INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS -DANGEROUS ALIENS OF NON-COMMUNIST NATIONS

From time to time personnel employed by or accredited to International Organizations, such as the United Nations and other International Organizations within the purview of the International Organizations Immunities Act are subjects of investigation.

Those who are considered dangerous upon investigation fall into three categories.

The first category includes those altens who are nationals of the Communist nations and who in the event of hostilities and after State Department authorization was given would be taken into protective custody for repatriation and exchange.

In the second category would be those citizens of the United States and those stateless persons not having the protection of a 3(7) visa who by Departmental ruling could be taken into custody under the Emergency Detention Program.

This leaves a third category of aliens employed by ar accredited to the United Nations or other Enternational Organizations within the purview of the International Organizations Immunities Act who have the protection of: that Act and who are from non-Communist countries or who though stateless residents, of the United States are in possession of shedomisps 141/05- 14879-

In the great of hastilities such individuals an this latter category as are considered dangerous to the internal security could neither be arrested under the Emergency Detention Program nor taken into protective custody for repatriation or exchange. Rebulet dated April 24, 1951, which furnished information and set forth instructions concerning captioned matter.

There is no indication at this time that there reside in Washington, D. G., any aliens, who can be considered as dangerous, who fall in the catagory of individuals covered in this case. In order to make certain that the Bureau's instructions are appropriately capplied with, certain investigation is being undertaken with the objective of making certain that no dangerous alien of a non-Communist nation is working and residing in the territory covered by the Washington Field Office. In connection with primary inquiries conducted in this matter, certain information has been secured which may be of possible interest and assistance to the Bureau and the New York Office. Such information is being set forth as follows:

As the Eureau points out, in reference letter, the catagory of interest in subject case, concerns those allers employed by or accredited to the United Nations or other International Organizations within the purview of the International Organizations Immunity Aof and who are from non-Communist countries or who, although stateless residents of the United States, possess 3 (7) visas. 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#### **PURPOSE**

To advise that Soviet and satellite United Nations personnel and U.S. citizens and stateless persons considered dangerous to the internal security are currently recorded in the Bureau in certain control files.

To provide for a similar control on United Nations personnel not falling within the afore-mentioned categories.

#### DETAILS

There are 3 categories of United Nations personnel, each category being handled in a separate and distinct manner.

The first category includes Soviet and satellite personnel who are members of national delegations, employees of the Secretariat or otherwise accredited to the United Nations.

These persons cannot be touched in the event of war unless and until the Department of State cuthorizes their being taken into protective custody for repatriation and exchange.

The protective custody will be carried out under the general provisions of "PRODIP." These individuals are listed from time to time in PRODIP both at the Bureau and in the New York Office. In addition, they are also listed in the appropriate files relating to the United Nations personnel of the respective countries involved.

The second category includes U.S. citizens and stateless persons who have not come within the protection of the immunities of the International Organizations Immunities Act. By Departmental ruling these individuals can be apprehended in the event of war under the Emergency Detention Program. Cards on these individuals appear in the Special Section of the Security Index for United Nations and International Organizations personnel. In addition, the United States citizens attached to the United Nations who are considered dangerous are reported summarily in a control of 1971.

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The third and remaining category are those aliens not falling within the previous categories who are considered dangerous and who for that reason are or have been under investigation. locording to Departmental ruling they are protected by the International Organizations Immunities Act and the UN Headquarters Site Agreement. Prior to any action being taken against them, it would be necessary, therefore, to obtain a waiver of immunity from the Secretary General of the United Nations regarding those employed by the Secretariat or accredited otherwise to the United Nations or a waiver from their respective governments if they were employed by a National Delegation. In practice, appropriate representations made by the Department of State to the Secretary General or to neutral or allied nations would result in either termination of their immunity or their departure from the United States. It is assumed that such individuals would not be liable to prosecution for any substantive violation but would merely be persons who if not protected by immunities would be liable to detention under the Emergency Detention Program.

At the present time there is no control file for such individuals.

Accordingly, instructions have been prepared for New York, copies to Washington Field, instructing that individuals who are neither

(1) Soviet or satellite aliens, nor

(2) United States citizens or stateless persons not in possession of 3(7) visas but who are

(3) Aliens employed by the Secretariat, employed in or by the delegations of member nations or otherwise accredited to the United Nations #

should, if considered dangerous to the internal security, be listed in a letter to the Bureau every 30 days so that in the event of hostilities, these persons can be immediately brought to the attention of the Attorney General and the Department of State in order that appropriate representations may be made to the Secretary General of the United Nations or the nation by which they are employed.

The proposed action would apply not only to those aliens employed by or accredited to the United Nations but also to aliens of that actegory who are employed by any other International Organization within the purview of the International Organizations Immunities Act.

As will be noted, in some instances the Bureau file number is not available in our files. In instances where the subject's holding of a 3(7) visa has not been definitely verified by investigation, the list does not show any type of visa; the subject is included in the list in each such instance, however, since it appears probable, from the other available information, that he does hold a 3(7) visa.

A problem has arisen in regard to the classification of Chinese. We have tentatively concluded, subject to further Bureau instructions, that Chinese representing the Nationalist government or traveling under its credentials, are aliens of non-Communist nation.

Inasmuch as the determination of the employment of a subject is essential in each security investigation, it is felt that this determination can be made by you during the regular course of a security investigation regarding such a subject. However, you should bear in mind the necessity of checking the names of subjects as they are brought to your attention against available lists of international organization employees where employment is unknown.

At this time there are no known dangerous aliens residing in Washington, D.C. who fall within the category of individuals covered in this case.

Additional reference is made to mylet of May 15, 1951, wherein known international organizations were listed for informational nurnoses.

inquiry at the Protocol Division reveals that this division maintains an index of employees of these various international organizations. It is estimated that this index includes approximately 5500 to 6000 names of which approximately 2000 are terminated employees from all organizations, particularly the United Nations, whose present whereabouts are unknown. This would leave approximately 3000 to 3500 current employees in various international organizations.

It appears questionable whether it would be worth-while or desirable to search these names through WFO indices, although consideration is being given to searching the names of employees of those international organizations located in Washington, D.C. It is not known whether the Bureau would wish to consider searching these names through Bureau indices, although it is felt that the results of such a procedure would not likely be consistent with the work expended in such a project.

It is requested that the Bureau advise if it is desired that this office undertake a special project in this matter in general conformity with the procedure outlined above or whether the identity of the dangerous aliens referred to in this case should be secured in the course of regular security investigations.

The list set forth above is the result of circularization among the Agents of the office. This method is probably effective in securing all the cases now pending in the office. As regards cases now in a closed status, this method is probably not completely effective. Accordingly, systematic indices check of the names appearing in the current United Nations telephone directory is being made, in an effort to secure all cases which qualify for inclusion in the list. The Bureau will appreciate that such an indices check is a substantial undertaking and will take some time to complete.

Bureau advice requested as to the following questions, which have arisen in the course of preparation of the monthly lists:

I. Are Yugoslav nationals to be considered as "slicks of non-Communist states," for the purpose of the monthly list?

The proposed letter may be objectionable on three

grounds:

- 1. It does not clearly show the identity of the Department of the Government which will be ultimately responsible for the transmittal of such derogatory summaries to the Secretary General.
- 2. It refers to the submission of such summaries to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for approval prior to their dispatch. The language of the letter should clearly show that the FBI will review the summaries to determine that the identities of confidential informants and investigative techniques are not disclosed.
- 3. It is not clearly indicated in the letter that the responsibility for determining the type of action to be taken against a United Nations employee rests with the Criminal Division and not with the Immigration and Naturalization Service or the FBI.

ACTION:

There is attached a proposed memorandum to Mr. Malone, the Deputy Attorney General, setting forth the Bureau's observations in these regards.

There are three observations which may be made, all of which refer to matters appearing on Page 2 of the proposed communication:

- 1. There is no designation of the Department of the U.S. Government upon which ultimate responsibility must be placed for the transmittal of summaries of derogatory information regarding foreign nationals employed by the Secretariat of the United Nations. You may wish to resolve this question of ultimate responsibility in your communication to the Secretary of State.
- 2. It is suggested that the references to "approval" by the Federal Bursau of Investigation of these summaries of derogatory information be changed to show that the FBI will review such summaries for the purpose of determining whether the identities of confidential informants and investigative techniques have been protected adequately... The word "approval" is sweeping in its connotation.
- 3. The item relating to the preparation of summartes of derogatory information by the Department of Justice where future recommendations may be initiated in the Department of Justice leaves a question regarding the responsibility within the Department for the preparation of these summaries. It is noted that in the case of Sidney S. Dell, the Immigration and Naturalization Service has been nequested to provide such a summary. You will recall that in connection

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

Inasmich as information from the State Department reveals that the subject want to Peking, China, while on home leave the Dureau desires that this case be reopened and thoroughly investigated to determine if the subject's present or past activities are inimical to the national security. In the above connection you will note from the State Department telegram from Hong Kong dated February 13, 1953, that was made available to you by Bulet dated February 27, 1953, the Consulate General at Hong Kong doubted that the sole purpose of the subject's trip to Peking was to visit his family in view of the subject's evasiveness and the relative ease with which he completed the trip to Peking.

For the information of the Washington Field Office, records of the State Department reflect that in December, 1952, the subject and applied to the American Congulate General in nong Kong for appropriate visas to return to the United Nations Secretariate following home leave in Communist China. C-2 visas were issued to the aliena on January 8, 1953, but were later cancelled and on February 23, 1953, nonimmigrant visas were refused under the provisions of Section 212(a)(27) of the Immigration and Nationality Act. The Consulate at Hong Kong had no information regarding the documentation for travel or entry visa, if any, had for entering into the United States on his return visit to this country. 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





In compliance with relet of 4/24/51 the NYO has placed on above-mentioned list those individuals employed at the UN who were considered dangerous after investigation and who held a 3(7) vigator a series G visa.

Relet of 5/14/54 is interpreted to mean that all aliens at the UN holding series I and series C visas deemed dangerous to the national security after investigation should be included in above list.

The matter concerning the series I and series C visas has been brought to the attention of agents of this office assigned to investigation of Internal Security matters of individuals outside the Soviet block employed by international organizations. This has reflected several cases currently under investigation which will probably fall in the catagory of the series I and series C visas. Due to the early stage of these investigations their potential dangerousness has not been established.

Information from Confidential Informant has previously reflected that many individ<del>uals who were initially employed at the UN</del> and held a series I visa later obtained a series G visa. It appears that many of the individuals currently under investigation and holding a series I visa will possibly be issued a series G visa by the time sufficient investigation has been conducted to determine whether they are dangerous to the national security. Tou are reminded that from time to time, at the request of the Department of State, the Attorney General permits certain individuals who are excludable by reason of subversive activities or associations to enter the United States for the purpose of attending the deliberations of the United Nations or its related bodies. In each instance, you are informed of the identities of such persons. Bureau policy has been that, where an excludable subversive is admitted to the United States under those conditions, with specific reference to Series I or Series C visa holders, we will not accept responsibility for their activities and will only investigate them if new allegations relating to subversive activities on their part while in the United States are brought to our attention.

Accordingly, you should submit a supplemental list showing those stateless persons or aliens from other than Soviet Bloc countries in attendance at the United Nations holding Series C or Series I visas who are excludable under the Immigration and Nationality Act but who have been permitted to enter the United States by the Attorney General at the insistence of the Department of State and regarding whom no investigation is being conducted by the Bureau.

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Such a supplemental list should accompany, likewise, each subsequent monthly listing of those persons in this matter whom you have determined to be dangerous it of the national security asking result; of investigation. Since most or all of the alien's falling in the category discussed are in the United States for a temperary period, it will be necessary for you to check with the Innigration. Service in New York to determine whether they are actually in the United States at the time your list is prepared.

In this Bureau's reply to Mr. Olney on May 13, 1954, we pointed out that the Department had indicated the responsibility for arrest and detention of dangerous aliens holding Series C visas would be that of the Immigration and Naturalization Service. We merely pointed out that it would be desirable to similarly fix responsibility for dangerous persons holding Series I visas. We did not mean to convey the impression that the FBI was assuming any responsibility whatsoever for the apprehension of such persons in an emergency.

With regard to your inquiry concerning the names of persons holding Series I visas (representatives of foreign press, radio, film, or other information media) and Series C visas (transit to and from the United Nations Headquarters district), we had no individuals in those categories under investigation as of July 30, 1954. time to time, the Attorney General, at the request of the Department of State, permits persons gtherwisg excludable Declarified &

It will also be noted that in numerous instances no record of certain individuals could be located in the files of INS, Central Office, sashington, b.C. In this connection, INS officials advised that the INS file of such individuals are probably in the process of being forwarded to the INS Office covering such person's current residence. Insamuch as the current residence of such individual is in New York City, it is requested that the New York Division periodically contact INS, New York City, to determine when such individual's file strives in New York and thereafter reviewing file for the requested information. -1
