Mr. Will Kammer, Chief, Freedom of Information Division, determined the redacted information within the enclosed documents should be withheld from release because it applies solely to Department of Defense (DoD) internal rules and practices, which if released, would risk circumvention of the DoD mission. Additionally, some of the information should be withheld because it is pre-decisional and deliberative in nature and contains subjective evaluations, opinions and recommendations which, if disclosed, would inhibit the decision making process. Release of this information would have the foreseeable harm of curtailing frank discussions and recommendations in the future. Finally, some of the information should be withheld because release would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of individuals. Consequently, this information should be denied pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(2)(High), (b)(5), and (b)(6).

If you are not satisfied with this action, you may appeal to the appellate authority, the Director of Administration and Management, Office of the Secretary of Defense, by writing directly to the Defense Freedom of Information Policy Office, Attn: Mr. James P. APPEAL OF FOIA REQUEST DENIAL

Dear Mr. Hogan,

I appeal the denial of my FOIA request number 06-F-2806. The application, submitted on September 13, 2006, was for a document entitled DOD transcript, Air Threat Conference Call, Sept. 11, 2001, which was mentioned in the 9/11 Commission Report. It was denied in full by a letter dated 7 March 2008 that stated that the document "contains information specifically exempt from release pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(1), which applies to information currently and properly classified consistent by Executive Order 12958, as amended, Section A.4(a), which pertains to military plans, weapons systems, or operations."

However, this denial was made in error, as numerous pieces of information based on this specific document have already been made public. The information already made public can no longer be classified and exempt from disclosure, and these portions of the underlying document requested, at least, should be released pursuant to the FOIA application. Below I list some of the information that has already been made public. Please release at least the relevant portions of the document requested. In addition, please release any other portions of the document not exempt from release.

# List of Some Information Already Publicly Available Based on the Air Threat Conference Call document:

- (1) According to the 9/11 Commission (9/11 Commission Report, pp. 37, 463), the document states that shootdown authority had already been conveyed by 10:25 a.m.
- (2) According to the 9/11 Commission (pp. 37, 463), the document contains a recap of events prior to 9:29 a.m., stating that two aircraft had hit the WTC and two fighters

had been scrambled from Otis air force base. There was also a request for information from the FAA, a statement that American 11 was still airborne by the deputy director of operations in the NMCC, and a transition from a significant event conference to an air threat conference. NORAD also confirmed that American 11 is airborne.

- (3) According to the 9/11 Commission (pp. 37, 463), the document states that there were three requests the FAA be added to the call before 10:03 a.m. An FAA representative subsequently joined at 10:17 a.m.
- (4) According to the 9/11 Commission (pp. 38, 463), the document states that at 9:39 the NMCC's deputy director said: "An air attack against North America may be in progress. NORAD, what's the situation?" NORAD replied it has conflicting reports and its latest information is "of a possible hijacked aircraft taking off out of JFK en route to Washington D.C." The NMCC then reported a crash into the mall side of the Pentagon and asked that the Secretary of Defense be added to the call.
- (5) According to the 9/11 Commission (pp. 38, 463), the document states that at 9:48 a representative from the White House shelter asked if there are any indications of another hijacked aircraft. The deputy director for operations mentioned a Delta flight and says "that would be the fourth possible hijack." At 9:49, the commander of NORAD directed all air sovereignty aircraft to battle stations, fully armed.
- (6) According to the 9/11 Commission (pp. 41, 464), the document states that at around or before 10:02 the Secret Service notified of an inbound aircraft heading to Washington.
- (7) According to the 9/11 Commission (pp. 41, 465), the document states that some people speculated that United 93 may have been shot down pursuant to instructions from the President shortly before 10:30 a.m.
- (8) According to the 9/11 Commission (pp. 41, 465), the document states that shortly after 10:30 Vice President Cheney communicated authorisation to "engage" or "take out" a hostile aircraft. At 10:33 Deputy National Security Advisor Stephen Hadley says: "I need to get word to Dick Myers that our reports are there's an inbound aircraft flying low 5 miles out. The Vice President's guidance was we need to take them out."
- (9) According to the 9/11 Commission (pp. 42, 465), the document states that the NMCC learned of the hijacking of United 93 at about 10:03.
- (10) According to the 9/11 Commission (pp. 42, 465), the document states that at 10:07 a NORAD representative states NORAD had "no indication of a hijack heading to DC at this time."
- (11) According to the 9/11 Commission (pp. 43, 465), the document states that leaders in Washington believed that fighters launched to intercept hijacked aircraft had been instructed to take them out.

(12) According to the 9/11 Commission (pp. 43, 465), the document states that the following exchange took place at 10:39 a.m.:

Vice President: There's been at least three instances here where we've had reports of aircraft approaching Washington--a couple were confirmed hijack. And, pursuant to the President's instructions I gave authorization for them to be taken out. Hello?

SecDef: Yes, I understand. Who did you give that direction to?

Vice President: It was passed from here through the [operations] center at the White House, from the [shelter].

SecDef: OK, let me ask the question here. Has that directive been transmitted to the aircraft?

Vice President: Yes, it has.

**SecDef:** So we've got a couple of aircraft up there that have those instructions at this present time?

Vice President: That is correct. And it's my understanding they've already taken a couple of aircraft out.

SecDef: We can't confirm that. We're told that one aircraft is down but we do not have a pilot report that did it

(13) According to the 9/11 Commission (pp. 326, 554), the document states that at 10:43 a.m. the Secretary of Defense directed the nation's armed forces to Defense Condition 3. Secretary Rumsfeld then discussed the issue with Vice President Cheney, and was asked to get the President's opinion on this. The conferees were told to "hold off" on the order, but it was reinstated shortly after by Secretary Rumsfeld, who said he has the authority to issue the order.

Please release the portions of the document specified above, at least. These portions can no longer be classified, as they, or significant information about them, is already public.

I look forward to your reply.

I have determined that you should be placed in the "other" category for fee purposes, which affords you two hours of search time and 100 pages of duplication free of charge. 



Reheuser, an Initial Denial Authority for the DoD, OGC, has determined that the document, totaling 182 pages, is exempt from release in its entirety pursuant to pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(1), which pertains to information that is properly classified in the interest of national security pursuant to Executive Order 12958, as amended, section 1.4(a) which concerns military plans, weapons, or operations, (c), which concerns intelligence activities of the United States, intelligence sources or methods, or cryptology, and (g) which concerns vulnerabilities or capability of systems, installations, infrastructures, projects, plans, or protection services relating to the national security, which includes defense against transnational terrorism.

This is an appeal of the decision dated March 24, 2009, of Paul J. Jacobsmeyer, Chief, Office of Freedom of Information, Department of Defense, on my client, Mike Williams' request for records concerning the Air Threat Conference Call that reportedly started in the Pentagon at 9:37 a.m. on September 11, 2001 and lasted for more than eight hours.

By letter dated September 19, 2008, I submitted a Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA") request on behalf of Mr. Williams for the complete transcript of the Air Threat Conference Call that reportedly started in the Pentagon at 9:37 a.m. on September 11, 2001 and lasted for more than eight hours.

By letter dated March 24, 2009, Mr. Jacobsmeyer denied this request in full. He indicated that 182 pages were located that the document was withheld in its entirety pursuant to FOIA exemption 1. Mr. Jacobsmeyer stated that this information was classified pursuant to Executive Order 12958 sections 1.4(a), 1.4(c) and 1.4(g).

Mr. Williams appeals the withholding of responsive records in this matter. Mr. Williams believes that even if some of the material may be properly classified that there are portions of the document that is not classifiable and should be segregated and released to him.

A 911 Commission document indicates that only a "relatively small subset of the document" . . . "discusses particularly sensitive matters." August 22, 2003 Letter from Daniel Levin, Department of Justice to Daniel Zellikow, Executive Director, National Commission on Terrorist Attacks Upon the United States. Further, other information from the 911 Commission indicates that material in the transcript has been made publicly available. As example, at 0958 Myers recommended evacuating Chicago's Sears Tower; Winfield took over the conference 48 minutes into the call; NORAD asked that the FAA be on the call, that United Flight 93 was mentioned for the first time at 10:09 when call participants were told that the flight was "20 minutes out"; that at 10:02 there was a report of an incoming target "25 minutes out"; and

finally that there were questions about whether Andrews Air Force Base had been contacted.

Thus, in light of the historical significance of this document and the well documented positions of President Obama and Attorney General Holder on transparency, my client believes that this document should be reviewed for possible declassification and segregation of responsive information. The times, and speakers on the phone call would cause no harm to national security and could be declassified and released. For instance it is public knowledge that then Defense Secretary Rumsfeld, former Vice President Cheney, General Richard Myers ("Myers") and Montague Winfield ("Winfield") participated in the call. Additionally, the publicly available information described above should also be declassified and released.

Finally, I note that embarrassment to the government is not a proper reason for classification. If any material in the transcript was classified only because it would embarrass someone, it is not properly classified.

Thus, I ask that you review the classification of this document de novo and release all segregable non-classified information.



Dear Mr. Hogan:

This is an appeal of the decision dated March 24, 2009, of Paul J. Jacobsmeyer, Chief, Office of Freedom of Information, Department of Defense, on my client, Mike Williams' request for records concerning the Air Threat Conference Call that reportedly started in the Pentagon at 9:37 a.m. on September 11, 2001 and lasted for more than eight hours.

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Mr. Williams appeals the withholding of responsive records in this matter. Mr. Williams believes that even if some of the material may be properly classified that there are portions of the document that is not classifiable and should be segregated and released to him.

A 911 Commission document indicates that only a "relatively small subset of the document"... "discusses particularly sensitive matters." August 22, 2003 Letter from Daniel Levin, Department of Justice to Daniel Zellikow, Executive Director, National Commission on Terrorist Attacks Upon the United States. Further, other information from the 911 Commission indicates that material in the transcript has been made publicly available. As example, at 0958 Myers recommended evacuating Chicago's Sears Tower; Winfield took over the conference 48 minutes into the call; NORAD asked that the FAA be on the call, that United Flight 93 was mentioned for the first time at 10:09 when call participants were told that the flight was "20 minutes out"; that at 10:02 there was a report of an incoming target "25 minutes out"; and

finally that there were questions about whether Andrews Air Force Base had been contacted.

Thus, in light of the historical significance of this document and the well documented positions of President Obama and Attorney General Holder on transparency, my client believes that this document should be reviewed for possible declassification and segregation of responsive information. The times, and speakers on the phone call would cause no harm to national security and could be declassified and released. For instance it is public knowledge that then Defense Secretary Rumsfeld, former Vice President Cheney, General Richard Myers ("Myers") and Montague Winfield ("Winfield") participated in the call. Additionally, the publicly available information described above should also be declassified and released.

Finally, I note that embarrassment to the government is not a proper reason for classification. If any material in the transcript was classified only because it would embarrass someone, it is not properly classified.

Thus, I ask that you review the classification of this document de novo and release all segregable non-classified information.

This is the final response to your Freedom of Information Act request dated September 19, 2008, for "a copy of the complete transcript of the Air Threat Conference Call that reportedly started in the Pentagon at 9:37a.m. on September 11, 2001 and lasted for more than eight hours."

A search of the records systems maintained by the Department of Defense (DoD), Office of the General Counsel (OGC), located one document responsive to your request. Mr. Michael E. Reheuser, an Initial Denial Authority for the DoD, OGC, has determined that the document, totaling 182 pages, is exempt from release in its entirety pursuant to pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(1), which pertains to information that is properly classified in the interest of national security pursuant to Executive Order 12958, as amended, section 1.4(a) which concerns military plans, weapons, or operations, (c), which concerns intelligence activities of the United States, intelligence sources or methods, or cryptology, and (g) which concerns vulnerabilities or capability of systems, installations, infrastructures, projects, plans, or protection services relating to the national security, which includes defense against transnational terrorism.


