Re: FEMA 2021-FEFO-00343 Final Response

This is the final response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request to the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) dated and received in this office on February 8, 2021 and amended on June 21, 2021. You are seeking:

- 1. A copy of each of the after-action reports, investigations (or equivalent) from the September 2, 2013 false alarm of the Emergency Alert System (EAS), which is managed by FEMA. On that date, residents in Suffolk County, New York were instructed to initiate an emergency evacuation.
- 2. Copies of the after-action reports, investigations, etc. from the 2005 false alarm EAS instructing evacuation from the State of Connecticut.
- 3. On June 21, 2021 you amended your request to include the September 2016 false alarm of the Emergency Alert System (EAS) to Suffolk County, New York.

We conducted a search of FEMA's Region National Continuity Programs Directorate (NCP) for documents responsive to your request. The search produced a total of 453 pages. Of those pages, I have determined that 254 pages of the records are releasable in their entirety, and 192 pages are partially releasable, pursuant to Title 5 U.S.C. §552(b)(6), FOIA Exemption 6.

The remaining seven (7) pages were referred to the National Atmospheric and Oceanic Administration (NOAA) and the Defense Information Systems Agency (DISA) in full.

FOIA Exemption 6 exempts from disclosure of personnel or medical files and similar files the release of which would cause a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. This requires a balancing of the public's right to disclosure against the individual's right to privacy. The privacy interests of the individuals in the records you have requested outweigh any minimal public interest in disclosure of the information. Any private interest you may have in that information does not factor into the aforementioned balancing test.

We had no direct involvement and have no records pertaining to the 2005 or the 2013 events. All requested records pertaining to the 2016 event were located.

Twelve pages are referred to the NOAA and ten pages to DISA for direct response to you.

Jesse,

Following discussion between Suffolk County, NY DHSES, AlticeUSA cable, and NYS Broadcasters we would like to substitute an IPAWS generated CAP RMT for the monthly test message scheduled for Thursday, May 4th at 10:55 AM. We propose to coordinate this CAP RMT with AlticeUSA so that they may observe and document how their equipment performs and responds to CAP messages. This change should not negatively affect any broadcast or cable operation serving the Long Island EAS operational area. If a station does not retrieve the RMT from IPAWS it should still receive it according to the EAS monitoring plan. In the specific case of Altice we will arrange for them to temporarily disconnect their EAS monitor receiver(s) to ensure that the RMT is initially received via IPAWS.

This is one of those rare occasions when you are asked to help by doing nothing: Don't originate the RMT, just sit back and watch it happen. We propose to originate the RWT from our IPAWS Lab facility in Indian Head, Maryland, the same facility we used when we originated the National IPAWS/EAS test in September. If you have a standard recorded RMT audio message and can send it to us as a digital audio file we will use that; otherwise we will ask the Lab to provide a suitable audio message. We could send it without audio to see if/how text to speech is working in the field but that's probably one test too many.

Indications are that for customers with Scientific Atlanta set top boxes served by the Altice Riverhead the test message text was truncated.

The full message text as originated through IPAWS was as follows:

"This is a Required Monthly test of the Long Island Operational Area Emergency Alert System. This is only a test. Broadcast and cable operators in your area have developed this system in voluntary cooperation with FEMA, the FCC and local authorities to keep you informed in the event of an emergency. If this had been an actual emergency an official message would have followed the alert tone.

This concludes this Required Monthly test of the Emergency Alert System."

It is an FCC requirement to initially display this EAS header derived text:

"Civil Authorities have issued a Required Monthly Test for the following New York counties of Nassau and Suffolk. Effective until May 04 – 12:55 PM EDT."

Greg Miniutti's video (attached) shows that the message scroll was truncated in the second sentence of the full message text:

"Civil Authorities have issued a Required Monthly Test for the following New York counties of Nassau and Suffolk. Effective until May 04-12:55 PM EDT. This is a Required Monthly test of the Long Island Operational Area Emergency Alert System. This is only a "

This is similar to the reported performance during the Suffolk EVI last summer. I have not had an opportunity for a follow up conversation with Altice cable. I suspect that their technical people are combing their head ends for differences between the Riverhead head end and the other locations which reportedly did not exhibit similar message truncation issues.

We extended an offer for our IPAWS Lab to work with Altice by having Altice point their EAS device at the Lab's Test and Demo IPAWS environment. If they were to do that the Lab can create a test message specifically designed for Altice to receive and process without interrupting programming for other EAS Participants in the Nassau/Suffolk county area.



Following discussion between Suffolk County, NY DHSES, AlticeUSA cable, and NYS Broadcasters we would like to substitute an IPAWS generated CAP RMT for the monthly test message scheduled for Thursday, May 4th at 10:55 AM. We propose to coordinate this CAP RMT with AlticeUSA so that they may observe and document how their equipment performs and responds to CAP messages. This change should not negatively affect any broadcast or cable operation serving the Long Island EAS operational area. If a station does not retrieve the RMT from IPAWS it should still receive it according to the EAS monitoring plan. In the specific case of Altice we will arrange for them to temporarily disconnect their EAS monitor receiver(s) to ensure that the RMT is initially received via IPAWS.

This is one of those rare occasions when you are asked to help by doing nothing: Don't originate the RMT, just sit back and watch it happen. We propose to originate the RWT from our IPAWS Lab facility in Indian Head, Maryland, the same facility we used when we originated the National IPAWS/EAS test in September. If you have a standard recorded RMT audio message and can send it to us as a digital audio file we will use that; otherwise we will ask the Lab to provide a suitable audio message. We could send it without audio to see if/how text to speech is working in the field but that's probably one test too many.

You may want to confirm this with Tom Ray and/or David Donovan (copied) and get back to me.

From the comments from the various Altice head-end techs on the conference call I assume that your location is served by the Riverhead head-end where the tech reported issues with the way SA (Scientific Atlanta) set-top boxes handled the message text. I suspect that their technical people are combing their head ends for differences between the Riverhead head end and the other locations which reportedly did not exhibit similar message truncation issues.

We extended an offer for our IPAWS Lab to work with Altice by having Altice point their EAS device at the Lab's Test and Demo IPAWS environment. If they were to do that the Lab can create a test message specifically designed for Altice to receive and process without interrupting programming for other EAS Participants in the Nassau/Suffolk county area.





The settings file you sent me has both verify and require checked in the IPAWS CAP server definition. If that ENDEC received an alert with a cert chain that included an expired cert, it would have been rejected and would not appear in the main log.

It would appear in the tools/logs/ipaws log page similar to this (time in utc):

And would count up the bad signature counter on the tools/stats/ipaws page.

Jesse,

Following discussion between Suffolk County, NY DHSES, AlticeUSA cable, and NYS Broadcasters we would like to substitute an IPAWS generated CAP RMT for the monthly test message scheduled for Thursday, May 4th at 10:55 AM. We propose to coordinate this CAP RMT with AlticeUSA so that they may observe and document how their equipment performs and responds to CAP messages. This change should not negatively affect any broadcast or cable operation serving the Long Island EAS operational area. If a station does not retrieve the RMT from IPAWS it should still receive it according to the EAS monitoring plan. In the specific case of Altice we will arrange for them to temporarily disconnect their EAS monitor receiver(s) to ensure that the RMT is initially received via IPAWS.

This is one of those rare occasions when you are asked to help by doing nothing: Don't originate the RMT, just sit back and watch it happen. We propose to originate the RWT from our IPAWS Lab facility in Indian Head, Maryland, the same facility we used when we originated the National IPAWS/EAS test in September. If you have a standard recorded RMT audio message and can send it to us as a digital audio file we will use that; otherwise we will ask the Lab to provide a suitable audio message. We could send it

without audio to see if/how text to speech is working in the field but that's probably one test too many.

You may want to confirm this with Tom Ray and/or David Donovan (copied) and get back to me.

The Suffolk Co message did include specific area information. Problem is that due to the way EAS works, the message header information and the opening words in the audio message said "Immediate Evacuation Warning for Suffolk County". A person had to continue to listen and read thru half the smaller message text crawling across the screen to hear/read that the evacuation was only for Fire Island.

We are working to duplicate the message sent with simulator systems at the IPAWS Lab. That will give a more informed view of what people probably saw. But for now, I suspect the message being annunciated (in a machine text to speech voice) and crawling across screen in smaller text said something like: "A Civil Authority has issued an Immediate Evacuation Warning for Suffolk County beginning at 7:10 PM and ending at 3:10 AM. This is an emergency message from Suffolk County Office of Emergency Management. Suffolk County has declared a state of emergency in anticipation of the arrival of Tropical Storm Hermine. Due to the forecast of potentially life-threatening storm surge on Fire Island and other storm conditions we are asking all those on Fire Island to begin a voluntary evacuation beginning immediately. Full medical services have been removed from Fire Island and we are concerned for those with medical conditions. Ferry Service to and from the island may be suspended as early as tomorrow at 1pm due to severe weather so you are urged to make arrangements to leave Fire Island prior to that time."



Q- What happened – how was the system used and/or used incorrectly?

During emergency preparations on Saturday in anticipation of tropical storm Hermine, Suffolk County used an emergency notification system to ask residents on Fire Island to voluntarily evacuate from the island. The emergency notification system used included interfaces to the FEMA IPAWS for the distribution of messages to people via radio and TV as Emergency Alert System (EAS) messages and via cellular phones as Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA).

The message that Suffolk County wrote and sent through the FEMA IPAWS to cellular phones was "Due to the severe weather a voluntary evacuation of Fire Island is ordered by 1pm 9/4/16" and was targeted to the Fire Island and adjacent shore areas shown on map:



The message Suffolk County sent to radio and TV providers included the following text that was intended for announcement on both radio and TV and for display on TV screens with the announcement. The message for distribution by radio and TV was:

"This is an emergency message from Suffolk County Office of Emergency Management. Suffolk County has declared a state of emergency in anticipation of the arrival of Tropical Storm Hermine. Due to the forecast of potentially life-threatening storm surge on Fire Island and other storm conditions we are asking all those on Fire Island to begin a voluntary evacuation beginning immediately.

Full medical services have been removed from Fire Island and we are concerned for those with medical conditions.

Ferry Service to and from the island may be suspended as early as tomorrow at 1pm due to severe weather so you are urged to make arrangements to leave Fire Island prior to that time."

EAS devices at TV stations receive and generate messages sent from local emergency officials using a data encoded in the header of the message.

The message date "event type" used by Suffolk County was "Evacuation Immediate". In accordance with how EAS messages are generated for display on TV, at least one local TV cable system, video service provider, to display the following message on television screens:

"A Civil Authority has issued an Immediate Evacuation Warning for Suffolk County beginning at 7:10 PM and ending at 3:10 AM."

FEMA IPAWS subject matter experts assisted Suffolk County staff after the messages were sent in explain that video service providers (cable and broadcast television) may not display the entire message text include in a message and may only decode a text message from the data encoded in the header of the message.

One of the news stories regarding this incident contains video of a bank of cable tv monitors displaying the text decoded from the message header data in large text in the center of the TV screen while the full Suffolk County message scrolls across the top of the monitor in much smaller text.

The systems all performed as designed and was used correctly except for a misunderstanding in how EAS messages are decoded and displayed on TV screens. Selection of a different message event type likely would have better communicated the voluntary evacuation message. As an example, use of Civil Emergency Message (CEM) or Local Area Emergency (LAE) event code would not have displayed an action on the TV screens allowing for people to consume the full message content for instruction.

Q-How many people received the incomplete message?

FEMA does not have a way to ascertain how many people viewed the message on televisions. The message was likely only "aired" once and within minutes of when Suffolk County sent the message at 8:10 PM, Saturday. (IPAWS has not found evidence or confirmation that any NYC television stations carried the Evacuation Immediate (EVI) EAS messages – only the evidence of a cable system from content in a new clip)

Q- Has this type of incident occurred before?

Very likely, but we do not have any documented cases similar to this incident. Other incidents may have occurred in areas with lower sensitivity.

Q-What is the timeline/actions to correct the issue?

Training, testing, practice and exercise is the initial corrective action that can assist Suffolk County, and others, before the public alert and warning systems are needed again. FEMA IPAWS provided an overview of how Suffolk County can craft a message to appear on TV as intended by the officials during the evening hours of Saturday after the Evacuation Immediate message was sent. Additionally, during the teleconferences on Saturday night during FEMA IPAWS suggested that Suffolk County leverage the services of the FEMA IPAWS Lab and Demo Environment to train and practice for free and with assistance from FEMA IPAWS experts. Testing and Training with the FEMA IPAWS Lab will allow officials to will be more familiar with exactly what sort of public display/announcement is produced on radio, TV, and cellular phones from input to their emergency notification system tools.

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

Wade,

I asked JITC to review the Suffolk County event and offer comments with the documentation and data available. I have edited for clarity and offer three main points for consideration:

- Suffolk needs to train and exercise. I offered that to them along with Region II
- Suffolk used a most urgent warning code, Evacuation Immediately (EVI) for their non-immediate voluntary evacuation message.
- This is another example of the inconsistencies in the television crawl and on screen messages displayed by the various EAS device makers. We have been urging the FCC about this since 2010, even prior to the Nationwide EAS Test of 2011.

The Suffolk Co message did include specific area information. Problem is that due to the way EAS works, the message header information and the opening words in the audio message said "Immediate Evacuation Warning for Suffolk County". A person had to continue to listen and read thru half the smaller message text crawling across the screen to hear/read that the evacuation was only for Fire Island.

We are working to duplicate the message sent with simulator systems at the IPAWS Lab. That will give a more informed view of what people probably saw. But for now, I suspect the message being annunciated

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



There were several things that went wrong for Suffolk County Saturday night. Apparently they may have launched a Code Red enhanced telephone notification with bad information. They did issue and EVI to EAS without realizing what the header derived text would look like. The text content was pretty long and may have been truncated. They followed up with 3 more (!) EVIs with more moderate messages in an attempt to correct the initial impression.

Probably should have gone with CEM to begin with since there was no mandatory evacuation, it was not calling for immediate action, and it did not affect the entire county.



Wade,

A few points to aid in framing the discussion with Suffolk. Region II wants to keep the conversation short. I am hoping the following bullets will help frame the discussion.

- IPAWS staff and Lab observations
- IPAWS, WEA and EAS worked as currently designed could use a few improvements that we are working on with the FCC
- Originator selected an extremely urgent event code: A Local Area Emergency (LAE) or Civil Danger Warning (CDW) may have been more appropriate
- TV EAS on-screen message is inconsistently displayed across EAS devices and TV/Cable participants. FEMA has been urging the FCC to address this (since 2010!)
- EAS text was a bit long:

This is an emergency message from Suffolk County Office of Emergency Management. Suffolk County has declared a state of emergency in anticipation of the arrival of Tropical Storm Hermine. Due to the forecast of potentially life-threatening storm surge on Fire Island and other storm conditions we are asking all those on Fire Island to begin a voluntary evacuation beginning immediately. Full medical services have been removed from Fire Island and we are concerned for those with medical conditions. Ferry Service to and from the island may be suspended as early as tomorrow at 1pm due to severe weather so you are urged to make arrangements to leave Fire Island prior to that time.

I'm not certain what the "text-to-speech" portion was, but, as we all know, it will not send the crawl below county level. The sender has to make sure the EAS TTS or audio message provides further instructions regarding the areas within the county. All is working on the logs and can provide more insight into that.

Suffolk County is using Code Red and may have received poor support from them and very little to no training.

NWC,

First off I need to thank the IPAWS team members for answering my calls and quickly engaging the stakeholders with me. Thanks to the NWC as well.

I just got off the phone with IPAWS rep Manny and the Suffolk County EOC director and staff. Issue is message can't be turned off and the current message is running until 11am, 9/4. Only positive is the message only plays once per device (TV & Cell phone.

(In my limited understanding of IPAWS/EAS)

Here is the IPAWS/EAS issue: Message sent directly from IPAWS/EAS to TV and cell phones worked as advertised. BUT many messages sent from IPAWS, were relayed and only the header info stating County evacuation was received by TVs, not the entire message text.

Suffolk EOC issued two pending corrections but the relay issue may occur again causing the same error tomorrow. There is no way to cancel these messages either.

There is no way with IPAWS/EAS to mitigate this issue.

Here are my AAR suggestions (as a non techie):

Implement a mechanism for IPAWS/EAS admins to end message of shorten duration after launch. Implement mechanism for IPAWS/EAS admins to end message that has been submitted but the start time has begun.

Manual for users needs to clearly state the limitations/issues with message transmission per device.

NWC should have a dedicated IPAWS/EAS POC for emergencies that RWCs can utilize.

Wall Street warms up to radio



Can radio re-kindle its romance with Wall Street?

Asking investors to love it the way they did 10 to 20 years ago may be too much – but an extensive Wells Fargo study suggests Wall Street's now willing to at least look at the sector. One graph shows something surprising – "Radio is the best-performing sector in traditional media in 2016." We're talking about stock prices, not revenues, remember. But the

data from Wells Fargo and Bloomberg shows the "radio index" (a basket of publicly-traded companies) out-performing the TV index and the outdoor index. Radio One is the top-performing radio stock so far this year, with Entercom, Salem, Beasley and even Cumulus out-performing the S&P since January. As Wells Fargo says "Townsquare is the laggard," trailing the S&P. When the focus shifts to actual revenues, the report says "Radio has only slightly under-performed other local ad media," if you exclude the political category. For all of 2016, it's predicting growth of 1% to 2%, aided by political, and "flat to slightly-up core ad sales growth." But for 2017, without political, radio revenues are estimated to be flat to down 1%. The Radio Industry Update from Davis Hebert and Eric Fishel is that "radio's share of advertising is 8%, with a modest decline to 7% through 2019."

What do investors want to see from radio (and what do they worry about)?

Conclusions from the Wells Fargo report – Investors "want to see positive/stable core ad sales." Also "more consistency across station groups," to reassure the Street that radio as a whole is firming up. (Not just specific companies.) The firm sees three factors as "new growth catalysts," and those are NextRadio (the thing some Emmis investors worry they might be shut out of, if the company goes private). Also Events, and Digital/Mobile. Next on the list of "what investors want to see" is "conservative balance sheets." The Street apparently likes Beasley's \$220 million announced acquisition of Greater Media radio, because Wells Fargo cites "consolidation" as a positive – it observes that "M&A has started to pick up." Out of that all those factors should come "more free cash flow." As for the "worry about" column, here are five big ones – Audience fragmentation. Radio's place in the dashboard. The challenging economics of digital. Royalty uncertainty (about radio's use of music). And "excessive leverage." One of the last charts is this – "We believe credit markets are open to conservatively leveraged radio companies," when it comes to needs like re-financings. Analyst Davis Hebert will be presenting at the Wednesday, September 21 "Pillsbury's Broadcast Finance Forecast Leadership Breakfast," at the Radio Show in Nashville.

"\$20 billion in revenue by the year 2022" – or "#20x22."

That's Andrew Curran's way of proposing an ambitious goal for the entire radio industry. On Labor Day, the President/COO of DMR/Interactive published an "open letter to radio," titling it "20 billion by 2022," thus the hashtag. He says "We need to be winning dollars not just from radio stations across the street, but from other media, specifically print, local TV and Pandora." Curran's worried about the PwC forecast of radio "projected to grow just 0.84% per year between 2016 and 2020." He says that sub-1% rate "won't even keep up with inflation." (Curran quotes NFL coach Mike Ditka – "In life, you get what you tolerate.") To Curran, that means radio "must focus on sustainable growth, which means as dollars shift between media each year (more for Facebook, less for print), we need to be winning dollars." iHeart tells Adweek "You can't possibly correctly predict the next big thing..."

Certainly not two years out, says Darren Davis. So the company's strategy is "Don't guess, just go everywhere." Darren's the President of iHeartMedia Network and the online/app-based IHeartRadio, and he says "it's all about ubiquity for our broadcast brands," taking them everywhere possible. They're even looking at virtual reality, says Chief Marketing Officer Gayle Troberman. She says "we're having some very

interesting conversations with some brands about what makes sense in VR. But how do we leverage it

and what can we do with it? We're all just beginning that journey." While she says branded podcasts and custom stations on iHeartRadio are already "a big growth area." To Darren Davis, "Some of these are big integrations and reach a lot of people, some are small and they don't." While marketer Troberman says "the best relationships we have with brands are the brands that tap into us and everage our capabilities across all these platforms." But the execs acknowledge that broadcast radio still generates the lion's share of revenues. Read the Adweek feature about iHeart here.



A Texas judge nixes Townsquare's bid to dismiss a racial discrimination suit.

A federal judge in Austin rules "there are sufficient allegations" to keep alive the suit brought by fired Killeen-Temple personality Charles Rivera. The former personality who identifies as Latino/Hispanic alleges both discrimination and retaliation, and claims that his sales manager asked him to charge the black artists he featured on his show for appearing. That was "despite the fact that this was not typically done to White artists." The suit says he was warned by management to be "careful about having Black people come to the station," and that management told him it didn't want to hear about him "being a victim" and he should "stop complaining about being discriminated against." Rivera was fired by Townsquare in June 2015 for alleged plagiarism. Though the suit says "at least two other similarly-situated, non-minority employees were accused of plagiarism, but were not terminated." Rivera filed with the Civil Rights Division of the Texas Workforce Commission, then sued in federal court (May 11 NOW Newsletter). Rivera's attorneys filed an amended complaint in July – and last week, Judge Sam Sparks denied the Townsquare motion to dismiss.



Threat from storm "Hermine" leads local officials to issue an incomplete EAS message – to "evacuate' part of Long Island.

Note that the messages seen on TV screens and transmitted via automated calls weren't because of something broadcasters did. It was apparently because of local authorities being unfamiliar with part of the Emergency Alert

System added after the devastating storm "Sandy." The full alert was aimed only at Fire Island, along the Long Island Sound, and it was only for a voluntary evacuation. But New York's WPIX-TV says Suffolk County Executive Steve Bellone had to issue a clarification Saturday night. While Staten Island's SILive says only the first part of the intended message was broadcast – about an evacuation order – and that federal authorities are now investigating just what happened.


The Omaha paper's online sports show graduates to KXSP radio/590.

"TBL" – The Bottom Line – is already streaming at Omaha.com, News Channel Nebraska Television and some other sources. But Omaha.com says the midday sports show anchored by Mike'l Severe, a broadcaster who joined the Omaha World-Herald to work on the Spring-2014 launch of "TBL," is being added to a local radio station. World-Herald Publisher Terry Kroeger says "TBL is an important part of

our strategy to reach more people with compelling content, and we're pleased that [Scripps-owned] 590 ESPN' will be part of that." The full Bottom Line runs four hours and they're re-positioning the complete online/streaming version to 10am-2pm, with the noon-2pm hours airing on KXSP. The new arrangement starts tomorrow.

Next Senate FCC oversight hearing to drill in on "concerns about partisanship."

Sure enough, Senate Commerce Committee Chair John Thune officially schedules the rumored Thursday, September 15 hearing (August 25 NOW). The Committee says "the hearing will have broad scope covering every aspect of the agency, and major policy issues before the Commission." This could be rough. Republican Chairman Thune certainly isn't happy with Democratic FCC Chair Tom Wheeler, and you can expect Republican Commissioners Ajit Pai and Mike O'Rielly to get plenty of chances to talk about how they've been ignored by the Democratic majority. Thune's setup statement is that "With the FCC considering significant new rules affecting consumer privacy, cable service through set-top boxes, and other issues impacting our economy, effective collaboration and informed decision making at the commission couldn't be more important." This could be Thune's last chance to grill Wheeler – who's probably leaving the FCC in early 2017. Though Wheeler's refusal to even commit to that (and leaving would be the traditional thing to do) is another thing that rankles Republicans in Congress. See the Senate calendar item about next week's oversight hearing here.



NFL opens its 2016-2017 season Thursday night with the Denver Broncos and the Carolina Panthers, the traditional Game One re-match of the Super Bowl teams. Westwood One announces its own teams for various broadcasts – Tom McCarthy and John Sadak will handle the Sunday doubleheaders, with the analyst corps including Mike Holmgren, Jason Taylor, Mike Mayock and Ross Tucker. Scott Graham will do the pre-game/post-game/half-time work. Sunday Night Football will be handled by Kevin Kugler, back for his fourth year for Westwood, and this will be the eighth season for analyst James Lofton, a Hall of Fame player. Monday Night Football is Kevin Harlan and Boom Esiason, and it's Boomer's 17th year in that role (back to before he began co-hosting mornings on CBS Radio's New York "Fan" WFAN-AM/FM). Kurt Warner will split the analyst schedule with Boomer, while Jim Gray takes the pre-game/half-time chores. Thursday Night Football is led by Ian ("EYE-in") Eagle, with Tony Boselli switching off with Coach Mike Holmgren. Westwood has 70 NFL games, including the Super Bowl, three games from London and one from Mexico City (the Oakland Raiders and Houston Texans).




Owner Steve Kingston of Annapolis-market adult alternative WRNR-

FM/103.1 stirs up so much support from listeners over interference from a proposed Baltimore translator move-in, he's pulled his promos off the air. But the onetime Z100/WXRK New York programmer Kingston contends the threat

is serious. He tells the Capital Gazette, the new translator "could affect 30% of our listenership." So WRNR-FM started running promos asking listeners to support the station with an online petition to the FCC – and PD Bob Waugh says "the reaction was overwhelming." So they backed off, for now. The translator was originally licensed to Roxanna, Delaware at 94.3. But under the FCC's AM Revitalization plan, it won permission to move in to Baltimore at 103.1, rebroadcasting Christian teaching WRBS/1230. It's the sister to "95.1 Shine" WRBS-FM, a commercially-operated contemporary Christian station owned by not-for-profit Peter & John. The translator's owned not by Peter & John, but by American FM Associates. It hasn't been lit up yet – but Kingston's primed. He's owned and sold several stations, and has kept WRNR-FM, licensed to Grasonville on Maryland's Eastern Shore.

New "Rising Star" recognition from the MIW (Mentoring and Inspiring Women) in Radio organization stems from last year's death from cancer of Marketron's VP/International Sales Renee Roth. Now Marketron's sponsoring a "Rising Star" award for women in sales management, and the first recipient is Beasley Broadcast Group's Tampa general sales manager Erika Beasley. As usual, the MIW's will gather on the first night of the Fall Radio Show, and this year that's Wednesday, September 21 in Nashville.



"There are a couple of ideas that would go a long way to 'fixing' AM."



Ben Downs, GM of Bryan Broadcasting in Bryan-College Station and a longtime advocate for the AM service, picks up last week's theme about AM and says "One idea I'm pushing is to allow Daytime (class D) AM stations with a translator to get protection for their translator in exchange for turning off their AM. It would require there be no interference complaints against the translator for a couple of years. There are over 800 class D licenses, and I would think a large percentage would choose the 24/7 coverage of their translator over the


daytime-only signal. Taking those 800 or so stations off the AM band would go a long way to cleaning up a lot of interference and noise.

"But the 'deep blue sky' idea," continues Ben Downs, "would be to provide some incentive for stations to convert to full AM Digital. Not the existing hybrid version, but the full digital that the NAB just completed testing. When a station has an FM translator, the AM has enough 'cover' to experiment and try new things like all-digital. In that mode, the signal goes as far as regular AM, and with FM

quality, but without the sideband hash of the current hybrid system on the air now. And all those new car radios pick it up just fine." Got your own opinion about AM revitalization and the AM band's future? Email the Soap Box – Tom@RTK-Media.com.



Cued by the President, Honolulu's rhythmic "Bomb" and "Power" are joined by "The Beat." In other words, iHeart's challenging rhythmic CHRs "102.7 Da Bomb" KDDB (owned by Ohana) and "Power 104.3" KPHW (a onetime Cox station now owned by SummitMedia). iHeart says Friday's kickoff used "a recording of [onetime Hawaii resident] President Obama saying 'Are we ready to go? We got the cue. Alright, drop the Beat." And cued to the station's frequency, the flip occurred at 9:39am Hawaii time on former rhythmic AC "Jamz 93.9" KHJZ. We'll see what kind of marketing budget and plans iHeart has. Market president Chuck Cotton says "We're looking forward to introducing this station to everyone, so watch for 'The Beat on the Street."






In Nashville, a two-translator classic country "Big Legend" joins iHeart's existing country "Big 98" WSIX. The classic country opening must've seemed obvious to iHeart, which also wouldn't mind knocking Cumulus down a peg or two and perhaps helping out WSIX in the rankings. Cumulus has "Nash Icon" WSM-FM/95.5 and "Nash 103.3" WKDF. WSM-FM, leaning slightly older than Nash, has soared to the #3 spot with age 6+ AQH shares in the last two Nielsen PPM

monthlies. While WSIX has remained stuck around tenth place (though ahead of WKDF). So iHeart decided to drop alternative rock "Alt 98.3" on two translators and chase classic country, instead. They're calling it "Big Legend" and these two Nashville-licensed translators achieve about as much they possibly can, running at nice high antenna heights. (Though they overlap a fair amount.) iHeart's imaging the pair using the 98.3 frequency of its own W252CM at 98.3. It's a bit south of town, simulcasting on a translator owned by iHeart's friend EMF, the K-Love Christian broadcasting folks. That's W248BQ at 97.5, a bit north of town. Both are fed by the HD2 signal of iHeart's WNRQ Nashville/105.9. Another thing to watch – the possible impact of "Big Legend" on Ryman Hospitality's classic country-and-more WSM-AM/650.

Saga's fifth "Outlaw" classic country signal is in Clarksville, Tennessee. Here's another example of 2016 translator strategy – Saga re-purposes a translator it already owned, W264CK, turning that into "Outlaw 100.7." That signal had been rebroadcasting Saga's sports "ESPN Clarksville" WKFN at 540. But Saga paid \$30,000 to move in a different translator for WKFN. It's the Morganfield, Kentucky signal now at 104.1 in Clarksville. That liberated 100.7 to go its own way as "Outlaw." It's rebroadcasting the HD3 signal of Saga's "Q108" WCVQ Fort Campbell, Kentucky/107.9. Check out the newest Saga Outlaw, playing "Legends and Young Guns," here. Saga also does the "Outlaw" format"

on what it calls metro signals in Asheville, Des Moines, Jonesboro and Springfield (Illinois).

After a K-Love deal-closing in Boise, the "Kool Oldies" brand migrates to an AM/HD4/translator combo owned by Impact Radio Group. For years "Kool Oldies 95.5" lived on Treasure Valley Broadcasting's KKOO, licensed to Fruitland, Idaho. As Impact CEO/market manager Darrell Calton says, "Randy Williamson and his family dedicated three decades to serving the Treasure Valley with local programming. When Randy made the decision to move on, we were thrilled to be able to bring the Kool Oldies brand over to Impact." Thanks to an intellectual property deal, Kool now lives at KSRV Ontario, Oregon (1380), the HD4 signal of KQBL Emmett, Idaho (101.9) and Boise translator K268CU at 101.5. They're imaging the trimulcast as "Kool Oldies 101.5." And yes – KKOO/95.5 is converting to EMF's contemporary Christian "K-Love." At least temporarily, EMF also owns KKOO's AM sister, Spanish variety hits "Radio Juan" KWEI/1260 licensed to Weiser. That presumably will be spun now that EMF has paid \$600,000 to Treasure Valley Broadcasting (May 13 NOW).



"What I learned about being a general manager" is blogger and Western Kentucky U. educator Dick Taylor's compendium of wisdom – and he doesn't go easy on himself. He advises radio pros to stay curious (as curious as they were in their early days), to get everyone in the organization focused on the same mission (there's a great JFK anecdote about NASA), working in a toxic environment for "a bastard," and the importance of balance (and the toll work can take on a marriage). 


"I tried Apple CarPlay, and so should you." Blogger Steve Goldstein was inspired by Jacapps' Bob Kernen to visit a local Honda dealer, and he found "the connection was seamless" between his phone and the car's dashboard – "It immediately took over the screen in the center stack and identified the CarPlay-compatible apps on my phone, and placed them on screen, eight at a

time." Steve says Apple CarPlay, the technology the company's pushing for adoption by automakers, 'relies heavily on Siri voice commands to keep the driver's eyes on the road and not the iPhone's tiny screen." More from Goldstein's "eye-opening" test drive at his Amplifi Media blog here. One of his conclusions – CarPlay and rival Android Auto constitute "a huge headwind" for AM/FM radio, because 'consumers are gaining an unrestricted ability to listen to audio from many different sources." Another conclusion is about an age-break – Steve's Honda rep said most potential customers above 40 are confused about this subject. But "under 40, connectivity is what sells cars."

FCC's annual regulatory fees are finalized, from the \$620 payable by Class C AMs serving a population of fewer than 25,000 all the way to the top of the card, \$17,175 due from Class B FMs and all the sub-classes of C FMs serving populations of more than six million. (Remember, this year there's a new in-between category of stations between three million and six million.) Attorneys David Oxenford and Kelly Donohue list the fee, containing "some adjustments" made after the first time we

saw the proposed schedule, here.




Trey Radel is returning to a morning radio gig that has perhaps even worse hours than his previous job – serving in Congress. His time on Capitol Hill ended after he pleaded guilty to buying some cocaine from an undercover officer in a DC restaurant. That was a misdemeanor charge and his record's been expunged, after he completed his probation. Until he resigned in 2011 to run for the House, Radel hosted "Daybreak" on Sun Broadcasting's talk "Fox 92.5" WFSX Estero in the Ft. Myers-Naples market, and the Naples News says he's been rehired. Drew Steele left "Daybreak" this Summer to join Salt Lake City's KSL-TV. Trey has been filling in – and Fox 92.5 GM Jim Schwartzel says "Trey's local knowledge stood out." Radel says he's still "a proud member" of the Republican party, but says "I don't feel any obligation whatsoever to give out garbage political talking points, especially Republican talking points."

Jim Pruett and Mark Stevens "helped define morning radio in their decades together in Houston radio," says Houston observer/blogger Mike McGuff. Stevens died in 2011, and now Jim Pruett has passed at 72. McGuff says that in their years on then-Rock 101 KLOL, "they introduced a lot of people to comedy, as teenagers, and a lot of people to sex." He adds that they also "spoke to power, and took on City Hall and did all kinds of things to answer questions that people really wanted to know." Earlier on, Jim and Mark had filled the "Hudson & Harrigan" roles on Houston's KILT. McGuff's working on a documentary about KLOL, and he draws from that (and an interview with then-GM Pat Fant) to say that Pruett worked in Oklahoma City before serving in Vietnam, then got hired at then-KNUZ Houston. He was "Tony Raven" on the Night Flight Show, playing album rock. The Stevens & Pruett era ended on KLOL when Mark Stevens was fired in 2001. Pruett was gone by November 2004, when Clear Channel flipped Rock 101 to a Spanish-language hurban format as "Mega 101." Pruett later opened his own gun shop – as you can see in McGuff's opening photo here. More about Jim Pruett from the Houston Chronicle here. Plans for a public memorial for Jim Pruett are in the works.



Officials: Automated system caused false evacuation alert for Hermine

A countywide evacuation order that crawled ominously — and falsely — across Suffolk television screens Saturday night as Tropical Storm Hermine approached was caused by the federal alert system that automatically generated a summary of the county's warning but cut off the longer message, federal and county officials said Monday.

A spokeswoman for the Federal Emergency Management Agency said its officials are investigating why the message, sent by Suffolk County Fire, Rescue and Emergency Services, was shortened. County officials said they wouldn't use the Emergency Alert System again until they had answers.

Sent from county emergency offices in the basement of a county building in Yaphank, the message that was supposed to appear was for a voluntary evacuation of Fire Island. Instead, what showed up on television screens at 7:40 p.m. on Saturday night read, "Civil Authorities have issued an Evacuation Immediate for the following New York counties: Suffolk. Effective until September 04-07:10 AM EDT. This is an emergency message from." It ended there.

The partial message sparked a flood of 911 calls from concerned residents and agencies, said Greg Miniutti, chief of communication for the Department of Suffolk Fire and Rescue.

"It was controlled chaos," Miniutti said. "The phone was ringing off the hook."

While Bellone's team took to Facebook to correct the alert and the police sent their own messages that county residents didn't need to leave, Miniutti and his team scrambled. They couldn't cancel the message. But they tried to send another.

They guessed a shorter version might go through, rather than the 600-character advisory originally sent. And it did.

About 10 to 15 minutes after the first message, the original warning reappeared with the new message — "UPDATED Message — Voluntary evacuation of Fire Island ONLY by 1 pm Saturday 9/4/16" — tacked onto the end.

Miniutti said the dispatch supervisor who sends the alert typed in the message correctly through the county's Code Red system, which it buys through a vendor to interact with the federal systems, including the Emergency Alert System.

FEMA spokeswoman Lauren Lefebvre said the original message that appeared on television is generated automatically by the computer system. The agency is investigating why the rest of the county's message wasn't broadcast.

"We've formally asked New York State Emergency Management to find out what happened," Suffolk Fire, Rescue and Emergency Services Commissioner Joseph Williams said. "Not to point fingers, but to find out what happened. We want to make sure what happened doesn't happen again."

The county will continue to use other aspects of the federal notification system, which allows it to send messages in other ways, including text messages to mobile phones near specific cell towers — as it did on Saturday night when the voluntary evacuation of Fire Island was enacted.

Lefebvre said she did not know of another instance when an abbreviated automated alert was sent in error. She said the public should continue to pay attention to local officials, newscasts and emergency alerts.

"It's peak hurricane season. Alerts will go out if needed and are critical and contain lifesaving messaging," she said.

Memorandum of Interoperability

For the purpose of Emergency Alerts in Oregon, using the "Federal Emergency Management Agency's" (FEMA) "Common Alerting Protocol" (CAP) and the associated "Wireless Emergency Alert" system (WEA) an agreement is made between the county, the Oregon Emergency Management (OEM) and the State Emergency Communications Committee. (SECC).

As part of the approval process, the County, OEM, and the SECC agree to the following:

EVENT CODES:

The following event codes are approved for used by the SECC. It is only these events that are programmed into the broadcasters and systems EAS decoders. Therefore, it is only these events that will forward. These events are the event codes used by civil authorities;

CODE	EVENT	USE
CEM	Civil Emergency	This is the generic emergency code issued by both counties and the state.
EVI	Evacuation Immediate	Used for Tsunami events, fires, and events that requires the public to relocate.
TOE	911 Outage Emergency	Used when citizens are not able to use 911. Alerts are used to provide an alternate phone number to call.
RMT	Required Monthly test	Used to test the system on a monthly basis. These tests are done by both the state and the counties. They are not sent by WEA.
RWT	Weekly Test	Although not required to be performed by civil authorities, weekly tests are very helpful to determine the function ability of EAS systems. They are not sent using the WEA
ADR	Administrative message	This event is <i>not</i> broadcast over broadcast and cable systems. However, using CAP to deliver this message it is a method to send text messages or voice messages to all broadcasters to be used as informational purposes. This event is not sent using the WEA.

INTEROPABILITY:

- 1. Using the Common Alerting Protocol through the FEMA server uses a connection through the public internet. It is very likely that in the event of a large disaster, such as earthquakes, tornados, etc. that the public internet becomes unusable due to either damage or excess traffic. This problem would hamper severely the ability for a county to issue an emergency alert.
- 2. As the ability to launch an emergency alert is available through multiple counties, the interoperability memorandum establishes an agreement with all counties with the ability to launch for other counties in the event.

I would appreciate it if you could share any URLs where Suffolk County is walking back their earlier claim that a "Federal Agency" issued the first, overstated alert. I ended up on a late evening conference call with Suffolk County and others on Saturday night. About all I could add was that the EAS was a one and done thing. Of course if you send out two follow-up EAS messages in an effort to "clarify" the situation without understanding that header data determines the initial part of (and in some cases the entire) scrolled message for video service providers you are just making a bad situation worse.

Sorry, IPAWS can't pull it back, we typically process in a second or so and it is gone! The WEA message was reasonable. Suffolk could have issued a cancel to suspend new deliveries of that but like I said it was reasonable. When I saw the string of three EAS messages all I could do was shake my head.

"We even called Code Red to make sure we were structuring the message correctly." Hmm, got good advice there; didn't ya?

That pretty well sums up the FEMA irritation factors from this.

I have to go back and scrub video captures to see if any NYC TV stations carried one or more of the EVIs. I've got yard work to do.

Originally local officials said FEMA caused this error. Now they are (rightly) backtracking and (wrongly) saying a software glitch caused this error.

I appreciate your passion Sean but I don't think you have a good handle on the emergency management arena. Some day when it's an actual "professional" field the lessons learned database or additional training and monitoring would be welcomed. It's a roadblock I've run into with tornado siren policies. "We don't need any outsiders telling us what that mumbo social science data shows - this is how we've always don't it and we aren't going to change."

Sadly seeing a professional emergency management field is probably decades away because the public doesn't really care.

Suffolk County, NY didn't understand how EAS, WEA and IPAWS work, and wanted to notify tourists on fire island about a voluntary evacuation. It had trouble using the system, and now has a media problem.

This is a great example of non-warning "emergency government information."

In the west, EMAs have been using EVI for voluntary evacuations for wildfires, instead of using the FRW with a more detailed explanation about what areas and a voluntary evactuation. That use of EVI has caused some public confusion also when messages leak through other warning channels.

The non-specific action codes Immediate Evacuation (EVI)and Shelter-in-Place (SPW)are best used for immediate and extreme warnings, and not for voluntary advisaries. Its better to use more specific hazard event codes, or the general purpose CEM or LAE for voluntary advisories.

It would be even better to have an official advisory government information, because EMAs often think there is something really important but isn't an actual emergency. Then broadcasters could safely leave EVI set for automatic, immediate broadcast, and handle less less immediate, less extreme advisories differently. While EMAs used other IPAWS channels such as WEA and computer users. Even when you don't intend to send an alert via a particular warning channel, its always a good idea to put information in all the fields just in case.

The challenge is EAS, WEA and IPAWS are now integrated systems. And understanding the relationships and impact on all the systems isn't always well-understood by the emergency officials using them and definitly not by the public.

It would be awsome if there was some forum available that all EAS, WEA and IPAWS participants and users could share lessons learned.

Several of Amanda's questions presuppose

What happened – how was the system used and/or used incorrectly?

Suffolk County incorrectly selected the EVI (Evacuation Immediately) event code for their message. This code automatically caused video service providers to display the following message first (header text):

"A Civil Authority has issued an Immediate Evacuation Warning for Suffolk County beginning at 7:10 PM and ending at 3:10 AM."

Further, Suffolk County did not understand that video service providers may not display the desired message text in the same format as the header text. One of the news stories regarding this incident contains video of a bank of cable tv monitors displaying header text center screen while the full message text scrolls across the top of the monitors in smaller text.

The issue with the event code selection is that they did not intend to issue an evacuation order, it was not intended for immediate action and they did not intend to target the entire county. Overall the selection

of EVI was not appropriate. Any of the following event codes approved for use by Suffolk County may have been more appropriate:

How many people received the incomplete message?

We have no way to track how many viewers we viewing cable television at the time the messages were displayed. Thus far I have not found evidence that any NYC television stations carried the EVI EAS messages.

Has this type of incident occurred before?

There are no documented cases similar to this incident although this probably has occurred before in an area with lower sensitivities than the New York Metro.

What is the timeline/actions to correct the issue?

The primary means of "correction" is training. Not only for the Suffolk County emergency services personnel but also for representatives of Code Red, the CAP authoring tool vendor, who provided active guidance during the process of generating the alert.

What are we doing to support the county in training, etc. to ensure it doesn't happen again?

Saturday night during our conference call with Suffolk County Manny suggested that Suffolk County schedule time to train against the JITC IPAWS Demo Environment so that they will be more familiar with exactly what sort of public display may be produced from input from their Code Red alerting tool.

The sender has to make sure the EAS TTS or audio message provides further instructions regarding the areas within the county. All is working on the logs and can provide more insight into that.

Suffolk County is using Code Red and may have received poor support from them and very little to no training.

There is nothing we can do once the message is sent. Suffolk attempted to correct the original message by sending "updated" messages. This caused more alerts to go out at the county level.

I offered to follow up with Suffolk to get them to understand the system better.

Mark,

I believe that the problem centers on how the cable system displayed the EAS message content. It's not the cable system's fault; that's just how there system is configured. Watch the attached news report. You will note that in big letters, center screen they displayed information normally associated with the data header: Originator & Event; I suspect that is part of a vertical scroll as you can see the tail of the truncated detailed message "rrow at 1pm due to severe w" disappearing at the top of the screen. You can also make out the full message text scrolling horizontally across the top of the screen in white on red.

This is the best video that I have been able to locate illustrating what happened in Suffolk County. Please note the screen displays at the beginning of the piece. These monitors were apparently all driven by the local cable system which displayed the header data center screen and the detailed message crawl at the top.

The text craw is required to display Originator, Event, Area Affected, Effective Time and End Time; essentially all the stuff normally contained in EAS header data. There's the issue: the event code EVI is "Evacuation Immediate" on the FCC event code list and the Area Affected is the county by reference to CFR 47 Part 11.31. I suppose they could have entered the FIPS code as 836103, where the "8" designates South Central, but nobody has ever used that as far as I know. So you end up with what appears to be an

immediate evacuation for the whole county which is the eastern two thirds of Long Island – something everyone there knows is impossible. They should have used a different event code so the standard EAS header crap was more generic.

As we know there are some notable errors in the statement by the Suffolk County Executive quoted.

You certainly picked a good week to be out of the office. By now you've most likely heard about the Suffolk County's EAS alerts issued in anticipation of the arrival of Tropical Storm Hermine. Here is a sample of the publicity resulting from those alerts:

Officials: Automated system caused false evacuation alert for Hermine

September 5, 2016 By David M. Schwartz david.schwartz@newsday.com

A countywide evacuation order that crawled ominously — and falsely — across Suffolk television screens Saturday night as Tropical Storm Hermine approached was caused by the federal alert system that automatically generated a summary of the county's warning but cut off the longer message, federal and county officials said Monday.

A spokeswoman for the Federal Emergency Management Agency said its officials are investigating why the message, sent by Suffolk County Fire, Rescue and Emergency Services, was shortened. County officials said they wouldn't use the Emergency Alert System again until they had answers.

Sent from county emergency offices in the basement of a county building in Yaphank, the message that was supposed to appear was for a voluntary evacuation of Fire Island. Instead, what showed up on television screens at 7:40 p.m. on Saturday night read, "Civil Authorities have issued an Evacuation Immediate for the following New York counties: Suffolk. Effective until September 04-07:10 AM EDT. This is an emergency message from." It ended there. The partial message sparked a flood of 911 calls from concerned residents and agencies, said Greg Miniutti, chief of communication for the Department of Suffolk Fire and Rescue. "It was controlled chaos," Miniutti said. "The phone was ringing off the hook."

While Bellone's team took to Facebook to correct the alert and the police sent their own messages that county residents didn't need to leave, Miniutti and his team scrambled. They couldn't cancel the message. But they tried to send another.

They guessed a shorter version might go through, rather than the 600-character advisory originally sent. And it did.

About 10 to 15 minutes after the first message, the original warning reappeared with the new message — "UPDATED Message — Voluntary evacuation of Fire Island ONLY by 1 pm Saturday 9/4/16" — tacked onto the end.

Miniutti said the dispatch supervisor who sends the alert typed in the message correctly through the county's Code Red system, which it buys through a vendor to interact with the federal systems, including the Emergency Alert System.

FEMA spokeswoman Lauren Lefebvre said the original message that appeared on television is generated automatically by the computer system. The agency is investigating why the rest of the county's message wasn't broadcast.

"We've formally asked New York State Emergency Management to find out what happened," Suffolk Fire, Rescue and Emergency Services Commissioner Joseph Williams said. "Not to point fingers, but to find out what happened. We want to make sure what happened doesn't happen again."

The county will continue to use other aspects of the federal notification system, which allows it to send messages in other ways, including text messages to mobile phones near specific cell towers — as it did on Saturday night when the voluntary evacuation of Fire Island was enacted. Lefebvre said she did not know of another instance when an abbreviated automated alert was sent in error. She said the public should continue to pay attention to local officials, newscasts and emergency alerts.

"It's peak hurricane season. Alerts will go out if needed and are critical and contain lifesaving messaging," she said.

What actually occurred is that Suffolk county decided to issue an EVI which produced the "offending" header data related text. They did not furnish an audio file but did include the following description which was broadcast by the LP-1 using TTS following a one hour hold (station policy, allowing a live operator to insert the message) since the station was operating unattended. No television stations broadcast the message as an EAS, some television stations routed the information to their newsrooms for inclusion in the next newscast (WCBS, WLNY). The main cable provider in the county automatically overrode all programming with a text screen featuring the entire message scrolling across the top in a red banner. The main screen displayed header data text as described in the second paragraph of the article above. All indications are that the cable system's EAS equipment performed correctly but people failed to read all the information presented.

EVIs with more moderate messages in an attempt to correct the initial impression.

One unattended LP-1 relayed the alert with a one-hour delay. The cable company may have two EAS systems connected internally because the message seemed to appear using two different display techniques. Observers tend to read only the big print in the middle of a TV screen and ignore the little letters scrolling across the top. And finally, the Suffolk County guy now knows more about how a message is displayed by the cable system than he did before.

You certainly picked a good week to be out of the office. By now you've most likely heard about the Suffolk County's EAS alerts issued in anticipation of the arrival of Tropical Storm Hermine. Here is a sample of the publicity resulting from those alerts:

Officials: Automated system caused false evacuation alert for Hermine

September 5, 2016 By David M. Schwartz david.schwartz@newsday.com

A countywide evacuation order that crawled ominously — and falsely — across Suffolk television screens Saturday night as Tropical Storm Hermine approached was caused by the federal alert system that automatically generated a summary of the county's warning but cut off the longer message, federal and county officials said Monday.

A spokeswoman for the Federal Emergency Management Agency said its officials are investigating why the message, sent by Suffolk County Fire, Rescue and Emergency Services, was shortened. County officials said they wouldn't use the Emergency Alert System again until they had answers.

Sent from county emergency offices in the basement of a county building in Yaphank, the message that was supposed to appear was for a voluntary evacuation of Fire Island. Instead,

what showed up on television screens at 7:40 p.m. on Saturday night read, "Civil Authorities have issued an Evacuation Immediate for the following New York counties: Suffolk. Effective until September 04-07:10 AM EDT. This is an emergency message from." It ended there. The partial message sparked a flood of 911 calls from concerned residents and agencies, said Greg Miniutti, chief of communication for the Department of Suffolk Fire and Rescue. "It was controlled chaos," Miniutti said. "The phone was ringing off the hook."

While Bellone's team took to Facebook to correct the alert and the police sent their own messages that county residents didn't need to leave, Miniutti and his team scrambled. They couldn't cancel the message. But they tried to send another.

They guessed a shorter version might go through, rather than the 600-character advisory originally sent. And it did.

About 10 to 15 minutes after the first message, the original warning reappeared with the new message — "UPDATED Message — Voluntary evacuation of Fire Island ONLY by 1 pm Saturday 9/4/16" — tacked onto the end.

Miniutti said the dispatch supervisor who sends the alert typed in the message correctly through the county's Code Red system, which it buys through a vendor to interact with the federal systems, including the Emergency Alert System.

FEMA spokeswoman Lauren Lefebvre said the original message that appeared on television is generated automatically by the computer system. The agency is investigating why the rest of the county's message wasn't broadcast.

"We've formally asked New York State Emergency Management to find out what happened," Suffolk Fire, Rescue and Emergency Services Commissioner Joseph Williams said. "Not to point fingers, but to find out what happened. We want to make sure what happened doesn't happen again."

The county will continue to use other aspects of the federal notification system, which allows it to send messages in other ways, including text messages to mobile phones near specific cell towers — as it did on Saturday night when the voluntary evacuation of Fire Island was enacted. Lefebvre said she did not know of another instance when an abbreviated automated alert was sent in error. She said the public should continue to pay attention to local officials, newscasts and emergency alerts.

"It's peak hurricane season. Alerts will go out if needed and are critical and contain lifesaving messaging," she said.

What actually occurred is that Suffolk county decided to issue an EVI which produced the "offending" header data related text. They did not furnish an audio file but did include the following description which was broadcast by the LP-1 using TTS following a one hour hold (station policy, allowing a live operator to insert the message) since the station was operating unattended. No television stations broadcast the message as an EAS, some television stations routed the information to their newsrooms for inclusion in the next newscast (WCBS, WLNY). The main cable provider in the county automatically overrode all programming with a text screen featuring the entire message scrolling across the top in a red banner. The main screen displayed header data text as described in the second paragraph of the article above. All indications are that the cable system's EAS equipment performed correctly but people failed to read all the information presented.

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There are some notable errors in the statement by the Suffolk County Executive quoted.

I'm not certain what the "text-to-speech" portion was, but, as we all know, it will not send the crawl below county level. The sender has to make sure the EAS TTS or audio message provides further instructions regarding the areas within the county. All is working on the logs and can provide more insight into that.

Suffolk County is using Code Red and may have received poor support from them and very little to no training.

I believe that the problem centers on how the cable system displayed the EAS message content. It's not the cable system's fault; that's just how there system is configured. Watch the attached news report. You will note that in big letters, center screen they displayed information normally associated with the data header: Originator & Event; I suspect that is part of a vertical scroll as you can see the tail of the truncated detailed message "trow at 1pm due to severe w" disappearing at the top of the screen. You certainly picked a good week to be out of the office. By now you've most likely heard about the Suffolk County's EAS alerts issued in anticipation of the arrival of Tropical Storm Hermine. Here is a sample of the publicity resulting from those alerts:

Officials: Automated system caused false evacuation alert for Hermine

A countywide evacuation order that crawled ominously — and falsely — across Suffolk television screens Saturday night as Tropical Storm Hermine approached was caused by the federal alert system that automatically generated a summary of the county's warning but cut off the longer message, federal and county officials said Monday.

A spokeswoman for the Federal Emergency Management Agency said its officials are investigating why the message, sent by Suffolk County Fire, Rescue and Emergency Services, was shortened. County officials said they wouldn't use the Emergency Alert System again until they had answers.

Sent from county emergency offices in the basement of a county building in Yaphank, the message that was supposed to appear was for a voluntary evacuation of Fire Island. Instead, what showed up on television screens at 7:40 p.m. on Saturday night read, "Civil Authorities have issued an Evacuation Immediate for the following New York counties: Suffolk. Effective until September 04-07:10 AM EDT. This is an emergency message from." It ended there. The partial message sparked a flood of 911 calls from concerned residents and agencies, said Greg Miniutti, chief of communication for the Department of Suffolk Fire and Rescue. "It was controlled chaos," Miniutti said. "The phone was ringing off the hook."

While Bellone's team took to Facebook to correct the alert and the police sent their own messages that county residents didn't need to leave, Miniutti and his team scrambled. They couldn't cancel the message. But they tried to send another.

They guessed a shorter version might go through, rather than the 600-character advisory originally sent. And it did.

About 10 to 15 minutes after the first message, the original warning reappeared with the new message — "UPDATED Message — Voluntary evacuation of Fire Island ONLY by 1 pm Saturday 9/4/16" — tacked onto the end.

Miniutti said the dispatch supervisor who sends the alert typed in the message correctly through the county's Code Red system, which it buys through a vendor to interact with the federal systems, including the Emergency Alert System.

FEMA spokeswoman Lauren Lefebvre said the original message that appeared on television is generated automatically by the computer system. The agency is investigating why the rest of the county's message wasn't broadcast.

"We've formally asked New York State Emergency Management to find out what happened," Suffolk Fire, Rescue and Emergency Services Commissioner Joseph Williams said. "Not to point fingers, but to find out what happened. We want to make sure what happened doesn't happen again."

The county will continue to use other aspects of the federal notification system, which allows it to send messages in other ways, including text messages to mobile phones near specific cell towers — as it did on Saturday night when the voluntary evacuation of Fire Island was enacted. Lefebvre said she did not know of another instance when an abbreviated automated alert was sent in error. She said the public should continue to pay attention to local officials, newscasts and emergency alerts.

"It's peak hurricane season. Alerts will go out if needed and are critical and contain lifesaving messaging," she said.

What actually occurred is that Suffolk county decided to issue an EVI which produced the "offending" header data related text. They did not furnish an audio file but did include the following description which was broadcast by the LP-1 using TTS following a one hour hold (station policy, allowing a live operator to insert the message) since the station was operating unattended. No television stations broadcast the message as an EAS, some television stations routed the information to their newsrooms for inclusion in the next newscast (WCBS, WLNY). The main cable provider in the county automatically overrode all programming with a text screen featuring the entire message scrolling across the top in a red banner. The main screen displayed header data text as described in the second paragraph of the article above. All indications are that the cable system's EAS equipment performed correctly but people failed to read all the information presented.

I'm generally not in a position to be quoted on behalf of FEMA but we've managed to work together to get correct information out.

This is an old story now but here's some additional background:

In the case of Suffolk County EAS and WEA worked properly, the message sent to cell phones was: "Due to the severe weather a voluntary evacuation of Fire Island is ordered by 1pm 9/4/16"

The juxtaposition of "voluntary" and "ordered" in a single message to the public was not optimal.

The biggest problem was selection of EVI "Evacuation Immediate" EAS event code. That produced the featured text on the cable system while the more moderate and accurate text message scrolled across the top of the screen. They probably would have been better off selecting CDW – Civil Danger Warning, CEM – Civil Emergency Message, or LAW – Local Area Emergency.

Well, I've received an education. I'm going to attempt to boil down twenty minutes of conversation with members of our development team into some brief plain English.

The problem with the CAE message sent out Tuesday is that the Description field was not correctly populated. <description > is a REQUIRED CAP element which is used by EAS device text to speech engines in the absence of, or delayed retrieval of an audio file. The Sage EAS devices properly followed protocol by substituting TTS from the Description field when they were unable to retrieve the audio file within a preset time interval.

The EASText element is an OPTIONAL element which may be used to generate a video display crawl.

This may be stuff that you cannot see from the alerting authority side of the CAP authoring tool. Good practice would call for both the Description element and the EASText element to be populated with the same information if it is used.

I've attached a copy of my problem CAP message of the week. This message is properly formed and populated so it is a good example. The issue with this one was that the alerting authority did not realize exactly how the selected Event Code would be displayed by dominant cable system in the county. Big letters saying Evacuation Immediate for a voluntary evacuation before noon tomorrow explained in little scrolling type did not work out well. This message was issued as TTS without any supporting audio file. The EAS boxes converted the contents of the Description element to machine speech. That part and the WEA worked well.

Well, I've received an education. I'm going to attempt to boil down twenty minutes of conversation with members of our development team into some brief plain English.

The problem with the CAE message sent out Tuesday is that the Description field was not correctly populated. <description> is a REQUIRED CAP element which is used by EAS device text to speech engines in the absence of, or delayed retrieval of an audio file. The Sage EAS devices properly followed protocol by substituting TTS from the Description field when they were unable to retrieve the audio file within a preset time interval.

The EASText element is an OPTIONAL element which may be used to generate a video display crawl.

This may be stuff that you cannot see from the alerting authority side of the CAP authoring tool. Good practice would call for both the Description element and the EASText element to be populated with the same information if it is used.

I've attached a copy of my problem CAP message of the week. This message is properly formed and populated so it is a good example. The issue with this one was that the alerting authority did not realize exactly how the selected Event Code would be displayed by dominant cable system in the county. Big letters saying Evacuation Immediate for a voluntary evacuation before noon tomorrow explained in little scrolling type did not work out well. This message was issued as TTS without any supporting audio file. The EAS boxes converted the contents of the Description element to machine speech. That part and the WEA worked well.

Rob,

I would appreciate it if you could share any URLs where Suffolk County is walking back their earlier claim that a "Federal Agency" issued the first, overstated alert. I ended up on a late evening conference call with Suffolk County and others on Saturday night. About all I could add was that the EAS was a one and done thing. Of course if you send out two follow-up EAS messages in an effort to "clarify" the situation without understanding that header data determines the initial part of (and in some cases the entire) scrolled message for video service providers you are just making a bad situation worse.

Sorry, IPAWS can't pull it back, we typically process in a second or so and it is gone! The WEA message was reasonable. Suffolk could have issued a cancel to suspend new deliveries of that but like I said it was reasonable. When I saw the string of three EAS messages all I could do was shake my head.

"We even called Code Red to make sure we were structuring the message correctly." Hmm, got good advice there; didn't ya?

Did you see this early report?

That pretty well sums up the FEMA irritation factors from this.

I have to go back and scrub video captures to see if any NYCTV stations carried one or more of the EVIs. There is always the possibility that the stream capture is ahead of EAS insertion at the studio so that's not a definitive source either. I've decided that's more an "in-shift" task. I've got yard work to do.

Originally local officials said FEMA caused this error. Now they are (rightly) backtracking and (wrongly) saying a software glitch caused this error.

I appreciate your passion Sean but I don't think you have a good handle on the emergency management arena. Some day when it's an actual "professional" field the lessons learned database or additional training and monitoring would be welcomed. It's a roadblock I've run into with tornado siren policies. "We don't need any outsiders telling us what that mumbo social science data shows - this is how we've always don't it and we aren't going to change."

Sadly seeing a professional emergency management field is probably decades away because the public doesn't really care.

On Sep 5, 2016, at 3:43 AM, Sean Donelan (b)(6) adonelan.com> wrote:

Suffolk County, NY didn't understand how EAS, WEA and IPAWS work; and wanted to notify tourists on fire island about a voluntary evacuation. It had trouble using the system, and now has a media problem.

This is a great example of non-warning "emergency government information."

In the west, EMAs have been using EVI for voluntary evacuations for wildfires, instead of using the FRW with a more detailed explanation about what areas and a voluntary evacuation. That use of EVI has caused some public confusion also when messages leak through other warning channels

The non-specific action codes Immediate Evacuation (EVI)and Shelter-in-Place (SPW)are best used for immediate and extreme warnings, and not for voluntary advisaries. Its better to use more specific hazard event codes, or the general purpose CEM or LAE for voluntary advisories.

It would be even better to have an official advisory government information, because EMAs often think there is something really important but isn't an actual emergency. Then broadcasters could safely leave EVI set for automatic, immediate broadcast; and handle less less immediate, less extreme advisories differently. While EMAs used other IPAWS channels such as WEA and computer users. Even when you don't intend to send an alert via a particular warning channel, its always a good idea to put information in all the fields just in case.

The challenge is EAS, WEA and IPAWS are now integrated systems. And understanding the

relationships and impact on all the systems isn't always well-understood by the emergency officials using them and definitly not by the public.

It would be awsome if there was some forum available that all EAS, WEA and IPAWS participants and users could share lessons learned.

Several of Amanda's questions presuppose

What happened – how was the system used and/or used incorrectly?

Suffolk County incorrectly selected the EVI (Evacuation Immediately) event code for their message. This code automatically caused video service providers to display the following message first (header text):

"A Civil Authority has issued an Immediate Evacuation Warning for Suffolk County beginning at 7:10 PM and ending at 3:10 AM."

Further, Suffolk County did not understand that video service providers may not display the desired message text in the same format as the header text. One of the news stories regarding this incident contains video of a bank of cable to monitors displaying header text center screen while the full message text scrolls across the top of the monitors in smaller text.

The issue with the event code selection is that they did not intend to issue an evacuation order, it was not intended for immediate action and they did not intend to target the entire county. Overall the selection of EVI was not appropriate. Any of the following event codes approved for use by Suffolk County may have been more appropriate:

Civil Danger Warning CDW
Civil Emergency Message CEM
Local Area Emergency LAE

How many people received the incomplete message?

We have no way to track how many viewers we viewing cable television at the time the messages were displayed. Thus far I have not found evidence that any NYC television stations carried the EVI EAS messages.

Has this type of incident occurred before?

There are no documented cases similar to this incident although this probably has occurred before in an area with lower sensitivities than the New York Metro.

What is the timeline/actions to correct the issue?

The primary means of "correction" is training. Not only for the Suffolk County emergency services personnel but also for representatives of Code Red, the CAP authoring tool vendor, who provided active guidance during the process of generating the alert.

Several months ago FEMA shared recommended improvements for the EAS device message retrieval process with the FCC; some of these recommended improvement address elements that may have contributed to this issue. Using incident as an example of current process limitations we may have an opportunity to press a renewed discussion of EAS message visual display options with the FCC.

What are we doing to support the county in training, etc. to ensure it doesn't happen again?

Saturday night during a conference call with Suffolk County Manny suggested that Suffolk County schedule time to train against the JITC IPAWS Demo Environment so that they will be more familiar with exactly what sort of public display may be produced from input from their Code Red alerting tool.

Manny may have additional thoughts.

This is the classic issue with jurisdictions trying to send evacuation sub-county messages over EAS. I'm not certain what the "text-to-speech" portion was, but, as we all know, it will not send the crawl below county level. The sender has to make sure the EAS TTS or audio message provides further instructions regarding the areas within the county. All is working on the logs and can provide more insight into that.

Suffolk County is using Code Red and may have received poor support from them and very little to no training.

There is nothing we can do once the message is sent. Suffolk attempted to correct the original message by sending "updated" messages. This caused more alerts to go out at the county level.

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FEMA issues accidental evacuation of Suffolk County as Tropical Storm Hermine looms

SUFFOLK COUNTY, N.Y. — Suffolk County residents were told to pack their bags Saturday evening by an accidental FEMA warning as Tropical Storm Hermine moves towards the tri-state area.

Suffolk County Executive Steve Bellone issued a statement Saturday night regarding an erroneous robocall several residents received.

"An inaccurate phone call went out this evening from a federal emergency management authority to some Suffolk County residents stating that all Suffolk County residents must evacuate. THAT WAS INCORRECT," wrote Bellone.

The evacuation was only supposed to be voluntary and for residents of Fire Island.

Bellone says while the Fire Island evacuation is voluntary, it is "of critical importance that those with medical conditions and certain seniors evacuate as access to doctors and medical assistance may be extremely limited."

A second round of calls has gone out to clarify that Suffolk County is not being evacuated.

ISLIP, N.Y. — Federal officials in New York are investigating an emergency alert system after a mistakenly truncated message about storm system Hermine wrongly advised TV watchers on Long Island of an ordered evacuation, authorities said Sunday.

The Saturday night confusion started after Suffolk County emergency officials used an aspect of the Federal Emergency Management Agency's alert system for the first time since gaining access to it after Superstorm Sandy. They had hoped to advise viewers that a voluntary evacuation had been ordered for Fire Island, a thin strip of land off of Long Island's southern shore and a popular summertime destination.

Instead, somehow only the first part of the message — that an evacuation order had been issued — was broadcast to viewers. That the order was voluntary and only applied to those on Fire Island didn't make it onto TV screens.

"It caused obvious and expected questioning," said Gregory Miniutto, chief of communication for Suffolk County's Department of Fire Rescue.

Lauren Lefebvre, a spokeswoman for the FEMA region that covers New York, said officials are investigating what caused the message to be shortened.

It wasn't immediately clear how many TV viewers saw the wrong alert. Nearly 2 million people live on Long Island, with 1.5 million people in Suffolk County and another roughly 321,000 in Nassau County, census records show.

After county officials realized the misleading alert had been sent to the public around 7:30 p.m. Saturday from FEMA's Integrated Public Alert and Warning System, a clarifying alert was subsequently issued, Miniutto said.

Emergency officials gained access to the FEMA broadcast system after 2012, when Superstorm Sandy caused major devastation, flooding and even deaths across Long Island and throughout New York and New Jersey.

Normally, Suffolk County uses another system that sends out emergency messages and mass notifications through text messages or reverse 911 calls to landlines, Miniutto said. But on Saturday evening officials decided to use the FEMA broadcast

system because most of the people on Fire Island are tourists and visitors who don't have landlines or sign up for emergency alerts on their phones, he said.

Cold War False Alarm - February 20, 1971 Operator at NORAD inserted incorrect tape signifying "Emergency Action Notification" Radio/TV stations begin emergency broadcast announcements standing by for additional attack information for 40 minutes... until the error cleared from the National Emergency Warning Center at Cheyenne Mountain

June 2014... San Luis Obispo Nuclear Power Plant accidentally sounded sirens and sent EAS and a WEA that said "Civil Emergency in this area until 4:10PM PDT Prepare for Action SLO_OES". Authorities quickly sent follow-up message 10 mins later that said "An early warning system siren has sounded in error. There is no emergency"

Sept 2016 – New York's Suffolk County, Long Island, incorrectly appeared to issue a county-wide Evacuate Immediately (EVI) alert by using an inappropriate event code for the situation.

Fall 2017 - . Riverside/San Bernardino County is a single two county IPAWS Common Operation Group (COG). Early last fall they issued a fire warning for a modest (by recent CA standards) brush fire near Riverside. The operator mistakenly selected San Bernardino County as the affected area. SB is a very large county which adjoins Clark County in Nevada. The message was something to the effect of "Brush fire at xxxx and xxxx Riverside" When this appeared on cell handsets near Las Vegas it raised a lot of questions.

January 13, 2018 – Hawaii EMA issued a Civil Emergency Message warning that a ballistic missile attack had been launched against the Hawaiian Islands.

January 23, 2018 – Oregon DOT ran a system test that resulted in an incorrect message being released to the public via ODOT's TripCheck website and social media channels: "I-5, 1 Mi S of I-84, Closed, An air craft crash has occurred, use an alternate route.... Tpck.us/I318844" "We were conducting a test and instead of being private and internal it went public," he said. "And for about four minutes there was an alert out there that there had been a plane crash when, of course, there had not been any plane crash."


February 2018 – National Tsunami Warning Center issued a routine test message for the US Atlantic coast that was misinterpreted by AccuWeather, a third party service, resulting in the third party notifying their subscribers of a Tsunami Warning. There was no IPAWS involvement.

May 2018 – National Tsunami Warning Center issued a routine test message for the US Pacific coast that was misinterpreted by EMnet, a third party service, resulting in transmission via EAS in Alaska. There was no IPAWS involvement.

May 30, 2018 – Oregon OEM issued a joint EAS and WEA message for a possible drinking water contamination problem. The EAS message with referenced audio worked well. They failed to enter a custom 90 character WEA message so this system default message was sent to cell phones: "Civil Emergency in this area until 11:28PM PDT Prepare for Action OEM,1,OR". The initial WEA message was not cancelled but was later followed up 30 minutes later with a new WEA message: "WATER EMERGENCY FOR THE SALEM AREA www.cityofsalem.net for info"

June 29, 2018 – Contra Costa County intended to issue a WEA supporting an immediate evacuation for a wild fire. Their software did not populate the 90 character WEA message field so the following generic LAE message appeared on phones: "Local Area Emergency in this area until 9:02 PM PDT Take Shelter Now CA Contra C". The message they intended to send was: "Immediate Evacuation in Concord near Montecito drive and Crystal Ranch Drive due to fire". They made a second attempt to send the WEA message and failed due to selection of COG to COG restriction. They then sent an EAS LAE twice with the following message for Text to Speech: "Immediate Evacuation in Concord near Montecito drive and Crystal Ranch Drive due to fire. This is a message from Contra Costa Fire Department. Due to fire an immediate evacuation has been ordered for Montecito and Crystal Ranch neighborhoods in Concord. Leave now by car. Avoid Ygnacio Valley Road going towards Walnut Creek. Take only those essential items you have ready and can carry with you. Pets must be in a carrier or on a leash. Lock your windows and doors as you leave. Stay off the phone unless you need to report a life-threatening emergency at your location. However, if you are physically unable to leave your home unassisted, call 9 1 1 for help." The two EAS messages were downloaded 634 and 621 times respectively. Four hours later they issued cancellations for all four IPAWS messages.

July 2, 2018 – Portland OR Bureau of Emergency Communications inadvertently sent a live transmission during testing their EAS origination:



The Portland Oregon area maintains a VHF Local Relay Network (LRN) for EAS activations. During a previously scheduled test they found that there were audio and distortion issues so Kent Randalls, the LECC, worked with the county telecom guys to make adjustments. Yesterday they went to test the LRN intending to send a DMO event code message. The originating equipment is a Sage Endec which they operate from the four button front panel. The operator selected "DMO" but didn't realize that there was another selection behind that menu level. The hidden selection was the "TOE" which is what was transmitted to the LRN.
