**RE:** Freedom of Information Act Request #23-F-00214: a copy of the listing of Office of Inspector General investigations (not audits) closed during calendar years 2021 and 2022, to include fields such as the case number, the date the investigation was closed, the title or subject of the investigation, the category or type of investigation, etc. IF no such listing exists or can be produced from the computer database, then I instead request a copy of the title page and/or cover page for each OIG investigation closed during CY 2021 and 2022.

Thank you for your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request seeking records from the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC). Enclosed is a copy of the records responsive to your request, contained in the Office of the Inspector General's (OIG) files, with certain excisions explained below. Portions of the enclosed records are being withheld pursuant to FOIA Exemptions 6, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(6). CPSC considered the foreseeable harm standard when reviewing these records and applying FOIA exemptions.

*Exemption 6.* FOIA Exemption 6 permits withholding personnel and medical files and similar files, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. Absent authorizations to disclose the records or personally identifying information from the persons identified in the records or their representatives, such information falls within the protection of this FOIA exemption to disclosure and is being withheld accordingly. CPSC redacted individuals' names pursuant to this exemption.

**FOIA Administrative Procedures**

*Right to appeal.* According to the CPSC's regulations implementing the FOIA at 16 C.F.R. § 1015.7, a partial withholding of records may be appealed. If you are not satisfied with the response to this request, you may administratively appeal in writing, addressed to FOIA APPEAL, Office of the General Counsel, ATTN: Division of Information Access, U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, 4330
