This letter is our final response to your FOIA request dated January 25, 2025, for the following:

Copy of each email in the email account of Shellie Zahniser (USGS) between January 20, 2025 and present that contains the word McKinley OR the word Denali OR the word Gulf. A copy of each email in the email account of Chris Hammond (USGS) between January 20, 2025 and present that contains the word McKinley OR the word Denali OR the word Gulf.

On March 17, 2025, we released 107 pages in our first interim response.

In this response, we are releasing one Portable Document Format (PDF) electronic file, consisting of 141 pages, in part. We reasonably foresee that disclosure would harm an interest protected by one or more of the nine exemptions to the FOIA's general rule of disclosure and disclosure would be prohibited by law; therefore, portions of these materials are being withheld under the following FOIA exemptions. Please note that some pages contain redactions pursuant to more than one exemption.

Exemption 3

Exemption 3 allows the withholding of information protected by a nondisclosure provision in a federal statute other than the FOIA. Specifically, disclosure of organizational and personnel information: exemption for specified intelligence agencies, 10 U.S. Code § 424b(3), prohibits the release of the number of persons employed by or assigned or detailed to any such organization or the name, official title, occupational series, grade, or salary of any organization or any function

of, and certain information pertaining to employees of the Defense Intelligence Agency, the National Reconnaissance Office, and the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency. Approximately 15 pages contain redactions per Exemption 3.

Exemption 5

Exemption 5 allows an agency to withhold "inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party ... in litigation with the agency." <u>5 U.S.C.</u> § 552(b)(5). Exemption 5 therefore incorporates the privileges that protect materials from discovery in litigation, including the deliberative process, attorney work-product, attorney-client, and commercial information privileges. Approximately 19 pages contain redactions under Exemption 5 because they qualify to be withheld under the following privileges:

Deliberative Process Privilege

The deliberative process privilege protects the decision-making process of government agencies and encourages the frank exchange of ideas on legal or policy matters by ensuring agencies are not forced to operate in a fishbowl. A number of policy purposes have been attributed to the deliberative process privilege, such as: (1) assuring that subordinates will feel free to provide the decisionmaker with their uninhibited opinions and recommendations; (2) protecting against premature disclosure of proposed policies; and (3) protecting against confusing the issues and misleading the public.

The deliberative process privilege protects materials that are both predecisional and deliberative. The privilege covers records that reflect the give-and-take of the consultative process and may include recommendations, draft documents, proposals, suggestions, and other subjective documents which reflect the personal opinions of the writer rather than the policy of the agency.

The materials that have been withheld under the deliberative process privilege of Exemption 5 are both predecisional and deliberative. They do not contain or represent formal or informal agency policies or decisions. They are the result of frank and open discussions among employees of the Department of the Interior. Their contents have been held confidential by all parties and public dissemination of this information would expose the agency's decision-making process in such a way as to discourage candid discussion within the agency, and thereby undermine its ability to perform its mandated functions.

Attorney-Client Privilege

The attorney-client privilege protects confidential communications between an attorney and his client relating to a legal matter for which the client has sought professional advice and is not limited to the context of litigation. Moreover, although it fundamentally applies to confidential facts divulged by a client to his/her attorney, this privilege also encompasses any opinions given by an attorney to his/her client based upon, and thus reflecting, those facts, as well as communications between attorneys that reflect confidential client-supplied information. The information that has been withheld under the attorney-client privilege of Exemption 5 constitutes confidential communications between federal attorneys and agency clients, related to

legal matters for which the client sought professional legal assistance and services. It also encompasses opinions given by attorneys to their clients based on client-supplied facts about a personnel action. Additionally, the USGS employees who communicated with the attorneys regarding this information were clients of the attorneys at the time the information was generated and the attorneys were acting in their capacities as lawyers at the time they communicated legal advice. The USGS has held this information confidential and has not waived the attorney-client privilege.

Exemption 6

Exemption 6 allows an agency to withhold "personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy." 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(6). The phrase "similar files" covers any agency records containing information about a particular individual that can be identified as applying to that individual. To determine whether releasing records containing information about a particular individual would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, we are required to balance the privacy interest that would be affected by disclosure against any public interest in the information.

Under the FOIA, the only relevant public interest to consider under the exemption is the extent to which the information sought would shed light on agency's performance of its statutory duties or otherwise let citizens "know what their government is up to." The burden is on the requester to establish that disclosure would serve the public interest. When the privacy interest at stake and the public interest in disclosure have been determined, the two competing interests must be weighed against one another to determine which is the greater result of disclosure: the harm to personal privacy or the benefit to the public. The purposes for which the request for information is made do not impact this balancing test, as a release of information requested under the FOIA constitutes a release to the general public.

The information that has been withheld under Exemption 6 consists of personal email addresses, home addresses, mobile phone numbers, names and email addresses of military personnel, names and identifying information of State Department personnel, and other personal matters. We have determined that the individuals to whom the information pertains have a substantial privacy interest in withholding it. Additionally, you have not provided information that explains a relevant public interest under the FOIA in the disclosure of this personal information and we have determined that the disclosure of this information would shed little or no light on the performance of the agency's statutory duties. Because the harm to personal privacy is greater than whatever public interest may be served by disclosure, release of the information would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of the privacy of these individuals and we are withholding the information under Exemption 6. Approximately 55 pages have been redacted under exemption 6.

Judy Cearley, Government Information Specialist, is responsible for this partial denial. Jennifer Heindl, Attorney Advisor with the Department of Interior, Office of the Solicitor, was consulted regarding this response.

Appeal Rights

You may appeal this response to the Department of the Interior's FOIA/Privacy Act Appeals Officer. If you choose to appeal, the FOIA/Privacy Act Appeals Officer must receive your FOIA appeal **no later than 90 workdays** from the date of this letter. Appeals arriving or delivered after 5 p.m. Eastern Time, Monday through Friday, will be deemed received on the next workday.

Your appeal must be made in writing. You may submit your appeal and accompanying materials to the FOIA/Privacy Act Appeals Officer by mail, courier service, fax, or email. All communications concerning your appeal should be clearly marked with the words: "FREEDOM OF INFORMATION APPEAL." You must include an explanation of why you believe the USGS's response is in error. You must also include with your appeal copies of all correspondence between you and USGS concerning your FOIA request, including your original FOIA request and USGS's response. Failure to include with your appeal all correspondence between you and USGS will result in the Department's rejection of your appeal, unless the FOIA/Privacy Act Appeals Officer determines (in the FOIA/Privacy Act Appeals Officer's sole discretion) that good cause exists to accept the defective appeal.

I've provided some basic talking points to OCAP already. We'd prefer that OCAP handle this.

- The Policy on Names Considered or Established by Congress or the President notes that
 "Geographic names and their applications specifically established by an act of Congress
 or Executive order are legally official, and therefore, are not bound by BGN principles,
 policies, and procedures." This includes name changes.
- For any names established by an act of Congress or Executive order (or proclamation), the name is entered into/changed in GNIS once official. Federal data sources are updated from GNIS on their own data refresh cycles.

The other request had some other details but this is the basic information people should know.

The BGN has nothing to do with any naming by Congress or the President.

At this point I am assuming you are all aware of the recent EO "RESTORING NAMES THAT HONOR AMERICAN GREATNESS" that was signed yesterday. We are

waiting for additional DOI guidance and confirmation for the renaming of both Denali->Mount McKinley and Gulf of Mexico-> Gulf of America.

You will also notice the following section in the EO:

Sec. 2. Appointments to the U.S. Board on Geographic Names. (a) Within seven days of the date of this order, each agency head with authority to appoint members to the Board on Geographic Names (Board) pursuant to 43 U.S.C. 364a, shall review their respective appointees and consider replacing those appointees in accordance with applicable law.

I will be pulling together a short informational memo for the Secretary to review to be responsive to this request. As current DOI deputy members, this memo will contain each of your names and biographical information that you provided to the BGN staff during the most recent appointment letter request in June 2023.

Please let me know if you have any concerns or questions. We'll be moving quickly to meet the deadline.

- The Policy on Names Considered or Established by Congress or the President notes that
 "Geographic names and their applications specifically established by an act of Congress
 or Executive order are legally official, and therefore, are not bound by BGN principles,
 policies, and procedures." This includes name changes.
- For any names established by an act of Congress or Executive order (or proclamation), the name is entered into/changed in GNIS once official. Federal data sources are updated from GNIS on their own data refresh cycles.

Additional answers for these kinds of questions:

What's the process for renaming a foreign name or international name like the Gulf of Mexico? Is it solely under the jurisdiction of the BGN and/or can a name change be made through an act of Congress or an executive action?

The <u>Principles</u>, <u>Policies</u>, and <u>Procedures</u> says that "A name proposal for a feature that crosses the international boundary with Canada or Mexico is likely to require additional processing time because the BGN must coordinate such proposals with the appropriate foreign names authority." But this is not a <u>proposal</u> to the BGN, but a statement by the President-Elect that he would change the name.

Once a name change is made by the BGN how is it applied? What changes?

BGN would not make the change if done by Executive action or Congress. GNIS would be updated and other federal data sources that use GNIS would be updated on their own refresh cycles.

Are BGN appointees serving at the discretion of the head of each agency/the president? Are they appointed by the head of each agency/the president?

The BGN bylaws Article II Section 2 states "The Board is comprised of principal members and deputy members. The head of each department and agency represented on the Board shall appoint one principal member and also may designate one or more deputy members."

Good morning,

My apologies for the delay - Federal offices in the US were closed yesterday as a day of mourning for former President Carter.

There are a few things I'd like to mention from the perspective of the US BGN.

1 - My home agency (USGS) has provided guidance that BGN staff (including me) are not to respond at this time to media inquiries. As you might guess, we have received a few questions from high-profile media outlets. But, we are currently not providing a response of any kind.

- 2 The process by which the name would be changed in the US depends on the type of action taken to make the renaming official. Of course, by far the most common method to name or rename a geographic feature is a proposal to the BGN, and allow the deliberative process to run its course. However, The BGN Policy on Names Considered or Established by Congress or the President notes that "Geographic names and their applications specifically established by an act of Congress or Executive order are legally official, and therefore, are not bound by BGN principles, policies, and procedures." This includes name changes. For any names established by an act of Congress or Executive order (or proclamation), the name is entered into/changed in GNIS once official. Federal data sources are updated from GNIS on their own data refresh cycles.
- 3 As of this morning, there is draft legislation to rename the Gulf of Mexico offered in the US House of Representatives (HR 256). I have attached the text which has been released (I believe on social media) by the sponsor, Rep. Taylor-Greene. If this were to pass into law the name would become official. The BGN would not be involved in the decision-making process and our authoritative database (GNIS) would be updated to reflect the new official name. The draft bill also dictates a schedule for update of Federal mapping products.
- 4 As others have stated, I am also unable to offer any additional information on how other national naming authorities would recognize this name change.

Good morning,

My apologies for the delay - Federal offices in the US were closed yesterday as a day of mourning for former President Carter.

There are a few things I'd like to mention from the perspective of the US BGN.

1 - My home agency (USGS) has provided guidance that BGN staff (including me) are not to respond at this time to media inquiries. As you might guess, we have

received a few questions from high-profile media outlets. But, we are currently not providing a response of any kind.

- 2 The process by which the name would be changed in the US depends on the type of action taken to make the renaming official. Of course, by far the most common method to name or rename a geographic feature is a proposal to the BGN, and allow the deliberative process to run its course. However, The BGN Policy on Names Considered or Established by Congress or the President notes that "Geographic names and their applications specifically established by an act of Congress or Executive order are legally official, and therefore, are not bound by BGN principles, policies, and procedures." This includes name changes. For any names established by an act of Congress or Executive order (or proclamation), the name is entered into/changed in GNIS once official. Federal data sources are updated from GNIS on their own data refresh cycles.
- 3 As of this morning, there is draft legislation to rename the Gulf of Mexico offered in the US House of Representatives (HR 256). I have attached the text which has been released (I believe on social media) by the sponsor, Rep. Taylor-Greene. If this were to pass into law the name would become official. The BGN would not be involved in the decision-making process and our authoritative database (GNIS) would be updated to reflect the new official name. The draft bill also dictates a schedule for update of Federal mapping products.
- 4 As others have stated, I am also unable to offer any additional information on how other national naming authorities would recognize this name change.



I. KEY POINTS

The BGN, conjointly with the Secretary of the Interior, is directed to establish and maintain uniform geographic name usage throughout the Federal Government, including solving name discrepancies, approving new names, validating and recording existing names, and promulgating all official names.

The BGN comprises representatives of Federal agencies concerned with geographic information, population, ecology, and management of public lands.

The U.S. Board on Geographic Names follows a set of principles, policies, and procedures approved by the Secretary of the Interior with reference to both domestic and foreign geographic names; and to decide the standard names, orthographies, applications, and their promulgation for official use.

The Geographic Names Information System (GNIS) was established and is maintained by the U.S. Geological Survey in cooperation with the U.S. Board on Geographic Names. It represents the Federal Government's only official repository for identifying official placenames. Its purpose is to have a single efficient source of official placenames for use by all federal agencies so they don't need to maintain their own data sources.

II. OPPORTUNITIES AND CHALLENGES

The BGN is integral in strengthening and maintaining Tribal relations and developing collaborative opportunities that preserve the history and diverse cultures of Tribes. These activities include Tribal consultation, pronunciation of Tribal geographic names for the public, engaging and requesting input on geographic naming proposals, and attending Tribal Historic Preservation Officer meetings.

The BGN offers the public a way to participate in the Federal geographic naming process. With respect to the Domestic Naming Committee, there are currently no limitations on who can participate in proposing new names, and name changes in the U.S.; something that can be both an opportunity, and a challenge and will require additional considerations as policies and procedures are updated. However, the Foreign Names Committee follows much stricter guidelines.

With the accessibility to the BGN via the internet comes greater visibility to a larger audience. Recently, the BGN has been involved with many high-profile cases that has increased the number of media inquiries, Congressional requests, and Freedom of Information Act requests, and inquiries from the public. With minimal staff and greater visibility, the ability to maintain operational tempo has been degraded.

The current design of GNIS does not meet the needs of agencies for a single efficient source of official placenames, requiring agencies to maintain their own data sources.

In addition to GNIS, the Geographic Names Server (GNS) is the central database for foreign geographic names approved for use on Federal products.

The BGN DNC mission is funded through Congressional appropriations allocated to the USGS, which is primarily used maintain GNIS. The annual appropriation is roughly \$900K; this funding supports the Executive Secretary of the Domestic Names Committee, 2 Federal staff, 1 contracted staff, and multiple technical personnel who maintain the GNIS database. Board members are not funded for their service to the BGN.

III. BACKGROUND

The U.S. Board on Geographic Names (BGN) is a Federal body created in 1890 and established in its present form by Public Law in 1947 to maintain uniform geographic name usage throughout the Federal Government.

By law, the BGN is responsible for promulgating all geographic names except those applying to offices or establishments of Federal agencies (Pub. L. 80–242, sec. 1 and 7; 43 U.S.C. 364 and 364f).

Geographic names and their applications specifically established by an act of Congress, Executive order, Treaty, or Federal proclamation are official by law. This does not apply to geographic names used incidentally in the language of documents intended for other purposes.

If not named by an act of Congress or Executive order, federal land units are named by the administering agency under the authority of an act of Congress.

All proposals are evaluated in cooperation with State geographic names authorities and advisors; Federal, State, and Tribal agencies; local governments; other authoritative bodies; and the public. BGN policies, published usage, and State, Tribal, and local governmental needs, will also be taken into consideration.





Dear Members of the Board

I write about the proposal of President Donald J. Trump to rename the Gulf of Mexico to the American Sea and to return the name of Mount Denali to Mount McKinley. I urge the members of the Board of Geographic Names to respect their decisions in naming these geographic features.

On August 30, 2015, Sally Jewell announced that the mountain would be renamed Denali, under authority of federal law which permits her as Secretary of the Interior to name geographic features if the Board on Geographic Names does not act within a "reasonable" period of time.

The International Hydrographic Organization — of which both the United States and Mexico are members — works to ensure all the world's seas, oceans and navigable waters are surveyed and charted uniformly, and also names some of them. There are some instances where countries refer to the same body of water or landmark by different names in their own documentation.

Clearly the incoming Secretary of the Interior has the power to direct the Board of Geographic Names to rename Mount Denali. It does not have the power to instruct the Board to rename the Gulf of Mexico which is in preview of an international organization.

Please respect the decisions the currently accepted names and resist the attempts of the current administration to change them. The rest of the world will continue to use them. Hundreds of thousands of Atlases, digital and physical, will retain them. The acceptance of the changes will only cause confusion and result in the isolation of the United States of America which is perhaps what the President wants.

Dear Members of the U.S. Board on Geographic Names:

I am writing to express my opposition to the presidential directive to rename the "Gulf of Mexico" to the "Gulf of America" on several grounds:

- 1. Cost. The cost of reprinting operational mapping products that include place names (e.g. operational navigation charts) will be prohibitive and will come out of budgets that would otherwise be used for more pressing matters.
- 2. Conflicting mapping standards. There is little likelihood that countries bordering the Gulf of Mexico will change its name as well. This will create unnecessary differences and confusion between maps produced by different countries. This could cause miscommunication urgent situations such as search and rescue and extreme weather warnings.
- 3. Contentious Symbolism. The new name creates an enduring public symbol of cultural and policy differences between the U.S. and the other countries bordering the Gulf, much like the difference between the "Persian Gulf" and the "Arabian Gulf." In a time of greatly increasing international tensions we do not need additional artifacts that can be used to mobilize conflict.

In his own self-interest (since he was a gold prospector), he wrote Mt. McKinley on a map of the High One, thus wiping out 10,000 years of Athabascan culture. No hearings; no public comments; no input. The Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act created changed the name to Denali National Park and Preserve, while Mt. McKinley remained...until action by the Secretary of the Interior to BGN to finally correct the name of The High One to the original name of Denali.

Attached is a draft Secretary's Order to implement the Executive Order "Restoring Names That Honor American Greatness". This draft was developed collaboratively by the USGS and the Solicitor's office, with input from key BGN officials including the BGN State Dept. representative. A few notes:

- 1. Sec. 2 of the EO calls for agency review of all agency BGN appointees. The USGS has sent forward through DTS a memo to the Secretary's office in support of the DOI membership review. Therefore, this draft does not include any additional guidance for implementation of that request. However, additional instruction can be added if the department feels it appropriate.
- 2. Sec. 4c of the draft corresponds to EO sec. 2d, but this is a situation that we don't anticipate will arise.
- 3. Sec. 4d of the draft corresponds to EO sec. 5. This section of the draft is less detailed because it is not a BGN or USGS function and will need some additional DOI decision-making over who should implement and in what timeframe. (E.g. I'll posit that it might be a responsibility for DOI's Office of Intergovernmental and External Affairs, and note that the need to prepare announcements in time for July 4, 2026, will be time-constraining on that process.)

This draft aims to help DOI address all relevant sections of the EO, but we can edit/adjust based on

your feedback.






