In the event you are dissatisfied with the results of any such appeal, judicial review will thereafter be available in the district where the requestor resides, has a principal place of business, or in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.

VOLUNTEER! MAKE A DIFFERENCE!

Thank you for your interest in volunteering your legal skills as a pro bono attorney, paralegal or nonlegal volunteer. Some employees think that because they are federal employees, they can't do pro bono work. That isn't true. In 1996, the Department issued its Pro Bono and Volunteer Services Policy, making it the first federal agency to establish a pro bono program and policy. The policy outlines everything you need to know about doing pro bono work as a

DOJ employee. It even establishes a fifty hour per year aspirational goal. As a result, DOJ attorneys and legal staff are making a tremendous difference in the lives of indigent families.

The steps you should take before beginning any *pro bono* work are outlined below, and the noted materials can provide you with the answers to most questions. <u>Remember that federal government attorneys do not need to be</u> <u>members of the DC Bar to do *pro bono* work in DC.</u> If you have further questions, please contact Laura Klein, the *Pro Bono* Program Manager, by e-mail or telephone, (202) 353-7529. If you are interested in non-legal volunteer work, please contact Richard Toscano, in JMD, by e-mail or telephone at (202) 305-1756.

I. Read the Most Commonly Asked Questions information and call your component's representative to the Department's *Pro Bono* Committee.

Answers to many of the most frequently asked questions regarding the Department's *Pro Bono* Policy can be found in the document, "Most Commonly Asked Questions about the Department's *Pro Bono* and Volunteer Services Policy," that was written by the Department Ethics Office. This valuable document addresses questions regarding the types of services and activities allowed, rules of conduct, and the use of office equipment and resources. You should contact your component's representative to the Department *Pro Bono* Committee and advise him or her of your interest in *pro bono* work. The list of component representatives to the Department (a.k.a. "FAQ") are available on this web site.

II. Determine the pro bono organization with which you would like to work.

You may want to identify a *pro bono* provider from the DOJ list of agencies, the list of current *pro bono* opportunities on the website, or from other sources, such as direct contact with a program. The organizations on the DOJ list carry malpractice insurance and are unlikely to present conflicts for DOJ volunteers. It is strongly recommended that you work with an organization that provides malpractice insurance. If you decide to work with an organization that is not from the DOJ list of *pro bono* providers, you must give extra thought to any potential or current conflicts that might arise between your *pro bono* representation and your DOJ legal work. Even if you select an organization from the DOJ list, you still need to consider conflicts of interest between your *pro bono* representation and your DOJ work, though we have more experience with the organizations on the DOJ list and therefore tend to be more aware of possible conflicts of interest. The DOJ list also has a brief description of the service agencies and the types of cases they handle.

There are many different types of *pro bono* activities from which to choose. There is the traditional case work, involving issues such as family law, landlord-tenant law, consumer law, personal injury, and employment law. Nonlitigation options are also available, however. Many DOJ attorneys have enjoyed preparing wills and powers of attorney for elderly clients or working at legal clinics, helping low-income people resolve their legal problems. These clinics do not involve client representation and offer a great opportunity to do *pro bono* work with no long-term commitment of time.

III. Contact the program or service provider with whom you wish to work.

You may contact the *pro bono* service provider to determine how you can help them. Each provider has different steps for matching *pro bono* attorneys with prospective clients, and some require *pro bono* attorneys to first complete training in the relevant area. Many *pro bono* provider agencies provide support help, and the DOJ *Pro Bono* Manager maintains a list of support staff who are willing to help on *pro bono* projects. Interested support staff should contact Laura Klein, DOJ *Pro Bono* Program Manager, at 3-7529. Before you formally take any *pro bono* work from the service provider, however, you must obtain approval from your component. See Part IV. Support staff must seek approval as well.

IV. Secure approval through your component's Deputy Designated Agency Ethics Official (DDAEO) and your direct supervisor.

In order to engage in *pro bono* work you must have approval from your component head. The approval procedures differ depending on the type of activity you choose. The policy and other noted documents describe the approval processes in detail.

To start, consult with your component *Pro Bono* Committee Representative or your DDAEO to find out whether the activity you have identified has been "generally approved" by your component head. The approval process is more streamlined for activities that have been generally approved. If the activity has not been generally approved, contact your DDAEO to discuss possible conflicts with the particular *pro bono* provider you choose, and submit a request for approval to your Assistant Attorney General or component head. The model "Request for Approval to Provide Uncompensated Legal Services," found on the website, can be adapted to meet your component's needs and can be tailored for your specific request. Your DDAEO is the best source of information on these points. Reviewing the form, however, is useful as it highlights the key ethical concerns in starting *pro bono* work.


Key points to include in your request are (1) that you will be performing the work in your personal capacity and that you will not use your position in any way in representing the client(s); (2) that you will not be handling a criminal or habeas matter, or a matter in which the U.S. has a direct or substantial interest; (3) that the representation will not present any other conflict with your work or that of the Department; (4) that you have cleared this representation with your supervisor

and it won't interfere with your ability to do your job. Check with your DDAEO to make sure you understand the requirements your component has for *pro bono* work. The request should also indicate whether you are working with an organization that will provide malpractice insurance coverage for your *pro bono* work.

The request form can be tailored for your particular office. Individual components are permitted to follow slightly different approval procedures that encompass the same Department-wide goals, but you must comply with the requirements of your component.



LEAVE TRANSFER & LEAVE BANK PROGRAMS

The <u>Voluntary Leave Bank Program</u> provides income protection for Department of Justice (DOJ) employees who experience a personal or family medical emergency, which causes the employee to exhaust their available paid leave and be absent in what would otherwise be a leave without pay (LWOP) status. To become a Leave Bank member, DOJ employees must contribute a minimum of one pay period of accrued annual leave (4, 6, or 8 hours) to the Leave Bank during an open enrollment period each year. Only Leave Bank members may apply to become a Leave Bank recipient and be awarded leave at the time of their medical emergency. A leave recipient may use emergency leave only for the purpose of an approved medical emergency by their supervisor along with supporting medical documentation from their doctor.

The Department's Offices, Boards & Divisions (OBD) <u>Voluntary Leave Transfer</u> <u>Program (VLTP)</u> assists JMD/OBD employees who have a medical emergency that requires a prolonged absence from work which would result in a substantial loss of income. The program covers employees who experience medical emergencies, as well as employees who are caring for family members who are experiencing medical emergencies. The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms & Explosives; Bureau of Prisons; Executive Office for Immigration Review; Drug Enforcement Administration; Executive Office of U.S. Attorneys; Office of the Inspector General; Office of Justice Programs; U.S. Marshals Service; and the Federal Bureau of Investigation each have their own VLTP program. Employees of those Bureaus should contact their respective Coordinators for assistance.

Assistive Technology Resource Center (ATRC) Pilot Program

On Monday, January 24, 2011, the Justice Management Division launched the Assistive Technology Resource Center (ATRC) Pilot Program. This pilot program was developed to identify appropriate and effective assistive technology as a reasonable accommodation for DOJ employees, specifically Employees with Disabilities. In addition, the pilot program will offer a variety of services that help to further support the Department's Disability employment goals, and ensure that all employees can effectively contribute to achieving the Department's important mission.

Initial service offerings include:

- "Just in time" delivery of assistive technology to Employees with Disabilities.
- Identifying assistive technologies to provide the appropriate accommodations for employees.
- Guiding managers and employees through the assistive technology acquisition process.
- Providing education and awareness of available technologies.
- Reviewing assistive technology solutions.
- Facilitating Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act compliance testing of software, hardware, web content, and equipment.

Pool Rewards: Commuters Earn Cash for Carpooling — Drive-Alone Commuters Sought for Enrollment

Commuter Connections is launching 'Pool Rewards, a program first introduced in 2009 as a demonstration project, to encourage drive alone commuters in the Washington, DC region to try carpooling. Participants can earn \$2 (\$1 each way) for each day they carpool to work over a consecutive 90-day period, up to a maximum of \$130. To be eligible, participants must start or join a new carpool, go online to log some simple information about their commutes, and complete a brief survey about their experiences. More than 70 percent of the initial 100-plus participants identified 'Pool Rewards as a valuable motivator to get them into carpools and stop driving alone.

In addition to advantages gained through 'Pool Rewards, ridesharing benefits in general may include savings on fuel costs, reduced mileage/automobile wear and tear, HOV lane access, and less driving and stress. In addition, with Commuter Connections, those who rideshare are given assurance through the free Guaranteed Ride Home program that gets commuters home in the event of an unexpected emergency or unscheduled overtime, making it easier to choose carpooling with confidence.

Commuter Connections, a regional transportation network coordinated by the National Capital Region Transportation Planning Board at the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments (COG), is launching this program as part of its ongoing efforts to improve traffic flow, decrease air pollution and promote long-term changes in commuting behavior. 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Changes to FSAs, HSA, and HRAs Regarding Over-the-Counter Drugs

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) recently issued guidance to reflect changes regarding certain taxfavored arrangements, such as health Flexible Spending Accounts (FSAs), Health Savings Accounts (HSA) and Health Reimbursement Arrangement (HRA) to pay for over-the-counter medicines and drugs.

On March 23, 2010, health care reform legislation was signed into law as the Affordable Care Act (ACA). The ACA established a new uniform standard that, effective January 1, 2011, applies to FSAs and HSAs. Under the new standard, the cost of an over-the-counter medicine or drug cannot be reimbursed from the account unless a prescription is obtained. The change does not affect insulin, even if purchased without a prescription, or other health care expenses such as medical devices, eye glasses, contact lenses, co-pays and deductibles. The new standard applies only to purchases made on or after January 1, 2011, so claims for medicines or drugs purchased without a prescription in 2010 can still be reimbursed in 2011.

The Federal FSAFEDS program includes a grace period, so if employees do not spend all of the money in their health FSAs by December 31 in a given year, they can use the amount left in the account to reimburse expenses incurred during the first 2½ months of the following year. However, if employees buy over-the-counter medicines or drugs without a prescription during the 2½-month grace period in 2011, they cannot use the amount left in the account at the end of 2010 to reimburse those expenses, according to the IRS, because the new standard applies to all purchases made on or after January 1, 2011. For more information on eligible expenses, filing deadlines for expense reimbursement, and the grace period, you should visit the <u>FSAFEDS' web site</u> or call 1-877-372-3337/TTY 1-800-952-0450.

During the upcoming annual Federal Benefits Open Season, November 8 through December 13, 2010, employees should take the new over-the-counter medicine or drug purchase changes into consideration when determining the amount of their FSA contributions, and their Federal Employees Health Benefits Program (FEHB) enrollment.

The Affordable Care Act also extends coverage for children until age 26 under the Federal Employees Health Benefits Program (FEHB) and Flexible Savings Accounts (FSAFEDS). Coverage for such children under the Federal Employees Dental and Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIP), the Federal Employees' Group Life Insurance Program (FEGLI) or the Federal Long Term Care Insurance Program, however, is unaffected by the Affordable Care Act.

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Thrift Savings Enrollment for 2011

The Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) is a retirement savings and investment plan that provides Federal employees the same type of savings and tax benefits that many private corporations offer their employees under "401(k)" plans. The retirement income that you receive from your TSP account will depend on how much you (and your agency, if you are a Federal Employees Retirement System (FERS) employee because TSP is part of FERS) have contributed to your account during your working years and the earnings on those contributions.

TSP Contributions. Civil Service Retirement System (CSRS) and FERS employees may elect to contribute any dollar amount or percentage of basic pay to TSP up to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) elective deferral limit. The IRS elective deferral limit for 2011 is \$16,500 for regular TSP contributions. You can enroll, change the amount of your contributions, or cancel your contributions at any time. To distribute the maximum \$16,500 regular TSP contribution over 26 pay periods, you should elect to contribute \$635 per pay period. No action is required if you wish to continue your current contributions.

TSP Catch-up Contributions. Employees who are age 50 or older (or will reach age 50 during 2011) also may make catch-up TSP contributions. You must contribute the maximum amount of regular TSP contributions (\$16,500 in 2011) to be eligible to make catch-up TSP contributions. The IRS deferral limit for catch-up TSP contributions is \$5,500 for 2011. TSP catch-up contributions elections must be made each year. To distribute the maximum \$5,500 catch-up TSP contributions over 26 pay periods, you should elect to contribute \$212 per pay period.

Equal Distribution over 26 Pay Periods. To distribute your regular and/or catch-up TSP contributions equally over all 26 pay periods in 2011, you should make your election(s) no later than December 31, 2010. The election will be effective for pay period 26 2010 (effective December 19, 2010) and it will be withheld from the paycheck you receive on January 10, 2011, the first pay check received in tax year 2011. To enroll, change or cancel your current TSP enrollment, you must make your election electronically using the Employee Personnel Page (EPP) at https://www.nfc.usda.gov/personal/index.aspx.



Diversity Management Plan for the Department of Justice

I am issuing this Diversity Management Plan to improve the effectiveness of the Justice Department's recruitment, hiring, retention, and professional development efforts. This plan and the action items it mandates reflect a critical fact. Based on my experience as Attorney General, and on my experience as a long-time career employee within the Department of Justice, I am convinced that the Justice Department is stronger, more credible, and more effective when its workforce includes qualified individuals whose backgrounds reflect our nation's rich diversity, and when its work environment encourages all of its employees to develop and to thrive professionally. This plan creates a framework for managing diversity across the Department of Justice, and sustaining our progress over time. In addition to focusing on the Justice Department's attorney employees, this diversity management plan will address efforts to foster diversity among the Justice Department's non-lawyers, particularly among the Department's law enforcement personnel. Moreover, it stresses improving coordination among components that have already undertaken diversity initiatives in order to better share best practices for improving diversity management. The Diversity Management Plan will ensure that the Department's standard operating procedures encourage diversity within the Department's workforce and that the Department's components actively recruit the best qualified employees.

Over the last twelve months, I have met with many of the Department's employees, and with many of the Department's employee organizations. I have listened to their concerns that the Justice Department was not doing all it could to ensure that its employees – attorneys and nonattorneys alike – were given an opportunity to excel in their work, and to advance in their organizations. Last year, I convened two working groups to advise me regarding the initial steps the Department should take to move closer to the goals enumerated in the Eight-Point Plan issued by the Attorney General more than 10 years ago. Some of those suggestions are reflected in the attached Diversity Management Plan. Others will be considered in the weeks and months ahead. Today is an important milestone in our efforts to build a more diverse Justice Department. The management structure and action items implemented here will ensure that the Department's commitment to diversity is reflected enduringly in its organizational culture and in its institutional practices. I look forward to working with each of you on this critically important task.

DIVERSITY MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE

As an institution, the Department of Justice is stronger, more credible, and more effective when it recruits, hires, develops, and retains qualified professionals from diverse backgrounds. This Diversity Management Plan for the Department of Justice is designed to ensure that the Justice Department's management practices and organizational culture reflect the Department's commitment to building and maintaining a workplace environment in which we effectively carry out our mission while ensuring that all employees have the opportunity to thrive professionally, to excel as public servants, and to advance in their careers.

This plan is divided into four sections, each focusing on a different aspect of managing and promoting diversity in an organization as large and complex as the Justice Department. These sections are: (1) leadership commitment and organizational infrastructure; (2) outreach, recruitment, and hiring; (3) professional development and retention; and (4) transparency, sustainability and best practices. Although the action items outlined here are the next steps in building a more effective, more inclusive Justice Department, they will not be the last. As the Department works to implement this plan, it will take additional steps as necessary to ensure that the Department's commitment to diversity is reflected in its management practices. Every member of the Department's workforce has a role to play in this effort and I look forward to working with each of you as we make this goal a reality.

Leadership Commitment and Organizational Infrastructure

Action Items:

1. Diversity Management Advisory Council

By May 31, 2010, the Attorney General will form a Diversity Management Advisory Council ("the Council"). The Council will coordinate department-wide diversity management efforts, monitor implementation of each component's diversity management plan, and meet biannually with the Attorney General to report on the status of the Department's diversity management efforts.

The Council will also recommend policies to promote effective diversity management practices in the Department of Justice. Specifically, the Council will recommend: (1) strategies to increase diversity among the department's managers, supervisors, and the Senior Executive Service; (2) options for measuring the Department's diversity management efforts; (3) hiring and management best practices; (4) training programs to promote effective diversity management; and (5) strategies to promote accountability for diversity management among the Department's managers and supervisors. The Associate Attorney General will serve as Chairperson for the Council. The Attorney General will designate an Assistant Attorney General ("AAG") to serve as Vice-Chairperson. The Attorney General will also designate AAG- or Director-level representatives to serve on the Council as necessary. The Deputy Associate Attorney General for Diversity Management and the Departmental Selective Placement Coordinator for Disability Hiring will also serve on the Council. The Justice Management Division ("JMD") will provide administrative support to the Council.

2. Deputy Associate Attorney General for Diversity Management

The Attorney General will appoint a Deputy Associate Attorney General for Diversity Management ("the DAAG"), who will serve as the Executive Director to the Council and as the Department's day-to-day coordinator for diversity-management issues. The DAAG will serve as the Department's point of contact with internal and external organizations regarding diversity management issues. The DAAG will communicate regularly with the leaders of the Department's components on behalf of the Council. The DAAG will monitor and study best practices in diversity management and evaluate their potential applicability to the Department. The DAAG shall prepare an annual report to the Attorney General, which shall be available publicly, describing the Department's diversity management efforts and the status of those efforts.

3. Departmental Placement Coordinator for Disability Hiring

The Department will establish a Departmental Placement Coordinator for Disability Hiring, a dedicated position in JMD to ensure appropriate consideration of qualified persons with disabilities for employment vacancies within the Department. The Departmental Selective Placement Coordinator for Disability Hiring will also work with the Department's components to achieve the Department's 2% hiring goal of persons with disabilities. I am confident we can attract qualified individuals and meet this goal.

4. <u>Component Diversity Management Committees</u>

Each component will establish a diversity committee ("Committee"), chaired by a senior leader selected by the head of the component. Each Committee will prepare a preliminary diversity management plan for its component. Each preliminary plan will be signed by the component head and submitted to the Council through the DAAG by June 30, 2010. Each preliminary plan will describe the component's compliance with the Eight-Point Plan to Enhance Diversity (issued by Attorney General Reno on June 16, 2000), as well as current diversity-management efforts with respect to: (1) recruitment; (2) hiring; (3) retention; and (4) professional development.

The component plans should identify strategies for accomplishing the following goals:

Broadening the component's applicant pool.

- Creating and administering mandatory and developmental diversity training for supervisors.
- Promoting diversity in higher-level positions.
- Informing employees of the component's diversity goals and efforts.
- Ensuring that progress is sustainable and continuing.

Each component's plan should incorporate existing strategies and practices for hiring and employing competitive and excepted service employees. Components must ensure that their budgets support proposals contained in their respective diversity management plans.

Outreach, Recruitment, and Hiring

Action Items:

1. OARM Detailee

The Attorney General will establish a detail position to OARM that will work closely with the DAAG and components to develop and implement focused recruitment strategies to broaden the Department's applicant pool to attract applicants from under-represented populations or communities. The detailee will be responsible for identifying and building new networks to reach a more diverse set of candidates, with a focus on experienced attorney outreach. The detailee, in conjunction with the components and in consultation with the employee organizations, will develop and train a cadre of Department recruiting ambassadors who will conduct outreach efforts to law schools and law student organizations.

2. <u>Training on Interview Skills</u>

The Department will institute mandatory training on merit systems principles and best practices for conducting interviews for all supervisors and individuals participating in the hiring process. JMD, EOUSA, and OARM will coordinate this effort.

3. New Hire Materials

Components shall coordinate with JMD to include information regarding the Department's employee affinity organizations in the components' new-hire orientation materials.

4. Post Vacancies on OARM Website

To enhance access to the Department's employment opportunities, components must post all excepted service attorney positions on OARM's website, the component's website, and with USAJobs. All other excepted service positions and competitive service positions must be posted on the component's website and with USAJobs.

5. Outreach Efforts

JMD, EOUSA, and OARM will work with the Department's components to develop and implement their outreach strategies, and explore additional ways to use technology to broaden their outreach efforts. JMD, EOUSA and OARM will assess their current recruitment and outreach practices and submit a report by June 30, 2010, to the Council, through the DAAG, that describes the Department's current outreach efforts and recommends specific actions to improve those efforts and to broaden the Department's applicant pool.

Professional Development and Retention

Action Items:

1. Attorney Skill Development Coordinator

By June 30, 2010, all components with more than 100 lawyers will designate an attorney professional development director, an experienced attorney, who will be responsible for working with attorney managers to develop competencies and skill-based training, maximizing the use of assignments as a professional development tool, and implementing a professional development process.

2. <u>Training on Case Assignments</u>

By June 30, 2010, EOUSA's Office of Legal Education will develop a module for attorney managers on the use of case assignments as a professional development tool which can be adapted for use by individual components throughout the Department.

3. Diversity Training

By June 30, 2010, in coordination with the Council, JMD and EOUSA will institute a mandatory, periodic training program for supervisors and personnel involved in the hiring process. The training will emphasize skills and strategies for recruiting, managing, and retaining a diverse workforce. The training will make use of all available technology and be integrated into the Department's various learning management systems ("LMSs") curricula. The LMSs include LearnDOJ, FBI Virtual Academy, JUSTLearn, Learn-ATF, and BOPLearn.

Transparency and Best Practices

Action Items:

1. Publish Diversity Management Plans and Policy Statements

By June 30, 2010, the Department will develop and display its diversity management policy statement on the DOJ website and each component will submit to the Council a diversity management policy statement that will be displayed on the component's website once approved by the Council.

In coordination with Open Government Plan activities, the following information will be posted on the Department's website: The DOJ EEO Policy Statement; The DOJ Diversity Policy Statement; and the DOJ Diversity Management Plan. The following information will be posted on the intranet: each component's diversity management plan; a description of each component's attorney hiring processes; and an annual summary of the Council's activities.

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
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
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Important news about Bank Secrecy Act regulations...

On March 1, 2011, FinCEN will transfer the Bank Secrecy Act regulations from 31 CFR Part 103 to 31 CFR Chapter X.

All criminal violations of the reporting requirements and structuring occurring before March 1, 2011, should continue to cite the regulations as they appear in 31 CFR Part 103.

Any violations occurring <u>on or after March 1, 2011</u>, will need to use the new citations contained in 31 CFR Chapter X. While the regulations have not been substantively changed they have been substantially reorganized.

New sample indictment forms will be published on AFML Online within the coming weeks. Additionally, a detailed cross-reference index as well as the new regulations can be found under <u>Program Resources (Money Laundering &</u> <u>Investigative Resources</u>).

There is no formal rating system for applying veterans' preference to attorney appointments in the excepted service; however, the Department of Justice considers veterans' preference eligibility as a positive factor in attorney hiring. Applicants eligible for veterans' preference must include that information in their cover letter or resume and attach supporting documentation (e.g., the DD 214, Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty and other supporting documentation) to their submissions. Although the "point" system is not used, per se, applicants eligible to claim 10-point preference must submit Standard Form (SF) 15, Application for 10-Point Veteran Preference, and submit the supporting documentation required for the specific type of preference claimed (visit the OPM website, <u>www.opm.gov/forms/pdf_fill/SF15.pdf</u> for a copy of SF 15, which lists the types of 10-point preferences and the required supporting document(s). Applicants should note that SF 15 requires supporting documentation associated with service-connected disabilities or receipt of nonservice-connected disability pensions to be dated 1991 or later except in the case of service members submitting official statements or retirement orders from a branch of the Armed forces showing that his or her retirement was due to a permanent service-connected disability or that he/she was transferred to the permanent disability retired list (the statement or retirement orders must indicate that the disability is 10% or more).

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Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB) Changes in Dependent Children Eligibility Rules

On March 23, 2010, health care reform legislation was signed into law. The new law, the Affordable Care Act (ACA), affects eligibility and benefits under the Federal Employees Health Benefits Program (FEHB) beginning on January 1, 2011. This article concerns changes to eligibility rules for dependents of Federal employees resulting from the ACA. The table below describes changes to FEHB dependent children eligibility rules.

Children	Effect of Affordable Care Act (ACA) on Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB)
Between ages 22 and 26:	Covered under parent's Self and Family enrollment up to age 26
Married Children:	Married children (but not spouses or their own children) are covered under parent's Self and Family enrollment up to age 26
Children with or eligible for employer- provided health insurance:	Children who are eligible for or have their own employer- provided health insurance are eligible for coverage up to age 26
Stepchildren:	Stepchildren do not need to live with their step-parent in a parent-child relationship to be eligible for coverage up to age 26
Children Incapable of Self-Support:	Children who are incapable of self-support because of mental or physical disability that began before age 26 are eligible to continue coverage (contact your Human Resources office for additional information)
Foster Children:	Foster children are eligible for coverage up to age 26

Children are not required to live with their parent, be financially dependent upon their parent, or be students to be covered up to age 26. There is no requirement that children have prior or current insurance coverage. FEHB plans will send notices to all their enrollees of the coverage eligibility

changes as part of their Open Season communications.

To add newly eligible children to your plan you must:

- Enroll the eligible child/children during the FEHB Open Season (November 8, 2010 December 13, 2010).
- If you currently have a "Self and Family" enrollment and do not plan to change health plans during the open season, contact your FEHB plan and give them the information on your eligible child/children. Your child/children will be covered on January 1, 2011.
- If you currently have a "Self Only" enrollment, you will need to change your enrollment to "Self and Family" if you want your children to be covered.

If you are not currently enrolled and you want FEHB coverage for yourself and your children, you will need to enroll in "Self and Family" during Open Season.

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Computer Security Alert

A new Computer "worm" has attacked several federal agencies and Fortune 500 companies. The malicious email messages contain the subject line "Here you have" or "Just For You" and contain a link to a seemingly legitimate PDF file. If users click on this link, they will be redirected to a malicious

website that will prompt them to download and install a screensaver (.scr) file. If they agree to install this file, they will become infected with an email worm that will continue to propagate through their email contacts.

The Department of Justice did receive over 200 of these emails but the Justice Security Operations Center (JSOC) activated the OCIO Incident Response Action Team and blocks were instituted at the TIC Internet gateways. Additionally, all components were required to update all antivirus products in use, which minimized our exposure to only six infected machines. Even though the Department is now protected, sometimes the adversaries change the email to look a little different so they can get past defenses.

The Department is asking all users to carefully watch your emails here at work and on your home machine.

To reduce the risk of compromising your DOJ workstation, be alert for unsolicited e-mail messages and keep in mind the following traits common to malicious e-mail messages:

- Subject matter related to recipient's work, possibly containing actual U.S. Government information
- A sense of urgency to convince the recipient to open an attachment or click a link within the message
- Convincing content such as upcoming meeting agendas, reports, information on current events or policy issues
- Seemingly-legitimate sender (government and commercial addresses, including @usdoj.gov) using legitimate signature and contact information
- Receiving an email with just a link
- An attachment (typically a .pdf or .zip file) or link

The Justice Security Operations Center would like to examine suspected malicious e-mail messages. To preserve the hidden message information typically invisible to average users, users must send suspicious e-mail messages to JSOC in a certain way. To forward suspicious messages for analysis, follow the instructions at the JSOC website:

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Annual Seasonal Flu Shots Now Available

Annual (Seasonal) Flu Shots will be administered to Department employees beginning Monday, September 20, 2010 for Priority/high risk groups that are identified by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). All remaining employees who choose to receive a vaccination may do so beginning Monday, September 27, 2010. See below for a list of these target groups. Flu shots will be free-of-charge.

To receive a flu shot, employees must go to their designated Health Unit and present their DOJ employee identification. If you are unsure whether you are in the priority/high-risk group, please contact your physician or the registered nurse in your designated health unit.

- Additional information regarding this year's flu season

High Risk Priority Groups Include:

- People aged 50 years and older, with and without chronic health conditions
- Residents of long-term care facilities

- People aged 2 49 years with chronic health conditions
- Children aged 6 months 5 years
- Pregnant women (require written permission from health care provider)
- Health-care personnel who provide direct patient care
- Household contacts and out-of-home caregivers of children less than 6 months of age, or high risk persons

Women who are pregnant or breastfeeding must have a written statement or consent from their private medical physician to receive the vaccine:

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Elimination of Federal Payroll Deductions for Savings Bonds

The United States Department of Treasury has announced it will discontinue issuing paper savings bonds through Federal payroll savings plans as of September 30, 2010.

Effective September 13, 2010 thru September 26, 2010, (pay period 19), the National Finance Center (NFC) will cancel all employee payroll paper bonds. No deductions for paper bonds will be made after Pay Period 19. However, an employee can change the paper savings bond deduction amount at any time up to Pay Period 19 to ensure the bond purchase price is completed in Pay Period 19. If an employee's deductions are not sufficient to purchase a bond, those deductions will be refunded to the employee in Pay Period 19. A bond refund will be displayed as a separate line item on the employee's Statement of Earnings and Leave.

NOTE: Employees who wish to continue purchasing savings bonds may do so by enrolling in the electronic bond program via Treasury Direct (<u>www.treasurydirect.gov</u>). More information regarding these changes may be found on the Treasury Direct website.

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Federal Long Term Care Insurance Program (FLTCIP) Expanded to Include Same-Sex Domestic Partners

The Office of Personnel Management issued final regulations on June 1, 2010 that expand the definition of "qualified relatives" to include same-sex domestic partners of eligible Federal employees in the Federal Long Term Care Insurance Program (FLTCIP). The Federal Long Term Care Insurance Program (FLTCIP) provides long term care insurance for its enrollees, who are Federal and U.S. Postal Service employees and annuitants, active and retired members of the uniformed services, and their "qualified relatives".

Like all "qualified relatives," same-sex domestic partners will be subject to Full Underwriting. Before submitting an application for coverage under the FLTCIP, an employee who has a same-sex domestic partner must document that the employee and his/her partner meet the definition of domestic partnership. The form used for this purpose is a "Declaration of Domestic Partnership" and it may be obtained from the FLTCIP website <u>http://www.ltcfeds.com</u> or your servicing Human Resources office.

To apply for the FLTCIP, the employee's same-sex domestic partner must check a box on the FLTCIP Full Underwriting Application certifying that documentation of the domestic partnership has been submitted to the employee's agency. 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DOJ Creates a Mediator Corps

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HUD Announces Refinancing Assistance Resource

The Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) <u>announced</u> on July 1st that Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac will begin refinancing mortgages with loan-to-value ratios of as much as 125 percent to boost participation in its anti-foreclosure programs. Currently Fannie Mae or Freddie Mac, through the <u>Home Affordable program</u>, can refinance mortgages they own or guarantee when the loan is worth as much as 105 percent of the home's market value. The program applies to mortgages that meet Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac's conforming loan limits of \$417,000 for some areas, and as much as \$729,750 in other areas. Borrowers with loan-to-value ratios of between 105 percent and 125 percent must refinance through their existing mortgage company to qualify. The <u>Homeowner</u> <u>Affordability and Stability Plan</u> provides help to homeowners to refinance or modify their mortgages. 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Results of the 2010 Attorney Student Loan Repayment Program

The 2010 Attorney Student Loan Repayment Program (ASLRP) selection process is complete. The Office of Attorney Recruitment and Management (OARM) sent notification messages to all selected attorneys on July 29, 2010, and will continue to follow up until all new selectees respond to confirm receipt. OARM also issued notifications to all the ASLRP component points of contact and requested that they notify applicants who applied but were not selected.

OARM regrets that it cannot issue a personal notification to all the applicants who were not selected. Regrettably, available funding does not permit funding to be awarded to all eligible attorneys, so many highly qualified applicants are not selected. OARM does not have any specific information relating to why an individual applicant was not selected; selections are based on the justification submitted by each applicant and his or her resume, and the recommendations from the attorney's component that are included in the forms. Notes on the content and preparation of this guide:

The purpose of this guide is to provide a listing of officers by name and by office, including years served, and the information necessary to locate their confirmation or nomination hearings. This is a work in progress. At this point, the guide includes most offices in existence from the Eisenhower Administration to the present. For a number of offices, the guide goes back to the first officer for which a published hearing or unpublished hearing transcript was found. The intention is to gradually add similar retrospective information for all offices. Further, additional offices will be added to the guide and it will be continually updated as new officers are confirmed.

The years of service are primarily based on the 56th edition of the *Register of the U.S. Department of Justice and the Federal Courts*, which was last published in 1992. Any errors found were corrected based on information from the Senate Judiciary Committee Calendars. For those serving subsequent to that time, the pertinent offices were contacted to verify years of service. Acting officers were not included except in a few cases considered to be of significance. Similarly, a number of hearings were included for nominees who were never confirmed because they were determined to be of interest.

The hearing locations listed are in the Main Library. For recent hearings, there are also links to the texts of the hearings found on <u>GPO Access</u>. Additionally, the hearings are available in the Main Library's microfiche collection. Because the unpublished hearing transcripts are only available on microfiche, the guide includes the CIS numbers necessary to locate them. In a number of cases, no published hearings or unpublished hearing transcripts on microfiche were located. In some of these cases, no hearings were held. In others, however, hearings were held, but Congress never published the hearings or made the unpublished transcripts widely available. Where determinations could be made as to whether hearings were actually held, the guide so indicates.
