Re: Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) Request No. 2021-OGC-05282-F Final Response

This is the final response to the above-referenced August 2, 2021, FOIA request submitted to the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA). The Office of Information Affairs (OIA), FOIA Division, processed your request. The OIA is under the purview of the Office of General Counsel (OGC) and serves as the focal point for USDA's FOIA program. It provides coordination and ensures agency-wide compliance with the FOIA. Additionally, the OIA processes requests and appeals on behalf of the Office of the Secretary (OSEC); the Under Secretaries, USDA's staff offices; and the Research, Education and Economics and Trade and Foreign Agricultural Affairs mission areas.

This response is being provided on behalf of the OGC, for your request seeking records, from 2018 to present, from the General Law and Research Division, regarding:

- Cease and Desist (or similar) Letters sent out regarding unauthorized use of the Smokey Bear character or the Forest Service Insignia.
- Copies of GLRD memos regarding unauthorized use of the Smokey Bear character or Forest Service Insignia as constrained by First Amendment and fair use principles.
- Copies of other records regarding unauthorized use of the Smokey Bear character

This request is being processed under the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552.

Searches for responsive records were conducted by the OIA's telecommunications provider, the Client Experience Center (CEC). The CEC provides comprehensive, fee-for-service information technology (IT) associated operations, security, and technical support services to USDA end users. The CEC also implements and manages enterprise IT solutions for users Department-wide. we have located three hundred and three (303) pages of responsive records for this final response.

Following a review of the responsive records, the OIA has determined that certain information contained therein should be withheld pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(5) and (b)(6), (FOIA Exemptions 5 and 6). Below is an explanation of the information that has been withheld.

FOIA Exemption 5 - Pre-decisional/Deliberative and Attorney Client Privilege

FOIA Exemption 5 protects from disclosure those "inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency." One of the frequently invoked FOIA Exemption 5 privileges is the deliberative process privilege. To fall within FOIA's deliberative process privilege, the records must be both pre-decisional and deliberative; the records must precede the adoption of an agency policy and include the opinions, recommendations, or deliberations on a legal or policy matter.

In this instance, the OIA is withholding portions of emails containing discussions about future agency actions, draft letters, draft talking points, colleague and interagency review of policy, responses, and/or recommendations between USDA attorneys and their clients. Disclosure of such information would have a chilling effect on the ability of agency officials to engage in free and frank discussions regarding policy but also may cause confusion on the agency's actual position on the policy at issue. Specifically, release of this information would reveal the USDA's deliberative and pre-decisional discussions of policies that were not adopted in part (or in full) and/or contemplations of legal and policy matters that were not yet acted on or not adopted.

The OIA is also withholding information under the attorney-client privilege. This privilege protects confidential communication between an attorney and his/her client relating to a legal matter for which the client has sought professional advice. Although this privilege fundamentally applies to facts divulged by a client to his/her attorney, this privilege also encompasses any opinion given by an attorney to his/her client based upon those facts, as well as communications between attorneys that reflect client supplied information. In this instance, the OIA is withholding information shared internally whereby legal advice is being sought from and provided by the Department's counsel.

These confidential communications are shielded from disclosure in order to encourage open and frank discussions between the Department and its legal advisors. Additionally, conversations discussion legal strategy between Department attorney's is being withheld where they are discussing legal strategy and matters of law. Ensuring the Department receives sound legal advice promotes public policy, and this advice depends on counsel being fully informed. The release of these confidential communications would inhibit the Department's ability to provide pertinent information and would impair the Department's counsel from making well-informed legal decisions.

FOIA Exemption 6

Exemption 6 generally is referred to as the "personal privacy" exemption. It provides that the disclosure requirements of the FOIA do not apply to "personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy." Application of the exemption involves balancing the public's interest in disclosure against individuals' privacy interests.

The information withheld under Exemption 6 consists of mobile telephone numbers, unpublished direct-dial phone numbers, and the identity of third-party citizens alerting the USDA to potential trouble. This information qualifies as "similar files" because it is information in which individuals have a privacy interest. Releasing mobile phone numbers, and email addresses for individuals could subject the individuals to unwarranted or unsolicited communications and would not shed additional light on governmental operations. Releasing the identity of a citizen alerting the Department to a potential legal issue would unnecessarily discourage this type of useful engagement with the public who may fear personal retribution. Because there are viable privacy interests that would be threatened by disclosure, Exemption 6 authorizes this office to withhold the information. Accordingly, we have determined that the public interest in the information's release does not outweigh the overriding privacy interests in keeping it confidential.

You may appeal this response by email at USDAFOIA@usda.gov. Your appeal must be in writing, and it must be received electronically no later than 90 calendar days from the date of this letter. The OGC will not consider appeals received after the 90 calendar-day limit. Appeals received after 5:00 p.m. EST will be considered received the next business day. The appeal letter should include the FOIA tracking number listed above, a copy of the original request, the OIA's response to your original request, and a statement explaining the basis of your appeal. For quickest possible handling, the subject line of your email should be marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal." You should also reference FOIA No. 2021-OGC-05282-F.

Talking Points on Proposal to repeal title 18 USC Section 711 relating to Smokey Bear Act P.L. 82-359 Ch. 327

- 88% of wildland fires (nearly nine out of ten) on all lands (federal, state and private) are human-caused, according to 1984-1990 and 1991-1997 Wildland Fire Statistics USDA Forest Service, and unpublished fire statistics 1998-2003
- The leading human-causes of wildfires in the United States are debris burning, campfires, equipment use and arson.
- The Cooperative Forest Fire Prevention (CFFP) Committee, (USDA Forest Service, National Association of State Foresters, and the Advertising Council) was formed in 1942 to create wildfire prevention messages that target specific human-caused wildfire ignitions. Smokey Bear is a crucial element of these wildfire prevention messages. Keeping Smokey's image and message protected under law is the key to success of the CFFP's wildfire prevention campaign.
- For-profit use of Smokey Bear's image and name is allowed if a license is obtained by adhering to the CFFP rules, regulations and licensing process as identified in 36 CFR 271 "Use of Smokey Bear."
- Royalties paid by Smokey Bear licensees to the Forest Service are reinvested into wildfire prevention programs, education materials, and other CFFP campaign products.
- P.L.82-359, the Smokey Bear Act of May 23, 1952 states that those who do not receive proper approvals from the CFFP for use of Smokey Bear's image or name shall be fined not more than \$250 or imprisoned not more than six months, or both."
- P.L. 82-359 states that the Secretary of Agriculture may authorize use of Smokey Bear "for a period not to exceed one hundred and eighty days, expiring no later than one year after the enactment" of this act. This was in an effort to mitigate substantial loss if an agreement of use was made prior to this enactment.
- Sec. 3 of P.L. 82-359 also states in Sec. 3 that funds received from fees collected under Smokey Bear regulations, shall be put in a special account and used to further "the nation-wide forest-fire prevention campaign."
- Public Law 93-318, the Woodsy Owl Act of June 22, 1974, identifies the name and character of "Smokey Bear" as property of the United States, in essence taking Smokey Bear out of public domain and inserted "and for profit" to describe the type of Smokey Bear use where fines and imprisonment shall be considered.

- In 1994, Public Law 103-322 substituted the following wording in P.L. 82-359 "fined under this title" for "fined not more than \$250" and struck out the element of permission to use for 180 days, since that time had clearly passed.
- 18 USC Ch. 33 Emblems, Insignia, and Names documents in Sec. 711 P.L. 82-359 and amendments to P.L. 103-22 and P.L. 93-318.

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

The act of June 22, 1974 (88 Stat. 244; 31 U.S.C. 488a; 488b-6; 18 U.S.C. 711) authorizes the collection of royalties and criminal penalties of six months imprisonment and/or fines for commercial use of the Smokey Bear symbol and slogan.

As you neither asked for nor received permission to use Smokey Bear as the basis for the Resist t-shirt, nor to make or distribute copies, including electronic copies, of same, you have willfully infringed on the rights of a licensor under 17 U.S.C. Section 101 et seq. and could be liable for statutory damages as high as \$150,000 as set forth in Section 504(c)(2) therein.



I demand that you immediately cease the use and distribution of all infringing works, and all copies, including electronic copies, of same, that you deliver to me, if applicable, all unused, undistributed copies of same, or destroy such copies immediately and that you desist from this or any other infringement of these rights in the future.

If I have not received an affirmative response from you by 5:00 PM ET Wednesday, March 15, 2017 indicating that you have fully complied with these requirements, I shall send this matter to the U.S. Forest Service for further action. The Viral T-Shirts of the Trump Resistance Are Made Right Here in Pittsburgh

Inside a sprawling industrial building below a Pittsburgh police station, Jay Fanelli stands next to a big wheel-like structure stamping a red-white-and-blue pattern on grey t-shirts.

The t-shirts say "Thanks Obama" with stars-and-stripes lettering. Since the election of Donald Trump, Fanelli's t-shirt company, Cotton Bureau, has looked for designs that oppose the president. And they've been flooded with requests for t-shirts, like the Thanks Obama tees, which were designed by a Pittsburgh artist.

"People on the other side politically use 'Thanks Obama' as an insult," says Fanelli, a self-described liberal. "And we've seen a couple people use Cotton Bureau t-shirts to try to take [the phrase] back a little and use it as a compliment."

Sporting a black hoodie, shaved head, beard and glasses, Fanelli is standing at the printing presses of Clockwise printshop, which is just a few feet down a hallway from Cotton Bureau's warehouse and delivery space.

It's been an unlikely journey for Fanelli and his custom-print t-shirt business into the role of clothier for the Trump resistance. Fanelli and his partners owned a graphic design business. But they wanted to make t-shirts for fun, so they founded Cotton Bureau almost four years ago as a way to make and sell t-shirts for designers and illustrators. The business grew, and eventually the team closed the graphic design business.

The artists submit their designs, and if Cotton Bureau accepts them, the company prints and sells them on its web site. Often the shirts are sold to raise money for charities like medical research or promoting STEM education.

But the business plan changed in November. Fanelli and co-founder Nate Peretic made the decision to focus on anti-Trump shirts, not necessarily because of his policies, but due to what Fanelli calls the "undermining of democratic norms" — things like the potential conflicts of interest posed by the president's many business ties around the world.

"We felt like we couldn't be neutral," says Fanelli, who is also the company's lead designer. "We didn't come out as a company in favor of Hillary Clinton. We're coming out against Donald Trump."

A week after the inauguration, the company received an email from someone affiliated with the @RogueNASA Twitter account, one of many alternative government accounts created to oppose the administration. It tweets often about climate change, which Trump has called a hoax.

Their contact at RogueNASA (they don't know the person's identity) wanted a t-shirt to sell for charity. The logo Fanelli helped design uses NASA's "meatball" logo — a simple blue circle with white stars and red arrow, with the word "Rogue" on it. It went up for sale on Cotton Bureau's web site, then all hell broke loose.

"It went live and it crashed our site," Fanelli says. "We've never had that happen before."

They sold 14,000 RogueNASA shirts. That's nearly three times the previous highest order on the site.

They've sold t-shirts for Pod Save America, a podcast run by former Obama aides and speechwriters. And the investigative website ProPublica commissioned a "We're not shutting up" shirt in response to Trump adviser Stephen Bannon's statement that the media should keep quiet.

One of the best sellers was a t-shirt with the word "Resist" emblazoned on the bat of a character resembling a displeased Smokey Bear.

That t-shirt — titled "Only You Can Prevent Alt Facts" — will benefit

That t-shirt — titled "Only You Can Prevent Alt Facts" — will benefit national parks, though it's not affiliated with any federal agency. So far, they've sold over 9,000 of that one.

All this means a lot of work for Fanelli and his small crew.

"The most t-shirts we've packed in a short amount of time is 15,000. It's going to be about 50,000 over the next three or four weeks," Fanelli says. "We're not only all hands on deck; we're asking anybody who has a brother or boyfriend or coworker who has a few hours to spare to help get these orders out."


In Cotton Burcau's small warehouse space next to the printing press, Nate Peretic's brother, Joel, sorts through a pile of packaged Smokey shirts ready to ship to various places — everywhere from Fairfield, Ohio to Brooklyn and France.

"We get orders from all over the place," says Joel Peretic. "We get a lot of Asian countries. We ship to every continent."

"We felt like we couldn't be neutral. We didn't come out as a company in favor of Hillary Clinton. We're coming out against Donald Trump." Fanelli says it's not surprising that t-shirts referencing agencies that study climate science and promote conservation have sold well. "Science and environmentalism have been under attack from the right for years. I don't think it's any coincidence these two shirts have become lightning rods for that kind of activism."

Fancili says they've lost customers with their foray into activism, but not nearly as many as they've gained. In any other election, he says, the company probably would have tried to stay in the middle. But with this president — Fancili isn't sure there is a middle ground.

"It's a little bit morally conflicting to know that things are going so well for our business and that's because we have the president we have."

Dear Ms. Kayoulakis:

Fenwick & West LLP represents Cotton Bureau, which has forwarded to us your March 8, 2017 threat and demand about the "Resist t-shirt."

The design of the t-shirt makes an obvious political statement by placing the word "resist" on the helmet of a bear and coupling that image and word with the phrase "Only You Can Prevent Alt Facts." If it were not obvious enough, the article you attached to your letter should have explained it sufficiently.

For the record: the shirts you have challenged feature expressions and symbols to suggest both (1) that resistance to Donald Trump is vital to serve the purposes for which Smokey Bear is a symbol and (2) citizens must be vigilant in combatting lies and propaganda by an increasingly authoritarian Trump Administration. Many persons fear that personnel appointments and budget cuts of the Trump Administration are jeopardizing our environment in many ways, including efforts to prevent fires. See, for

example, https://insideclimatenews.org/news/06022017/sonny-perdue-georgia-usda-agriculture-secretary-national-forest-service-climate-change. The Resist t-shirt both expresses support for the purposes that Smokey Bear stands for and promotes standing up for those purposes, and against lies and government propaganda, under the current Administration.

Metis Group and you individually have made it clear that you are both acting as agents for the government on this matter. You have made threats on the government's behalf with specific reference to criminal penalties and threats of legal action.

As an agent of the United States Government invoking the law on its behalf, you should have reasonably known that there is a strong First Amendment right to engage in the expression that the "Resist t-shirt" (as you described it) embodies. That First Amendment right has been clearly established. The article that you attached to your letter could not have made the First Amendment issues any clearer.

Your letter refers to sections 488a and 489b-6 of Title 31 of the United States Code. Have you read those sections lately? They have not existed since the mid-1980s. Your company and you sent a harassing threat without any familiarity with the relevant current statute or attention to the First Amendment of the United States Constitution. Cotton Bureau assumes that your company and you sent the letter without even consulting with competent legal counsel. A competent lawyer would have called your attention to the NSA's and Department of Homeland Security's misguided effort to enjoin a parody use of the NSA logo. A competent lawyer would also have alerted you to Lighthawk v. Robertson, 812 F.Supp. 1095 (W.D. Wash.), which ruled unconstitutional, as in violation of the First Amendment, the application of statutes restricting use of the Smokey Bear character in circumstances similar to those here.

Your allegation of a violation of the Copyright Act exhibits a similar disregard of the fair use provisions of the Copyright Act. Sections 106 and 107 of the Copyright Act establish that fair use is not an infringement of copyright. Fair use is an important provision that ensures First Amendment protection against the statutory monopoly of copyright. Criticism is an explicit paradigmatic fair use under section 107.

(5) Deliberative Process Privilege, Attorney Client Privilege, Attorney Work Product Privilege

Your reckless actions have damaged Cotton Bureau by (a) forcing it to spend money to consult with a lawyer to receive legal assurance that its conduct enjoys clear First Amendment protection, (b) intimidating it and thus chilling Cotton Bureau's speech when it temporarily halted availability of the Resist t-shirt pending legal analysis in the face of your threats (b), Deliberative Process Privilege, Attorney Client Privilege, Attorney Work Product Privilege

Cotton Bureau demands that your company and you expressly withdraw your threats and offe an apology for your unconstitutional and illegal actions by 5:00 pm on March 22, 2017, or you will force Cotton Bureau to evaluate all causes of action and remedies available to it. Any further harassment by your company and you will constitute further, willful, violations of Cotton Bureau's Constitutional rights and interference with its business.

By copy of this communication Cotton Bureau also puts Ms. Beavans on notice of this matter so that she, and the Forest Service, are fully aware of this unconstitutional and illegal conduct in the name of the United States Government.



B.2 BACKGROUND

The USDA Forest Service (USFS) Cooperative Forest Fire Prevention (CFFP) Program is a comprehensive information and education awareness program that uses Smokey Bear as a vehicle for wildfire prevention messages. The program uses a variety of techniques and approaches to stimulate active support and cooperation with other public agencies, educators, business industry, and organizations in working to prevent human caused wildfires. Smokey Bear's prevention messages were introduced in 1944. The Smokey Bear Act, Public Law (PL) 82-359 as amended by PL 93-318 were passed to provide protection for his image and use and allow for the collection of royalties.

The law permits the Secretary of Agriculture to license the commercial use of Smokey Bear and to collect royalties and secure them in a fund to be used only for the prevention of wildfires. That authority is delegated to The USFS who manages the program, in consultation with the Ad Council and the National Association of State Foresters. Commercial licensing ventures must retain the original purpose of the symbol, which is wild fire prevention, and his current message "Only You Can Prevent Wildfires." The image and appearance of all licensee products must meet established guidelines and standards for quality control. This includes review and approval of all artwork, costume, association, context and presentation of the federally protected symbol.

B.3 SCOPE

The purpose of this performance work statement is to manage certain aspects of the commercial licensing of Smokey Bear and his message to increase awareness of human-caused fires through message exposure and to generate royalties for wildfire prevention program initiatives.

B.4 APPLICABLE DOCUMENTS

- (a) Public Law 82-359, the Smokey Bear Act as amended by PL 93-318, protects the image of Smokey Bear and allows for certain commercial uses and for the collection of royalties.
- (b) USDA Forest Service regulation at 36 CFR 271 "Use of 'Smokey Bear' Symbol" provides for the commercial use of the character and name of Smokey Bear. The regulations can be viewed at the Electronic Code of Federal Regulations website: https://www.gpo.gov/fdsys/pkg/CFR-2012-title36-vol2/pdf/CFR-2012-title36-vol2-part271.pdf. Part 271 specifies the conditions for public service, the commercial use of the Smokey Bear symbol and slogans, and establishes conditions for revocation of licenses.
- (c) USFS program policy and guidelines at FSM Chapter 3110 http://www.fs.fed.us/about-agency/regulations-policies, "Cooperative Forest Fire Prevention" and "Wildland Fire Prevention Handbook", Chapter 20, Smokey Bear Program http://www.fs.fed.us/cgi-bin/Directives/get_dirs/fsh?5109.18 governs public

service advertising, Smokey Bear program educational activities, commercial licensing of Smokey Bear name and artwork, image and appearance of Smokey Bear, and Smokey Bear awards program.

(d) Website <u>www.smokeybear.com</u> provides background on the Smokey Bear wildland fire prevention campaigns.

B.5 SUMMARY OF REQUIREMENTS

- (a) The requirements of the commercial licensing for Smokey Bear are to:
 - (i) Work with the USFS in the commercial aspects of the Smokey Bear program.
 - (ii) Manage the licensing vendors, keep applications current, and review new products and opportunities.
 - (iii) Research and promote products that communicate a clear wildfire prevention message.
 - (iv)Protect the image and integrity of Smokey Bear as a wildfire prevention symbol.
 - (v) Encourage private enterprise by providing potential licensees with marketing advice and product placement.
 - (vi)Provide income to the USFS by negotiating royalties with new licensees and ensure existing licensees send their royalties to the USFS; royalties are in turn used for wildfire prevention programs.
 - (vii) Maintain image and appearance of all licensee products within the intent of the Smokey Bear wildfire prevention program.
- (b) Images of Smokey Bear are property of the USFS. The image and appearance of all licensee products must meet established guidelines and standards for quality control. This includes review and approval of all artwork, costumes, associations, context, and presentations of the federally protected symbol by the USFS. Commercial licensing ventures must retain the original purpose of the symbol and its current message: "Only You Can Prevent Wildfires." Initial and Final approval of all proposals, products, and licensing are the responsibility of the USFS, Director of Fire and Aviation Management (FAM). Contractor will present all such requests for approvals from licensees to the USFS within 5 business days. Contractor will ensure that any new artwork of Smokey by a licensee is given to the USFS (licensee waives ownership- see license agreement). Contractor will ensure that any terminated licensee returns all digital or hardcopy images of Smokey. The Contractor shall use the license agreement developed by the USFS.

- (c) The Contractor must maintain a publicly accessible website which contains a current list of all licensed companies and their contact information. The website must also provide information about the licensing program, instructions on how to apply for a license, and license application forms. The Contractor must also provide a secure electronic site that contains all approved images of Smokey Bear; this site cannot be made available to the general public.
- (d) The Contractor must have the computer hardware, software, and telecommunication equipment that is no older than the current USFS software package in order to prepare license agreements and send and receive electronic communications.

B.6 PERFORMANCE:

- (a) The Contractor must proactively market the licensing program to seek potential new licensees and maintain the current licensees through timely renewals. The contractor must also maintain complete, accurate, and up-to-date licensee files by individual licensee. These files are the property of the USFS and must be returned to the USFS at the termination of this contract or at the written request of the USFS.
- appropriate, license the product. The Contractor shall participate in licensing events and conventions, and shall prepare and submit an annual report of their marketing activities and an annual marketing plan to the USFS by September 30 of each year. The Contractor must be or become a member of relevant associations.
 - (1) The Contractor shall address each of the following and demonstrate how each shall be achieved in the annual marketing plan:
 - (i) Reach and penetrate the target markets for children and adults, and actively seek licenses that provide products for those markets.

- (c) In accordance with this task order, the Contractor shall provide a plan for outgoing transition for transitioning work from an active task order to a follow-on contract/order or to a Government entity. Quarterly report inputs (Current Licensee List Report, Licensee Website Update, Licensee Royalty Report, Marketing and Outreach Activities Contact Log, and Unlicensed Products Investigation Report) shall be put in the same quarterly report (e.g. Master Excel Workbook) and are due not later than 45 days after the end of the fiscal quarter to the USFS FAM Contracting Officer Representative (COR). Fiscal quarter(s) end on March 31, June 30, September 30, and December 31 of each year. If COR indicates corrections are needed to the submitted quarterly royalty report, a final and correct quarterly report is due within 60 days of the end of the fiscal quarter.
- (b) Files and Licensee Agreements: The Contractor shall maintain accurate, complete, and up-to-date records/files and shall prepare license agreements and files for each and all licensees who are either renewing or submitting new agreements for approval. - (d) Each license agreement shall have a cover page which includes the Smokey Bear head image; the licensee's name and address, contact name, contact telephone number, contact email address, license number, effective and end dates of contract; a listing of the products authorized by this license; the negotiated royalty percentage; and the approval date. The Contractor will use the current license agreement developed by the USFS.
- (e) Contractor shall prepare and maintain all license agreements and files for licensees who are either renewing or submitting new license agreements for approval. Proposed license agreements shall be submitted, electronically to the USFS for review and approval within 15 working days of submission from the licensee to the Contractor. The Contractor will notify the licensee applicant (with an electronic copy to the USFS) within five (5) business days after receiving approval or disapproval from the USFS.
- (f) Contractor shall maintain an accurate and up-to-date (updated at least quarterly) website with listings of licensees, contact information, and their licensed products so that the public can contact the licensee to buy products. Information about the licensing program will be available, including all necessary forms, on the website. The Contractor must also provide a secure electronic site that contains all approved images of Smokey Bear; this site cannot be made available to the general public.

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(g) The license agreement files maintained by the contractor are the property of the USFS and must be returned to the USFS at the termination of this contract or at the written request of the USFS.

B.8 OUTREACH AND MARKETING

The Contactor shall demonstrate outreach and marketing accomplishments.

- (a) The Contractor shall submit a quarterly contact log (e.g., containing marketing and outreach efforts in the quarterly report due as listed in section B.9
- (b) The Contractor shall forward all proposed potential license products within 15 business days of receipt to the USFS. After receiving approval or denial from the USFS the Contractor shall generate notifications of approval or denial to licensees of proposed products (with an electronic copy to the USFS) within 5 working days of approval or denial.



- (d) The Contractor shall maintain a log of reports, investigations, outcomes, and shall submit a quarterly log in the quarterly report due as listed in section B.9 on any investigations of unlicensed products and the outcome to the USFS.
- (e) Review of Current Licensees: The Contractor shall conduct a review of licensee agreements including approved product lines at regular intervals and submit a quarterly log of Smokey Bear Licensees in the quarterly report due as listed in section B.9 and advise the COR of any necessary remedial actions for any licensee in noncompliance with the royalties.



The US Air Force Office of the Chief Information Security Office (CISO) is under ethics investigation for a number of issues, one of which is trademark and IP appropriation for the marketing of its "Platform One" software and security program. The program is complicated, but essentially Platform One establishes a set of government-approved commercial software products which are then mandated to USAF and DOD contractors, in order to maintain consistency and security. These are commercial software products, and not public or government-created. As a result, the Platform One project helps promote these commercial products by forcing contractors to use them.

To market its Platform One effort, the USAF Office of CISO has appropriated the IP of both Disney/Lucasfilm and the US Forest Service, combining elements of "Baby Yoda" with "Smokey Bear." These images are not only then used in published marketing materials for Platform One, but physical products such as medallions.

The USAF claims "military heritage" as allowing it to appropriate this IP. It's not clear what they mean. Again, however, the usage is not limited to simply airplane nose art, but to promote the sale of actual commercial products packaged under Platform One. The Chief Information Officer of USAF has confirmed it has not paid anything to trademark holders for this usage.

ORDER

DIMMICK, District Judge.

Plaintiff LightHawk, the Environmental Air Force ("LightHawk") is a small environmental organization that has sued the Chief of the United States Forest Service ("Forest Service") in a declaratory judgment action. LightHawk claims that the Forest Service cannot prevent it from publishing a political advertisement featuring a depiction of a chainsaw wielding Smokey Bear. Both parties have moved for summary judgment. As the proposed application of the statute and regulation authorizing the Forest Service to prohibit LightHawk from using Smokey Bear abridges the organization's First Amendment rights, summary judgment must be granted in favor of LightHawk.

BACKGROUND

The background of this case is simple and undisputed. LightHawk ran a political advertisement in several newspapers between May 18 and May 20, 1992. The advertisement criticized the Forest Service's management of public lands, and featured a drawing of Smokey Bear with a chainsaw partially hidden behind his back. Printed below the caricature was the slogan, "Say it ain't so, Smokey." See attached Exhibit A.

On July 6, 1992 F. Dale Robertson, Chief of the Forest Service, sent a letter to LightHawk's Seattle office advising it to stop its unauthorized use of Smokey Bear and indicating that if the use continued LightHawk would be sued for injunctive relief. The Forest Service cited to 16 U.S.C. § 580p 4(a), which reads:

> (a) Whoever, except as provided by rules and regulations issued by the Secretary, manufactures, uses, or reproduces the character "Smokey Bear" or the name "Smokey Bear" or a facsimile or simulation of such

character or name in such a manner as suggests "Smokey Bear" may be enjoined from such manufacture, *1097 use, or reproduction at the suit of the Attorney General upon complaint by the Secretary.

This statute was enacted as part of the Conservation Act of 1974, which added the enforcement mechanism of section 580p 4(a) to the criminal sanctions that were already available to prevent the unauthorized use of Smokey Bear. 18 U.S.C. § 711. The Act also indicates that "the name and character 'Smokey Bear' " were originated by the Forest Service of the United States Department of Agriculture in cooperation with the Association of State Foresters and the Advertising Council. 16 U.S.C. § 580p. Further the "name and character" Smokey Bear are declared to be "the property of the United States." 16 U.S.C. § 580p 1. Congress intended the original passage of the laws regulating use of the image of Smokey Bear to protect the government's interest in Smokey Bear so that the character's value to the campaign against forest fires would not be diminished. See S.Rep. No. 1128, 82nd Cong., 2nd Sess. (1952), reprinted in 1952 U.S.C.C.A.N. 1484 86.

The Forest Service has promulgated regulations to implement the laws protecting the **Smokey Bear** character. The regulation that controls non-commercial uses of **Smokey Bear** reads:

The Chief [of the Forest Service] may authorize the use of **Smokey Bear** for non-commercial educational purposes, without charge, when such use is essentially as a public service, and will, in his judgment, contribute to public information and education concerning the prevention of forest fires. ²

36 C.F.R. § 271.3.

In response to the Forest Service's demand that it stop publishing the **Smokey Bear** advertisement or risk litigation, LightHawk filed this declaratory judgment action claiming that the application of the statute and regulation to the advertisement abridged LightHawk's First Amendment rights. Both sides have moved for summary judgment, and both concede that the facts are undisputed. Thus summary judgment is warranted pursuant to Fed.R.Civ.P. 56 as the Court need only decide a matter of law.

DISCUSSION

The issue before the Court is whether the threatened application of the statute and implementing regulation affecting unauthorized non-commercial uses of the character **Smokey Bear** unconstitutionally abridge LightHawk's First Amendment free speech rights. LightHawk believes that the Forest Service may not limit its non-commercial use of **Smokey Bear** because the limitation is based on the content of LightHawk's message. The Forest Service, however, claims it owns the character **Smokey Bear** just as it owns other forms of property, and that it may prohibit LightHawk from diminishing the value of **Smokey Bear** by putting it to an unauthorized use that does not further the forest fire prevention theme.

A. The Appropriate Level of Scrutiny

The first question to decide in determining if the statute and regulation are unconstitutional *1098 as applied to LightHawk is what level of scrutiny to apply. Should the Court employ the level of scrutiny generally applicable to content based regulations of protected speech, or should the Court use the less stringent standard of scrutiny appropriate for examining commercial speech regulations, and time, place, and manner restrictions of speech?

LightHawk challenges 16 U.S.C. § 580p 4(a) and the implementing regulation, 36 C.F.R. § 271.3 only as they are applied to non-commercial uses. Specifically, LightHawk objects to the Forest Service attempt to limit its use of Smokey Bear in a political advertisement because that limitation as required by statute and regulation is based on the content of the advertisement. The statute prohibits the use of Smokey Bear unless authorized by regulations issued by the Secretary of Agriculture. 16

U.S.C. § 580p 4(a). The relevant regulation in turn allows the use of Smokey Bear for non-commercial purposes only when the Forest Service determines that **Smokey** is being used to express an appropriate message that will "contribute to public information and education concerning the prevention of forest fires." 36 C.F.R. § 271.3.

[1] [2] A statute or regulation that places a burden on speakers due to the content of their speech is "presumptively inconsistent with the First Amendment." Simon & Schuster, Inc. v. Members of New York State Crime Victims Board, 502 U.S. 105, , 112 S.Ct. 501, 508, 116 L.Ed.2d 476, 486 87 (1991). A content based regulation of protected speech is subject to the "most exacting scrutiny," and may be allowed only when the government can show a compelling state interest that is narrowly drawn to serve that interest. Boos v. Barry, 485 U.S. 312, 321, 108 S.Ct. 1157, 1164, 99 L.Ed.2d 333 (1988).

LightHawk urges application of the presumption against content based burdens on protected speech, and application of the most exacting scrutiny to the statute and regulation that the Forest Service threatened to use to stop their use of the character **Smokey Bear**. Indeed, the Supreme Court has applied these standards to find statutes unconstitutional under similar circumstances.

The Supreme Court has ruled that a statute prohibiting the reproduction of United States currency was unconstitutional because the prohibition was content based. Regan v. Time, Inc., 468 U.S. 641, 644, 104 S.Ct. 3262, 3264, 82 L.Ed.2d 487 (1984). In Regan, Time Magazine challenged a statute that imposed criminal liability upon those who printed or reproduced a likeness of United States currency, unless this activity was "printing, publishing, or importation ... of illustrations of ... any ... obligation or other security of the United States ... for philatelic, numismatic, educational, historical, or newsworthy purposes in articles, books, journals, newspapers, or albums." 18 U.S.C. §§ 474, 504; Regan, 468 U.S. at 644, 104 S.Ct. at 3264. The Court found that

[u]nder the statute, one photographic reproduction will be allowed and another disallowed solely because the Government determines that the message being conveyed in the one is newsworthy or educational while the message imparted by the other is not. The permissibility of the photograph is therefore often "dependant solely on the nature of the message being conveyed."

Id. at 648, 104 S.Ct. at 3267 (quoting Carey v. Brown, 447 U.S. 455, 461, 100 S.Ct. 2286, 2290, 65 L.Ed.2d 263 (1980)). The Court accordingly ruled that the statute was unconstitutional because "[r]egulations which permit the Government to discriminate on the basis of the content of the message cannot be tolerated under the First Amendment." Id. 4 The Court did not scrutinize *1099 the statute any further to justify the holding.

However, more recent Supreme Court cases have allowed further scrutiny of such regulations, which can be permitted if the government can "'show that its regulation is necessary to serve a compelling state interest and is narrowly drawn to achieve that end." Simon & Schuster, 502 U.S. at , 112 S.Ct. at 509, 116 L.Ed.2d at 488 (quoting Arkansas Writers' Project, Inc. v. Ragland, 481 U.S. 221, 231, 107 S.Ct. 1722, 1729, 95 L.Ed.2d 209 (1987)). In Simon & Schuster the Court invalidated a New York statute that required any publisher of a criminal's account of his crime to turn over profits from the publication to the State Crime Victims Board. The Court found the statute to be an unacceptable content based regulation of protected speech because the statute applied only to certain works based on the work's subject matter. Id. 502 U.S. at , 112 S.Ct. at 511 12, 116 L.Ed.2d at 491. Although the Court recognized a compelling interest in compensating crime victims, it found the statute was not narrowly tailored to achieve the state's objective. Id.

[3] Analogously, the statute and regulation relied on by the Forest Service to prohibit LightHawk's use of Smokey Bear are clearly content based restrictions of protected speech that are presumptively invalid and subject to the most rigorous scrutiny. First, the Forest Service has threatened to apply the statute and regulation to LightHawk's political advertisement, which as a form of criticism of government policies is on the "highest rung of the hierarchy of First Amendment values." Carey, 447 U.S. at 467, 100 S.Ct. at 2293. The use of a cartoon like caricature of **Smokey Bear** to relay the message does not diminish the value of the speech involved.

> Despite their sometimes caustic nature, from the early cartoon portraying George Washington as

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an ass down to the present day, graphic depictions and satirical cartoons have played a prominent role in public and political debate.... From the viewpoint of history it is clear that our political discourse would have been considerably poorer without them.

Hustler Magazine, Inc. v. Falwell, 485 U.S. 46, 54 55, 108 S.Ct. 876, 881, 99 L.Ed.2d 41 (1988).

Second, the threatened application of the statute and regulation would prevent LightHawk's non-commercial use of **Smokey Bear** unless the Forest Service determined that the message to be conveyed was educational, supported public service, and conveyed the importance of preventing forest fires. 16 U.S.C. § 580p 4(a); 36 C.F.R. § 271.3. While the restriction advances worthy ideals, it is clearly a content based regulation similar to the seemingly innocuous and well-intentioned statute in *Regan* that was intended to discourage counterfeiting. *Regan*, 468 U.S. at 644, 104 S.Ct. at 3264. Thus it would seem that the statute and regulation as applied to LightHawk are presumptively invalid and subject to the highest level of scrutiny.

The Forest Service, however, argues that the prohibition against the use of **Smokey Bear** is not presumptively invalid, and should not be subject to the most exacting level of scrutiny under First Amendment analysis. Because the Forest Service has a legitimate property right in the character **Smokey Bear**, it believes that in order to demonstrate constitutionality it need only show that it has a substantial interest in limiting the use of **Smokey Bear** that is advanced by a prohibition on speech that is no broader than necessary. This standard was articulated in *San Francisco Arts & Athletics, Inc. v. United States Olympic Committee*, 483 U.S. 522, 107 S.Ct. 2971, 97 L.Ed.2d 427 (1987) (hereafter "USOC").

In *USOC* the Supreme Court found a statute that prohibited any unauthorized use of the word Olympic for commercial purposes to be constitutional. The statute in question read:

[A]ny person who uses for the purpose of trade, to induce the sale of any goods or services, or to promote

any theatrical *1100 exhibition, athletic performance, or competition

.

(4) the words "Olympic" ... tending to cause confusion, to cause mistake, to deceive or to falsely suggest a connection with ... any Olympic activity;

shall be subject to suit in a civil action ... for the remedies provided in the [Lanham Trademark] Act.

36 U.S.C. § 380(a).

The United States Olympic Committee ("Olympic Committee") had sued to enjoin a group from promoting a "Gay Olympic Games." The group promoting the Games argued that their use of the word Olympic was intended as a political statement about the status of homosexuals in society. Thus they concluded that the prohibition of their use of the term Olympic violated their First Amendment free expression rights.

The Court rejected this argument. Initially, the Court noted that the statute's regulation of the use of the term Olympic for trade or to induce sales affected only commercial speech. USOC, 483 U.S. at 535, 107 S.Ct. at 2980. Next, the Court explained that although the limits on the use of the term Olympic for promotion of theatrical and athletic events mainly regulated commercial speech, "some uses may go beyond the 'strictly business' context." Id. The Court then concluded that the use of the word Olympic to promote the Gay Olympic Games did not go significantly beyond the strictly business context, but instead affected mostly commercial interests, with only incidental restrictions on expressive speech. Thus the statute was analyzed according to the reduced level of scrutiny applicable to commercial speech. ⁵ *Id.* at 536, 107 S.Ct. at 2981. This test allows that:

A restriction on nonmisleading commercial speech may be justified if the government's interest in the restriction is substantial, directly advances the government's asserted interest, and is no more extensive than necessary to serve the interest.

Id. at 536 n. 16, 107 S.Ct. at 2981 n. 16. The Court also indicated that "purely expressive [non-commercial] uses" of Olympic would probably not be affected by the statute. *Id.* at 536, 107 S.Ct. at 2981. ⁶

Applying this reduced level of scrutiny the Court found that the government had a substantial property interest in protecting the value of the word Olympic, which had been created by the efforts of the Olympic Committee. Further, the Act's incidental restrictions on First Amendment freedoms were held to be no greater than necessary to further the government's substantial interest because the statute was limited to those areas "that would directly impinge *1101 on the [Olympic Committee's] legitimate right to exclusive use." *Id.* at 540, 107 S.Ct. at 2983.

[4] The application of the reduced level of scrutiny in *USOC*, however, does not extend to the facts in the present dispute. Section 580p 4(a) and the implementing regulation 36 C.F.R. § 271.3 do not primarily regulate commercial uses of the character **Smokey Bear** as in *USOC*, with only incidental restrictions on First Amendment protected speech. ⁷ By its terms and as applied to LightHawk's political advertisement the statute regulates all "uses" of **Smokey Bear**, and the regulation specifically prohibits non-commercial uses based on the content of the message in which **Smokey Bear** is employed. ⁸ **Smokey** cannot be used if he does not further the message of forest fire prevention. 36 C.F.R. § 271.3.

Rather than term this a regulatory scheme protecting property that incidently affects free expression, ⁹ the statute and regulation must be read as a restriction on speech intended to protect government property. The application of this content based statute and regulation is thus presumptively invalid, and cannot be tolerated unless the government can demonstrate a compelling interest, that is directly advanced by the statute, and that is narrowly drawn. *Simon & Schuster*, 502 U.S. at

, 112 S.Ct. at 507 08, 116 L.Ed.2d at 486 87; *Boos*, 485 U.S. at 321, 108 S.Ct. at 1164.

B. Application of Most Exacting Scrutiny

[5] Pursuant to the applicable constitutional standard the statute and regulation as applied to LightHawk are presumptively invalid. "Regulations which permit the Government to discriminate on the basis of the content of the message cannot be tolerated under the First Amendment." *Regan*, 468 U.S. at 648 49, 104 S.Ct. at 3267 (citing *Carey*, 447 U.S. at 463, 100 S.Ct. at 2291.)

Moreover, the Forest Service cannot demonstrate a compelling government interest that is narrowly drawn

such that the application of the statute and regulation could pass constitutional muster. As the Supreme Court has said, while "certain state interests may be so compelling that where no adequate alternatives exist a content-based distinction if narrowly drawn would be a permissible way of furthering those objectives, this is not such a case." *Carey*, 447 U.S. at 465, 100 S.Ct. at 2292.

The Forest Service claims a substantial interest "not only in protecting the **Smokey Bear** symbol as government property, but also the message of forest fire prevention which the symbol conveys." The Forest Service's ability to implement its goals is substantially hampered, it claims, when groups like LightHawk "exploit the 'commercial magnetism' " of the symbol **Smokey Bear** thereby undercutting the Forest *1102 Service's efforts to "use, and sell the right to use, the [symbol] in the future, since much of the ... value comes from its limited use." *USOC*, 483 U.S. at 539, 107 S.Ct. at 2982 (citing *Mishawaka Rubber & Wollen Mfg. Co. v. S.S. Kresge Co.*, 316 U.S. 203, 205, 62 S.Ct. 1022, 1024, 86 L.Ed. 1381 (1942)).

Conveying the message of forest fire prevention and maintaining the value of the character Smokey Bear to aid this effort are certainly important, but are not compelling in the context of First Amendment rights. The Forest Service interest in protecting Smokey Bear and spreading its message of forest fire prevention is no more compelling than other governmental interests that the Supreme Court has found lacking as justification for content based regulations. The Court has struck down statutes that furthered government interests in preventing counterfeiting, Regan, 468 U.S. at 656, 104 S.Ct. at 3271, in preventing the use of military uniforms without authorization, Schacht, 398 U.S. at 61, 90 S.Ct. at 1558, and in "preserving the flag as a symbol of nationhood and national unity." Texas v. Johnson, 491 U.S. 397, 407, 109 S.Ct. 2533, 2541, 105 L.Ed.2d 342 (1989).

The Forest Service argues that its ownership of the symbol Smokey Bear strengthens its interest in preventing unauthorized uses. The government has created much of the value of Smokey Bear through its promotional efforts. However, the government's proprietary rights do not change an important interest in protecting the value of Smokey Bear to spread the forest fire prevention theme into a compelling interest under First Amendment analysis. Accepting such an argument could open the door for the passage of other content based regulations

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premised merely on the government's ownership of a particular symbol. Further, the government's ownership of the symbol itself does not define the government interest. Instead, it is the goals that are served through protecting the property interest that must be weighed. The interest in protecting the value of the symbol in order to promote the forest fire prevention theme simply does not justify this content based regulatory scheme.

Moreover, the application of the statute and regulation to LightHawk's political advertisement undermines the importance of the government interest. The use of **Smokey** Bear in political speech and parody is unlikely to diminish the value of **Smokey Bear** for forest fire prevention purposes, and so the government's interest in prohibiting the use of **Smokey** in political speech or parody is only marginal.

The government's property interest in the character Smokey Bear is analogous to, but admittedly broader than, that of an owner of a trademark. Under trademark law courts have uniformly ruled that non-commercial parodies and satires do not infringe legitimate trademarks because there is little chance of confusion as to sponsorship. Cliffs Notes, Inc. v. Bantam Doubleday Dell Pub. Group, 886 F.2d 490, 496 (2d Cir.1989) (court found it "hardly likely" that purchaser might mistakenly think Cliffs Notes produced Spy Notes parody).

More notably, a district court has refused to apply the statute at issue in *USOC* to prohibit the use of the term Olympic in a political poster protesting construction of a prison at the Lake Placid Olympic Village site. The court stated:

> [T]he poster is not likely to be viewed as a commercial advertisement, [and] there is no danger that it will induce anyone to associate the word "Olympic" or the Olympic symbols with any goods or services not provided, sponsored or endorsed by the U.S.O.C. Nor does it appear likely that it will induce viewers to associate them with S.T.O.P. or its constituent members in such a way that it weakens their propensity to bring to mind the Olympic games

or the U.S.O.C. Accordingly, the Court declines to find that plaintiff's poster has a diluting effect on defendant's marks.

S. T. O.P., 489 F. Supp. at 1123. Applying a similar statute that protected the Girl Scouts another court has held that while Congress granted rights in the Girl Scouts to the emblems, badges, and designating marks of the group, the right did not "protect *1103 it inviolable from the lampooning use of its name, motto and insignia." Girl Scouts of the United States v. Personality Posters Mfg. Co., 304 F.Supp. 1228, 1232 (S.D.N.Y.1969). Similarly, the satirical use of **Smokey Bear** to criticize Forest Service management techniques is unlikely to cause confusion or to dilute the value of **Smokey Bear** to help prevent forest fires. Thus the Forest Service cannot have a compelling interest in prohibiting such use.

While not necessary to the Court's ruling it is also worth noting that because LightHawk's use of the symbol is unlikely to diminish its value the statute and regulation are not sufficiently narrowly drawn. As the Forest Service stated in its brief, "[T]he use of Smokey Bear ... in the form of a satirical cartoon ... is not fatal to the Smokey Bear regulatory scheme because it is not likely to cause anyone to view that use of **Smokey Bear** in such a way that it 'weakens their propensity to bring to mind' the message of forest fire prevention." See S.T.O.P., 489 F.Supp. at 1123; Girl Scouts, 304 F.Supp. at 1231. The statute and regulation could certainly have been more narrowly drawn so that the Forest Service could prohibit only those uses that would have a high propensity to weaken the value of the symbol.

Alternatively, the statute and regulation could have been written to prohibit only unauthorized commercial uses. While the application of the regulatory scheme to commercial uses is not before the Court, it appears likely under USOC that those provisions would be held valid. The statute and regulation, however, go too far by prohibiting all uses, whether commercial, or noncommercial and purely expressive.

C. Facial Challenge

Having found that 16 U.S.C. § 580p 4(a) and 36 C.F.R. § 271.3 are unconstitutional as applied

to LightHawk, the remaining question is whether the Court should rule the statute and regulation facially unconstitutional. LightHawk argues in its motion for summary judgment that because the statute and regulation require the Forest Service to differentiate among protected uses of Smokey Bear based on the content of the message the statute and regulation are facially unconstitutional. The argument as framed by LightHawk depends on a finding that the statute and regulation are "unconstitutional in every conceivable application." Members of the City Council v. Taxpayers for Vincent, 466 U.S. 789, 796, 104 S.Ct. 2118, 2124, 80 L.Ed.2d 772 (1984).

As no determination has been made as to the constitutionality of the application of 16 U.S.C. § 580p 4(a) to commercial uses, the Court cannot find that the statute is unconstitutional in every conceivable application. It may be that the statute as applied to commercial uses falls within the ambit of constitutionally allowable regulations. In addition, while it is tempting, the Court declines to rule that because 36 C.F.R. § 271.3 explicitly limits only non-commercial uses it is facially invalid. It is conceivable that some non-commercial uses of Smokey Bear would not be eligible for the same level of protection as LightHawk's purely expressive use. The Court will not delve into the gray area of future attempts by the Forest Service to protect its legitimate property interest in the symbol, especially when the parties have not briefed the issue.

[8] Further, while LightHawk has not demonstrated that the regulatory scheme would be unconstitutional in all applications, it might be susceptible to an overbreadth challenge because it burdens a substantial amount of protected activity. However, "[a]pplication of the overbreadth doctrine in this manner is, manifestly, strong medicine. It has been employed by the Court sparingly and only as a last resort." Broadrick v. Oklahoma, 413 U.S. 601, 613, 93 S.Ct. 2908, 2916, 37 L.Ed.2d 830 (1973). As LightHawk did not raise the overbreadth issue, it will not be considered. The Court will not embark on its own examination of possible overbreadth without any argument in the record to support, or to refute such a claim.

By ruling that the 16 U.S.C. § 580p 4(a) and 36 C.F.R. § 271.3 are unconstitutional *1104 as applied to LightHawk the Court by no means intends to create an open season on **Smokey Bear**. While the question is not before the Court the government can likely regulate commercial uses of **Smokey Bear** as allowed by *USOC*. Those portions of the regulatory scheme addressing solely commercial uses remain intact. However, the statute and regulation, which impose content based restrictions on non-commercial uses, cannot be applied to LightHawk's purely expressive political speech.

THEREFORE, the summary judgment motion of plaintiff LightHawk, the Environmental Air Force is GRANTED, and the summary judgment motion of defendant, the Forest Service is DENIED. The Court DECLARES that 16 U.S.C. § 580p 4(a) and 36 C.F.R. § 271.3 are unconstitutional as applied to LightHawk's non-commercial use of Smokey Bear. The Clerk of the Court is directed to enter judgment so stating, and judgment ENJOINING the Forest Service from enforcing the provisions of 16 U.S.C. § 580p 4(a) or 36 C.F.R. § 271.3 against LightHawk for its use of Smokey Bear in the political advertisement at issue in this case.

Footnotes

1 Section 711 reads:

> Whoever, except as authorized under rules and regulations issued by the Secretary of Agriculture after consultation with the Association of State Foresters and the Advertising Council, knowingly and for profit manufactures, reproduces, or uses the character "Smokey Bear" ... shall be fined not more than \$250 or imprisoned not more than six months, or both.

- 2 Authorization to use Smokey Bear for "commercial" purposes may also be granted so long as the Chief of the Forest Service determines the use "contributes to public information concerning the prevention of forest fires," and the user is required to pay a "use or royalty charge." 36 C.F.R. § 271.4. Royalty fees generated from these licenses are deposited into a special account "furthering the nation-wide forest-fire prevention campaign." 16 U.S.C. § 580p-2.
- 3 In its motion for summary judgment LightHawk also claims that the statute and regulation prohibiting unauthorized noncommercial uses of **Smokey Bear** are facially unconstitutional. The Court will initially address the "as applied" challenge, and will then consider whether any portions of the statute and regulation at issue should be declared facially invalid.
- 4 Schacht v. United States, 398 U.S. 58, 62–3, 90 S.Ct. 1555, 1558–59, 26 L.Ed.2d 44 (1970), is also cited by LightHawk in support of its argument. The Court held unconstitutional a statute that prohibited the wearing of military uniforms without authority, unless an actor wore a uniform in a dramatic portrayal that did not "tend to discredit" the military. The Court read this as an unconstitutional limitation of the wearing of a uniform based on the content of the speech conveyed by the person wearing the uniform.
- 5 The Court also indicated that it would be applying the test for time, place, and manner restrictions enunciated in United States v. O'Brien, 391 U.S. 367, 376, 88 S.Ct. 1673, 1678, 20 L.Ed.2d 672 (1968), because it found this test to be

"substantially similar" in application to the commercial speech test. *USOC*, 483 U.S. at 537 n. 16, 107 S.Ct. at 2981 n. 16. Under the *O'Brien* test, the Court in *USOC* asked "whether the incidental restrictions on First Amendment freedoms [were] greater than necessary to further a substantial governmental interest." *Id.* at 537, 107 S.Ct. at 2981. The *O'Brien* test is applied to regulations of conduct that combine speech and non-speech elements. Such a regulation on conduct is allowable if:

it furthers an important or substantial governmental interest; if the governmental interest is unrelated to the suppression of free expression; and if the incidental restriction on alleged First Amendment freedoms is no greater than is essential to the furtherance of that interest.

O'Brien, 391 U.S. at 377, 88 S.Ct. at 1679. The use of the O'Brien test demonstrates the inappropriateness of applying the lower level of scrutiny to the **Smokey Bear** statute and regulation. The **Smokey Bear** regulatory scheme would not be covered by the O'Brien test because the Forest Service interest is directly related to the suppression of free expression. The statute and regulation were intended to prohibit the use of **Smokey Bear** to express any message other than the importance of preventing forest fires.

- The Court cited a district court ruling that the statute restricting use of the term Olympic did not apply to a purely expressive poster expressing opposition to a plan to convert the Lake Placid Olympic Village into a prison. Stop Olympic Prison v. United States Olympic Committee, 489 F.Supp. 1112, 1118–21 (S.D.N.Y.1980) (S.T.O.P.).
- The Forest Service argues that because the Court in *USOC* cited the statutory protection afforded **Smokey Bear** when it noted that a statutory grant of "exclusive use of distinctive words and symbols by Congress is not unique," the lower standard of scrutiny should also be applied to the **Smokey Bear** statute and regulation. *USOC*, 483 U.S. at 532 n. 8, 107 S.Ct. at 2979 n. 8. However, the Court in *USOC* cited only the criminal penalty arm of the statutory enforcement scheme, 18 U.S.C. § 711, which applies only to "for profit" uses of **Smokey Bear** and not to non-commercial uses like that at issue in the present action.
- The Forest Service also argues that the advertisement is not purely expressive speech, but is actually a form of commercial speech because it contains an invitation for interested persons to contact the LightHawk organization. This invitation does not alter the expressive nature of the ad. When viewed in its entirety it is clear that the primary purpose of the advertisement is to express a political view. The invitation for interested people to associate with LightHawk is not prominently displayed, does not solicit membership fees or donations, and does not contain any other element that would impart commercial intentions.
- The Forest Service seeks to classify the regulatory scheme as a protection of property, arguing that it has just as much right to prevent the destruction of government property like an Army Jeep, as it does to prevent the diminution of the value of Smokey Bear. This analogy is incomplete. Protecting Smokey Bear depends on the content of the message the symbol is used to convey, while protecting the Jeep is "unrelated to the suppression of free expression." O'Brien, 391 U.S. at 377, 88 S.Ct. at 1679.
