In this response, we are releasing one Portable Document Format (PDF) electronic file, consisting of 47 pages of records responsive to your request. These records are being released in their entirety.

We are continuing to process the remaining records associated with your request. Due to the nature of the records, we will need to consult with the other federal agencies and Department of the Interior, Office of the Solicitor (SOL). We anticipate providing another response by March 20, 2026.

I wanted to make sure you were informed of where we are at after the call with ACIO this afternoon.

I reiterated that no changes have been made to the names at this time and that we are closely coordinating between NGP & NGTOC and preparing to act once the SO is signed.

There was definitely some confusion on the basemaps vs. the OnDemand Topo products, and where to go to get on-demand maps. They suggested we are clear with where we point the incoming Secretary (and users) to request maps with these names changes and are prepared to answer why the name changes are not immediately present on the basemaps within the various TNM applications. They thought they could come to topoBuilder and get 1 map covering the entire area around the Gulf, they also thought they just open topoBuilder and they will see GOA on the basemap.

We clarified that NGTOC is working on a Special Map Request for the announcement of these name changes and that map is different than the maps that will be available from topoBuilder.

We shared that based on our current system we will be holding the topoBuilder 2.0 (ArcGIS Pro) release until after things have settled down with these orders.

We are working on how to scale the topoBuilder 1.0 (ArcMap) system differently so that we have less maps in the queue, maps can immediately go to processing, thus resulting in a shorter delivery timeframe. I shared this information and estimates of what this might cost with ACIO, including estimates of what the cloud cost would be if we see an increase in demand (which we do expect).

We briefly discussed some of the challenges/complexity around implementing basemap changes faster than the 1mo estimate. There are some options for deploying larger instances than what we currently use which could save some time with caching. This would also result in a cost increase. We did not commit to anything faster than the current 1mo estimate.

IF we want to deploy larger instances to help the basemap updates be completed faster, we could either pay for reserved instances or on demand instances. There may be options for purchasing reserved instances for a shorter period of time than is normally allowed (a few months), this would cost less than the On Demand instances. Robert Djurasaj will be in communication with ACIO about that.

To the United States Geological Survey Board on Geographic Names:

Additionally, I would appreciate clarification on the reasoning behind this change and whether there is a process for public input on such decisions.

Dear BGN leadership,

I'm a science, environmental and political journalist working for media outlets such as Frankfurter Allgemeine Zeitung, Yale E360, RiffReporter and Spectrum of Science (<https://www.christian-schwaegerl.de/home-english>) and currently on assignment by spektrum.de (part of the Nature/Springer group) to write about geographical names in the light of the "Gulf of America" issue.

I'm writing to you because I need clarification on the extent of the recent renaming:

In his Executive Order, President Trump wrote:

"As such, within 30 days of the date of this order, the Secretary of the Interior shall, consistent with 43 U.S.C. 364 through 364f, take all appropriate actions to rename as the "Gulf of America" the U.S. Continental Shelf area bounded on the northeast, north, and northwest by the States of Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama and Florida and extending to the seaward boundary with Mexico and Cuba in the area formerly named as the Gulf of Mexico."

The reference to the U.S. coastal and shelf waters is very clear here.

However, in the Secretary's ORDER NO. 3423, it's stated that the president's order was to „rename the Gulf of Mexico to the Gulf of America" – without any reference to the U.S. Continental Shelf limits. The accompanying geographical coordinates, on the other hand, only refer to U.S. coastal locations.

For my reporting, my question is:

Will the new map show the whole of the Gulf of Mexico as "Gulf of America", including coastal and EEZ waters of Mexico and Cuba, or will the "Gulf of America" be limited to U.S. waters and the rest of the water body will still be named Gulf of Mexico?

Gina,

My assumption is that this question will be asked several times, and it would be helpful to have a stock answer we can provide. From my perspective, the EO did limit the name change to just the EEZ, but the Secretary's Order - using the authority given to the Secretary by law - implemented the name change more broadly to include the entire body of water.

As an example, FWS updated their official map of the National Wildlife Refuge System and National Fish Hatchery System yesterday. This is a publicly available representation (to me, at least) that the entire body of water has been renamed. That is also consistent with the text definition in GNIS.

Dear BGN leadership,

I'm a science, environmental and political journalist working for media outlets such as Frankfurter

Allgemeine Zeitung, Yale E360, RiffReporter and Spectrum of Science (<https://www.christian-schwaegerl.de/home-english>) and currently on assignment by spektrum.de (part of the Nature/Springer group) to write about geographical names in the light of the "Gulf of America" issue.

I'm writing to you because I need clarification on the extent of the recent renaming:

In his Executive Order, President Trump wrote:

"As such, within 30 days of the date of this order, the Secretary of the Interior shall, consistent with 43 U.S.C. 364 through 364f, take all appropriate actions to rename as the "Gulf of America" the U.S. Continental Shelf area bounded on the northeast, north, and northwest by the States of Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama and Florida and extending to the seaward boundary with Mexico and Cuba in the area formerly named as the Gulf of Mexico."

The reference to the U.S. coastal and shelf waters is very clear here.

However, in the Secretary's ORDER NO. 3423, it's stated that the president's order was to „rename the Gulf of Mexico to the Gulf of America" – without any reference to the U.S. Continental Shelf limits. The accompanying geographical coordinates, on the other hand, only refer to U.S. coastal locations.

For my reporting, my question is:

Will the new map show the whole of the Gulf of Mexico as "Gulf of America", including coastal and EEZ waters of Mexico and Cuba, or will the "Gulf of America" be limited to U.S. waters and the rest of the water body will still be named Gulf of Mexico?

- Worldview: will be complete on Feb 20 when Esri pushes out their changes
- FIRMS: will be complete on Feb 20 - although we will need to see which services are auto-updated or whether we need to update urls to the US version of the maps.
- GIBS - labels will not be fixed on Feb 20, they'll be deprecated at that point. This will affect:
 - Earthdata Search: ~~actively evaluating technical options (update from Val - will most likely convert to Esri, can take up to 2 weeks for the change over)~~ **working on an update now and expect it to be available during the upcoming sprint (which begins next week and runs through February 28).**
 - Worldview Snapshots

 - Sea Level Change Portal

More info:

The GIBS team created a reference label layer (as raster tiles) using open data from OpenStreetMap and Natural Earth. It was most recently updated in the 2021 timeframe, though it was noted at the time that the underlying processing pipeline was brittle due to a number of factors and would be difficult to maintain. As such, GIBS will now deprecate this label layer and asked users to either remove them from their mapping app or replace them with another source which meets the requirements of the EO, specifically to refer to the Gulf of Mexico as the Gulf of America.

The Worldview team has identified Esri's vector tile service as the most expedient replacement since they regularly make updates to their reference layers, they support the geographic (EPSG:4326) map

projection, and are free to use for NASA customers. Note that any vector tile service isn't a drop-in replacement, though, as the process for incorporating vector tiles is different than raster tiles.

I could use your assistance in the draft below. Any edits?

The USGS served two roles in implementing the name change. First, the Geographic Names Information System - the authoritative database of geographic names for Federal use - was updated to reflect the name change. Maintenance of this database is a standard activity, and little additional cost was attributed to updating GNIS for the Gulf of American name change. Second, the USGS creates and distributes maps for use by Federal, State, and local governments as well as the public. The topoBuilder platform allows for user-requested, customized maps that leverage the most recent available data, implemented through a cloud computing architecture. TopoBuilder was capable of producing map products that showed the new name after the GNIS update. Given the wide interest in the name change, USGS planned for a short-duration upscale in cloud computing resources that would allow more rapid delivery of maps requested through the topoBuilder platform. An additional \$40,000 was allocated for this upscaling activity, though the final cost is driven by demand and will not be known until the end of the billing cycle. Given that the timing of the name change occurred on a weekend, a modest additional cost was incurred for overtime pay for staff for both updating GNIS and configuring topoBuilder.

On background: The Board on Geographic Names under the Department of the Interior has purview over names for federal use. BGN names are only binding to federal departments and agencies.

Historically, the U.S. Geological Survey and the Board on Geographic Names will update the Geographic Names Information System (GNIS) for federal use effective immediately, and the Department of State will update the Geographic Names Server (GNS). It is up to each federal agency and office to change their signage and websites per their own budgetary needs and website update scheduling. There is a link in the press release that gives additional background information on the name changing process.

The IMIA is a business ecosystem of some map and map data creators, but a majority are upstream geospatial companies used to create the maps and map data and downstream companies that disseminate this in many ways. Therefore, there are a minority of companies that are making and maintaining map content, including geographic names, and a majority are using it to create value added products.

You are already aware of how Esri is handling this from emails from Jeremy. A number of IMIA publishers are from outside the US and are actively reviewing this change, and do use GNIS as an authoritative source, but have not made decisions yet. Many of our IMIA members are paper map publishers, globe companies or app developers and do not need to make decisions at this time because they do not have immediate product deadlines that would require them to make decisions on the changes.

1. IMIA - This was in fact a topic of our recent IMIA board meeting. I will send out an email to the IMIA board and to the IMIA committees that I chair and/or sit on and ask them for an answer by COB on Thursday so you have time to compile. Please let me know if you need it sooner.

With your permission, I would like to copy Ariel Doumbouya on that rely as she is our IMIA Board Advisor on National Government. (By the way, Ariel is doing a great job at this and Bob Davis is pleased with the results back to USGS).

2. As Esri is an IMIA member you may be interested in how the Esri Living Atlas team will handle this on the ArcGIS Online Basemaps. The following is guidance I gave a customer last week after talking with Sean Breyer who leads that team (copied), but I will check with him again to see if anything as changed:
 - Denali to Mount McKinley will be active in the 20 February 2025 basemap release for all vector basemap styles. Gulf of Mexico will still be the name for all World or non US styled maps. There will be a new US Style basemap collection that will have the Gulf of America designation in the US part of the gulf but we need to have the GNIS geographic definition. **so only Denali rename will show up in all vector basemaps, the Gulf will be setup for a locale version of the vector basemap for users who have set their org as US”**
 - Gulf of X should not affect the world vector map styles, only the Denali/McKinley change will show up.
 - Esri has a vector tile style editor so anything can be overridden for personalization. Sean has shared this with people last week for the people who feel the pressure to solve things now in their own way.

The "Carto" raster map style which is the default map on osm.org doesn't render labels for seas and oceans from OSM. Discussion here: <https://github.com/gravitystorm/openstreetmap-carto/issues/2278> TL;DR is that since seas and oceans don't have verifiable borders, they're usually mapped as nodes, and if they were displayed on the map, mappers would endlessly be nudging them around to try and get the label placement to match their aesthetic preference. A lot of maps that have ocean labels at low zooms (e.g. Mapbox's and MapTiler's example map styles) actually use Natural Earth data for labels of continents and oceans at low zoom, rather than OSM data.

Thanks for the explanation - I think I followed it all

Essentially, it's up to the developer, then. They can choose the default 'name' tag, which right now is "Golfo de México", the english language name tag ("name:en Gulf of Mexico"), or if they wanted to be locally specific, the "official_name:en-US Gulf of America"

But, unless weatherunderground, or other OSM users, change the tag for local use is the US, it won't display as "Gulf of America".

That all makes sense...but why, though, is there no label at all right now for the feature

in the basemap [osm.org](https://openstreetmap.org)? I would expect that it would show the label according to the 'name' field, but I don't see anything displaying...it's just unlabeled. But, that seems to be the same for other large bodies of water, too.

Lake Superior ('water' feature type) and Lake Erie ('lake' feature type) DO show their label...but Gulf of America ('sea' feature type), Atlantic Ocean ('ocean' feature type), Pacific Ocean ('ocean' feature type), Mediterranean ('sea' feature type), etc. are all unlabeled.

Wondering if the layer visibility is feature-type based? water/lake are default turned on...but sea/ocean are not?

So... I mispoke. It's language based...
Since it's just 1 tileset, on [osm.org](https://openstreetmap.org), the map is uniform - and labels are what's in the name tag (usually the local language name). If you're using [osm.org](https://openstreetmap.org) API directly, it'll show up as whatever is in the name field. But, if you search for the Gulf of America in OSM, you'll find it under that main tag Gulf of Mexico.... So, in effect, the official_name:en-US tag will only show up in maps using OSM if a developer adds manual support to show that particular label. The tag mainly supports that search function at this point.

Vector vendors like Mapbox will set the label based on the user's language (in english it would prefer name:en to name... but only a few vendors support localized views of things like borders - and most don't use OSM for that. I checked weather underground, and it still says Gulf of Mexico - and that map is a Mapbox service. It's hard to know where vendors are pulling names and borders (we don't have that info) but here's documentation [on mapbox](#). It may look like it's all OSM data since we have to be attributed, but there's likely public domain data in those base maps as well that doesn't require attribution. It's a fun lil cocktail.

I'm sure you are aware that President Trump, [through DOI](#), has enacted a name change of the Gulf of Mexico to Gulf of America. DOI is also seeing the new label propagate through federal and commercial mapping applications and products. I recognize that the enacted name change is required only for federal agencies, and there is no requirement that OSM implement the name change. However, DOI is very interested in understanding the pace and breadth of uptake across the board.

Do you have any information you could provide about how OSM is treating, or intends to treat, the name change?

I'm hoping you can help me connect the dots, and perhaps provide input on behalf of DOT.

I'm sure you are aware that President Trump, through DOI, has enacted a name change of the Gulf of Mexico to Gulf of America. That name change was implemented Sunday through the Geographic Names Information System, and DOI is starting to see that label propagate through federal and commercial applications. However, DOI leadership is keenly interested in understanding the pace and breadth of uptake by the mapping community.

I was asked yesterday by DOI leadership to provide an assessment of which products, services, etc. throughout the federal government and private sector have been updated. I issued that data call through the Board on Geographic Names members, which includes a number of agencies. The response is pasted below for your awareness. However, we do not have a DOT member on the board from whom I could request info.

This morning I noticed the [http://'Gulf%20of%20America'%20arrives%20on%20Google%20Maps%20|%20CNN%20Business]CNN article which linked to an [FAA directive](#) to update products, though. That's great, and definitely the type of product I'd like to include in my reporting.

DOI leadership was appreciative of the efforts of the fed government so far, but have also requested an update by Friday on additional implementation. Could you please provide me an update of maps, products, services, etc. that DOT is updating, or plans to update?



Good morning Ed, Amy,

I'm hoping you can help me connect the dots, and perhaps provide input on behalf of DOT.

I'm sure you are aware that President Trump, through DOI, has enacted a name change of the Gulf of Mexico to Gulf of America. That name change was implemented Sunday through the Geographic Names Information System, and DOI is starting to see that label propagate through federal and commercial applications. However, DOI leadership is keenly interested in understanding the pace and breadth of uptake by the mapping community.

I was asked yesterday by DOI leadership to provide an assessment of which products, services, etc. throughout the federal government and private sector have been updated. I issued that data call through the Board on Geographic Names members, which includes a number of agencies. The response is pasted below for your awareness. However, we do not have a DOT member on the board from whom I could request info.

This morning I noticed the [http://'Gulf%20of%20America'%20arrives%20on%20Google%20Maps%20|%20CNN%20Business]CNN article which linked to an [FAA directive](#) to update products, though. That's great, and definitely the type of product I'd like to include in my reporting.

DOI leadership was appreciative of the efforts of the fed government so far, but have also requested an update by Friday on additional implementation. Could you please provide me an update of maps, products, services, etc. that DOT is updating, or plans to update?







To continue supporting the GNIS name changes we've created a document that will help you add GOA and any other future names to the results of your search widget in apps/maps ahead of when the Esri world geocoding service is updated.

Mt. McKinley was already in the geocoding service, but searching for GOA brings you to Cook Inlet, AK as its best guess because GOA does not currently exist in the geocoding service. The service will be updated later this year, potentially late March, but in the meantime it is possible to add a custom geocoding service to your org to achieve the result below. All that is required is an ArcGIS Enterprise to host the geocoding service, which will contain the GOA name/location and would be added as part of your default geocoding services. 

These name updates **will not be addressed** in the **retired/deprecated** raster tile basemaps. These layers have been retired for three years, so we are again recommending users replace any maps using raster tile basemaps with the equivalent vector basemaps.

Over the next few days, we will provide more detailed guidance on how an organization will need to verify their Region setting and the steps users will need to do to see these changes on their existing web maps, apps, ArcGIS Pro projects. Esri also plans for regular updates for ArcGIS Enterprise, StreetMap Premium, and Data Appliance. This will help our federal agency users prepare for the update. If a user needs to make a name label update sooner, they can use the Esri Vector Tile Style Editor so anything can be overridden for personalization. Here is a

There are a couple of things to emphasize from the draft text:

- The vector tile style editor would allow you to change the name to GOA right now in any USGS apps if you would like to see the change happen before 2/20. Once the basemaps are updated on 2/20 you'll want to switch to the new U.S. Centric Basemaps.
- Basemaps coming from an ArcGIS Enterprise would not be included in the 2/20 release, they would be updated in a future release of ArcGIS Enterprise. If an app is using an ArcGIS Enterprise basemap you could just switch it to an AGOL version.
- Widgets like the search bar would not be updated in the 2/20 release, they would be updated by other future Product releases. I am still gathering more information on this timeline.




Thank you for the time this morning and I want to reassure you that we are prioritizing these name changes based on the executive order. Updating the nearly 35 basemaps and 50 cartographic layers is key to a successful release, and we must produce updates on a 3-week cycle. That next release is on time for Feb 20th, but we are looking for ways to advance it slightly. In this release specifically, we are building a new matching collection of the 35


basemaps and 50 layers that will support both US GNIS and State Department boundaries and names for about 20 countries. This required additional work during the release and QA process to ensure all new changes were verifiable and correct in all map styles. With this release, there will be additional steps to ensure agencies use new correct US map styles. This will involve the agencies after the release to refresh their maps inside their organizations, and we are providing guidance so they can smoothly implement the updates. BLM has already worked with some of our Solution Engineers to test this and quickly updated about 800 of their maps.

One outstanding item we are concerned about is that Mount McKinley has not been updated in GNIS, and without that change, we need to wait for guidance. Can we confirm that will be over the next few days?

Also, within the ArcGIS System, we have provided a name override capability for short-term name style changes. If there are any specific maps for which these changes are needed now, we have shared a how-to-guide, and we have Solution Engineers that can help an agency implement this until the 2/20 release. Below are the technical details that were shared with Michael Tischler and will be shared across all the agencies over the next few days.

"Esri will release its regular update to the Esri Vector Basemaps on Feb. 20th. This update will refresh all the data inside the global vector tiles. It will also specifically address the U.S. name changes to Mount McKinley and the naming for the Gulf of Mexico / Gulf of America worldwide. In this release, Esri will introduce a new collection of custom Esri Vector Basemap styles for the United States (as we have for several countries). These styles will become the default basemaps when a user is signed in to ArcGIS Online and the organization (or public account) Region setting is set to "United States." They will also be the default basemaps when a user within the United States accesses ArcGIS Online anonymously and uses the map viewer or scene viewer to access or create a map or scene. The effect for either of these scenarios is that the user's map will display the label Gulf of America. For all non-U.S. Region settings or anonymous access outside the U.S., users will see the label Gulf of Mexico. The Mount McKinley name change will be universal across all Regions. Additionally, with the custom U.S. basemap styles, we will be including over a dozen U.S. State Department defined treatments for boundaries and names around the world.

These name updates **will not be addressed** in the **retired/deprecated** raster tile basemaps. These layers have been retired for three years, so we are again recommending users replace any maps using raster tile basemaps with the equivalent vector basemaps.

Over the next few days, we will provide more detailed guidance on how an organization will need to verify their Region setting and the steps users will need to do to see these changes on their existing web maps, apps, ArcGIS Pro projects. Esri also plans for regular updates for ArcGIS Enterprise, StreetMap Premium, and Data Appliance. This will help our federal agency users prepare for the update. I hope you are doing well. I am writing on behalf of the Penn Libraries Mapping and GIS Club regarding the renaming of the "Gulf of Mexico" to the "Gulf of America," as mandated by President Trump's January 20 Executive Order.

Under Principle III and Policy I of the U.S. Board on Geographic Names (BGN) *Principles, Policies, and Procedures*, names established by Executive Order are "official by law" and thus "take precedence over BGN principles, policies, and procedures." On January 30, I contacted USGS customer service and was informed that "no workflow exists yet" for this name change and that the agency is "waiting for directions" without a timeline.

Given the 30-day window in the Executive Order, could you please clarify:

1. **Status of Formal Instruction:** Has the Acting Secretary of the Interior provided any formal directive to the BGN regarding implementation of the "Gulf of America" name?
2. **GNIS Database Timeline:** Given that GNIS downloadable files are updated bi-monthly, web services are updated quarterly, but the order trumps BGN principles, policies, and procedures, when do you anticipate finalizing this change?
3. **Reference Removal:** The Executive Order states "remove all references to the Gulf of Mexico from the GNIS, consistent with applicable law." Will the BGN also remove variant names referring to "Gulf of Mexico" in other languages or contexts?

We appreciate any information you can share on how this process will move forward under the current leadership at DOI. We look forward to referencing "Gulf of America" in our academic GIS work once it is formally adopted in GNIS.

Jennifer/Josh,

Thank you for the time this morning and I want to reassure you that we are prioritizing these name changes based on the executive order. Updating the nearly 35 basemaps and 50 cartographic layers is key to a successful release, and we must produce updates on a 3-week cycle. That next release is on time for Feb 20th, but we are looking for ways to advance it slightly. In this release specifically, we are building a new matching collection of the 35 basemaps and 50 layers that will support both US GNIS and State Department boundaries and names for about 20 countries. This required additional work during the release and QA process to ensure all new changes were verifiable and correct in all map styles. With this release, there will be additional steps to ensure agencies use new correct US map styles. This will involve the agencies after the release to refresh their maps inside their organizations, and we are providing guidance so they can smoothly implement the updates. BLM has already worked with some of our Solution Engineers to test this and quickly updated about 800 of their maps.

One outstanding item we are concerned about is that Mount McKinley has not been updated in GNIS, and without that change, we need to wait for guidance. Can we confirm that will be over the next few days?

Also, within the ArcGIS System, we have provided a name override capability for short-term name style changes. If there are any specific maps for which these changes are needed now, we have shared a how-to-guide, and we have Solution Engineers that can help an agency implement this until the 2/20 release. Below are the technical details that were shared with Michael Tischler and will be shared across all the agencies over the next few days.

"Esri will release its regular update to the Esri Vector Basemaps on Feb. 20th. This update will refresh all the data inside the global vector tiles. It will also specifically address the U.S. name changes to Mount McKinley and the naming for the Gulf of Mexico / Gulf of America worldwide. In this release, Esri will introduce a new collection of custom Esri Vector Basemap styles for the United States (as we have for several countries). These styles will become the default basemaps when a user is signed in to ArcGIS Online and the organization (or public account) Region setting is set to "United States." They will also be the default basemaps when a user within the United States accesses ArcGIS Online anonymously and uses the map viewer or scene viewer to access or create a map or scene. The effect for either of these scenarios is that the user's map will display the label Gulf of America. For all non-U.S. Region settings or anonymous access outside the U.S., users will see the label Gulf of Mexico. The Mount

McKinley name change will be universal across all Regions. Additionally, with the custom U.S. basemap styles, we will be including over a dozen U.S. State Department defined treatments for boundaries and names around the world.

These name updates **will not be addressed** in the **retired/deprecated** raster tile basemaps. These layers have been retired for three years, so we are again recommending users replace any maps using raster tile basemaps with the equivalent vector basemaps.

Over the next few days, we will provide more detailed guidance on how an organization will need to verify their Region setting and the steps users will need to do to see these changes on their existing web maps, apps, ArcGIS Pro projects. Esri also plans for regular updates for ArcGIS Enterprise, StreetMap Premium, and Data Appliance. This will help our federal agency users prepare for the update. If a user needs to make a name label update sooner, they can use the Esri Vector Tile Style Editor so anything can be overridden for personalization. Here is a blog for label overrides that users can make against any Esri Vector basemap.

Please see below for the steps the Census Bureau has taken to address the change:

Census Bureau Actions Related to the Gulf of America

- 1) The live Master Address File/Topologically Integrated Geographic Encoding and Reference (MAF/TIGER) System has been updated with the name "Gulf of America." All future spatial data products (e.g., shapefiles) that include hydrography will reflect the new name. Benchmarks¹ of the MAF/TIGER database that were in existence prior to Department of Interior Secretarial Order 3423 issued on February 7, 2025 were not modified.
- 2) All static maps (e.g., pdf, images, printed maps) published after February 7, 2025, that include labels for water features will use the label "Gulf of America."
- 3) All web map applications published after February 7, 2025, that include labels for water features will use the label "Gulf of America."
- 4) Existing web map applications that include labels for water features, and are not explicitly associated with the 2020 Census, will be updated to reflect the name "Gulf of America."
- 5) Existing web map applications that include labels for water features, and are explicitly associated with the 2020 Census, will continue to reflect the name "Gulf of Mexico."
- 6) The current TIGERweb map application references TIGER benchmark data from our BAS25 benchmark from November 2024. With the next release of the application from our ACS25 benchmark in September 2025, if a user decides to turn on hydrography labels, the application will reflect the name "Gulf of America" as the name has changed within the MAF/TIGER System.
- 7) For the Decennial TIGERweb and Economic Census TIGERweb map applications, if a user decides to turn on hydrography labels, the applications will continue to reflect the name "Gulf of Mexico," as the change was not in effect in for the data

years represented in the applications.

¹ Benchmarks refer to copies of the MAF/TIGER database at a specific point in time.



Hi All,

The message from Sarah Ryker yesterday described the following action based on the name changes for the Gulf of America (GoA) and Mount McKinley:

"The Department of the Interior has directed all bureaus and offices to take immediate steps to implement these name changes. Bureaus and offices must conduct a review of offices, documents, policies, internal and public-facing webpages, signage, and other materials that reference the "Gulf of Mexico" or "Denali" and efficiently change all references, as appropriate, to the "Gulf of America" or "Mount McKinley" by February 28, 2025."

This mandate will require changes to CSS MA Viewers and newly created map products. The following includes current status of underlying Base Map Viewers used by CSS Programs/Centers:

TNM Viewer: As per below, I did a quick inventory on CSS viewers that I am aware of. Some are using the TNM Viewers. While the GoA has already been updated in the TNM Viewer, work is underway by NGTOC to update Mt McKinley as well. NGTOC is also working on artifacting in the cached basemap tiles in some areas outside of the US.

Esri Basemaps: For those viewers that rely on Esri, we were just notified by Esri to the following regarding their Vector Basemaps:

"Esri will release its regular update to the Esri Vector Basemaps on Feb. 20th. This update will refresh all the data inside the global vector tiles. It will also specifically address the U.S. name changes to Mount McKinley and the naming for the Gulf of Mexico / Gulf of America worldwide."

For those viewers that rely on Esri basemaps, please refer to the ArcGIS Blog for instructions and verify that they are showing the GoA and Mount McKinley.

OpenStreetMap and Other Base Maps: With respect to OSM, they have implemented the name change for GOA, but OSM is not currently showing the name changes on their basemap. As a result, it will be necessary to utilize another viewer such as TNM or the Esri Base Map viewers rather than OSM.

Below is a summary of the current CSS viewers and the underlying Base Maps being used that I identified while doing a search by Programs. Note that this may not be an all inclusive list:

 - PAD-US Viewer relies on the TNM Base Map Viewer

 - Does not appear to rely on a basemap viewer
- NCGMP
 - topoView
 - Using OpenStreetMap which does not label GofA and still shows Denali.
- NGGDPP – No apparent basemap viewers
- NGP/NGTOC
 - topoBuilder viewer and map products
 - TNM Viewers – current and advanced
 - Staged topo maps – To be addressed by NGTOC
 - Lidar Explorer – (relies on TNM Viewer)
 - 3DEP Viewer – Has banner but otherwise is not displaying the data

With the due date of 02/28, please work to ensure your viewers and related datasets conform with the DOI mandate. As requested by Sarah Ryker, if we are unable to achieve compliance by that date, we must notify Jenn Lacey of those situations so they can be communicated to the USGS Deputy Director of Operations by Monday, 02/24. **To support this, I will be developing a tracking spreadsheet today that will be made available to the CSS SLT and needs to be populated by noon ET on Monday, 02/24. The spreadsheet must identify CSS viewers/products that require compliance, targeted compliance date and identify any issues that impact our ability to comply by 02/28.**

GNIS:

History: Secretary's Order 3423 directs the Board on Geographic Names ("BGN") to immediately rename Denali to Mount McKinley and to update the Geographic Names Information System to appropriately reflect the change. This Order implements President Trump's direction in Executive Order 14172, "Restoring Names That Honor American Greatness," that the name be changed.

Description: Elevation 20,310 ft.; the highest point in North America. Named in 1896 by William A. Dickey, prospector, "after William McKinley of Ohio, who had been nominated for the Presidency and that was the first news we received on our way out of that wonderful wilderness." McKinley, 1854-1901, was the 25th President of the United States. The first mention of the massif was by Captain George Vancouver, who when seeing it from Cook Inlet in 1794, referred to the "stupendous snow mountains." The Russians descriptively called it "Bolshaya (Bulshaia) Gora" or "big mountain." Alfred Mayo and Arthur Harper, pioneer Alaska traders, after a trip up the Tanana River in 1878, reported, "a great ice mountain to the south," but did not name it. A prospector, Frank Densmore, spoke so enthusiastically after seeing the mountain from Lake Minchumina in 1889, that it was known for years among prospectors as "Densmores Peak." The north summit was first reached on April 3, 1913, by Archdeacon Hudson Stuck, Walter Harper, Robert Tatum, and Harry Karstens (later park superintendent). On August 28, 2015, the name Mount McKinley was changed by Secretary's Order No. 3337 to Denali.



Mike, Bob, and Kim,

Robert Djuraj gave me a heads up that he was contacted by Eric Martinez from the Hazards group yesterday afternoon to inform us they've been instructed by "the top" to start using our basemap services for their <https://earthquake.usgs.gov> application while ESRI updates Gulf of America basemap (expected by 2/20).



Liz and Robert have already spoke about this in greater detail and have taken the precautionary steps to slightly increase our cloud resources for the incoming traffic. The Delivery team will have probably expanded autoscaling capabilities for the basemap services backend to 4-8 min/max number of instances. We have already enabled CloudFront caching mechanism to be prepared to take the brunt of the incoming traffic from Earthquakes app (<https://earthquake.usgs.gov/earthquakes/map/>).

As you can see, the Earthquake app is already in the top two of our all-traffic list for the past 24 hours, even though it has been around for less than five hours. The Delivery team will closely monitor the situation in

Sumologic as well.

As directed by the President, the Gulf of Mexico will now officially be known as the Gulf of America

USGS's Board of Geographic Names supports name change with the implementation of Executive and Secretarial Orders.

Last week, the USGS's [Board of Geographic Names \(BGN\)](#) played an essential role in helping to enact Secretarial Order 3423 to rename the Gulf of Mexico to the Gulf of America.

Following President Trump's [Executive Order 14172](#), "Restoring Names That Honor American Greatness," on February 7, Secretary of the Interior Doug Burgum signed [Secretary's Order \(SO\) 3423 - The Gulf of America](#). The order states, "The area formerly known as the Gulf of Mexico has long been an indelible part of America and an asset to our Nation. The Gulf has played a pivotal role in shaping America's history and promises to play a vital role in our future, serving as a flourishing natural resource of critical importance to our Nation's economy and people."

The SO directed the BGN to immediately rename the Gulf of Mexico to the Gulf of America.

The BGN is a federal body created in 1890 and established in its present form by public law in 1947 to maintain uniform geographic name usage throughout the federal government. The BGN is comprised of representatives of multiple federal agencies concerned with geographic information, population, ecology, and management of public lands.

The BGN oversees and maintains two authoritative databases to standardize geographic names across the federal government. Domestic names are in the [Geographic Names Information System \(GNIS\)](#). Foreign geographic names are available by navigating to the [Geographic Names Server](#) webpage.

Geographic names and their applications specifically established by an act of Congress or Executive order are legally official, and therefore, are not bound by BGN principles, policies, and procedures.

Once an Executive Order is signed, the name is official. The role of the BGN is to inform the geographic names database managers to implement the change in accordance with guidance provided by the Secretary of Interior. Federal agencies are in the process of updating their maps products, and services to align with this name change, and there will not be an effort to update prior products to conform to the Orders. The BGN will not accept proposals intending to change names designated by the President, Congress, Proclamation, or Treaty.

Thanks to the hard work of the USGS employees at the National Geospatial Technical Operations Center, the name was changed in the GNIS in time for the President's Proclamation to recognize February 9, 2025, as the first ever Gulf of America Day. As such, the [USGS](#)

[topoBuilder application](#) was updated in time to include the capability to generate new maps with the updated name.

A name change of this magnitude has multiple facets and requires the efforts of many. The USGS's Science Publishing Network follows the GNIS in affecting name changes and from this point forward will utilize the Gulf of America on current and future publications. In addition, the Core Science Systems Mission Area has reached out to third party mapping companies who will be changing the name within their own systems.

All other web applications and physical signs will take some time to update. It is up to each federal agency and office to change their signage and websites per their own budgetary needs and website update scheduling.





Significant progress has been made this week in implementing the "Gulf of America" name change across federal, commercial, and open-source maps. The U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) has been actively collaborating with partners across all sectors to update map products, achieving widespread labeling of the Gulf of America. Federal agencies are actively updating their maps, products, and services to comply with the executive order. The USGS has successfully leveraged established partnerships with commercial geospatial companies, ensuring that basemaps used across the geospatial community reflect the updated Gulf of America name. Major commercial geospatial companies, including Apple, Google, and Microsoft, have already updated their basemaps, with ESRI targeting February 20th for release. 



Hi Mike,

Let's start with this. Phyllis is working on numbers but hopefully this at least gets you something:

The map view that is displayed via the web is created from a base map cache. A base map cache consists of map tile chips that have been "pre-rendered" which allow for the user to experience instant draw time when looking at an image on the screen, including if the user decides to pan around the map display via the web viewer.

The base map caches in the viewers managed by NGTOC contain hundreds of map tile chips. The viewers are designed to allow for on-the-fly rendering by pulling in the relevant chips, with each chip having multiple pyramids to allow for seamless zooming in and out. These chips work together as a set, they must be updated all together or the relationships governing the cartographic content (what is seen first, where features that intersect take priority on the map) will be broken. To put it simply at that point the map won't "look right" to the public, and there will probably be issues with zooming in and out.

NGTOC will work to update the chips for these basemaps (this involves multiple teams) to include new rendering, pyramid building, and indexing to replace the outdated chips, and test the entire map to ensure cartographic relationships are preserved and panning and zooming appears seamless and instantaneous for the user. Our standard operating procedure for this about four weeks from start to finish given the complexity of our data and the amount of map tile chips. We can look at ways to expediate this process however.

Mike,

The spreadsheet is a bit confusing as it does not break down each row in sufficient detail. The topoBuilder application has three parts - the ability to create OnDemand topos, the banner to explain the basemap, and the basemap update.

The basemap update will impact three viewers (topoBuilder, GNIS Serach, and TNMViewer) that we host, and many external applications that use the web service. We have made adding banners to the other viewers a high priority, and we are also expediting the basemap update, but I do not have a schedule yet. Normally it takes about 4 weeks to update the basemap cache due to the sheer volume of data processing and verification that needs to occur.

The other important thing to update are the GNIS staged products, as these are what most federal agencies use to create their products. They download a GNIS staged product, load it into their systems, and that drives their production and update. Once we have the GNIS staged products updated, you (or maybe Gita or Bob?) can notify the other federal agencies that this is ready.



 - Staged products such as the US Topo 7.5 min quads will be updated to reflect the change to the Gulf of America at a later date. Please use topoBuilder to get the updated maps until further notice.
- How to get involved in acquisition? Refer them to the GPSC website, Contracting Officer Representative Walter Kloth, and/or Contracting Officer Trisha Beals.
- For the hiring freeze, confirm we are currently under a hiring freeze but we can still discuss opportunities for students.

Other Talking Points:

What % of the nation is covered with 3DEP data?

- The 3D Elevation Program (3DEP) has progressed significantly, with 98.3% of the Nation covered by elevation data that meet 3DEP specifications for high accuracy and resolution. The program is on track to complete the national baseline of consistent, high-resolution 3D elevation data by Fiscal Year 2026 depending on budget and partnerships. We are already in transition to the next generation of 3DEP and collecting higher quality data on a faster refresh rate to meet growing demands that were documented in the 3D Nation Elevation Requirements and Benefits Study. The new goal is to refresh CONUS in 5 years and AK, HI and territories in 8 years at QL2 or higher.

What is next after 3DEP completes national coverage?

- While the initial 3DEP coverage provides an essential baseline reference,

the addition of multiple repeat topographic lidar coverage which began in the last few years significantly expands analysis capabilities and supports applications necessary for a more resilient economy, such as flood risk management, infrastructure construction and management, energy development, critical minerals exploration and more.

Pursuant to President Trump's Executive Order No. 14172, "Restoring Names That Honor American Greatness," and Secretary Burgum's Order 3423, "The Gulf of America" and Order 3424, "Mount McKinley and Landmarks Honoring the Alaskan People", the Board of Geographic Names renamed the "Gulf of Mexico" to the "Gulf of America", on February 9, 2025 and reinstated the name "Mount McKinley" to the summit named "Denali", on February 14, 2025.

Sarah,

I wanted to draw to your attention an idea that might have interest in ASWS. The two name changes (Mount McKinley, Gulf of America) are both of national significance, and we expect an increased demand for USGS/NGP map products that show the newly labeled features.

While the initial change in the authoritative name database (GNIS) will be nearly immediate, most map products will take some time - days to months - to update. This includes the basemaps on all NGP applications, web services, and USTopo maps.

The exception to this is the dynamic mapping application is TopoBuilder. TopoBuilder was designed to read real-time from data services that are kept up to date and create a map on-the-fly. As soon as GNIS is updated with the new names, TopoBuilder will be able to produce maps with the new names.

TopoBuilder is a cloud-native application that relies on numerous machines in the cloud to compile a map request and deliver the map by email. Each machine in the cloud has a cost, and we have constrained the number of possible machines to maximize value for our budget. As a result, it takes an average of 2hrs to deliver a map upon request. We expect increased requests from the public, and if the Department will want to promote/encourage DOI maps to show the renamed features it may be beneficial to scale-up the number of cloud machines to accommodate the expected increase, and shorten the delivery time to ~30 minutes. While the overall cost is somewhat demand based, we do not expect the increased cost to exceed \$40k/month, which we currently don't have funds to cover. However, if you think it would be of interest to ASWS and they have access to funding, it might be something to propose.

Thanks, David. I just wanted to reinforce what Mike mentioned, and I've included screen capture references for clarity. The Denali label only appears when significantly zoomed in, as shown below. Additionally, the Gulf of America/Gulf of Mexico labels do not appear at all in their online map, and there is inconsistency in the tags used for these features.

These are community-created maps, and the process often involves volunteer special topic groups to ensure some control and consistency, though I'm unsure if that applies here. Typically, the Executive Director, Maggie Cawley, informs those who ask that anyone can propose updates by signing up, but there is no dedicated staff for making modifications. If it would help, I can reach out to gain a clearer understanding of their final update process.

Regarding Option 2, there could be complications due to their ODbL license. Making modifications and addressing copyright issues would make changing their maps outside of their systems complicated.





The short answer is no, USGS/DOI have not provided any direction/mandate to other agencies. We have notified other departments that have BGN members of the change, and also through the FGDC community. But, we really have no enforcement mechanism.

With respect to OSM, they have implemented the name change for GOA, but it is at the discretion of the developer. A tag has been added that recognizes the official US name:

But, the developer creating the webmap has to choose to have the label assigned to that particular tag. In addition, the default styling of the OSM basemap leaves large bodies of water unlabeled. So, the visibility of those labels would have to be forcibly turned on.

With McKinley, OSM has similarly created an additional tag in the entry for the feature





The short answer is no, USGS/DOI have not provided any direction/mandate to other agencies. We have notified other departments that have BGN members of the change, and also through the FGDC community. But, we really have no enforcement mechanism.

With respect to OSM, they have implemented the name change for GOA, but it is at the discretion of the developer. A tag has been added that recognizes the official US name:



But, the developer creating the webmap has to choose to have the label assigned to that particular tag. In addition, the default styling of the OSM basemap leaves large bodies of water unlabeled. So, the visibility of those labels would have to be forcibly turned on.

With McKinley, OSM has similarly created an additional tag in the entry for the feature



But, again, the developer would have to adjust the feature label to display this tag, rather than the default.

Good morning Ed, Amy,

I'm hoping you can help me connect the dots, and perhaps provide input on behalf of DOT.

I'm sure you are aware that President Trump, through DOI, has enacted a name change of the Gulf of Mexico to Gulf of America. That name change was implemented Sunday through the Geographic Names Information System, and DOI is starting to see that label propagate through federal and commercial applications. However, DOI leadership is keenly interested in understanding the pace and breadth of uptake by the mapping community.

I was asked yesterday by DOI leadership to provide an assessment of which products, services, etc. throughout the federal government and private sector have been updated. I issued that data call through the Board on Geographic Names members, which includes a number of agencies. The response is pasted below for your awareness. However, we do not have a DOT member on the board from whom I could request info.

This morning I noticed the [CNN article](#) which linked to an [FAA directive](#) to update products, though. That's great, and definitely the type of product I'd like to include in my reporting.

DOI leadership was appreciative of the efforts of the fed government so far, but have also requested an update by Friday on additional implementation. Could you please provide me an update of maps, products, services, etc. that DOT is updating, or plans to update?



Here is the response from NGTOC. If you have any other questions, please feel free to reach out to Mike Tischler directly.

We did learn Esri will be updating their base maps and expect the update to be public by 2/20. We are hoping it will be earlier but that is their regular refresh cycle for their maps.

Response:

US Topo Basemap: In an effort to rapidly implement the Secretary's Order 3423 a different process (takes far less time) was used to update the basemap cache for USGS viewers. The issues that the users are seeing are a result of this different process. We are actively investigating these and working on a fix as quickly as possible.

Mike and I have discussed, I hope this response supports WMA. It may be appropriate to have someone at a different level respond with these answers to WMA however, I'm happy to discuss.

US Topo Basemap: In an effort to rapidly implement the Secretary's Order 3423 a different process (takes far less time) was used to update the basemap cache for USGS viewers. The issues that the users are seeing are a result of this different process. We are actively investigating these and working on a fix as quickly as possible.

USGS Hydrography Layer: We are currently using the "faster" process to update the Hydrography layer, and anticipate seeing results soon. However, we also expect the same issues to manifest in that basemap cache.

The options for CSS are for us to continue to prioritize rapid updates that will likely not show appropriately at each level, or we can go back to our standardized process which will take longer but should catch similar issues as a part of the standard process. There are 16 "zoom" levels so standard process does take more time.

We can also turn off basemap caching which would eliminate the presence of the "Gulf of Mexico" name, but the end-users will deal with at least five minute refresh times due to the scale of the maps.






