. In addition, ADRO staff proposed enhancements to its case management software, Law Manager and worked with OCIO to implement these proposals in order to increase office efficiency.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the second quarter of FY 2020, RAD processed 4 Reason to Believe (RTB) and 1 Final Determination recommendation memoranda, which are awaiting Commission vote.

OAR had no new challenges to process in the second quarter. The Commission collected \$5,856 in fine payments.

In the second quarter, the Reviewing Officer continued to assist ADR and OGC with processing civil penalty payments and completing financial reports for OCFO. The Reviewing Officer attended in-house OPM facilitated training on Engaging and Encouraging Employees and

began participating in the Partnership for Public Service Engagement Coordinator Collective to assist the agency in engagement planning.

Audit Division (Audit)

During the second quarter of FY 2020, the Audit Division (Audit) processed the following audit reports:

Audit has a total of **18** open audits. Four of these audits are authorized committees and fourteen audits are unauthorized committees.

Two of the open audits are for the 2016 election cycle. One audit, in the Audit Division Recommendation Memorandum stage, remains with the OGC for legal analysis; and the second has been circulated to the Commission with a recommendation to transfer the matter to the ADRO for further processing.

Four of the open audits are for 2018 authorized committees. One audit is awaiting the committee's response to the interim audit report, two audits are in the interim audit report writing stage and the remaining audit is currently on hold given that Audit has not received the records necessary to commence the audit. (b) (5), (b) (7)(A)

The Audit Division will circulate an informational update to the Commission on this audit in May.

The remaining 12 open audits are for 2018 unauthorized committees. Fieldwork is in progress for all of the audits. Due to COVID-19, obtaining records has posed some challenges for some audits. Staff has made good progress on fieldwork for these audits despite some of the obstacles encountered. Exit conferences will begin in May, with two scheduled thus far.

(b) (7)(E)

With respect to the Presidential Election Campaign Fund (PECF), Audit continued forwarding the monthly PECF reports received from the U.S. Treasury, to the Office of Chief Information Officer (OCIO) for web placement. Audit addressed the following inquiries from the Commission's internal stakeholders: confirmed for the Enforcement Division that the Commission approved the August 2007 Guideline for Presentation in Good Order; verified the 2020 Voting Age Population and Cost of Living Adjustment calculations, as well as the 2020 Presidential Spending Limits for the Information Division; periodically affirmed for the Press Office and Information Division that no matching fund applications had been received; and updated the Office of Compliance briefing book for the PECF information. For external stakeholders, Audit provided the U.S. Treasury Department with PECF-related edits for the 2019 Oversight Inquiry and answered questions related to the calculation of the budget estimates. Finally, Audit completed its own training manual detailing processes related to various aspects of the PECF review and administration.

(b) (5)

Audit management collaborated with OPM to update the performance standards for the GS-7, 9, and 11 Auditor positions and the standards are in the process of being finalized. In March the Audit management team also received recommendations from Audit staff stemming from the 2019 Federal Employee Viewpoint Survey results, which included specific ideas presented to management on what would help to improve the division. Audit management has implemented several of the recommendations and looks forward to continuing to do so.

With regard to training, Audit held division-wide training on Audit Division Quality Standards in January and Auditors and Managers continue to complete courses to satisfy the requirement to complete 80 hours of Continuing Professional Education every two years. Additionally, Audit Managers attended the in-house OPM facilitated training on Engaging and Encouraging Employees in February.

Following the recent retirements of several auditors and an Audit Manager, and the transfer of one Auditor to the agency's Office of the Inspector General, the Commission approved the hiring of four Auditors and one Audit Manager. Audit has selected two external Auditors and an Audit Manager and looks forward to bringing these new hires onboard once background checks are complete and laptops are able to be issued given the current telework environment. We have also selected a RAD Analyst with prior audit experience who will transfer to Audit in early May, and we are in the process of working with HR Solutions to announce and fill our fourth and final approved Auditor vacancy.

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the second quarter of FY 2020, RAD continued to play a critical role in the development of the NextGen electronic filing system by making suggestions for improvements and enhancements and conducting testing to confirm the software reflects the reporting requirements for Form 3X filers. Requirements gathering and development of Forms 3 and 3P has begun with the other forms to follow. Also during the second quarter, RAD collaborated with OGC on COVID-19 guidance concerning paper filings and collaborated with OCIO to develop a process for accepting pdf filings from paper Form 5 and Form 9 filers. In addition, RAD created a Federal Employee Viewpoint Survey (FEVS) working group to develop solutions to areas where improvement is needed based on the survey results. RAD Management has implemented several solutions to address the issues identified.

During the second quarter RAD staff reviewed a total of 20,791 documents totaling 7,070,636 pages and 94.5% of the reports were reviewed within 90 days of receipt, thus exceeding the strategic goal of 75% of reports reviewed within 90 days of receipt. RAD generated and sent 2,260 letters to the filing community and 87% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report

review date. Also during the second quarter, RAD generated 5 referrals (1 OGC, 4 ADRO) and sent 1,237 non-filer notices where the Commission approved recommendations to publish 27 authorized committees for failure to timely file an election-sensitive report. In addition, RAD staff handled 3,460 phone calls and 236 emails. Finally, the Reports Processing Branch coded 21,225,101 transactions, 1,149 documents and processed 9,852 pages from 891 documents in the Paper Conversion system.

RAD received a resignation from an Assistant Branch Chief on the Party/Non-Party Branch during the second quarter. Upon approval to backfill this position, a selection was made for a 120-day detail. We also received approval to fill two (2) additional CFA positions and will begin the backfill process in the near future. In addition, RAD Management revised and finalized the performance standards for the Coding Clerk position, are in the process of revising the performance standards for the Campaign Finance Analyst positions, and all RAD managers received Mid-Year performance assessments.

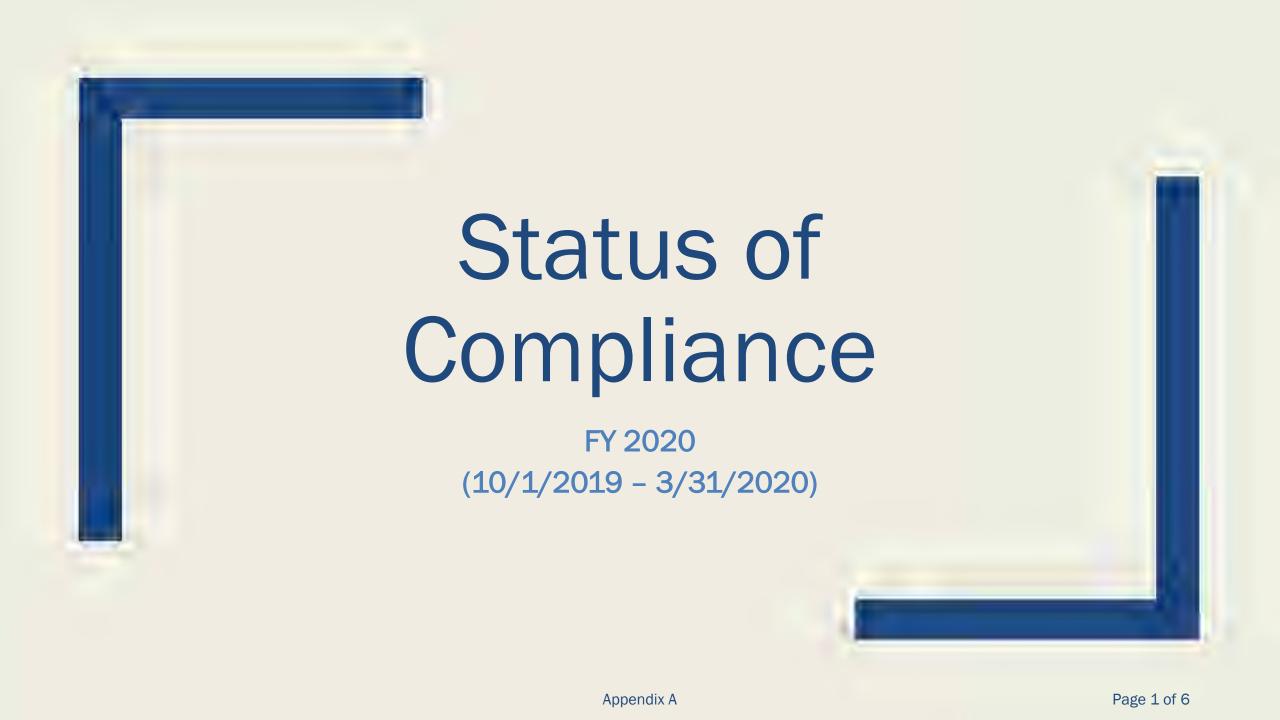

RAD staff collaborated with the Information Division on reporting & FECfile webinars for Candidate Committees, PACs and Party Committees, on the FEC regional conference for all committee types in San Antonio, and on Independent Expenditure webinars.

RAD commenced an electronic filing working group to develop feedback and formulate solutions to improve both customer service and knowledge of the electronic filing system.

Status 3/31/20

Form 3X is expected to be completed and fully tested in the third quarter of FY2020, with the other forms to follow.

Candidate, PAC and Party reporting and FECfile webinars were held in January 2020, the regional conference was held in February 2020, and the Independent Expenditure webinars and another candidate webinar were held in March 2020.

The group met in March 2020 to brainstorm ideas. Future meetings will address ways to improve customer service including assisting the Electronic Filing Office (EFO) during filing deadlines, establishing procedures for transferring calls, and cross training analysts to assist with technical issues.

SUBJECT: Status of Compliance – Fiscal Year 2020 – 3rd Quarter Highlights (4/1/20 –

6/30/20)

The Office of Compliance (Compliance) submits this memorandum to provide the Commission with a snapshot of accomplishments and highlights for the 3rd quarter FY 2020 (4/1/20-6/30/20). The intent of this document is to provide an update of the workload and achieved results of the Office of Compliance on a quarterly basis. The Status of Compliance and the Directive 68 (Statute of Limitations) documents are scheduled to be discussed during an upcoming Executive Session.

The attached **Appendix A** provides the Commission with third quarter highlights for each office and a statistical overview of FY 2020 results and progression towards meeting the goals outlined within the 2018-2022 Strategic Plan adopted by the Commission. **Appendix B** provides an overview of all open audits and their respective stages within the audit process. **Appendix C** is an Audit Report entitled 'Proposed Final Audit Report – Due Date' which highlights the report manager, stage, phase, pre-audit start date, fieldwork begin date and the date the Proposed Final Audit Report must be approved in order to meet the current Strategic Plan goal. **Appendix D** (ADRO Civil Penalty Report) highlights civil penalties assessed, paid and an overview of nonmonetary terms to include date due and completed. **Appendix E** (AF Performance Goals Report) shows FY 2020 statistics for meeting strategic performance goals related to the Administrative Fine Program. **Appendix F** (AF Penalties Assessed and Collected) shows the total amount of penalties assessed and collection rate for FY 2015 – 2020.

As always, we welcome any feedback or suggestions that could be incorporated to enhance the presentation of the information contained within the overview.

Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO)

In the third quarter of FY 2020, the ADRO received 8 cases. Of these, the Reports Analysis Division (RAD) referred 6 matters and the Office of General Counsel (OGC) transferred 2 matters. During this time period, the ADRO only closed 2 matters due to the loss of quorum. The Commission assessed \$17,950 in civil penalties.

During the third quarter, the ADRO circulated recommendations in 8 matters. (b) (7)(E)

There are currently 9 matters pending with the Commission

for a vote.

In the third quarter of FY 2020, the ADRO focused on handling a high volume of cases (53 active matters), including 10 audit eligible matters in which Committees will receive tailored training. In addition, ADRO staff continued to work with OCIO to implement enhancements to its case management software, Law Manager, in order to increase office efficiency.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the third quarter of FY 2020, RAD processed 10 Reason to Believe (RTB) memoranda. (b) (7)(E)

OAR had no new challenges to process in the third quarter.

The Commission approved RAD's RTB recommendations in 96 cases. In addition, the Commission made a final determination that the respondents in 206 cases violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and assessed \$531,552 in civil penalties. The Commission collected \$5,113 in fine payments.

In the third quarter, the Reviewing Officer collaborated with OCIO to launch a redesigned Administrative Fine Calculator for the website. The Reviewing Officer also worked with OGC and RAD to implement new procedures for the receipt of AF challenge documentation during COVID-19, which will now be submitted via email. With the high volume of RTB findings approved at the end of the third quarter, OAR expects to receive a high volume of challenges in the fourth quarter of FY 2020.

Audit Division (Audit)

During the third quarter of FY 2020, the Audit Division (Audit) processed the following audit reports:

Audit has a total of 17 open audits. Four of these audits are authorized committees and thirteen audits are unauthorized committees.

There is one 2016 cycle audit that remains open and is awaiting Commission approval of the Audit Division Recommendation Memorandum.

For the 2018 cycle, there are sixteen open audits, four of which are for authorized committees. Of the four audits, one audit is in the draft final audit report writing stage and two audits are with the Office of General Counsel's Compliance Advice Team (OGC-CAT) for legal analysis and the remaining audit is currently on hold given that Audit has not received the records necessary to commence the audit. (b) (5), (b) (7)(A)

The Audit Division circulated an informational update to the Commission on May 27, 2020 and will provide another update in August.

The remaining 12 open audits are for unauthorized committees. Fieldwork is concluding for nine of the audits, with exit conferences scheduled to take place in August. Two audits are in the interim audit report writing stage and one audit is awaiting the committee's response to the interim audit report.

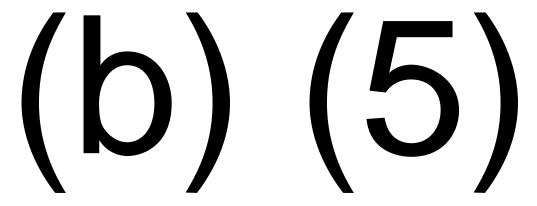
COVID-19 impacted Audit's ability to obtain records in some audits. Audit staff, in partnership with OGC-CAT, has procured tolling agreements in four such audits to preserve the Commission's ability to pursue any potential enforcement action, and the audits continue to progress despite the obstacles encountered.

(b) (7)(E)

With respect to the Presidential Election Campaign Fund (PECF), Audit forwarded three 508 accessibility compliant monthly PECF reports received from the U.S. Treasury, to the Office of Chief Information Officer (OCIO) for web placement. Audit addressed an inquiry from the Commission's Office of General Counsel - Policy Division regarding a potential rulemaking to address the Commission's modified operations during the pandemic. Audit was asked if there was anything that might be helpful to include in the rulemaking to better facilitate submissions related

to the Presidential Matching Funds. (b) (5)

For internal stakeholders, Audit confirmed that no matching fund applications had been received. Audit also coordinated with the Information Division on the yearly Consumer Price Index letter from the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Once available, Audit will forward this letter to the U.S. Treasury Department, per its' request.



With regard to training, Audit ensured that Auditors and Managers had access to on-line auditing and accounting courses needed to satisfy the 80 hours of required Continuing Professional Education every two years. Additionally, Audit Managers held regular team meetings to keep auditors apprised of new information, monitor the status of open audits and engage staff in team collaboration in this virtual environment.

Audit welcomed one new Auditor in the 3rd quarter and completed RAD campaign guide training and in-depth Audit training. Audit will welcome one additional Auditor and an Audit Manager in early August and is in the process of reviewing applications for the remaining two approved Auditor new hires. Audit finalized the updated GS-7 and GS-9 Auditor performance standards and continues to research various electronic workpaper options, as the current system is slated for a 2023 end-of-life.

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the third quarter of FY 2020, RAD Reports Processing Branch staff volunteered to report to the building in order to scan and process paper reports as part of the Phase 1 reopening of agency operations. Due to their efforts, the backlog of reports that resulted from the suspension of mail are now on the public record. In addition, RAD staff conducted in-depth user acceptance testing on Form 3X for the NextGen Efiling program and collaborated with OCIO on identifying and assessing contract requirements. Also during the third quarter, RAD managers reviewed and commented on Business Process Analysis and Mission Essential Function worksheets concerning RAD processes for the FEC Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP), and completed surveys for

division programs and processes from Amazon Web Services (AWS) who is analyzing how best to modernize the FEC's infrastructure and internal applications as part of the IT Modernization Project.

During the third quarter RAD staff reviewed a total of 23,734 documents totaling 31,436,243 pages and 91.8% of the reports were reviewed within 90 days of receipt, thus exceeding the strategic goal of 75% of reports reviewed within 90 days of receipt. RAD generated and sent 1,931 letters to the filing community and 85% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report review date. Also during the third quarter, RAD generated 14 referrals (1 OGC, 6 ADRO, 2 Administrative Fine, 5 Administrative Termination) and sent 2,036 non-filer notices where the Commission approved recommendations to publish 37 authorized committees for failure to timely file an election-sensitive report. In addition, RAD staff handled 3,529 phone calls and 285 emails. Finally, the Reports Processing Branch coded 17,877,651 transactions and 438 documents.

RAD committed extensive resources in the area of training and outreach during the third quarter. The division held a professional development month for staff where virtual training sessions were offered throughout each week on a variety of topics. In addition, RAD held a division-wide customer service virtual training session and approved several individual staff requests for training opportunities. RAD also assisted other offices with training and outreach, conducting Party and PAC training for Audit Division staff and collaborating with the Information Division to present nine reporting and FECfile webinars to the filing community.

In the area of personnel during third quarter, a Campaign Finance Analyst (CFA) transferred to the Audit Division and a 120-day detail for an Assistant Branch Chief on the Party/NonParty branch was filled. Upon receiving approval to fill CFA, Coding Clerk, Data Disclosure Assistant, Assistant Branch Chief, and Supervisory Training and Program Manager positions, we are in the process of working with HR Solutions on these postings and expect to fill them by the end of FY 2020. In addition, RAD Management revised and finalized the performance standards for the Campaign Finance Analyst positions.

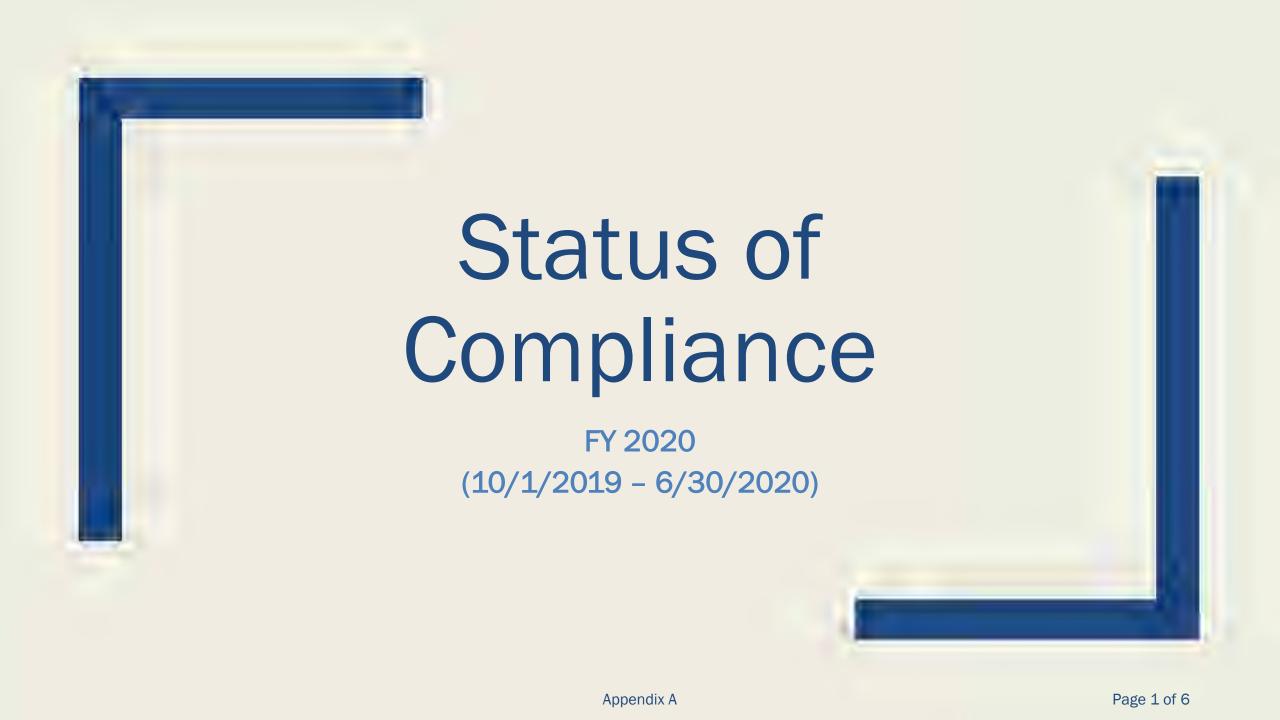

SUBJECT: Status of Compliance – Fiscal Year 2020 Overview and 4th Quarter Highlights

(7/1/20 - 9/30/20)

The Office of Compliance (Compliance) submits this memorandum to provide the Commission with a snapshot of Fiscal Year 2020 and fourth quarter accomplishments and highlights FY 2020 (7/1/20 - 9/30/20). The intent of this document is to provide an update of the workload and achieved results of the Office of Compliance on a quarterly basis. The Status of Compliance and the Directive 68 (Statute of Limitations) documents are scheduled to be discussed during an upcoming Executive Session.

The attached **Appendix A** provides the Commission with fourth quarter highlights for each office and a statistical overview of FY 2020 results and progression towards meeting the goals outlined within the 2018-2022 Strategic Plan adopted by the Commission. **Appendix B** provides an overview of all open audits and their respective stages within the audit process. **Appendix C** is an Audit Report entitled 'Proposed Final Audit Report – Due Date' which highlights the report manager, stage, phase, pre-audit start date, fieldwork begin date and the date the Proposed Final Audit Report must be approved in order to meet the current Strategic Plan goal. **Appendix D** (ADRO Civil Penalty Report) highlights civil penalties assessed, paid and an overview of nonmonetary terms to include date due and completed. **Appendix E** (AF Performance Goals Report) shows FY 2020 statistics for meeting strategic performance goals related to the Administrative Fine Program. **Appendix F** (AF Penalties Assessed and Collected) shows the total amount of penalties assessed and collection rate for FY 2015 – 2020.

As always, we welcome any feedback or suggestions that could be incorporated to enhance the presentation of the information contained within the document.

Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO)

In the fourth quarter of FY 2020, the ADRO received 8 cases. Of these, the Reports Analysis Division (RAD) referred 6 matters, the Office of General Counsel (OGC) transferred 1 matter, and the Commission voted to offer 1 Committee the opportunity to terminate its audit and participate in ADR. During this time period, the ADRO closed 37 matters. The Commission assessed \$223,395 in civil penalties.

During the fourth quarter, the ADRO circulated recommendations in 6 matters. (b) (7)(E)

There are currently 18 matters pending with the Commission

for a vote.

In the fourth quarter of FY 2020, the ADRO focused on closing a record number of cases upon the restoration of a quorum. In addition, ADRO staff continued to work with OCIO to implement enhancements to its case management software, Law Manager, in order to increase office efficiency.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the fourth quarter of FY 2020, RAD processed 10 Reason to Believe (RTB) memoranda. (b) (7)(E)

OAR processed Reviewing Officer Recommendations (RORs) for 5 cases during the fourth quarter. OAR forwarded 100% of these RORs within 60 days, thus exceeding the strategic goal of processing 75% of RORs within 60 days of the challenge receipt date. There are currently 29 Administrative Fine Program memoranda pending with the Commission.

In the fourth quarter, OAR received 19 new challenges in response to the high volume of RTB findings approved at the end of the third quarter. OAR processed RORs in 6 of these cases,

and the remaining 13 cases will be processed in first quarter of FY 2020. OAR also processed \$116,146 in Administrative Fine payments and continued to assist with financial reporting for all civil money penalties assessed by the Commission.

Audit Division (Audit)

For the 2018 cycle, Audit staff conducted 16 audits which had a total of 584,411 receipt transactions totaling \$53,503,967 and 17,950 disbursement transactions totaling \$52,695,757.

During the fourth quarter of FY 2020, the Audit Division (Audit) processed the following audit reports:

Audit has a total of 17 open audits. Four of these audits are authorized committees and 13 audits are unauthorized committees.

There is one 2016 cycle audit that remains open and is awaiting Commission approval of the Audit Division Recommendation Memorandum.

For the 2018 cycle, there are 4 ongoing authorized committee audits. One Interim Audit Report and one Audit Division Recommendation Memorandum is pending before the Commission due to the lack of quorum and 1 audit is with the Office of General Counsel's Compliance Advice Team (OGC-CAT) for legal analysis of the Draft Final Audit Report. The remaining audit continues to be on hold given that Audit has not received the records necessary to commence fieldwork. (b) (5), (b) (7)(A)

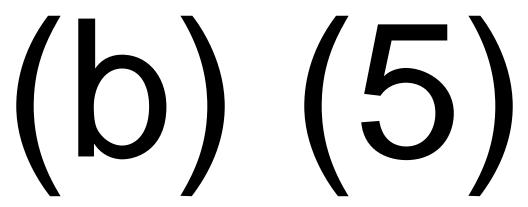
The

Audit Division most recently circulated an informational update to the Commission on September 16, 2020 and will provide another update in December.

The remaining 12 open audits are for unauthorized committees. Fieldwork has concluded in 10 of the audits, with exit conferences scheduled to take place in November for the remaining 2. Of the 10 audits in the post-fieldwork stage, 6 are in the Interim Audit Report writing stage, 1 is with OGC-CAT for legal analysis of the Interim Audit Report, 2 are awaiting the committee's response to the Draft Final Audit Report and 1 Proposed Final Audit Report is pending before the Commission.

(b) (7)(E)

With respect to the Presidential Election Campaign Fund (PECF), Audit forwarded three 508 accessibility compliant monthly PECF reports received from the U.S. Treasury, to the Office of Chief Information Officer (OCIO) for web placement. In addition, Audit has begun preparing the budget estimate calculations for the next ten fiscal years, 2021 – 2031.



Audit provided assistance to OGC Enforcement in one matter and in two matters for ADRO, and is currently working with OCIO to set up user acceptance testing (UAT) with Windows 10 and Office 2016 for the Download Application, Audit Sampling Program, Audit Status Database, and Contribute Program since audit webpages are currently on the transition webpage in preparation for receiving new laptops. TeamMate Champions attended the 2020 TeamMate User Forum (virtually). TeamMate Champions also continued to conduct market research on various replacement electronic workpaper systems, given that the current system is slated for a 2023 end-of-life. Following a fourth quarter meeting with OCFO's Budget Office, the procurement process for the new software will begin, in earnest, in early 2021. Audit provided systems information regarding storage of different applications used by Audit staff to Amazon and OCIO for possible transition to the cloud.

With regard to training, Audit Managers attended Prohibited Personnel Practices training with the Office of Special Counsel and Building High Performance Teams training via American University. Additionally, Audit held internal training on How to Reference Audit Reports and all Audit staff received 508 Compliance training in an effort to assist the agency with complying with federal law requiring that all content posted in a pdf format on the agency's website be accessible to those with disabilities who use assistive technology to read the website. The Audit staff is now working to ensure that all Audit reports and documents placed on the FEC's website are 508 compliant.

During the fourth quarter, Audit warmly welcomed a new Auditor and a new Audit Manager. The two completed RAD Party/Non-Party campaign guide training in September and continue to complete the in-depth Audit training program. We anticipate hiring our remaining two Auditors in the next couple of months, as Audit Managers are currently reviewing applications for the posting that closed in September.

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the fourth quarter of FY 2020, RAD Reports Processing Branch staff continued to volunteer to report to the building weekly in order to scan and process paper reports as part of the Phase 1 reopening of agency operations. In addition, RAD staff continued to collaborate with OCIO on the NextGen efiling program conducting user acceptance testing on Forms 24, 1M and 3L, as well as two factor authentication, role-based access, and uploading/amending reports. Also during the fourth quarter, RAD staff assisted the Press Office with the vetting of the 18-month statistical summary and provided review and comment for the October Quarterly reporting reminder. RAD management also began the process of making proposed recommendations for the 2021-2022 RAD Review and Referral Procedures. We anticipate circulating a proposed recommendations draft to the Commission for review in November.

During the fourth quarter RAD staff reviewed a total of 28,981 documents totaling 23,694,148 pages and 92.5% of the reports were reviewed within 90 days of receipt, thus exceeding the strategic goal of 75% of reports reviewed within 90 days of receipt. RAD generated and sent 2,964 letters to the filing community and 87% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report review date. Also during the fourth quarter, RAD generated 7 referrals (1 OGC, 6 ADRO) and sent 1,341 non-filer notices where the Commission approved recommendations to publish 22 authorized committees for failure to timely file an election-sensitive report. In addition, RAD staff handled 3,803 phone calls and 205 emails. The Reports Processing Branch coded 63,983,177 transactions, 4,873 documents and processed 18,028 pages from 1,771 documents in the Paper Conversion system. Finally, RAD met or exceeded all of its performance goals for FY20.

RAD continued its commitment to training and outreach during the fourth quarter. RAD staff conducted Party/PAC Campaign Guide training for new Audit Division staff and collaborated with the Information Division on 4 reporting & FECfile webinars for Candidate Committees, PACs and Party Committees, and 2 Pre-Election Communications webinars. In addition, RAD staff attended the FEC Diversity Council Briefing and attended a virtual division training session on Unconscious Bias and Inclusion. In the area of assistance, RAD assisted OGC with 29 matters, ADRO with 3 matters, the Audit Division with 9 matters, the Information Division with 2 matters, Congressional Affairs with 1 matter, the Press Office with 3 matters, and responded to 16 inquiries from Commission offices.

In the area of personnel during fourth quarter, a Campaign Finance Analyst (CFA) retired and Assistant Branch Chief (Party/NonParty Branch) and Supervisory Training and Program Manager positions were filled. Upon receiving approval to fill CFA and Coding Clerk positions, interviews were conducted, and selections made with 3 new employees expected to join the RAD team in November. In addition, we are in the process of filling a Data Disclosure Assistant position and are awaiting Commission approval to backfill a Coding Clerk, Authorized Branch Assistant Branch Chief, and two Senior Campaign Finance and Reviewing Analyst (GS-12) positions. Finally, all RAD Managers received performance assessments for the 2019-2020 performance period and completed 2020-2021 performance management plans.

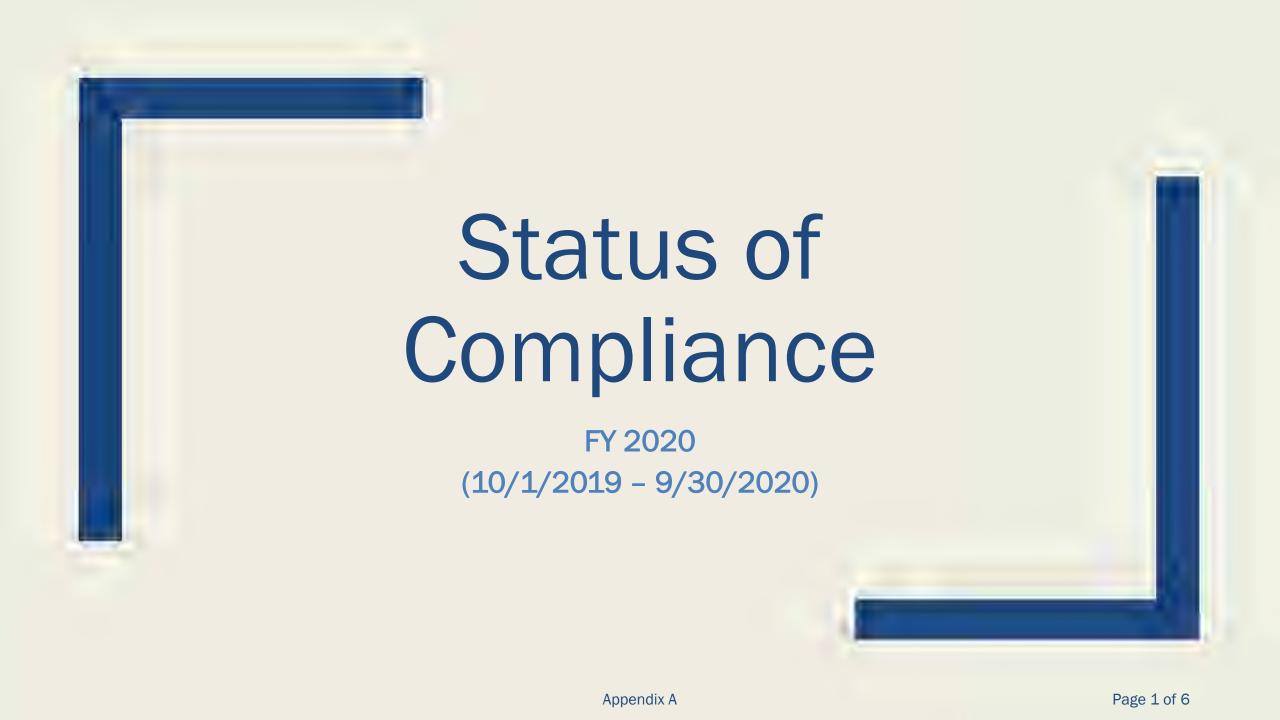

SUBJECT: Status of Compliance – Fiscal Year 2021 – 1st Quarter Highlights (10/1/20 –

12/31/20)

The Office of Compliance (Compliance) submits this memorandum to provide the Commission with a snapshot of accomplishments and highlights for the first quarter of FY 2021 (10/1/20 - 12/31/20). The intent of this document is to provide an update of the workload and achieved results of the Office of Compliance on a quarterly basis. The Status of Compliance and the Directive 68 (Statute of Limitations) documents are scheduled to be discussed during an upcoming Executive Session.

The attached **Appendix A** provides the Commission with fourth quarter highlights for each office and a statistical overview of FY 2021 results and progression towards meeting the goals outlined within the 2018-2022 Strategic Plan adopted by the Commission. **Appendix B** provides an overview of all open audits and their respective stages within the audit process. **Appendix C** is an Audit Report entitled 'Proposed Final Audit Report – Due Date' which highlights the report manager, stage, phase, pre-audit start date, fieldwork begin date and the date the Proposed Final Audit Report must be approved in order to meet the current Strategic Plan goal. **Appendix D** (ADRO Civil Penalty Report) highlights civil penalties assessed, paid and an overview of nonmonetary terms to include date due and completed. **Appendix E** (AF Performance Goals Report) shows FY 2021 statistics for meeting strategic performance goals related to the Administrative Fine Program. **Appendix F** (AF Penalties Assessed and Collected) shows the total amount of penalties assessed and collection rate for FY 2015 – 2021.

As always, we welcome any feedback or suggestions that could be incorporated to enhance the presentation of the information contained within the document.

Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO)

In the first quarter of FY 2021, ADRO received 11 matters, including 9 cases from RAD and 2 from OGC. During this time period, the ADRO closed 1 matter. The Commission assessed \$2,250 in civil penalties and collected \$22,235.

During the first quarter, the ADRO circulated recommendations in 7 matters. (b) (7)(E)

After several approvals upon the restoration of a quorum, there are currently 12 matters pending with the Commission for a vote.

In the first quarter of FY 2021, ADRO staff continued to work with OCIO to implement enhancements to its case management software, Law Manager, in order to increase office efficiency. ADRO provided internal education to staff to enhance negotiation skills. The ADR Specialist served on the Engagement Steering Committee and the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Council. Two ADRO staff members attended virtual COGEL, and the ADR Specialist completed coursework at Harvard's Program on Negotiation.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the first quarter of FY 2021, RAD processed 9 Reason to Believe (RTB) and 22 Final Determination (FD) recommendation memoranda. (b) (7)(E)

OAR processed

Reviewing Officer Recommendations (RORs) for 13 cases during the first quarter, completing its review of challenges received in FY 2020. OAR forwarded 100% of these RORs within 60 days, thus exceeding the strategic goal of processing 75% of RORs within 60 days of the challenge receipt date. OAR also processed 12 FD recommendation memoranda during the first quarter. There are currently 19 Administrative Fine Program memoranda pending with the Commission.

OAR processed \$59,582 in Administrative Fine payments during the first quarter of FY 2021 and continued to assist with financial reporting for all civil money penalties assessed by the Commission. OAR also collaborated with OCIO to make corrections and enhancements to the OGC and ADRO financial reports to increase efficiency in monthly reporting. OAR is expecting the Commission will receive a high volume of Administrative Fine challenges and payments in the second quarter in response to the mass approval of RTB findings in January 2021.

Audit Division (Audit)

During the first quarter of FY 2021, the Audit Division (Audit) processed the following audit reports:

Audit has a total of 16 open audits. Four of these audits are authorized committees and 12 audits are unauthorized committees. The Commission approved the Proposed Final Audit Report in a 17th audit on January 11, 2021.

The Commission voted on the Audit Division Recommendation Memorandum for the one remaining 2016 cycle audit on January 28, 2021 and the Proposed Final Audit Report is currently being prepared.

For the 2018 cycle, there are 4 ongoing authorized committee audits. One Interim Audit Report and one Audit Division Recommendation Memorandum are pending before the Commission, and one audit is in the Proposed Final Audit Report writing stage. The remaining audit continues to be on hold given that Audit has not received the records necessary to commence fieldwork. (b) (5), (b) (7)(A)

The Audit

Division most recently circulated an informational update to the Commission on December 16, 2020 and will provide a further update in March 2021.

The remaining 11 open audits are for unauthorized committees. Fieldwork has concluded in 10 of the audits, with an exit conference scheduled to take place in February for the remaining audit. Of the 10 audits in the post-fieldwork stage, four are in the Interim Audit Report writing stage, one Interim Audit Report was approved in the January 28, 2021 Executive Session and is being prepared to be provided to the committee for comment, one is in the Audit Division Recommendation Memorandum writing stage following the Audit Hearing held on January 28, 2021, one is in the Proposed Final Audit Report writing stage, and three are with the OGC Compliance Advice Team (OGC-CAT) for legal analysis of the Interim Audit Report.

(b) (7)(E)

With respect to the Presidential Election Campaign Fund (PECF), Audit forwarded four 508 accessibility compliant monthly PECF reports received from the U.S. Treasury, to the Office of Chief Information Officer (OCIO) for web placement. In addition, Audit prepared the preliminary budget estimate calculations for the next ten fiscal years, 2021 - 2031. However, the Commission has not yet received the U.S. Treasury's annual request for the budgetary figures. Audit inquired as to whether such request will be forthcoming, however, the U.S. Treasury has not advised further. The Internal Revenue Service liaison provided Audit with the fiscal year 2020 check-off rates for PECF.

(b) (5)

Audit provided assistance to OGC Enforcement in one matter and to ADRO in one matter and completed (UAT) with Windows 10 and Office 2016 for the Download Application, Audit Sampling Program, and the Audit Status Database. TeamMate Champions also continued to conduct market research on various replacement electronic workpaper systems, given that the current system is slated for a 2023 end-of-life. Audit conducted two series of UAT with the Audit Sampling Program.

In October and November, respectively, Audit held internal, division-wide training on reviewing media disbursements and parent-memo transactions. Each member of the Audit Division also successfully completed their required Continued Professional Education hours for the 2019-2020 cycle. The Audit staff also continued efforts to make all 2017-2018 Audit reports and documents placed on the FEC's website 508 compliant. Additionally, Audit is creating a 508 compliance instruction manual for staff.

During the first quarter, Audit completed the interview process for two additional Auditors, from which one new Auditor was selected and will onboard February 16, 2021. In addition, one tenured Auditor will retire from the Commission on February 27, 2021.

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the first quarter of FY 2021, RAD Reports Processing Branch staff worked diligently to ensure the unprecedented volume of transaction level data was processed and made publicly available in a timely manner. During 2020, staff processed a 400% increase in transactions when compared to the 2016 presidential election year. In addition, RAD staff continued volunteering to report to the building weekly in order to scan and process paper reports as part of the Phase 1 reopening of agency operations. Also, during the first quarter, RAD management circulated proposed recommendations for the 2021-2022 RAD Review and Referral Procedures to Commission offices for review and comment and met with two offices to address questions. The document was circulated to the Commission for a vote in December and we hope to receive approval quickly in order to begin the review of 2021 reports promptly.

During the first quarter, RAD staff reviewed a total of 31,042 documents totaling 59,283,494 pages and 97% of the reports were reviewed within 90 days of receipt, thus exceeding the strategic goal of 75% of reports reviewed within 90 days of receipt. RAD generated and sent 2,206 letters to the filing community and 91% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report review date. Also, during the first quarter, RAD generated 11 referrals (2 OGC, 9 ADRO) and sent 2,815 non-filer notices where the Commission approved recommendations to publish 33 authorized committees for failure to timely file an election-sensitive report. In addition, RAD staff handled 4,545 phone calls and 288 emails. The Reports Processing Branch coded 63,428,038 transactions, 1,827 documents and processed 1,451 pages from 109 documents in the Paper Conversion system.

RAD continued its commitment to training, outreach and assistance during the first quarter. RAD staff conducted tailored training for four 2018 cycle audit eligible party committees, collaborated with the Information Division on a Winding Down the Campaign webinar, and reviewed and commented on Tips for Treasurers covering recount donations and earmarked contributions and Record articles covering guidance for the Georgia runoff and the 30 Day Post-General reporting reminder. In addition, RAD staff reviewed and/or developed content for the FEC website including reporting examples for payroll deductions and bitcoin contributions, a revision to the candidate loan reporting example, and a new webpage for requests for legal consideration by the Commission. In the area of assistance, RAD assisted OGC with 24 matters, ADRO with 2 matters, the Audit Division with 6 matters, the Information Division with 3 matters, the Press Office with 3 matters, and responded to 10 inquiries from Commission offices.

Regarding training, RAD Managers completed OPM Supervisory training to satisfy the three-year management training requirement and participated in an OPM 360 Leadership Assessment to solicit feedback from colleagues and team members. Finally, two RAD team members served on the Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Council.

In the area of personnel during first quarter, a Data Disclosure Assistant retired, a Senior Campaign Finance and Reviewing Analyst transferred to the Information Division, and a Senior Campaign Finance Analyst accepted a detail opportunity in the Office of the Chief Financial Officer (OCFO). RAD welcomed two new Campaign Finance Analysts (CFA) and one Coding Clerk during the first quarter. We are awaiting Commission approval to backfill a Coding Clerk,

Authorized Branch Assistant Branch Chief, and two Senior Campaign Finance and Reviewing Analyst (GS-12) positions. Further, we previously received Commission approval to fill two CFA positions and one Data Disclosure Assistant position for which we are awaiting approval to move forward.

SUBJECT: Status of Compliance – Fiscal Year 2021 – 2nd Quarter Highlights (1/1/21 –

3/31/21)

The Office of Compliance (Compliance) submits this memorandum to provide the Commission with a snapshot of accomplishments and highlights for the second quarter of FY 2021 (1/1/21 - 3/31/21). The intent of this document is to provide an update of the workload and achieved results of the Office of Compliance on a quarterly basis. The Status of Compliance and the Directive 68 (Statute of Limitations) documents are scheduled to be discussed during an upcoming Executive Session.

The attached **Appendix A** provides the Commission with fourth quarter highlights for each office and a statistical overview of FY 2021 results and progression towards meeting the goals outlined within the 2018-2022 Strategic Plan adopted by the Commission. **Appendix B** provides an overview of all open audits and their respective stages within the audit process. **Appendix C** is an Audit Report entitled 'Proposed Final Audit Report – Due Date' which highlights the report manager, stage, phase, pre-audit start date, fieldwork begin date and the date the Proposed Final Audit Report must be approved in order to meet the current Strategic Plan goal. **Appendix D** (ADRO Civil Penalty Report) highlights civil penalties assessed, paid and an overview of nonmonetary terms to include date due and completed. **Appendix E** (AF Performance Goals Report) shows FY 2021 statistics for meeting strategic performance goals related to the Administrative Fine Program. **Appendix F** (AF Penalties Assessed and Collected) shows the total amount of penalties assessed and collection rate for FY 2015 – 2021.

As always, we welcome any feedback or suggestions that could be incorporated to enhance the presentation of the information contained within the document.

Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO)

In the second quarter of FY 2021, the ADRO received 15 cases including 12 from the Reports Analysis Division (RAD), 2 from OGC, and 1 directly from the Commission. During this time period, the ADRO closed 19 matters - 18 approved Negotiated Settlements and 1 approved dismissal. The Commission assessed \$96,115 in civil penalties and collected \$64,770 during the quarter.

(b) (7)(E)

There are currently 5 matters pending with the Commission

for a vote.

In the second quarter of FY 2021, ADRO staff continued to work with OCIO to implement enhancements to its case management software, Law Manager, to increase office efficiency. Specifically, new templates were deployed to reduce staff time required to produce routine correspondence and case-related documents. Additionally, ADRO developed and implemented a new case tracking database to manage our workflow. The ADR Specialist served on the Engagement Steering Committee and the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Council. Two ADRO staff members completed Conflict Coaching training. The office posted for a GS-13 ADR Specialist position, which will be filled in the third quarter of the fiscal year.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the second quarter of FY 2021, the Commission processed 244 Reason to Believe (RTB) findings. OAR received challenges in 20 cases and processed 2 Reviewing Officer Recommendations (RORs). The Commission reviewed final determination recommendations in 93 cases, made a final determination that the respondents in 90 cases violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a), and assessed \$320,902 in civil penalties. The Commission also collected \$62,590 in fine payments and prepared 86 cases for public release.

(b) (7)(E)

Additionally, OAR forwarded 100% of RORs within 60 days of receipt of each challenge, thus exceeding its strategic goal of processing 75% of RORs within 60 days (Appendix E).

In the second quarter, the Reviewing Officer collaborated with OGC and ADRO to provide responsive materials to a FOIA request related to unpaid civil money penalties. OAR also began to collaborate with OCIO to develop a new Administrative Fines search system for the website. This new search system will eventually replace the current Administrative Fines search within the Enforcement Query System.

Audit Division (Audit)

During the second quarter of FY 2021, the Audit Division (Audit) processed the following audit reports:

As of the date of this memorandum, Audit has a total of 18 open audits, including three 2018 authorized committee audits; nine 2018 unauthorized committee audits; and six 2020 authorized committee audits, for which audits commenced on April 28, 2021, following the Commission's April 22nd approval.

For the 2018 cycle authorized committee audits, (b) (5)

The recommendation of the Office of General Counsel's Compliance Advice Team (OGC-CAT) is currently pending before the Commission. The Proposed Final Audit Report of the second authorized committee audit is also

currently pending before the Commission. The remaining audit continues to be on hold given that Audit has not received the records necessary to commence fieldwork. (b) (5), (b) (7)(A), (b) (3) (A)

This recommendation is likewise pending before the Commission.

Regarding the nine 2018 unauthorized committee audits, two are in the Interim Audit Report writing stage; two have been analyzed by OGC-CAT and are being revised accordingly; and two are currently with OGC-CAT for legal analysis. In addition, one audit is in the Draft Final Audit Report writing stage and two Interim Audit Reports are currently pending before the Commission.

(b) (7)(E)

With respect to the Presidential Election Campaign Fund (PECF), Audit forwarded four 508 accessibility compliant monthly PECF reports received from the U.S. Treasury, to the Office of Chief Information Officer (OCIO) for web placement. In addition, Audit updated the annual list of the Commission's authorized signatories for the calendar year 2021 which contained the Commissioners' electronic signatures and provided it to the U.S. Treasury liaison.

(b) (5)

During the second quarter, Audit provided assistance to the Alternative Dispute Resolution Office on one ADRO matter and assisted OGC-CAT in preparing for the Jill Stein Administrative Reviewing Hearing held this quarter. Additionally, Audit held Division meetings during the quarter which included training on Presentation and Public Speaking skills, as well as Preparing for Commission Meetings. Audit also completed the preparation of a comprehensive instructional manual to assist in ensuring that all audit related documents placed on the Commission's website are 508 compliant.

Audit collaborated with OCIO with respect to User Acceptance Testing on TeamMate 12.6, Download Application, Audit Sampling Program, FEC Quality Standards training in Skillport and Audit Status Database. Audit managers collaborated with OGC Compliance Advice, Public Information, and the OCIO web team on the layout of the new Audit webpages, as well as ensuring the data transition was complete and accurate. Audit staff also received new laptops with Windows 10 and Office 2016.

The Annual Mandatory FEC Quality Standards training was completed by all Audit staff. In addition, Audit Managers met with individual Auditors to complete 2021-2022 individual training plans with respect to the Core Competencies. New Auditor training was completed for 2 new staff members.

In February, Audit welcomed a new Auditor to the Division, and she is continuing to progress through Audit's comprehensive training program. Also, during this quarter, a tenured and experienced Auditor retired after 29 years of service to the FEC. A second tenured, experienced and well-respected Auditor retired on April 30th after 22 years with the FEC. Their retirements not only increase the number of Division vacancies, but also represents a great loss in institutional knowledge. The Audit Division currently has 9 Auditor vacancies. As the number of vacancies within the division increases, Audit continues to seek innovative ways to continue to accomplish its mission, and to do so in a timely fashion, such as enlisting the assistance of RAD Campaign Finance Analysts to assist with certain reviews.

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the second quarter of FY 2021, RAD management worked with Commission offices to gain approval of the 2021-2022 RAD Review & Referral Procedures. RAD staff has been trained on the changes and review of the 2021 reports has begun. In addition, we are in the process of completing a redacted version of the document to be circulated for Commission approval and posted on the FEC website. RAD also referred six Authorized committees to the Audit Division for the 2019-2020 election cycle, which were approved by the Commission. We are currently in the process of making assessments for Party committees and PACs and will send our audit referral recommendations to the Audit Division in July. Also, during the second quarter, Reports Processing Branch staff continued to report to the building on a weekly basis to process paper documents, ensuring they were made publicly available timely and that the 48-hour statutory requirement was met.

During the second quarter, RAD staff reviewed a total of 33,332 documents totaling 102,386,652 pages and 82% of the reports were reviewed within 90 days of receipt, exceeding the strategic goal of 75% of reports reviewed within 90 days of receipt. RAD generated and sent 3,781 letters to the filing community and 92% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report review date. Also, during the second quarter, RAD generated 25 referrals (12 ADRO, 6 Audit, 7 Administrative Fine) and sent 1,398 non-filer notices. In addition, RAD staff handled 3,405 phone calls and 233 emails. The Reports Processing Branch coded 53,828,278 transactions, 3,099 documents and processed 9,906 pages from 1,083 documents in the Paper Conversion system.

RAD staff was active in providing training, outreach and assistance during the second quarter. RAD staff conducted campaign guide training for a new Auditor and collaborated with the Information Division on Candidate Committee, Party/PAC, Corporate PAC, Member/Labor PAC and FECfile webinars. RAD staff also reviewed and commented on Record articles covering Reports Due in 2021, the Louisiana Special elections, the Texas-06 Special election and the April 2021 Reporting Reminder, as well as a Tip for Treasurers addressing Candidate registration when the district is uncertain. In addition, RAD staff assisted the Press Office with the vetting of the 21-month statistical summary and collaborated with the Electronic Filing Office to facilitate the 2020 Year End, 2021 February Monthly, and 2021 March Monthly reporting reminders for electronic filers. In the area of assistance, RAD assisted OGC with 54 matters, ADRO with 4 matters, the Audit Division with 10 matters, the Press Office with 4 matters, and responded to 37 inquiries from Commission offices.

In the area of personnel during second quarter, RAD filled an Assistant Branch Chief position, a Campaign Finance Analyst (CFA) transferred to another agency, and another CFA recently left the agency. In addition, a Coding Clerk staff member provided notification of retirement for later this year and we expect additional tenured Reports Processing Branch staff members to follow in the near future. As we currently have three vacant Coding Clerk positions, there is concern that with a pending retirement and the likelihood of others, we will not be equipped to handle the volume of reports and transactions expected in 2022. In addition, RAD currently has six vacant CFA positions and one CFA on detail with the OCFO, raising concerns about the speed at which we will be able to conduct the review of 2021-2022 cycle reports. Finally, Mid-Year performance assessments were completed for all RAD managers during the second quarter.

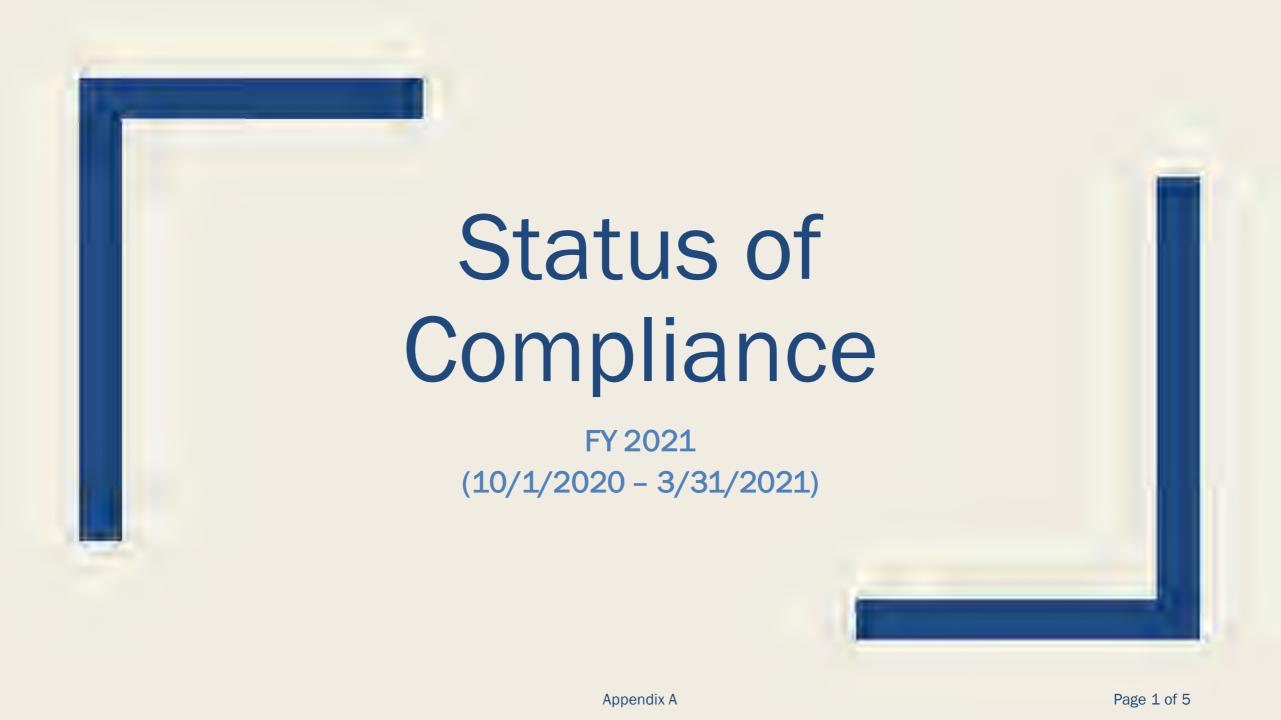

outlined within the 2018-2022 Strategic Plan adopted by the Commission. **Appendix B** provides an overview of all open audits and their respective stages within the audit process. **Appendix C** is an Audit Report entitled 'Proposed Final Audit Report – Due Date' which highlights the report manager, stage, phase, pre-audit start date, fieldwork begin date and the date the Proposed Final Audit Report must be approved in order to meet the current Strategic Plan goal. **Appendix D** (ADRO Civil Penalty Report) highlights civil penalties assessed, paid and an overview of nonmonetary terms to include date due and completed. **Appendix E** (AF Performance Goals Report) shows FY 2021 statistics for meeting strategic performance goals related to the Administrative Fine Program. **Appendix F** (AF Penalties Assessed and Collected) shows the total amount of penalties assessed and collection rate for FY 2015 – 2021.

As always, we welcome any feedback or suggestions that could be incorporated to enhance the presentation of the information contained within the document.

Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO)

In the third quarter of FY 2021, the ADRO received 31 cases including 27 from the Reports Analysis Division (RAD), 3 from Audit, and 1 directly from the Commission. During this time period, the ADRO closed 17 matters – 16 approved Negotiated Settlements and 1 approved dismissal. The Commission assessed \$65,215 in civil penalties and collected \$56,770 during the quarter.

(b) (7)(E)

There are currently 6 matters pending with the Commission

for a vote.

In the third quarter of FY 2021, ADRO focused on improving our efficiency while processing a record number of incoming matters – a nearly 250% increase over the same quarter in the previous election cycle. Staff continued to work with OCIO to implement enhancements to its case management systems, ensuring that Law Manager functions to automate drafts of our case processing documents including memos, correspondence, settlements, and recommendations. Further, ADRO continued to develop and implement a custom case tracking application to manage day-to-day details of our workflow and automate reports. ADRO will work closely with OCIO in the coming quarter to ensure that data can be transferred from Law Manager to our new database to improve the efficiency of our data entry and ensure accuracy.

The ADRO filled a GS-13 ADR Specialist position internally. During the quarter, an ADRO staff member continued to serve on the Engagement Steering Committee and the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Council.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the third quarter of FY 2021, the Commission processed 114 Reason to Believe (RTB) findings. OAR received challenges in 11 cases and processed 23 Reviewing Officer Recommendations (RORs). The Commission reviewed final determination recommendations in 40 cases, made a final determination that the respondents in 38 cases violated

52 U.S.C. § 30104(a), and assessed \$130,084 in civil penalties. The Commission also collected \$114,820 in fine payments and prepared 39 cases for public release.

(b) (7)(E)

Additionally, OAR forwarded 95.6% of RORs within 60 days of receipt of each challenge, thus exceeding its strategic goal of processing 75% of RORs within 60 days (Appendix E).

In the third quarter, the Reviewing Officer also continued to work with OCIO to develop and test the new Administrative Fines search system for the website. This new search feature will go live in August 2021 and replace the current Administrative Fines search within the Enforcement Query System.

Audit Division (Audit)

During the third quarter of FY 2021, the Audit Division (Audit) processed the following audit reports:

As of the date of this memorandum, Audit has a total of 16 open audits, including one 2018 authorized committee audit; nine 2018 unauthorized committee audits; and six 2020 authorized committee audits, approved by the Commission in this third quarter. Pre-audit reviews are underway for the 2020 audits, with fieldwork expected to begin in early September.

For the 2018 cycle authorized committee audits, during the third quarter the Commission approved one Proposed Final Audit Report and the Audit staff referred to the Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO) one committee with Commission-approved findings that breached materiality thresholds for referral. (b) (5), (b) (7)(A)

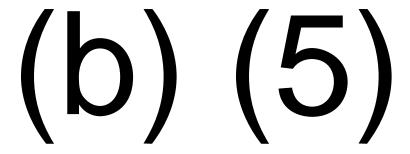

The committee has since provided its response to the Interim Audit Report and the Audit staff is finalizing the Draft Final Audit Report for legal analysis by the Office of General Counsel's Compliance Advice Team (OGC-CAT). (b) (5)

Regarding the 2018 unauthorized committee audits, in the third quarter the Commission approved one Proposed Final Audit Report and five Interim Audit Reports, and the Audit staff referred to ADRO two committees with Commission-approved findings that breached materiality thresholds for referral. Additionally, the nine open audits are in the following stages: three are in the committee response period to the Interim Audit Report; four are in the Draft Final Audit Report writing stage; and three are currently with OGC-CAT for legal analysis.

(b) (7)(E)

With respect to the Presidential Election Campaign Fund (PECF), Audit forwarded three 508 accessibility compliant monthly PECF reports received from the U.S. Treasury, to the Office of Chief Information Officer (OCIO) for web placement. In addition, Audit was contacted by the U.S. Treasury liaison and answered questions pertaining to the 2020 presidential election spending limits. In consultation with OGC-CAT, Audit also provided comments and edits to the Information Division and OCIO on the new web pages for presidential candidates and matching funds.



During the third quarter, Audit provided assistance to ADRO on one matter and assisted OGC on three matters. Audit staff also prepared and delivered a presentation to OGC detailing the who, what, when and why of the Audit Division, its processes and the types of violations most often referred to OGC. Additionally, Audit held monthly Division meetings during the quarter which included training on Time Management techniques, how to conduct Records Inventory, and changes resulting from the 2019-2020 Title 52 Authorized Audit Program, Materiality Thresholds and Error Definitions, which were approved by the Commission in April. The 2019-2020 Title 52 Unauthorized Audit Program, Materiality Thresholds and Error Definitions were recently emailed to the Commission for comments and questions prior to being formally circulated for vote.

Audit Management and OGC-CAT met with Commission offices to discuss the audit process as it exists currently in Directive 70 and potential changes Commissioners would like to see to the process and audit reports. Subsequent to those meetings, Audit Management and OGC-CAT have met to brainstorm ideas that may find consensus among the Commissioners and are preparing proposed modification options for the Commission's informal consideration.

Audit staff received new laptops, courtesy of OCIO in April and successfully upgraded to TeamMate version 12.6. Audit management also collaborated with OCIO to implement the use of SharePoint as a secure means of receiving electronic documents from committees, which has been instrumental in receiving records for the 2020 authorized committee audits. Additionally, Audit collaborated with OCIO with respect to User Acceptance Testing on migration to Amazon Web Services (AWS) for TeamMate 12.6, as well as the Download Application, Audit Report Search System, Audit Status Database and Coding Database. All migrations to-date have been successful. Crystal Reports and the Audit Sampling Program are scheduled to migrate to AWS in early August.

The Audit Division currently has 9 Auditor vacancies, equivalent to approximately 1/3 of our Auditor staff, and recently received approval to fill one of these vacancies. The posting is scheduled to open on July 30th. Thus far this fiscal year, two Auditors have retired and this trend is expected to continue as another Auditor will retire in December 2021, and three additional Auditors are eligible and making arrangements to retire between now and FY 2024. This shortage

will continue to be exacerbated as Auditors retire and/or separate from the agency and as this occurs, we will continue to seek Commission approval to backfill vacancies.

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the third quarter of FY 2021, RAD staff wrapped up the 2019-2020 cycle review and made audit referral assessments for Unauthorized committees, referring 12 committees (2 Party, 10 PACs) to the Audit Division during the fourth quarter. In addition, the RAD Education Program (the Program) was implemented for the first time which provides an informal, educationbased means for resolving compliance issues. The goal of the program is to educate political committees on disclosure and compliance requirements to ensure future compliance with the FECA and Commission regulations. The Program provides eligible committees with an opportunity to participate in tailored training focused on the issues identified during the review of the committees' reports and cited in Requests for Additional Information sent during the election cycle, in lieu of a referral for an audit. Further, committees that are not otherwise eligible for an audit referral, but that meet certain criteria outlined in the RAD Procedures, are invited to participate in the Program to prevent future compliance issues. For the 2019-2020 cycle, 14 committees have been identified thus far as eligible to participate in the Program and all 14 have agreed to participate. Further, training sessions have been completed for four of the committees and are in the process of being scheduled for the remaining 10. Feedback received so far from the committees that have attended the training sessions has been positive and indicates that attendees are appreciative and found the sessions to be very helpful. Also, during the third quarter, Reports Processing Branch staff continued to report to the building on a weekly basis to process paper documents, ensuring they were made publicly available timely and that the 48-hour statutory requirement was met.

During the third quarter, RAD staff reviewed a total of 17,977 documents totaling 12,070,517 pages and 77% of the reports were reviewed within 90 days of receipt, exceeding the strategic goal of 75% of reports reviewed within 90 days of receipt. RAD generated and sent 1,519 letters to the filing community and 92% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report review date. Also, during the third quarter, RAD generated 33 referrals (27 ADRO, 4 OGC, 2 Administrative Fine) and sent 607 non-filer notices. In addition, RAD staff handled 2,720 phone calls and 196 emails from the filing community. The Reports Processing Branch coded 6,731,027 transactions, 616 documents and processed 13,543 pages from 1,378 documents in the Paper Conversion system. Also, the 2021-2022 Redacted RAD Review & Referral Procedures were approved by the Commission and posted on the FEC website.

RAD staff was active in providing training, outreach and assistance during the third quarter, collaborating with the Information Division on Candidate Committee, Party, Trade PAC and FECfile webinars. Further, RAD staff conducted an OnTopic training session on Registration for Campaigns, as well as two FEC Connect training sessions for ADR cases. RAD staff also reviewed and commented on Record articles covering the Ohio-11 and New Mexico-01 Special elections. In addition, RAD staff assisted the Press Office with the vetting of the 24-month statistical summary and collaborated with the Electronic Filing Office to facilitate the 2021 April Quarterly, April Monthly and May Monthly reporting reminders for electronic filers. RAD staff also provided extended phone coverage for the 2021 April Quarterly filing deadline. In the area of assistance provided to other offices, RAD assisted OGC with 28 matters, ADRO with 14 matters,

the Audit Division with 11 matters, the Press Office with 7 matters, and responded to 20 inquiries from Commission offices. In addition, a RAD overview was provided to Commissioner EAs, as well as side-by-side review sessions.

RAD management continued its commitment to providing consistent communication, as well as learning and team building opportunities to staff members in the Office of Compliance. During the third quarter, Office Overview sessions were held covering the Administrative Fine Program and with the Office of Congressional Affairs and OGC – Policy Division. These sessions allowed staff to learn about the functions and responsibilities of other offices within the agency. RAD management also continued to provide a monthly newsletter to staff which includes FEC and RAD news, as well as employee recognition and spotlight features. Also, a division meeting was held which included updates on agency projects and division customer service initiatives, performance and peer award presentations, and a team building activity. During the next quarter we will be introducing a "Meet a Commissioner Event Series" which will enable staff to get to know Commissioners and submit topics for discussion.

In the area of personnel during third quarter, two Campaign Finance Analysts (CFA) transferred to OCFO and two CFAs were promoted to Senior Campaign Finance & Reviewing Analysts. We are currently in the process of filling a CFA position, two Data Disclosure Assistant positions and one Senior Campaign Finance & Reviewing Analyst position. (b) (7)(E)

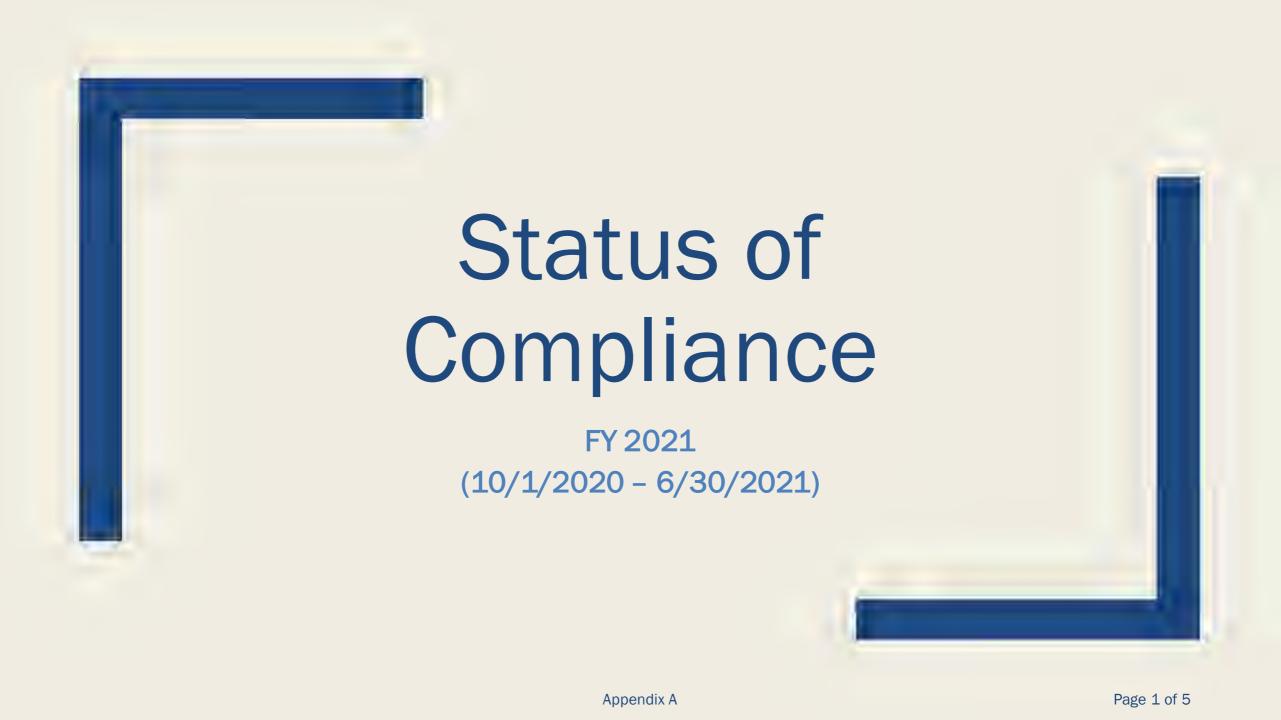

SUBJECT: Status of Compliance – Fiscal Year 2021 – 4th Quarter Highlights (7/1/21 –

9/30/21)

The Office of Compliance (Compliance) submits this memorandum to provide the Commission with a snapshot of accomplishments and highlights for the fourth quarter of FY 2021 (7/1/21 - 9/30/21). The intent of this document is to provide an update of the workload and achieved results of the Office of Compliance on a quarterly basis. The Status of Compliance and the Directive 68 (Statute of Limitations) documents are scheduled to be discussed during an upcoming Executive Session.

The attached **Appendix A** provides the Commission with fourth quarter highlights and a statistical overview of FY 2021 results and performance goals outlined within the 2018-2022

Strategic Plan adopted by the Commission. **Appendix B** provides an overview of all open audits and their respective stages within the audit process. **Appendix C** is an Audit Report entitled 'Proposed Final Audit Report – Due Date' which highlights the report manager, stage, phase, preaudit start date, fieldwork begin date and the date the Proposed Final Audit Report must be approved in order to meet the current Strategic Plan goal. **Appendix D** (ADRO Civil Penalty Report) highlights civil penalties assessed, paid and an overview of non-monetary terms to include date due and completed. **Appendix E** (AF Performance Goals Report) shows FY 2021 statistics for meeting strategic performance goals related to the Administrative Fine Program. **Appendix F** (AF Penalties Assessed and Collected) shows the total amount of penalties assessed and collection rate for FY 2015 – 2021.

As always, we welcome any feedback or suggestions that could be incorporated to enhance the presentation of the information contained within the document.

Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO)

In the fourth quarter of FY 2021, the ADRO received 12 cases including 10 from the Reports Analysis Division (RAD), 1 from the Office of General Counsel (OGC), and 1 directly from the Commission. During this time period, the ADRO closed 30 matters – all of them approved Negotiated Settlements. The Commission assessed \$158,505 in civil penalties and collected \$114,705 during the quarter.

During the fourth quarter, the ADRO circulated recommendations in 27 matters. (b) (7)(E)

There is currently 1 matter pending with the Commission

for a vote.

Throughout FY 2021, ADRO focused on improving our efficiency while processing a near record number of incoming matters – almost double the prior fiscal year. Staff continued to work with OCIO to implement enhancements to its case management systems, ensuring that Law Manager functions to automate drafts of our case processing documents including memos, correspondence, settlements, and recommendations. Further, ADRO continued to develop and implement a custom case tracking application to manage day-to-day details of our workflow and automate reports. ADRO will work closely with OCIO in the coming quarter to ensure that data can be transferred from Law Manager to our new database to improve the efficiency of our data entry and ensure accuracy.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the fourth quarter of FY 2021, the Commission processed 25 Reason to Believe (RTB) findings. OAR received challenges in 3 cases and processed 6 Reviewing Officer Recommendations (RORs). The Commission reviewed final determination recommendations in 168 cases, made a final determination that the respondents in 163 cases violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a), and assessed \$498,833 in civil penalties. The Commission also collected \$88,226 in fine payments and prepared 78 cases for public release.

(b) (7)(E)

OAR forwarded 50% of RORs within 60 days of receipt of each challenge, not meeting its strategic goal of processing 75% of RORs within 60 days (Appendix E).

In the fourth quarter, the Reviewing Officer and RAD worked with OCIO to launch the new Administrative Fines search system for the website. This new search feature includes capabilities to search closed matters by case number, committee name, and keywords. Case summaries include a new payment status, and the disposition overview now clearly indicates matters that have been challenged or transferred to Department of the Treasury for collection.

Audit Division (Audit)

For the 2018 cycle, the Audit staff referred to the Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO) Commission-approved findings with violations totaling \$218,416, for which \$5,735 in civil penalties were assessed. One finding, totaling \$106,674, was ultimately referred by ADRO to the Office of General Counsel (OGC), as the committee declined to participate in the ADRO process.

During the fourth quarter of FY 2021, the Audit Division (Audit) processed the following audit reports:

As of the date of this memorandum, Audit has a total of 16 open audits, including one 2018 authorized committee audit; nine 2018 unauthorized committee audits; and six 2020 authorized committee audits, approved by the Commission in the third quarter. Preliminary audit reviews were completed and entrance conferences held for each of the 2020 authorized committee audits, with fieldwork estimated to conclude in five of the six audits in the coming weeks.

For the 2018 cycle authorized committee audit, when providing its response to the Draft Final Audit Report, the committee requested an audit hearing before the Commission. The hearing was granted on October 12, 2021 and will be held on November 10, 2021.

Regarding the 2018 unauthorized committee audits, in the fourth quarter the Commission approved two Interim Audit Reports. The nine open audits are in the following stages: one is in the Interim Audit Report writing stage; one is awaiting the committee's response to the Interim Audit Report; one is in the Draft Final Audit Report writing stage; three are awaiting the legal analysis on the Draft Final Audit Report; two are awaiting the committee responses to the Draft Final Audit Report; and one is in the Audit Division Recommendation Memorandum writing stage.

(b) (7)(E)

With respect to the Presidential Election Campaign Fund (PECF), Audit forwarded four 508 accessibility-compliant monthly PECF reports received from the U.S. Treasury, to the Office of Chief Information Officer (OCIO) for web placement. Audit also coordinated with the Press Office to respond to an inquiry pertaining to the types of resources – financial, personnel, and otherwise, the Commission utilizes to administer and maintain the PECF Program.

(b) (5)

During the fourth quarter, Audit provided assistance to ADRO on seven matters, assisted OGC on six matters and collaborated with OCIO with respect to additional User Acceptance Testing for TeamMate 12.6, the Audit Sampling Program and Crystal Reports. Monthly Division meetings were also held during the quarter which included training on conducting Entrance and Exit Conferences, Parent-Memo Entries for Receipts, and best practices related to committees filing Form 99 Miscellaneous Text Documents, in lieu of amendments, in response to Audit's recommendations.

Additionally, the 2019-2020 Title 52 Unauthorized Audit Program, Materiality Thresholds and Error Definitions circulated for approval during the fourth quarter. (b) (5)

The Audit Division is currently staffed with 20 Auditors and has nine Auditor vacancies, equivalent to approximately 1/3 of our Auditor staff. In December, another tenured auditor will retire, bringing a total of three Auditor retirements this fiscal year. Combined, these three Auditors served the agency for a total of 74 years. In the fourth quarter, Audit received approval to hire one Auditor. The interview stage for this approved hire was recently completed and Audit looks forward to checking references and making a final selection. With this new hire effectively backfilling our December retiree, we will continue to be down nine auditors heading into 2022. As such, we have requested approval from the Personnel Committee to hire two additional Auditors.

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the fourth quarter of FY 2021, RAD staff continued to implement the RAD Education Program (the Program) for 2019-2020 cycle committees providing eligible committees with an opportunity to participate in tailored training focused on the issues identified during the review of the committees' reports and cited in Requests for Additional Information, in lieu of a referral for an audit. For the cycle, 16 committees were identified as eligible to participate. During the fourth quarter, training sessions were completed for 14 of the committees. Further, the training session for one of the remaining two committees eligible has been scheduled. Additionally, 13 committees have met the Program requirement of filing amended reports for outstanding issues and were sent completion letters. Feedback from surveys sent to the committees that attended the training sessions continues to be positive and indicates that attendees found the sessions to be very helpful. In addition, RAD managers circulated recommendations to the Commission for revisions to Standard 21 (Inaugural Committee Review) of the 2021-2022 RAD Review and Referral Procedures in response to an OIG report.

During the fourth quarter, RAD staff reviewed a total of 19,889 documents totaling 13,339,120 pages and 82.8% of the reports were reviewed within 90 days of receipt, exceeding the strategic goal of 75% of reports reviewed within 90 days of receipt. RAD generated and sent 1,772 letters to the filing community and 86% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report review date. Also, during the fourth quarter, RAD generated 35 referrals (10 ADRO, 7 OGC, 6 Administrative Fine, and 12 Audit) and sent 1,280 non-filer notices. In addition, RAD staff handled 2,963 phone calls and 252 emails from the filing community. The Reports Processing Branch coded 10,386,508 transactions, 797 documents and processed 4,254 pages from 439 documents in the Paper Conversion system.

RAD was again active during the fourth quarter in providing training, outreach and assistance, collaborating with the Information Division on the first FEC Virtual Conference and on Candidate Committee, Party/PAC and FECfile webinars. Further, RAD staff conducted an FEC Connect training session for an ADR case. RAD staff assisted the Press Office with the vetting of the 2021-2022 6-month statistical summary and collaborated with the Electronic Filing Office to facilitate the 2021 Mid-Year, July Monthly, August Monthly, September Monthly and TX-06 Special Runoff election reporting reminders for electronic filers. RAD staff also provided extended phone coverage for the 2021 July Quarterly and Mid-Year filing deadlines. In the area of assistance provided to other offices, RAD assisted OGC with 56 matters, ADRO with 17 matters, the Audit Division with 7 matters, the Press Office with 1 matter, the Congressional Affairs Office with 2 matters and responded to 20 inquiries from Commission offices.

RAD management continued its commitment in maintaining positive morale, promoting communication, and providing learning and team building opportunities to staff members in the Office of Compliance. During the fourth quarter, Office Overview sessions were held with the Office of the Commission Secretary and the Fec.gov Front-end UX team, as well as a "Meet a Commissioner Event" with the Chair. RAD management continued to provide a monthly newsletter to staff which includes FEC and RAD news, as well as employee recognition and spotlight features. The RAD team also implemented two important division initiatives during the fourth quarter. The first was the creation of the 2020 FEVS Focus Group to identify opportunities for improvement and develop possible suggestions for improvements within RAD. The group

provided its recommendations to the RAD Management team and we are in the process of developing solutions to address those recommendations. Second, RAD Management and a team of Campaign Finance Analysts formed a working group to create a customer service survey. The survey was sent to filers that have had contact with RAD within the past year. We are in the process of compiling and analyzing the results and plan to provide the Commission with an overview of the results during the next quarter. Finally, all RAD managers received 2020-2021 annual performance assessments and created performance management plans for the 2021-2022 performance period.

In the area of personnel during fourth quarter, one Campaign Finance Analysts (CFA) was promoted to a Senior Campaign Finance & Reviewing Analyst and two Coding Clerks were promoted to Data Disclosure Assistants. In addition, a selection was made to fill one approved CFA position. With a recent resignation, RAD currently has eight additional vacant CFA positions and has requested approval to fill at least three positions with best qualified candidates from the recent CFA posting. 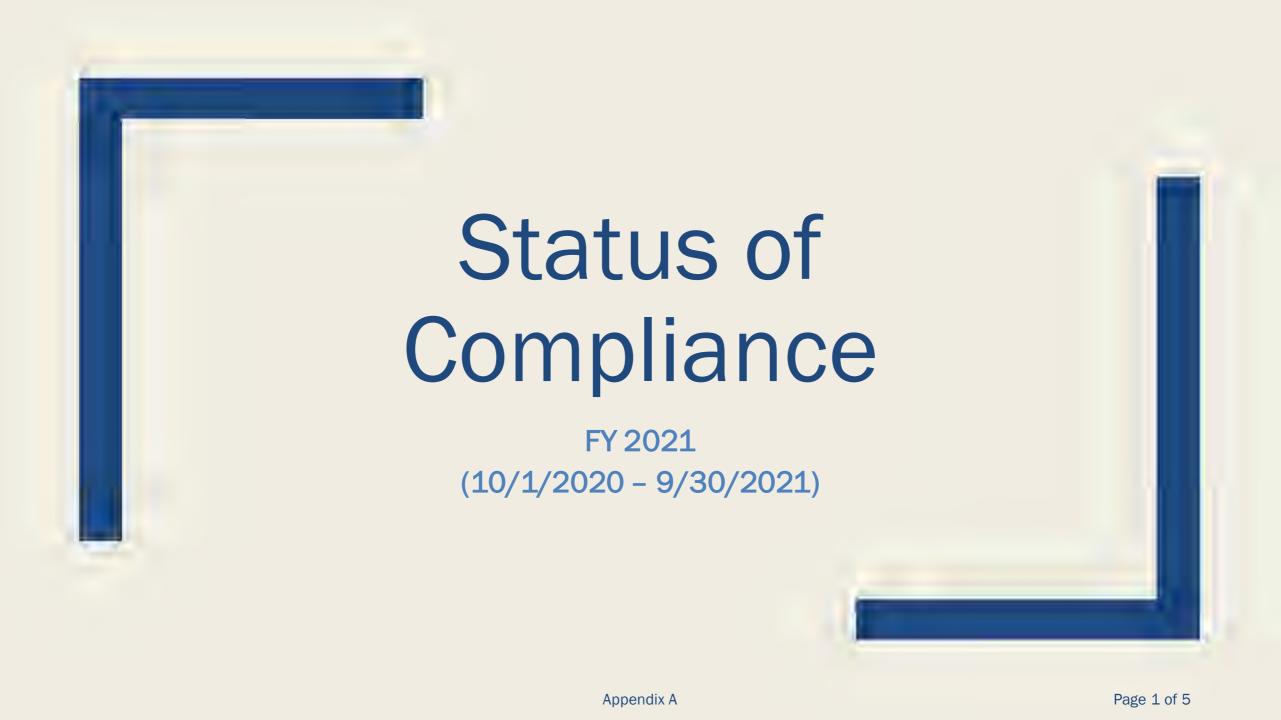

RAD staff collaborated with the Information Division on the FEC Virtual Conference for Candidates, PACs and Party Committees, as well as the following webinars: Candidate Committee, Party/PAC, and FECfile (2). An FEC Virtual Conference for Candidates, PACs and Party Committees was held in August 2021. Party/PAC and FECFile webinars were held in July 2021, Candidate Committee and FECfile webinars were held in September 2021.

RAD implemented the RAD Education Program for the 2020 cycle to provide an informal, education-based means for resolving compliance issues, in lieu of an audit in some cases. SUBJECT: Status of Compliance – Fiscal Year 2022 – 1st Quarter Highlights (10/1/21 –

12/31/21)

The Office of Compliance (Compliance) submits this memorandum to provide the Commission with a snapshot of accomplishments and highlights for the first quarter of FY 2022 (10/1/21 - 12/31/21). The intent of this document is to provide an update of the workload and achieved results of the Office of Compliance on a quarterly basis. The Status of Compliance and the Directive 68 (Statute of Limitations) documents are scheduled to be discussed during an upcoming Executive Session.

The attached Appendix A provides the Commission with first quarter highlights and a statistical overview of FY 2022 results and performance goals outlined within the 2018-2022 Strategic Plan adopted by the Commission. Appendix B provides an overview of all open audits and their respective stages within the audit process. Appendix C is an Audit Report entitled 'Proposed Final Audit Report – Due Date' which highlights the report manager, stage, phase, preaudit start date, fieldwork begin date and the date the Proposed Final Audit Report must be approved in order to meet the current Strategic Plan goal. Appendix D (ADRO Civil Penalty

Report) highlights civil penalties assessed, paid and an overview of non-monetary terms to include date due and completed. **Appendix E** (AF Performance Goals Report) shows FY 2022 statistics for meeting strategic performance goals related to the Administrative Fine Program. **Appendix F** (AF Penalties Assessed and Collected) shows the total amount of penalties assessed and collection rate for FY 2015 - 2022.

As always, we welcome any feedback or suggestions that could be incorporated to enhance the presentation of the information contained within the document.

Alternative Dispute Resolution Office (ADRO)

In the first quarter of FY 2022, the ADRO received 22 cases including 7 from the Reports Analysis Division (RAD), 1 from the Office of General Counsel (OGC), 6 audit transfers approved by the Commission, and 8 other matters directly from the Commission. During this time period, the ADRO closed 15 matters – all of them approved Negotiated Settlements. The Commission assessed \$83,575 in civil penalties and collected \$132,250 during the quarter.

During the first quarter, the ADRO circulated recommendations in 16 matters. (b) (7)(E)

There are currently 2 matters pending with the Commission

for a vote.

During the first quarter, ADRO focused on improving our efficiency handling a high caseload. Staff continued to work with OCIO to implement enhancements to its case management systems, ensuring that Law Manager functions to automate drafts of our case processing documents including memos, correspondence, settlements, and recommendations. Further, ADRO continued to develop and implement a custom case tracking application to manage day-to-day details of our workflow and automate reports. ADRO will work closely with OCIO as the new application is deployed in the second quarter.

Administrative Fine Program (Office of Administrative Review)

During the first quarter of FY 2022, the Commission processed 18 Reason to Believe (RTB) findings. OAR received challenges in 4 cases and processed 4 Reviewing Officer Recommendations (RORs). The Commission reviewed final determination recommendations in 143 cases, made a final determination that the respondents in 142 cases violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a), and assessed \$421,233 in civil penalties. The Commission also collected \$59,078 in fine payments and prepared 101 cases for public release.

OAR forwarded 75% of RORs within 60 days of receipt of each challenge, meeting its strategic goal of processing 75% of RORs within 60 days (Appendix E).

In the first quarter, OAR and RAD worked with the OCIO to prepare for the 2022 Inflation Adjustments for Civil Money Penalties. The adjusted penalties went into effect on December 28, 2021. OAR and RAD ensured necessary updates were made to internal programs, website content, and the Administrative Fine Calculator.

During the first quarter of FY 2022, the Audit Division (Audit) processed the following audit reports:

As of the date of this memorandum, Audit has a total of 21 open audits, including one 2018 authorized committee audit; eight 2018 unauthorized committee audits; six 2020 authorized committee audits; and six unauthorized committee audits.

In addition to the Commission holding two Audit Hearings in December, a 2018 cycle unauthorized committee also requested an audit hearing before the Commission in December. The hearing was granted on December 15, 2021 and awaiting scheduling by the Commission.

The following chart details the Audit stage for all (21) open audits. Audits awaiting a legal analysis on the Interim Audit Report (IAR), Draft Final Audit Report (DFAR) or the Audit Division Recommendation Memorandum (ADRM) are noted with "In OGC" in the applicable column.

During the first quarter, Audit provided assistance to ADRO on two matters, assisted OGC on two matters and collaborated with OCIO with respect to additional User Acceptance Testing for the Audit Sampling Program and Crystal Reports. Monthly Division meetings were also held during the quarter which included training on best practices related to committees filing Form 99 Miscellaneous Text Documents, in lieu of amendments, in response to Audit's recommendations; and an overview of Audit documents to be used for the 2020 Unauthorized Audits in lieu of an approved Audit Program, Error Definitions and Materiality Thresholds. Additionally, the 2019-2020 Title 52 Redacted Authorized Materiality Thresholds, which are currently pending with the Commission, were circulated for approval in November.

Lastly, Audit advised the committee's treasurer of the status of the resubmission. Audit referenced previous communications addressing the timing of the resubmission and stated that the Commission will decide whether the candidate may be considered for matching funds. Audit will communicate with the treasurer once the Commission's directive is available.

With regard to personnel, a tenured Auditor retired on December 31st; however, we warmly welcomed a new Auditor on January 18th. As such, the Division continues to be staffed with 20 Auditors, with nine (9) Auditor vacancies. During the first quarter, the personnel committee approved the hire of two additional Auditors, for which the vacancy announcement closed in January. As we continue to process the 21 current open audits and plan for the 2022 audits, taking into consideration the four additional Auditors who are eligible to retire in the next two years, we will seek approval from the personnel committee to backfill more of our nine (9) vacancies.

Reports Analysis Division (RAD)

During the first quarter of FY 2022, RAD staff reviewed a total of 15,184 documents totaling 8,336,969 pages and 87% of the reports were reviewed within 90 days of receipt, exceeding the strategic goal of 75% of reports reviewed within 90 days of receipt. RAD generated and sent 1,263 letters to the filing community and 87% of RFAIs were sent within 40 days of the report review date. Also, during the first quarter, RAD generated 18 referrals (7 ADRO, 5 OGC, 4 Administrative Fine, 1 Debt Settlement, and 1 Administrative Termination) and sent 482 non-filer notices. In addition, RAD staff handled 2,308 phone calls and 201 emails from the filing community. The Reports Processing Branch coded 14,830,878 transactions, 478 documents and processed 5,951 pages from 541 documents in the Paper Conversion system.

RAD management continued its focus on maintaining positive morale, promoting communication, and providing learning and team building opportunities to staff members in the virtual environment. During the first quarter, RAD staff coordinated and moderated a "Meet a Commissioner Event" with the former Vice Chair for Office of Compliance staff. RAD management continued to provide a monthly newsletter to staff which included FEC and RAD news, professional development resources, as well as employee recognition and spotlight features. In response to the feedback from the 2020 Federal Employee Viewpoint Survey (FEVS) working group, RAD management created a professional development folder with resources and training opportunities for staff. Also during the first quarter, RAD compiled and began to analyze the RAD Customer Satisfaction Survey results and provided an overview of the results to the Commission. We will continue to analyze the results and identify areas that can be improved upon.

RAD was again active during the first quarter in providing training, outreach and assistance, collaborating with the Information Division on an FEC Virtual Conference, a Nonconnected committee webinar and FEC Connect OnTopic informal discussions on "How to Contact Your Committee's Analyst" and "Registration for PACs and Party Committees." Further, RAD staff conducted an FEC Connect training session for an ADR case. RAD staff collaborated with the Electronic Filing Office to facilitate the 2021 October Quarterly, October Monthly,

November Monthly, December Monthly and OH-11, OH-15, FL-20 Pre and Post Special General election reporting reminders for electronic filers. RAD staff also provided extended phone coverage for the 2021 October Quarterly filing deadline. In the area of assistance provided to other offices, RAD assisted OGC with 30 matters, ADRO with 2 matters, the Audit Division with 6 matters, the Press Office with 2 matters, the Congressional Affairs Office with 1 matter and responded to 6 inquiries from Commission offices.

In the area of personnel during first quarter, one Campaign Finance Analyst (CFA) resigned, and we welcomed one CFA on the Authorized Branch. RAD currently has eight vacant CFA positions (3 Authorized Branch and 5 Party/NonParty Branch) and has requested approval to fill at least three positions with best qualified candidates from the recent CFA posting if these candidates are still available, which would save the division time and resources. It should also be noted that we currently have three vacant Coding Clerk positions and have requested approval to fill two. (b) (7)(E)

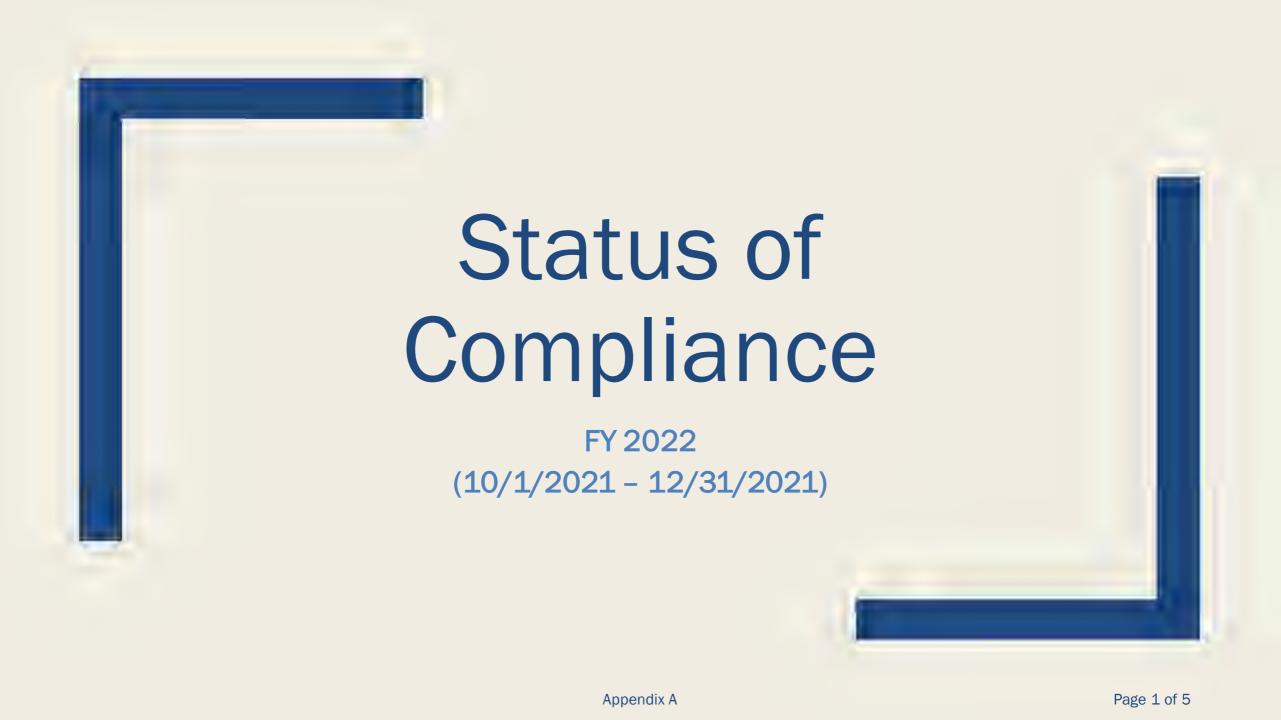

RAD staff provided extended phone coverage from 5:30pm to 8:00pm for the 2021 October Quarterly reporting deadline.

RAD staff handled 25 calls for the 2021 October Quarterly filing deadline between 5:30pm and 8:00pm. 153 total calls were handled on the October Quarterly filing deadline.

RAD staff collaborated with the Information Division on the FEC Virtual Conference for Candidates, PACs and Party Committees, a webinar for Nonconnected committees, as well as the FEC Connect OnTopic informal discussion on "How to Contact Your Committee's Analyst."

The FEC Virtual Conference for Candidates, PACs and Party Committees was held in November 2021. The Nonconnected committee webinar and FEC OnTopic session were held in December 2021.

RAD staff collaborated with OCIO to implement two of the Scam PAC working group's website recommendations: Displaying Percentage of Political Committee's Disbursements Spent on Specific Vendors and Amending Column Headers on Political Committee Search Pages to clarify committee types.

The new features went live on FEC.gov in December 2021.
