FBI FOIPA Addendum

As referenced in our letter responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, the FBI FOIPA Addendum provides information applicable to your request. Part 1 of the Addendum includes standard responses that apply to all requests. Part 2 includes standard responses that apply to requests for records about individuals to the extent your request seeks the listed information. Part 3 includes general information about FBI records, searches, and programs.

Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) 5 U.S.C. § 552(c). Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIPA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c)]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIPA. Additional information about the FBI and the FOIPA can be found on the www.fbi.gov/foia website.
- (ii) Intelligence Records. To the extent your request seeks records of intelligence sources, methods, or activities, the FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and as applicable to requests for records about individuals, PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself a classified fact protected by FOIA exemption (b)(1) and/or would reveal intelligence sources, methods, or activities protected by exemption (b)(3) [50 USC § 3024(i)(1)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that any such records do or do not exist.

Part 2: The standard responses below apply to all requests for records on individuals:

- (i) Requests for Records about any Individual—Watch Lists. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of any individual's name on a watch list pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(7)(E) and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(7)(E), (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that watch list records do or do not exist.
- (ii) Requests for Records about any Individual—Witness Security Program Records. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records which could identify any participant in the Witness Security Program pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(3) and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(3), 18 U.S.C. 3521, and (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.
- (iii) Requests for Records for Incarcerated Individuals. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records which could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any incarcerated individual pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(7)(E), (b)(7)(F), and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(7)(E), (b)(7)(F), and (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.

Part 3: General Information:

- (i) Record Searches and Standard Search Policy. The Record/Information Dissemination Section (RIDS) searches for reasonably described records by searching systems, such as the Central Records System (CRS), or locations where responsive records would reasonably be found. The CRS is an extensive system of records consisting of applicant, investigative, intelligence, personnel, administrative, and general files compiled by the FBI per its law enforcement, intelligence, and administrative functions. The CRS spans the entire FBI organization, comprising records of FBI Headquarters, FBI Field Offices, and FBI Legal Attaché Offices (Legats) worldwide; Electronic Surveillance (ELSUR) records are included in the CRS. The standard search policy is a search for main entity records in the CRS. Unless specifically requested, a standard search does <u>not</u> include a search for reference entity records, administrative records of previous FOIPA requests, or civil litigation files.
 - Main Entity Records created for individuals or non-individuals who are the subjects or the focus of an investigation
 - Reference Entity Records- created for individuals or non-individuals who are associated with a case but are not known subjects or the focus of an investigation
- (ii) FBI Records. Founded in 1908, the FBI carries out a dual law enforcement and national security mission. As part of this dual mission, the FBI creates and maintains records on various subjects; however, the FBI does not maintain records on every person, subject, or entity.
- (iii) Requests for Criminal History Records or Rap Sheets. The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division provides Identity History Summary Checks – often referred to as a criminal history record or rap sheet. These criminal history records are not the same as material in an investigative "FBI file." An Identity History Summary Check is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization, or military service. For a fee, individuals can request a copy of their Identity History Summary Check. Forms and directions can be accessed at www.fbi.gov/about-us/cjis/identity-history-summary-checks. EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b)(3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;
- (b)(4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;
- (b)(6) personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552a

- (d)(5) information compiled in reasonable anticipation of a civil action proceeding;
- (j)(2) material reporting investigative efforts pertaining to the enforcement of criminal law including efforts to prevent, control, or reduce crime or apprehend criminals;
- (k)(1) information which is currently and properly classified pursuant to an Executive order in the interest of the national defense or foreign policy, for example, information involving intelligence sources or methods;
- (k)(2) investigatory material compiled for law enforcement purposes, other than criminal, which did not result in loss of a right, benefit or privilege under Federal programs, or which would identify a source who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(3) material maintained in connection with providing protective services to the President of the United States or any other individual pursuant to the authority of Title 18, United States Code, Section 3056;
- (k)(4) required by statute to be maintained and used solely as statistical records;
- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.

It looks like we will need to extend the guard service; we have a dehumidifier at 604 S. Pickett Street that will be in place for at least another 5 days. The bay door is temporarily sealed by a sheet of plywood. We have had the roving (5a-9p M-F) and special guards sitting in their vehicle between it and the buckled door on the end. It is my understanding that end door has been replaced today, but the new door will not close completely.

Even after the dehumidifier is removed, we will have to have someone from team work with our ET to install door contacts on the new door and check the contacts and system integrity throughout, in order to arm the alarm system. The good news (about time, huh?) is that SOC called me today to report multiple motion detector (PIR) alarms at 604. I advised them of the situation and told them to turn down the annunciator and disregard until further notice. But, that does indicate the overall system is probably still usable, once the damaged contacts are changed.

To exascerbate the issues, we still have approximately 14 freezer trailers/freezer POD devices split between 604 South Pickett and the main ARC buildings at 917/923/841/883/885 S. Pickett. As these contain the same records we are compelled to protect with alarms and XO-9 locks, and are unalarmed and have only heavy duty padlocks, armed guard protection is our only security option.

So, we are faced with two alternatives: extend the emergency work order; or expedite implementation of Mr. EC (319Q-HQ-1487641-RMD, Serial 29) requesting permanent 8p-5a and 24 hour weekend/holiday coverage by one roving, armed officer. I am convinced that the experiences of the past several weeks has supported the efficacy of that EC request.

I think we are missing the more important issue that the files and boxes are coated with dried mud that was considered contaminated as a result of the flood in September. The mud is now either dried and in a dust type format on the boxes and files and the floors and shelves in the units as well as caked on dried mud on the floor of the units as well as some of the boxes. The removal of boxes from several of the trailers will raise dust from the dried contaminated mud as the boxes are moved and as personnel walk through the 53' long trailers.

The units themselves are kept below 32 degrees Fahrenheit ranging from 25 to -10. A few of the freezer pods are currently frozen solid as a single mass also.

So workers will need protection from both the cold and from the possible contamination from the dried mud and dust.

Please note, as I reviewed your e-mail, I have provided some items that maybe helpful until you hear from Ms.

Giving the facts that were provided at this time and that OSHA has no specific regulation that addresses the protection of workers from environmental cold, the FBI must comply with the General Duty Clause for guidelines and resources on how workers can be protected from Cold weather/Cold working conduction.

Areas of concern: Worker Hands, Foot, Head, Body and Face from cold conductions, for example Gore-Tex. breathable, Coats are great protection for the body.

Note: This building has very heat sources, also I would recommend that special attention be giving to the walkingworking surfaces as personnel unloaded the trucks using correct lifting procedures.

Last items, I didn't see or or names listed or your e-mail, please note they are also working another issue in the same building with concerns of exterminating and fumigating pest, that may conflict with your operation.

In the next few weeks, RMD is planning to begin sorting through the damaged files at the Alexandria Records Center (ARC). These files were contaminated with flood water in September 2011. The files are currently frozen and stored in 5 freezer pods and 10 freezer trailers outside building 604 at the ARC.

We are planning to unload the boxes from the pods and trailers and sort them into boxes to be destroyed and boxes to keep. The box and file sorting effort will be accomplished within building 604, which is closed and ventilated.

Work will occur inside 604 S. Pickett Street. We will limit the time period the boxes are out of the freezer environment to prevent them from thawing.

We plan to use RMD volunteers for this sorting operation. We may also have a limited amount of contract moving assistance.

We would like your advice on how these workers should be outfitted (tvyek suit, gloves, goggles, breathing masks, etc) and other guidance you could provide for a safety and health standpoint. There are obvious concerns about contamination from the flood water, and about possible mold growth in the records since the flooding, although we think most mold growth was stopped by the rapid response to freeze the files after the flood.

This project has been expedited because of the need to reduce the significant reoccurring monthly costs, and the near-term prospect that the destruction of approximately half of the files may be authorized.

Please provide comments/suggestions/concurrence as soon as possible.

– per our telcal today, RMD is currently engaged in a project to restore a portion of approximately 10,000 flood damaged case files which were damaged in a flood in September, 2011; the FBI has obtained permission to destroy the vast majority of the flood damaged records with few exceptions. To date, RMD has identified approximately **90** of the flood damaged boxes contain files pertinent to the Trace Evidence project. In an effort to identify any and all pertinent Trace Evidence files in the flood damaged collection, RMD requests complete/reconstructed FBI file numbers for a portion of the incomplete data contained in the attached Trace Evidence spreadsheet. The attached spreadsheet was sent by the Lab to RMD earlier in the Trace Evidence project. As we discussed in our telcal, RMD intends to use the additional requested data only to search the inventory of the flood damaged records currently maintained in freezer trailers and pods to identify files that must be restored for the Trace Evidence project; RMD is **not** suggesting, and the Laboratory has **not** requested that the additional requested data be used to pull additional paper files from our records storage facilities or field offices for scanning.

In September, 2011, a flood at the Records Management Division's (RMD) Alexandria Records Center (ARC) damaged approximately 10,000 boxes containing approximately 240,000 case files. The damaged case files include both field office and HQ files. The National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) has provided the FBI authorization to

destroy most of the collection of flood damaged records absent files subject to a litigation hold, FOIA request, or other serious matter. RMD has reviewed the list for files subject to FOIA requests. OGC has reviewed the list for files subject to a litigation hold issued by OGC. However, in rare circumstances, a CDC may issue a litigation hold or preservation notice for a file that is not tracked by OGC.

Could you please review the files assigned to your field division to determine if there is any reason to remediate and preserve these files. Some of the files contain Elsur/Title III information that requires the court's permission to destroy. The files with Elsur are marked. If your office has these files you will need to contact the local U.S. Attorney's Office, advise them of the situation and if appropriate they must obtain the court's permission to destroy.

I have also included the records officers for each field division so they might help you in this review.



So my Admin. Specialists and I are trying to come up with a plan of action to review the files. Can you answer a few questions for us regarding the project.

- a) With regards to the destruction of these files, will RDM destroy the files in the computer? No, the electronic records will remain in ACS/Sentinel. A notation will be made in the system indicating that the paper file was destroyed during the flood, and this is the only information available on this case file. As the files reach the end of their retention period, the computer data will be destroyed or transferred to the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) in accordance with our records retention schedules.



The FBI proposes to transfer of prior-year unobligated balances to its No-Year appropriation to cover costs related to the Records Remediation effort.

### Justification for Records Remediation

The FBI's Records Management Division (RMD) administers the creation, storage, maintenance, and disposition of all FBI records. On September 8, 2011, approximately 10,000 cubic feet of FBI records were damaged by muddy and potentially contaminated water that reached approximately two feet above floor level at the Alexandria Records Center (ARC) Building 604. All boxes stored on the bottom two rows of shelving sustained water damage. Some of the boxes were moderately wet from the flood water. Other boxes were saturated with potentially contaminated water and mud. Mold growth could be present in some of the boxes due to the length of time it took to remove them from the building. These damaged boxes were originally stored in a heated warehouse area of the ARC that lacked complete temperature and humidity controls. A professional grade dehumidifier was installed approximately 14 hours after the event, and RMD removed and froze the damaged boxes to prevent further damage. Although the majority of the boxes were loaded in freezer trailers and freezer pods in less than 48 hours after the flood, some records took as long as 72 hours before being placed in a freezer. The damaged records remain frozen and stored in ten freezer trailers and five freezer pods at the ARC.

The FBI has identified records that are eligible for immediate destruction due to the expiration of their retention period and has requested authorization from the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) to destroy additional records within non-permanent file classifications that have not reached the expiration of their retention period. If authorized, the destruction of some records will reduce the number of boxes which require remediation and recovery, and will reduce the monthly expenses of maintaining the permanent files in a frozen state.

The records to be remediated contain information related to FBI Domestic Terrorism, Weapons of Mass Destruction, Foreign Counterintelligence, Cyber crimes and FBI Confidential Human Sources. The loss of this information would have a significant negative impact on the FBI mission. These records continue to be requested and reviewed by agent and analytical personnel throughout the FBI, to support ongoing investigative and intelligence activities. For example, the FBI San Diego Field Office recently requested some of these damaged records to support an ongoing National Security investigation. The loss of information contained in the FBI's Civil Rights investigations may impact the rights and interests of United States citizens. Recent direction by the Department of Justice to re-open closed Civil Rights cases could be impacted by the loss of these records. As the United States continues to confront the housing crisis and Mortgage Fraud, the loss of FBI records related to this activity could hamper efforts to prosecute those involved in fraudulent activities. Some of these records are related to recent Office of Professional Responsibility Matters and may be needed to defend the FBI's decisions related to the conduct of FBI personnel. Many of these files contain information that is not available electronically or in hard copy in other locations throughout the FBI. The records designated for remediation have previously been determined by National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) to be of such historical significance that they were designated as permanent. Upon transfer to the NARA by the FBI, these records will be maintained in perpetuity. The absence of these records would leave a void in the historical record of the FBI's intelligence and investigative activities.

The FBI is required to manage records throughout their life cycle in accordance with federal records management laws and regulations per 36 CFR Parts 1220-1235 and 44 USC Chapters 31 and 33.

The FBI is currently spending approximately _____ per month to maintain the damaged files in a frozen state, and will continue to incur the costs indefinitely until remediation is finalized. Approval of this request will enable the FBI to remediate the records and end the accrual of ongoing monthly expenses.



I have reviewed the report and believe that we would be good to go with requiring FBI employees to do the remediation work on the files provided they are given the appropriate protective gear and are provided proper instruction on the proper use of the protective gear. Further, I note that the report suggests that should the boxes be opened and the documents inside the boxes be handled, then further testing should be conducted. As such, I would recommend that RMD get with OSEP in order to establish a testing protocol for when the boxes are opened. While it would seem that the amounts of possible containments one would expect from the flood would be less, prudence dictates that we still test to be sure.

**Details:** As background, on 09/08/2011, approximately 10,000 boxes of closed FBI files stored at 604 South Pickett Street, Alexandria, VA, were damaged by flooding. The files are stored in trailers and pods outside 604 and 917 South Pickett Street. The FBI has determined which of these damaged files should be remediated and which should be destroyed. NARA has recently approved the FBI's recommendation of which files can be destroyed.

RMD will soon begin a sorting operation of the 10,000 damaged boxes. The sort operation is expected to be a significant effort requiring dozens of RMD personnel. FBInet connectivity is

crucial for RMD to execute an effective and efficient sort operation. Because traditional FBInet connectivity cannot be restored to the building in a timely or cost effective manner, RMD requests that TRU provide a temporary FBInet connectivity solution. Unet connectivity is present and functional at 604 South Pickett Street.

The FBInet terminals are needed to access the FBI's records inventory application, TRIM, during the sort operation. TRIM runs on FBInet. The operation will occur at 604 South Pickett Street, which is cleared for open secret storage, but has no operational FBInet connectivity.

FBInet and TRIM access are essential to the efficient and effective execution of the RMD sort operation, as personnel will scan the thousands of boxes, enter the scanned data into TRIM, query against the data, and utilize the data for quality control.

The large volume of files, and their storage condition in trailers and pods, dictates that the sort operation be conducted in place. It is not feasible to move the trailers and pods to a different location with established FBInet or Unet connectivity.

RMD will break down and remove all TRU equipment daily for overnight storage at 885 South Pickett Street. Reference 261D-HQ-C1062048-704, serial 17, the FBI facility at 885 South Pickett Street was approved by the Security Division as an open storage secure area.

The FBInet terminals will be required from 04/18/2012 through approximately 5/18/2012, and will be returned to TRU at the conclusion of the operation.



In response to your request, CIH of Consolidated Safety Services, Inc. (CSS) (Occupational Safety and Environmental Programs (OSEP) Industrial Hygiene Contractor) conducted sampling of boxes, paper and file folders that were contaminated with mud during a flood event in September of 2011. At the time of the sampling the boxes were being stored in refrigerated pods and trailers. An attempt was made to collect representative samples of boxes, paper and file folders. However, most of the sample consisted of cardboard box material. Sampled materials were collected from trailers 1, 6, 8 and 11 and pods 3 and 7. assisted in the collection of the samples.

The materials sampled were packaged and sent to Analytics Laboratory in Richmond, VA to determine hazardous waste characteristics using the toxicity characteristic leaching procedure (TCLP) test method 1311 in "Test Methods for Evaluating Solid Waste, Physical/Chemical Methods, EPA Publication SW-846." Analytics is approved as an environmental laboratory in conformance with the National Environmental Laboratory Accreditation Conference (NELAC) standards through the State of Virginia for the following categories: Potable Water, Non-Potable Water, Solid and Hazardous Waste, and Air and Emissions.

Results of the TCLP analysis indicate all hazardous waste contaminants listed in Table 1 of 40 CFR 261.24 were below detectable levels and below the maximum concentration of toxicity characteristics. Results are presented in Table 1. The results as reported by the laboratory are also attached.



Synopsis: (U//<del>FOUO)</del> OSEP conducted an exposure assessment during trailer replacement activities at the ARC warehouse located at 604 S. Pickett Street on February 4-6, 2013. RMD personnel relocated flood-impacted boxes out of refrigerated trailers and pods into refrigerated trailers. Personal samples for arsenic and lead along with bulk and area air samples for mold were collected. An instant-read instrument was used to track volatile organic compounds during box relocation. Results for arsenic and lead were below all applicable exposure limits. Volatile organic compound levels were consistent with background levels in non-industrial spaces. Elevated levels of mold were found in the trailers. RMD personnel should continue to wear appropriate PPE when handling affected boxes.

#### Details:

OSEP conducted an exposure assessment during the relocation of stored materials by the Records Management Division (RMD). The materials were exposed to water and mud following a major flood in September 2012 and were subsequently frozen and stored in climate-controlled trailers and pods at the Alexandria Records Center (ARC). The assessment was performed from February 4-6, 2013 and the point of contact was Mr.

Four of the trailers were replaced and four pods were also emptied and their contents moved into climate-controlled trailers. Fifteen RMD employees worked in teams to remove boxes from their current trailer or pod location, stack them on pallets, wrap and strap them, and relocate them to their assigned trailers. After the trailers and pods were emptied, bulk debris and shelves or scaffolding were removed and the trailers and pods were cleaned. The work tasks took three days to complete.

Based on previous analytical results and the potential for exposure to mold, OSEP collected personal air samples for lead and arsenic, area air and bulk samples for mold, and used a direct reading instrument to measure concentrations of volatile organic compounds (VOCs), including petroleum hydrocarbons.

Air monitoring for metals was conducted in accordance with National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) Method 7300, *Eleme nts by ICP*. The industrial hygienists collected a total of seven personal air samples during trailer replacement operations.

The industrial hygienists collected a total of three air samples for fungal spores during trailer replacement operations. Two samples were collected inside separate trailers during box removal, and one sample was collected outdoors for comparison.

The industrial hygienists collected two bulk samples of suspected mold growth during trailer replacement operations. Both samples were collected from suspected growth observed on two different boxes removed from Trailer 9.

To evaluate potential exposure to VOCs, the industrial hygienists used a RAE Systems ppbRAE 3000 Photoionization Detector (PID) to measure concentrations of ionizable vapors in the trailers and outdoors, for comparison.

The results of the personal exposure monitoring indicate that arsenic and lead concentrations were well below any recognized occupational exposure limit.

The results of the mold sampling indicate an amplification of *Penicilli um/Aspergillus* in the trailers which could result in allergic-type responses or other adverse health effects in susceptible individuals if respiratory protection were not used.

Levels of VOCs detected in the trailers, pods, and Gaylord boxes are consistent with concentrations measured in typical indoor, non-industrial environments and do not indicate a potential concern.

#### Conclusions and Recommendations

- 1. The personal exposure monitoring results for arsenic and lead were well below recognized occupational exposure limits. These results indicate that employees are not exposed to hazardous concentrations of lead and arsenic while handling flood-impacted boxes from the ARC 604 warehouse. However, additional personal sampling is recommended if employees access the contents of the boxes to review, sort, and segregate documents or other materials.
- 2. The air sampling for fungal spores indicated high concentrations of *Penicillium/Aspergillus* in the trailers relative to the outdoors. Mold growth, which included *Penicillium/Aspergillus* types, was identified on the two bulk samples collected. These results indicate that employees are potentially exposed to airborne mold concentrations that may cause adverse health effects in susceptible

individuals. The PPE worn by RMD employees during trailer replacement activities (coveralls, gloves, and N95 filtering facepieces or half-face elastomeric respirators equipped with P100 filters) is appropriate and should continue to be worn by employees when handling flood-impacted materials from the ARC 604 warehouse in other situations.

- 3. The results of the air monitoring for VOCs indicated that measured concentrations were typical of those found in indoor, non-industrial work environments and do not indicate potential exposure concerns while handling flood-impacted boxes. However, additional monitoring is recommended if employees access the contents of the boxes to review, sort, and segregate documents and other materials
- 4. Fecal coliform bacteria were identified in the composite bulk sample collected in April 2012 from flood-impacted materials from the ARC 604 warehouse. Exposure to these bacteria were not sampled during the trailer replacement activities, however, since there is currently no sampling method to estimate airborne exposure concentrations and no established occupational exposure limit. The PPE worn during the trailer replacement activities would provide adequate protection from exposure to fecal coliform bacteria. In addition to wearing PPE, employees should also follow good hygiene practices (i.e., no eating, drinking, or chewing gum or tobacco use in the work area and washing hands and face thoroughly after exiting the work area).

In response to a request, CIH, CSP and CSP, of Consolidated Safety Services (CSS), FBI Occupational Safety and Environmental Programs (OSEP) industrial hygiene contractor, conducted an exposure assessment during the relocation of stored materials by the Records Management Division (RMD). The materials were exposed to water and mud following a major flood in September 2011 and were subsequently frozen and stored in climate-controlled trailers and pods at the Alexandria Records Center (ARC). The assessment was performed from February 4-6, 2013 and the point of contact was Mr. The purposes of the exposure assessment were to: (1) quantify exposure to contaminants previously identified in mud and debris associated with the flood impacted materials and 2) determine if the control measures used, including the personal protective equipment (PPE), were adequate.

RMD maintains warehouses at the ARC. In September 2010, boxes containing documents, records, and evidence which were stored on the lower shelves of the warehouse at 604 S. Pickett Street were contaminated with water and mud during a flood event. In an effort to prevent or minimize mold growth, the documents were frozen and stored in climate-controlled trailers and pods beginning approximately 48 hours after the flood occurred. During the record relocation

operation in February 2013, four of the trailers were replaced, one due to a malfunctioning refrigeration system and three for fiscal reasons. Four pods were also emptied and their contents moved into climate-controlled trailers. Fifteen RMD employees worked in teams to remove boxes from their current trailer or pod location, stack them on pallets, wrap and strap them, and relocate them to their assigned trailers. RMD personnel provided their own cold weather clothing as needed. RMD provided the following PPE for employees:

- Coveralls Kimberly-Clark KleenGuard A20 Breathable Particle Protection Coveralls
- Disposable nitrile exam gloves Kimberly-Clark
- Disposable cotton work gloves with coated palm
- N95 filtering facepieces Moore Medical Moorebrand N95 Particulate Respirator Mask
- Half-face elastomeric respirators 3M 6000 series
- P100 filters (for respirators) 3M
- Goggles
- Kneepads
- Shoe covers Grainger 5T455A

Boxes were stored inside the trailers along each wall on either prefabricated shelving, shelving built from 2x4s and plywood, or stacked on the floor. Boxes on the floor were moved by employees forming a line and passing the boxes from one person to the next. Boxes stored on shelves were moved in the same manner or by sliding them along the shelves to the back of the trailer before being passed out of the trailer by hand. Although sliding the boxes on the shelves decreased the manual lifting and required less people, it did appear to appreciably increase airborne dust levels from boxes sliding over the loose dust and dirt left by previous boxes.

Boxes stored in the pods were stored on the floor and stacked on top of each other. Boxes were moved out of the pods by forming a line of employees, who then passed the boxes from one person to the next.

After the trailers and pods were emptied, bulk debris and shelves or scaffolding were removed. The trailers were then swept and cleaned with a water-based cleaning solution. RMD provided several household cleaners including dishwashing detergent, Formula 409 and Simple Green. A pump sprayer was used to apply the cleaning solution in the pods and a hose was used in the trailers. The work tasks took three days to complete.

#### Exposure Assessment Methods

In April 2012, composite bulk samples of mud and debris were collected from flood-damaged materials and analyzed for heavy metals (arsenic, cadmium, lead, and mercury), fecal coliform bacteria, and petroleum hydrocarbons. The analytical results of this bulk sampling indicated that lead and arsenic, fecal coliform bacteria, and petroleum hydrocarbons were detected in the bulk sample. Based on these analytical results and the potential for exposure to mold and mold spores, CSS collected personal air samples for lead and arsenic, area air and bulk samples for mold, and used a direct reading instrument to measure concentrations of volatile organic compounds (VOCs), including petroleum hydrocarbons.

Air monitoring for metals was conducted in accordance with National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) Method 7300, Elements by ICP. The industrial hygienists collected a total of seven personal air samples during trailer replacement operations. With the exception of samples 020413-RMD-01 and 020413-RMD-03, each sample was collected from the breathing zone of a different RMD employee. Sample 020413-RMD-01 was discarded due to an equipment malfunction, so sample 020413-RMD-03 was collected from the same employee. Each air sample was collected using a sampling pump that draws air at a known flow rate through a 0.8 micron mixed cellulose ester filter. Sampling pump flow rates were measured prior to and following each sampling period, using a mini-Buck M-5 calibrator, to determine an average flow rate for the sampling period. An eighth filter cassette was opened on site but no air was drawn through it. This cassette was submitted for analysis as a field blank. All samples were labeled with a unique identification code and shipped to Galson Laboratories (Galson) in East Syracuse, NY for analysis. Galson is accredited by the American Industrial Hygiene Association (AIHA) Industrial Hygiene Laboratory Accreditation Program. All samples were analyzed using inductively coupled plasma.

The industrial hygienists collected a total of three air samples for fungal spores during trailer replacement operations. Two samples were collected inside separate trailers during box removal, and one sample was collected outdoors for comparison. The air samples were collected using an Aerotrap Total Fungal Sampler that draws air through a sampling orifice at a known flow rate and deposits entrained particulate matter, including mold spores, onto a spore trap slide (a glass microscope slide with an adhesive reservoir). The fungal sampler flow rate was determined using a calibrated rotameter prior to sample collection and validated after completion of the final sampling period. The samples were labeled with a unique identification code and hand delivered to EMLab P&K located in Fairfax, VA. The samples were analyzed using direct microscopic examination. EMLab P&K is accredited by the American Industrial Hygiene Association (AIHA) Environmental Microbiology Laboratory Accreditation Program (EMLAP).

The industrial hygienists collected two bulk samples of suspected mold growth during trailer replacement operations. Both samples were collected from suspected growth observed on two different boxes removed from Trailer 9. The samples were labeled with a unique identification code and hand delivered to EMLab P&K in Fairfax, VA. The samples were analyzed by direct microscopic examination.

To evaluate potential exposure to VOCs, the industrial hygienists used a RAE Systems ppbRAE 3000 Photoionization Detector (PID) to measure concentrations of ionizable vapors in the trailers and outdoors, for comparison. Field experience suggests the following guide for the use of PIDs to assess indoor environments ⁽¹⁾:

- <100 parts per billion (ppb) is obutylene⁽²⁾ units: normal outdoor air
- 100-400 ppb isobutylene units: normal indoor air
- $\geq$  500 ppb isobutylene units: potential of indoor air quality contaminants

¹ RAE Systems, Inc. Application Note AP-212 Using PIDs for Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) Surveys (January 2002)

 $^{^2}$  PIDs are commonly calibrated with isobutylene; therefore, the response of the instrument to the TVOCs encountered in the field is relative to the response to isobutylene.

The PID was equipped with a 10.6 electron volt (eV) lamp and was calibrated using a 10 ppm isobutylene gas standard before the sampling period. The PID will ionize and measure most organic or inorganic vapors or gases with an ionization potential of 10.6 electron volts (eV) or less.

#### Exposure Assessment Results

The results of the personal air sampling for metals performed on February 4-6, 2013 are presented in Table 1.

The results of the personal exposure monitoring indicate that airborne concentrations of lead were detectable in some personal samples collected during the trailer replacement activities. Although lead concentrations were detectable, they were well below any recognized occupational exposure limit. The monitoring results indicate that employees were not exposed to hazardous concentrations of arsenic or lead when handling boxes impacted by the flood. Detailed laboratory results are included with this report in Attachment A. Sample RMD-020513-04 was erroneously identified in the laboratory report as a blank. It was not a blank, but was submitted for analysis with no air volume reported.

#### Fungal Spore Air Sampling Results

The total concentration of spores in the samples collected in the trailers ranged from 8,400 spores per cubic meter of air (spores/m³) to 35,000 spores/m³. The total concentration of spores in the outdoor sample was 1,200 spores/m³. The total concentration of spores inside the trailers was significantly higher than the total concentration outdoors. Penicillium/Aspergillus spore concentrations were much higher inside the trailers relative to the outdoors and dominated the types of fungal spores detected. In the sample collected in Trailer 3, approximately 97% of the spores identified were Penicillium/Aspergillus spores and in the sample collected in Trailer 2, approximately 96% were Penicillium/Aspergillus spores. Laboratory results are included with this report in Attachment B.

The results of this sampling indicate an amplification of Penicillium/Aspergillus in the trailers which could result in allergic-type responses or other adverse health effects in susceptible individuals if respiratory protection were not used.

Light to moderate growth of various fungal species were reported in both samples. Numerous Penicillium/Aspergillus type spores were identified in both trailer samples, which is consistent with the results of the fungal spore air sampling. Levels of VOCs detected in the trailers, pods, and Gaylord boxes ranged from 29 to 524 ppb. These concentrations are consistent with concentrations measured in typical indoor, non-industrial environments and do not indicate a potential concern.

Mold growth, which included Penicillium/Aspergillus types, was identified on the two bulk samples collected. These results indicate that employees are potentially exposed to airborne mold concentrations that may cause adverse health effects in susceptible individuals. The PPE worn by RMD employees during trailer replacement activities (coveralls, gloves, and N95 filtering facepieces or half-face elastomeric respirators equipped with P100 filters) is appropriate and should continue to be worn by employees when handling flood-impacted materials from the ARC 604 warehouse in other situations.
- 3. The results of the air monitoring for VOCs indicated that measured concentrations were typical of those found in indoor, non-industrial work environments and do not indicate potential exposure concerns while handling flood-impacted boxes. However, additional monitoring is recommended if employees access the contents of the boxes to review, sort, and segregate documents and other materials
- 4. Fecal coliform bacteria were identified in the composite bulk sample collected in April 2012 from flood-impacted materials from the ARC 604 warehouse. Exposure to these bacteria were not sampled during the trailer replacement activities, however, since there is currently no sampling method to estimate airborne exposure concentrations and no established occupational exposure limit. The PPE worn during the trailer replacement activities would provide adequate protection from exposure to fecal coliform bacteria. In addition to wearing PPE, employees should also follow good hygiene practices (i.e., no eating, drinking, or chewing gum or tobacco use in the work area and washing hands and face thoroughly after exiting the work area).

Debbie: I concur with your additions.

I am pressing very hard to have the EC requesting that the third ARC guard post (8pm-5am weekdays, 24/7 weekends and holidays) be approved. We have the additional guard coverage for October, but no guarantees beyond that, unless we get the post made permanent. SECD & FLSD should come up with a back-up alternative; the most logical without guards is moving trailers not being worked to a government site with a fence and 24-hour surveillance. The NVRA, Ft. Belvoir, and Quantico come to mind. This would clearly present logistical issues, but we simply cannot leave trailers sitting in the parking lot. I suspect that the trailer being used could be temporarily tied to the 923 b7E alarm system with a harness.



barcode info that was previously un-available when we tried in Sept.

When laser reader is tested on boxes in a freezer truck and a POD, I want your folks need to be present and also test with the Denzo LED technology wand to see if there is any difference. The failure to read in Sept may have been caused by a reflection from wet labels or pollutants and not just a blurring of the bar-code from being dipped. Either way, we need to see if we can resume box-level control by barcode using the wands.

It's looking to be far too costly to remediate everything—about 10,000 boxes total. So the current plan is to seek approval to select and remediate just those boxes with permanent files based on file classification alone (not serial count or prominent names) and about 1,500 – 2,000 boxes of OPR files and permanent HQ files which were prepped and pending accession. The rest would be destroyed. RPAS is drafting a Director-level request to the Archivist for this expanded emergency destruction. So, ability to track boxes by bar code as they come off of the trucks has become of increased importance.


