While discussing other matters with the President at 8 p.m., 3/14/66 (he called concerning the Western Union incident at Austin, Texas), he stated he was very concerned about the actions of Iron Curtain embassies in Washington, D. C.

The President indicated that he wanted the Director advised that the FBI should constantly keep abreast of the actions of representatives of these embassies in making contact with senators and congressmen and any citizens of a prominent nature. The President indicated that he strongly felt that much of the protest concerning his Vietnam policies, particularly the hearings in the Senate, had been generated by the Soviet embassy.

The President stated that the FBI should use any method or device whatsoever to keep him advised as to the identity and purpose of visits paid by legislators and other prominent U.S. citizens to Iron Curtain embassies. He stated he wanted to reiterate that the FBI should attempt any method in order to ascertain such information.

The President continued that he would like for the Director to have prepared a chronological study, beginning in July 1964 and continuing up to the present time, of all legislators (meaning senators and congressmen) who have called at the Russian Embassy. He stated he felt such a study will clearly reflect that Senators Fulbright and Morse have been in constant contact with the Russian Embassy.

The President stated that he was also troubled about the actions of Joseph Alsop, the syndicated columnist. He mentioned that Alsop has been "bitching" about the fact that he cannot receive any classified information from the White House or the Pentagon. Alsop, therefore, plans to journey to Hong Kong and from there to Vietnam, so that he can obtain information firsthand about the war in Vietnam. The President added that Alsop probably wants to stop over in Hong Kong so that he can visit with some of his "queer" boyfriends. He mentioned that Alsop probably has a large amount of secret documents on hand and it would be wrong for him to reveal the contents of these documents to the Russians or Red Chinese. The President indicated that the FBI should keep a very close check on Joseph Alsop insofar as contacts with Iron Curtain representatives are concerned.

The President asked if the FBI had an office in Vietnam. I told him we did not. He then asked if we had an office in Hong Kong. I told him this was a foreign intelligence matter and, therefore, under CIA's jurisdiction. He stated he knew this, but wanted to know if we had a representative in Hong Kong. I told him that the Director was in process at the present time of opening an office in Hong Kong; however, as of this date the man has not arrived there. *et 5-1*

The President stated we should carefully check and find out when Alsop planned to go to Hong Kong and if we had a man there at the time we should keep abreast of Alsop's movements. I told the President this would be most difficult, in view of the fact that the FBI had specifically promised the British that our representative would not be operational. The President stated nevertheless perhaps we could check Alsop through other sources. *(S)*

Re memorandum Mr. DeLoach to Mr. Tolson dated 3-15-66 reporting that the President indicated he strongly felt that much of the protest concerning his Vietnam policies, particularly the hearings in the Senate, had been generated by the Soviet Embassy. The President requested that the Director have prepared, a chronological study, beginning in July, 1964, and continuing up to the present time listing all Senators and Congressmen who have contacted the Russian Embassy. The President indicated he felt such study would clearly reflect that Senator Fulbright of Arkansas and Senator Morse of Oregon have been in constant contact with the Russian Embassy.

We have compiled the study requested by the President and it discloses that thirty U.S. Senators, twenty-two U.S. Representatives and thirty-seven staff members of Congress have had contact with the Soviets since July 1, 1964. Based upon our coverage, it appears the Soviets are making more frequent contacts with Senators J. William Fulbright, Robert F. Kennedy (New York), George McGovern (South Dakota), and Wayne L. Morse, than with other U.S. Legislators. There are several staff members of Congress who appear to have been singled out more by the Soviets than other staff members. Included are _____ to Senator Wayne Morse; _____ to Representative William Fitts Ryan of New York; _____ Office of the Secretary of the Senate; _____ to the Senate Committee on Foreign Relations; and _____ to Senator J. William Fulbr

In accordance with the President's request on March 14, 1966, there is enclosed a comprehensive summary dated March 18, 1966, which sets forth information we have developed through our coverage of Soviet officials and establishments in Washington, D. C., concerning contacts between representatives of the Soviet Union and members or staff personnel of the United States Congress during the period July 1, 1964, through March 17, 1966. The date of the contact is set forth in the enclosed summary in chronological order concerning each United States Senator, United States Representative and staff member contacted.

There is also enclosed a ~~three~~-page memorandum dated March 18, 1966, which sets forth contacts between Soviet officials in Washington, D. C., and Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey and [redacted]. This data is being forwarded to you in view of Mr. Humphrey's previous affiliation with the United States Senate prior to the time he assumed the Vice Presidency. 105-229897-6

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A review of the summary disclosed that Soviet officials in Washington, D. C., are known to have been in contact with thirty United States Senators, twenty-two United States Representatives and thirty-seven members of their staffs since July 1, 1964. Based upon our coverage, it appears that Soviet officials are making more contacts with Senator J. William Fulbright of Arkansas, Senator Robert F. Kennedy of New York, Senator George McGovern of South Dakota and Senator Wayne L. Morse of Oregon than with other United States legislators. 65-30092-7574

Dear Mr. Watson:

In accordance with the President's request, you have been furnished comprehensive summaries on March 21, 1966, and April 1, 1966, setting forth information we have developed through our coverage of Soviet officials and establishments in Washington, D. C., concerning contacts between representatives of the Soviet Union and members or staff personnel of the United States Congress. There is enclosed a similar summary covering such contacts during the period of March 30, 1966, to April 10, 1966.

Senator James Caleb Boggs (Delaware) has volunteered information regarding the activities of Anatoli G. Myshkov, First Secretary, Soviet Embassy, which tends to clarify certain items set forth in the summaries previously furnished to you.

At the time of the courtesy call paid by Myshkov in March, 1966, Myshkov stated that the purpose of his visit was to insure that Senator Boggs had been well treated during his recent visit to the Soviet Union as a member of the Senatorial Delegation headed by Senator Michael J. Mansfield (Montana) late in 1965. After discussing tourist attractions in the Soviet Union, Myshkov directed the conversation to Vietnam. Senator Boggs stated he was quite frank in his comments to the effect that he feels this Nation is on the right course in Vietnam.

Senator Boggs stated that sometime later, while he was out of the city, Myshkov stopped at his office and personally delivered invitations for [redacted] to Senator Boggs, and [redacted]

In accordance with the President's request on March 14, 1966, we furnished the White House a comprehensive summary setting forth information we developed through our coverage of Soviet officials and establishments in Washington, D. C., concerning contacts between representatives of the Soviet Union and members or staff personnel of the U. S. Congress during the period July 1, 1964 through March 17, 1966. On March 21, 1966, the Director advised that the President was very pleased with the material furnished to him and the Director requested that we send over similar material to bring the matter up to date every ten days to two weeks, which has been done.

Prior to March 14, 1966, we furnished this information to the White House as the individual contacts came to our attention and we are continuing this action at the present time. This results in unnecessary duplication of dissemination to the White House.

This can be corrected by eliminating the individual letters reporting contacts of members of Congress and their staff personnel with Soviet officials. These contacts, which are more or less of a routine character, can be included in the summary which is furnished to the White House biweekly.

Of course, if some unusual circumstances exist, such as a contact involving a Senator who is a member of the Foreign Relations Committee, we should effect immediate dissemination of the information and thereafter include it in the biweekly summary furnished the White House; however, in routine contacts we should limit dissemination to the biweekly summary.

RECOMMENDATION:

If you agree, we will handle dissemination of information developed through our coverage of Soviet officials and establishments concerning contacts with members of staff personnel of the U. S. Congress as set forth above.

Committee on Commerce, United States Senate, advised the Federal Bureau of Investigation that about three weeks ago he encountered Geliy D. Skritskiy, Second Secretary, in downtown Washington, D. C., and they agreed to meet for lunch a few days later.

[redacted] recalled that about a year ago, Skritskiy attended a hearing on two on East-West Trade, which hearings were open to the public and sponsored by the Committee on Commerce. During the evening luncheon, according to [redacted] Skritskiy indicated an interest in knowing if anything was new in the area of East-West Trade.

[redacted] replied there appeared to be nothing new on this subject. Skritskiy remarked that probably little progress could be made in stepping up East-West Trade as long as the Viet-Nam war continued.

[redacted] mentioned to Skritskiy that the Department of Commerce might send a trade delegation to Hungary in October, 1966, and wondered if it might serve the cause of East-West Trade if the mission made a side trip to the Soviet Union. Skritskiy replied it was always useful to talk but he felt that so long as the Viet-Nam war continued little progress would result from the talks.

Myshkov, First Secretary, on Myshkov's invitation. During lunch Myshkov inquired of [redacted] concerning Congressman Joelson's stand on the Viet-Nam situation. He was told by [redacted] that the Congressman supports the Administration's Viet-Nam policy. Myshkov then spoke of a visit made to the Soviet Embassy by Representative Robert E. Sweeney of Ohio, and eight constituents, including a Rabbi, who wanted to discuss alleged anti-Semitism in the Soviet Union. Myshkov made reference to an article prepared by Drew Pearson in the "Washington Post and Times Herald" wherein Myshkov gained the impression Representative Sweeney had a reputation of being anti-Semitic.

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Myshkov spoke of newspaper accounts of alleged misuse of campaign funds by Senator Thomas J. Dodd of Connecticut and wondered where Drew Pearson and his associate Jack Anderson received their information concerning this matter. He inquired as to [redacted] opinion on the outcome of the inquiry by the United States Senate Select Committee on Standards and Ethics concerning Senator Dodd.

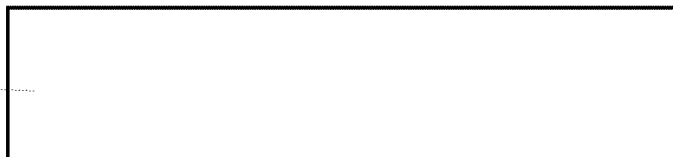
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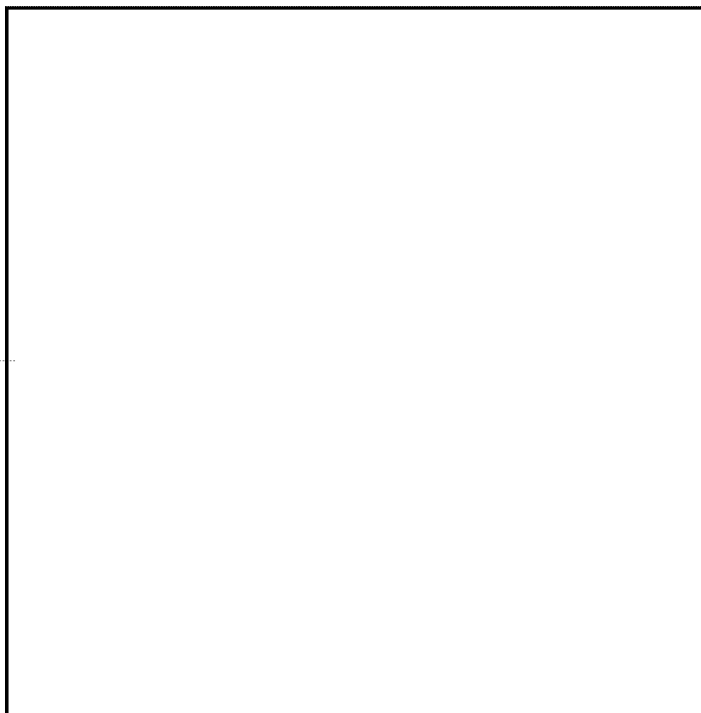

In accordance with the President's request on March 14, 1966, we furnished to the White House a comprehensive summary which set forth information we developed through our coverage of Soviet officials and establishments in Washington, D. C., concerning contacts between representatives of the Soviet Union and members or staff personnel of the United States Congress during the period July 1, 1964, through March 17, 1966. On March 21, 1966, the Director advised that the President was very pleased with the material we had furnished to him and the Director instructed that we send over similar material to the White House bringing this matter up to date every ten days to two weeks. We have done this.

By airtel May 2, 1966, the Washington Field Office transmitted to the Bureau a memorandum dated May 2, 1966, setting forth additional contacts between Soviet officials in Washington, D. C., with members or staff personnel of the United States Congress during the period April 21, 1966, through May 1, 1966.

In memorandum Mr. DeLoach to Mr. Tolson dated March 15, 1966, it was reported that the President indicated he strongly felt that most of the protest concerning his Vietnam policies, particularly the hearings in the Senate, had been generated by the Soviet Embassy. The President requested that the Director have prepared a summary beginning in July, 1964, listing all Senators and Congressmen who have been in contact with the Soviet Embassy. The President indicated he felt such study would clearly reflect that Senator J. William Fulbright of Arkansas and Senator Wayne Morse of Oregon have been in constant contact with the Soviet Embassy.

In accordance with the President's request, we prepared the summary desired by him and listed under each Senator and Congressman and staff member of Congress a chronological listing of contacts between such individual and Soviet officials in Washington, D. C. The President was very pleased with this summary.

The President has now requested that we furnish him similar information commencing January 1, 1965, except that we set forth each contact in a chronological fashion which would give a day-to-day picture of contacts between Congressional representatives and Soviet officials. The President felt that such summary would give a concise picture of a pattern of constant and continual contacts between the Soviets and Congressional representatives.

We have prepared the summary desired by the President. Upon approval, such summary will be printed on card paper which is heavier than ordinary bond paper and the summary will be included in a hard-bound three-ring binder.

Frelinghuysen, New Jersey, advised a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that he and his wife attended a reception at the Soviet Embassy, on April 30, 1966, for members of the Congressional Secretaries Club, a social club composed of staff employees of the House of Representatives. Here he met several members of the Soviet Embassy staff among whom were Yuriy K. Linkov, Third Secretary, and Linkov's wife.

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On May 16, 1966, Linkov contacted [REDACTED] and arranged to meet him for lunch on [REDACTED]. During lunch, Linkov engaged in a discussion concerning the difference between the Senate Foreign Relations Committee and the House of Representatives Committee on Foreign Affairs, noting that Representative Frelinghuysen was a member of the Foreign Affairs Committee. He further inquired as to whether the President planned to have aerial bombing in Vietnam extended to oil storage targets near Hanoi and Haiphong, and whether it was true that American troop strength in Vietnam would be raised to 400,000 men. Linkov later stated he heard that there would be a considerable change in the State Department and that Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara would replace Dean Rusk as Secretary of State. Linkov is suspected of being an officer of the Committee of State Security.

Memorandum Branigan to Sullivan dated May 5, 1966, reported that the President had requested we furnish to him a chronological summary showing contacts between Congressional representatives and Soviet officials since January 1, 1965. The President felt such summary would give a concise picture of a pattern of constant and continual contacts between the Soviets and Congressional representatives.

The summary desired by the President was prepared and delivered to him May 13, 1966. The Soviets are continuing their contacts with Congressional personnel and in accordance with instructions of the Director, we are continuing to send up-to-date information regarding such contacts to the President, in order that the summary will be continually current.

There have been 23 additional contacts of this nature during the period June 13 through June 30, 1966. We have prepared the concise summary of each of these contacts and have printed such data on pages 55 through 60 for insertion at the end of the President's copy of the summary. We have also prepared a revised ten-page index to make such index completely current.

Memorandum Branigan to Sullivan dated May 5, 1966, reported that the President had requested we furnish to him a chronological summary showing contacts between Congressional representatives and Soviet officials since January 1, 1965. The President felt such summary would give a concise picture of a pattern of constant and continual contacts between the Soviets and Congressional representatives.

The summary desired by the President was prepared and delivered to him on May 13, 1966. The Soviets are continuing their contacts with Congressional personnel and in accordance with instructions of the Director, we are continuing to send up-to-date information regarding such contacts to the President in order that the summary will be continually current.

There were ten additional items setting forth details of contacts between the Soviets and Congressional personnel during the period July 1 through July 20, 1966. We have prepared a concise summary of each of these contacts and have printed such data on pages 61 through 63 for insertion at the end of the President's copy of the summary. We have also prepared a revised 11-page index to make such index completely current.

Memorandum Branigan to Sullivan dated May 5, 1966, reported that the President had requested we furnish to him a chronological summary showing contacts between Congressional representatives and Soviet officials since January 1, 1965. The President felt such summary would give a concise picture of a pattern of constant and continual contacts between the Soviets and Congressional representatives.

The summary desired by the President was prepared and was delivered to him on May 13, 1966. The Soviets are continuing their contacts with Congressional personnel and in accordance with instructions of the Director, we are continuing to send up-to-date information regarding such contacts to the President in order that the summary will be continually current.

There were 15 additional items setting forth details of contacts between the Soviets and Congressional personnel during the period July 19, 1966, through August 10, 1966. We have prepared a concise summary of each of these contacts and have printed such data on pages 64 through 67 for insertion at the end of the President's copy of the summary. We have also prepared a revised eleven-page index to make such index completely current.

Representative Tunney stated he had put the Soviet in his place throughout the entire conversation and had not agreed with anything the Soviet had stated. Representative Tunney added that he felt the Soviet probably would not contact him again but he desired to make this first meeting a matter of record in FBI files.

Memorandum Branigan to Sullivan dated May 5, 1966, reported that the President had requested we furnish to him a chronological summary showing contacts between Congressional representatives and Soviet officials since January 1, 1965. The President felt such summary would give a concise picture of a pattern of constant and continual contacts between the Soviets and Congressional representatives.

The summary desired by the President was prepared and was delivered to him on May 13, 1966. The Soviets are continuing their contacts with Congressional personnel and in accordance with instructions of the Director, we are continuing to send up-to-date information regarding such contacts to the President in order that the summary will be continually current.

There were 17 additional items setting forth details of contacts between the Soviets and Congressional personnel during the period August 11, 1966, through September 1, 1966. We have prepared a concise summary of each of these contacts and have printed such data on pages 68 through 71 for insertion at the end of the President's copy of the summary. We have also prepared a revised eleven-page index to make such index completely current.

Memorandum Branigan to Sullivan dated May 5, 1966, reported that the President had requested we furnish to him a chronological summary showing contacts between Congressional representatives and Soviet officials since January 1, 1965. The President felt such summary would give a concise picture of a pattern of constant and continual contacts between the Soviets and Congressional representatives.

The summary desired by the President was prepared and was delivered to him on May 13, 1966. The Soviets are continuing their contacts with Congressional personnel and in accordance with instructions of the Director, we are continuing to send up-to-date information regarding such contacts to the President in order that the summary will be continually current.

There were 25 additional items setting forth details of contacts between the Soviets and Congressional personnel during the period September 2, 1966, through September 21, 1966. We have prepared a concise summary of each of these contacts and have printed such data on pages 72 through 78 for insertion at the end of the President's copy of the summary. We have also prepared a revised 13-page index to make such index current.

ACTION:

Attached for delivery to the President are the new title page dated September 30, 1966, up-to-date pages 72 through 78 of the summary, and index pages one through thirteen containing our revised index to the summary. Mrs. Stegall, personal secretary to the President, will assure that appropriate revisions are made in the bound copy of the summary maintained by the President.

Representative Joelson informed a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that at 10 a.m., October 5, 1966, Igor D. Bubnov visited Representative Joelson's office and introduced himself. He stated he had as one of his duties

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at the Soviet Embassy the responsibility of analyzing the happenings in Congress. Bubnov raised the question of alleged anti-Semitism in the Soviet Union and denied that such a situation currently exists. Bubnov questioned Representative Joelson on the major issues confronting him in the forthcoming congressional elections. On the subject of Vietnam, Bubnov was surprised when Representative Joelson informed him that criticism of the Administration has principally been for its not being aggressive enough militarily and not, as Bubnov thought, from people who want the Administration to de-escalate the situation. 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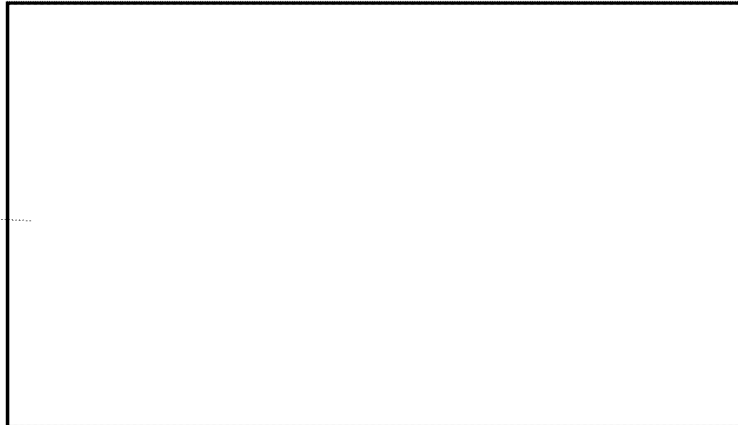

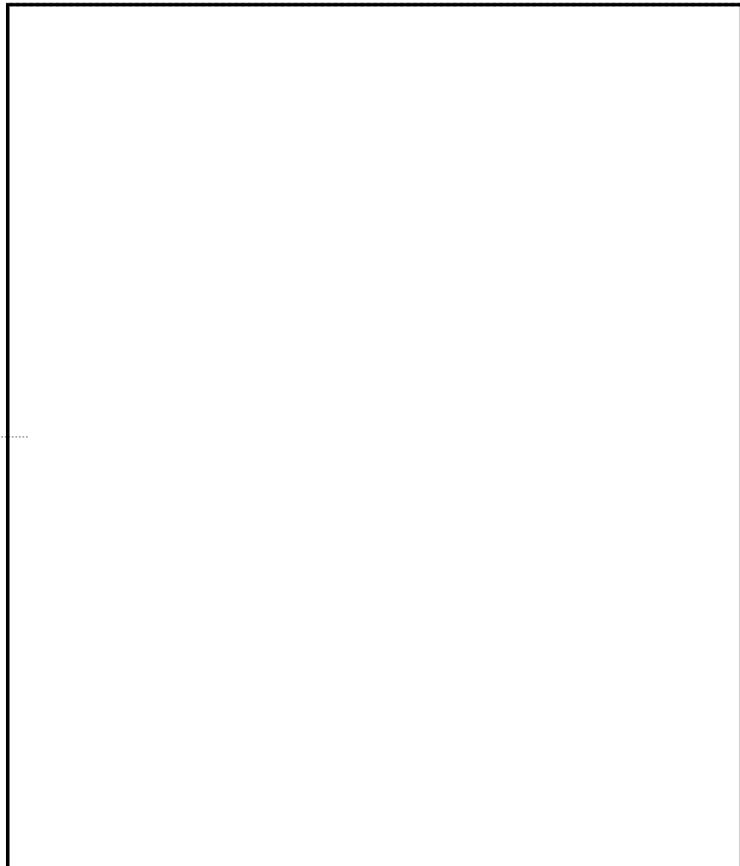

Memorandum Branigan to Sullivan dated May 5, 1966, reported that the President requested we furnish to him a chronological summary showing contacts between Congressional representatives and Soviet officials since January 1, 1965. The President felt such summary would give a concise picture of a pattern of constant and continual contacts between the Soviets and Congressional representatives.

The summary desired by the President was prepared and was delivered to him on May 13, 1966. The Soviets are continuing their contacts with Congressional personnel and in accordance with instructions of the Director, we are continuing to send up-to-date information regarding such contacts to the President in order that the summary will be continually current.

There were 14 additional items setting forth details of contacts between the Soviets and Congressional personnel during the period September 22, 1966, through October 11, 1966. These contacts disclose that the Soviets are continuing their attempts to determine United States policy in dealing with the Vietnam situation and other trouble areas throughout the world. We have prepared a concise summary of each of these 14 contacts and have printed such data on pages 79 through 82 for insertion at the end of the President's copy of the summary. We have also prepared a revised twelve-page index to make such index current.

Submissions covering the period from the first through the fifteenth of each month should issue from your office on the sixteenth of each month and those for the period of the sixteenth through the end of each month on the first day of the following month. When the first or the sixteenth falls on a weekend or holiday, your submissions should reach the Bureau on the first work day following these dates so that prompt dissemination of the material may be effected by Bureau.

Stenographic, Agent and supervisory personnel of your office should utilize meticulous care to insure that information submitted by you is correct as to spelling, punctuation and grammar. Names of individuals mentioned should be checked against the Congressional Directory, Congressional Staff Directory or Diplomatic List to insure they are correctly spelled and the positions or titles of these persons are accurately described.

Note that intelligence affiliation, if any, of Soviets mentioned is not to be set forth; also, that when the name of an individual is set forth two or more times on the same page, it will not be necessary to restate it in full or set forth the position and/or title of the individual. Exception to this involves Senators or Congressmen whose titles should always be used with their names even though only the last name is used.

Handling as above will result in substantial savings of stenographic and Agent time at Seat of Government as well as expedite the necessary dissemination of the information which must be effected by Bureau.

NOTE:

WFO currently submits five copies of an LHM at approximately ten-day intervals wherein information concerning contacts between representatives of the USSR and members or staff personnel of U. S. Congress is set forth. The material is set forth in chronological order under caption of the Congressional staff personnel involved. These LHMS are not disseminated by Bureau but are used to prepare a plastiplat setting forth the information which has, in the past, been furnished to the White House in chronological order by date. This procedure necessitates review of the material submitted by WFO, redictating it or having an SOG stenographer retype the material on a plastiplat which is used to produce the pages containing the information disseminated to the White House. WFO preparation of the material on a plastiplat in form as described above will result in substantial savings of stenographic and Agent time at SOG and enable more expeditious dissemination of the material to the White House.

The Soviets are continuing their contacts with Congressional personnel and in accordance with instructions of the Director, we are continuing to send up-to-date information regarding such contacts to the President in order that the summary will be continually current.

There were 8 additional items setting forth details of contacts between the Soviets and Congressional personnel during the period November 16 through November 30, 1966. These contacts indicate the Soviets continue their efforts to ascertain information concerning United States domestic and foreign policy. We have prepared a concise summary of each of these 8 contacts and have printed such data on pages 92 through 94 for insertion at the end of the President's copy of the summary. We have also prepared a revised 13-page index to make such index current.

Memorandum Branigan to Sullivan dated May 5, 1966, reported that the President requested we furnish to him a chronological summary showing contacts between Congressional representatives and Soviet officials since January 1, 1965. The President felt such summary would give a concise picture of a pattern of constant and continual contacts between the Soviets and Congressional representatives. (S)

The summary desired by the President was prepared and was delivered to him on May 13, 1966. The Soviets are continuing their contacts with Congressional personnel and in accordance with instructions of the Director, we are continuing to send up-to-date information regarding such contacts to the President in order that the summary will be continually current. (S)

There were 10 additional items setting forth details of contacts between the Soviets and Congressional personnel during the period February 1 through February 15, 1967. These contacts indicate the Soviets continue their efforts to ascertain information concerning United States domestic and foreign policy. We have prepared a concise summary of each of these 10 contacts and have printed such data on pages 110 through 113 for insertion at the end of the President's copy of the summary. We have also prepared a revised 19-page index to make such index current. (S)

Memorandum Branigan to Sullivan dated May 5, 1966, reported that the President requested we furnish to him a chronological summary showing contacts between Congressional representatives and Soviet officials since January 1, 1965. The President felt such summary would give a concise picture of a pattern of constant and continual contacts between the Soviets and Congressional representatives.

The summary desired by the President was prepared and was delivered to him on May 13, 1966. The Soviets are continuing their contacts with Congressional personnel and in accordance with instructions of the Director, we are continuing to send up-to-date information regarding such contacts to the President in order that the summary will be continually current.

There were 18 additional items setting forth details of contacts between the Soviets and Congressional personnel during the period May 16 through 31, 1967. These contacts indicate the Soviets continue their efforts to ascertain information concerning United States domestic and foreign policy. We have prepared a concise summary of each of these 18 contacts and have printed such data on pages 151 through 154 for insertion at the end of the President's copy of the summary. We have also prepared a revised 23-page index to make such index current.

Attached for delivery to the President are the new title page dated June 7, 1967, up-to-date pages 151 through 154 of the summary and revised index pages. Mrs. Stegall, personal secretary to the President, will assure that appropriate revisions are made in the bound copy of the summary maintained by the President.

Since May, 1966, we have furnished a bimonthly summary to the President showing contacts between Congressional representatives and Soviet officials. No comment has been received from the White House indicating a continuing interest in receipt of this material.

This recommends that a representative in the Office of Assistant to the Director DeLoach determine if it is desired that these summaries continue to be furnished to Mrs. Mildred Stegall, personal secretary to the President.

BACKGROUND:

In May, 1966, the President requested we furnish him a chronological summary showing contacts between Congressional representatives and Soviet officials since January 1, 1965. Summary requested was prepared and delivered to the President May 13, 1966. Since that time we have continued to furnish bimonthly summary to Mrs. Mildred Stegall, personal secretary to the President, setting forth additional contacts which occurred during the pertinent period together with revised index pages to make it current.

The index now consists of 23 pages listing names of all persons mentioned in the summary. In listing the names of Congressional employees, we have also included the title of their position and the Congressman or committee employing. Soviets have been listed by names only. Since the titles of the Americans involved frequently change, this necessitates additions and deletions to the index so that it conforms with the summary. In order to reduce the length of the index and to provide uniformity to it, we contemplate revising the index to the summary which will be furnished subsequent to September 1, 1967, so that only the names of both Soviets and Americans mentioned in the summary will be set forth in the index. Their titles and the positions which they occupy will continue to be set forth in the details of the summary showing the contacts which are effected.

OBSERVATIONS:

The summary now comprises 174 pages of information which has been furnished since May, 1966. The material is bound in four looseleaf binders which bear the caption of this memorandum and which are ~~classified "Secret."~~ Since submission of the original summary we have never received any comment from the White House that the material is of continuing interest or that it is still desired that we continue to submit it on a bimonthly basis.

Details of the contacts and revised index pages have averaged 23 pages per bimonthly submission over the last six months. It costs \$2.50 per page to print this material which does not include Agent or stenographic time to prepare, proofread and assemble. Based on the above, cost of the printing alone during the past six-month period has been \$700.

RECOMMENDATION:

That a representative in the Office of Assistant to the Director, DeLoach determine from Mrs. Mildred Stegall, personal secretary to the President, if the material we have been furnishing is of continuing interest and if it is desired that we follow our present procedure of furnishing it on a bimonthly basis. If the information is desired, the index will be revised as indicated above with the summary submitted subsequent to September 1, 1967, which will include material accumulated during the period August 16 through 31, 1967.

At request of White House from 1-1-65 through 12-31-68, we furnished bimonthly summaries to it concerning captioned subject matter. Summaries classified "Secret" since majority of information received from sensitive coverage of foreign diplomatic establishments.

Total material submitted comprises five volumes which are maintained in three-ring, loose-leaf binders. Seven extra sets were maintained in Room 824, 9th and D, in order to satisfy any additional dissemination requirements, which were not forthcoming, and bimonthly summaries have not been issued since 1-1-69.

Since future dissemination requests for this material are unlikely and in order to conserve space, five of the seven volumes currently maintained in Room 824, 9th and D, should be destroyed. One complete volume, without loose-leaf binders, should be retained so that our file will show exactly what material was disseminated and one set, with loose-leaf binder intact, should be retained in the event we should have to disseminate in future. Suitable reproduction can be effected from this copy.

In view of sensitive nature of material involved, file copy and copy for future dissemination should be maintained as bulky exhibit in Special File Room. Extra loose-leaf binder covers will be forwarded to Exhibits Section in the event it is possible to remove the subject matter appearing on the covers and utilize them for some other project in future. Noted original acquisition cost of these folders was considerable.

Attached for approval is communication containing information concerning captioned matter for delivery to the Honorable H. R. Haldeman, Assistant to the President, the White House, pursuant to his request for this material.

Memorandum C. D. Brennan to Mr. W. C. Sullivan, dated 7/27/70 advised that Haldeman was interested in receiving any information Bureau had developed relating to contacts between Soviet nationals and members of Congress and their staff. Soviet Section, Domestic Intelligence Division, has reviewed information developed through our coverage of Soviet officials and establishments from January, 1967, to date concerning this subject matter and incorporated pertinent information in communication suitable for dissemination to Haldeman.

Review disclosed continuing interest by Soviets in maintaining contacts with and cultivating members or staff personnel of the U. S. Congress; however, frequency of such contacts have declined during past four-year period. Projection of information developed to date this year through December, 1970, should show substantial decrease. Our information also shows Soviets apparently making more contacts with Congressmen or members of their staff who have depicted themselves as "doves" concerning U. S. foreign policy, such as Senators Fulbright, McCarthy, McGovern and Muskie, than with other U. S. Legislators. Majority of Soviet personnel maintaining contacts on Capitol Hill are either known or suspected intelligence personnel and while most of their contacts appear to conform with overt diplomatic duties, communication points out we cannot completely disregard possibility of Soviet intelligence recruitment efforts on Capitol Hill. Succinct statement concerning Soviet recruitment of former employee of Representative Alvin E. O'Konski (R-Wisc.), whose activities we directed with Congressman's concurrence, and effort by female Cultural Attache to establish social relationship with Congressman Kenneth J. Gray are included without identifying any individual involved by name.

On an annual basis, usually in the Spring, the Soviets hold a reception at their Embassy in Washington, D. C., for Congressional staff employees. Individuals who have attended these functions have informed us that Soviets whom they initially encountered at these events have later used the introductions effected there as an entree for further contacts. With concurrence of the Chairmen of the respective Congressional Committees or from individual Congressmen themselves, we are currently directing the activities of eight persons employed on Capitol Hill as a means of keeping apprised of Soviet contacts there. None of these eight situations is presently indicative of being sustained by the Soviets for clandestine intelligence purposes; however, information received from these individuals and that developed through our other coverage discloses that the majority of Soviet personnel maintaining contacts on Capitol Hill [REDACTED]

By letter 7/29/70, we transmitted to Mr. H. R. Haldeman, Assistant to the President, a letterhead memorandum concerning contacts by Soviet officials with personnel of the U. S. Congress. This was in response to Haldeman's request.

On August 4, 1970 [redacted] at the White House, advised Supervisor [redacted] that Haldeman was most pleased to receive this information and felt it would be very helpful to him. [redacted] advised confidentially by way of background that [redacted]

[redacted] of the Subcommittee on National Security of the Government Operations Committee, of which Senator Jackson is chairman, has, she believes, detected an increase in contacts by Soviets with her office. She has kept some records of this which she made available to Jackson, who in turn furnished them to the White House. The White House has requested that the FBI contact [redacted] and interview her in detail concerning the nature and extent of these contacts.

Bureau files show [redacted] has worked in the Senate since [redacted] In [redacted] based on [redacted] however, no determination on loyalty was made since State Department withdrew its request. Updating of this inquiry in 1965 was completely favorable with individuals such as Senators Jackson and Mansfield commenting very favorably concerning [redacted] performance and general reputation.

The Crime Records Division advises our relations with Senator Jackson have been cordial. Since the White House has asked that we interview [redacted] it is believed that we should contact Senator Jackson as a matter of courtesy and secure his approval for the interview.

[redacted] Subcommittee on National Security (SNS) of the Committee on Government Operations of the United States Senate, advised on August 10, 1970, that she has served in her present capacity for approximately [redacted] years. She said that throughout that period members of the Soviet Embassy staff and representatives of the various official Soviet news agencies have shown some interest in the publications issued by the SNS and have made occasional requests of her office for copies of these publications. She stated that visits to her office and requests for SNS publications have intensified during 1970. Concerned at this evidence of increased interest by the Soviets relative to SNS affairs, [redacted] stated that she had furnished the SNS Chairman, Senator Henry M. Jackson of Washington, an account of her knowledge in the matter.

[redacted] stated she felt that this new Soviet interest in the SNS grew out of the publication, in January, 1970, of the results of the SNS hearing, in December, 1969, with the British author and analyst of Soviet history and Soviet political leaders, Robert Conquest. Shortly thereafter, the SNS published a paper by Professor Adam Ulam, Harvard University, entitled "Communist Doctrine and Soviet Diplomacy: Some Observations," which she felt was also of special interest to the Soviets.

[] said that the most frequent Soviet visitor to the SNS office during 1970 has been []. He first visited the office in January, 1970, and obtained copies of published material relative to "Planning - Programming - Budgeting," as set out on page six of the "List of Jackson Subcommittee Publications (As of July, 1970)," a copy of which list is attached in the appendix. Shortly thereafter, [] consulted with [] regarding that material, and proved to be knowledgeable in the field and, in her opinion, a person of excellent academic background and intellect. He informed [] that his profession is that of librarian.

[] visited the SNS office an estimated total of eight or ten times between January, 1970, and the present. During that time, he requested copies of all the remaining publications set out in the above-mentioned appended list. Copies of all such publications still available were furnished to him. [] had no recollection of which of these publications might not have been available and thus not furnished to him. She stated that none of these publications were subject to government security classification.

In the course of his visits, [] presented [] and her secretary, [] each with a bottle of vodka and a small wooden Russian doll. He also extended to [] an invitation to a reception of the Soviet Embassy, Washington, D.C. (WDC), on May 8, 1970, which she accepted but did not attend.

On one of [] visits, he was accompanied by Igor D. Bubnov, then a First Secretary at the Soviet Embassy, WDC, whom he introduced to []. It is noted that Bubnov has subsequently been promoted to the position of Counselor at the Soviet Embassy.

[redacted] also named Vadim I. Kuznetsov, Third Secretary, Embassy of the USSR, as another Soviet Embassy official who has visited the SNS office on more than one occasion.

[redacted] advised, in addition to the above, the usual persons whom she knows or believes to be from the official press organizations of the USSR have continued to stop in the SNS office occasionally for publications and information releases. She does not know these representatives by name but their visits, and those of other foreign news agencies, are the routine operational procedure for Congressional offices such as the SNS office.

[redacted] advised that on some of the visits by these Soviet representatives to her office, two of them came together, and while one was making inquiry about a publication, the other seemed to her to be trying to observe whatever material might be spread on the nearest desk. She said, however, that no information of a classified or sensitive nature crosses those desks in the front of the office near which she had noted such activity. She advised that she had no independent recollection regarding which of the Soviets had visited the office in pairs, and that it had occurred only a few times.

[redacted] said that she had discerned a definite effort on the part of the various Soviets to determine the names of the persons on her staff. She cited the apparent efforts of Vladimir N. Orlov to engage one of the summer interns, [redacted] in conversation. On that particular occasion, [redacted] interceded by introducing herself to Orlov and asking if she could help him. Orlov showed annoyance at the interruption and later apparently made a point of visiting the office during [redacted] lunch hour to pick up a publication. He spoke

[] said she similarly intercepted Vadim I. Kuznetsov late in July, 1970, when he came to the office and approached [] desk in the front of the room. Kuznetsov, who did not seem to have a definite errand to perform, merely picked up one of the routine publications and left the office without further conversation. She gathered the impression that he, too, might have been annoyed at her interruption, and this impression has been reinforced by the fact that none of the Soviets have visited the SNS office since this incident, a period of two weeks or more.

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[] advised that the SNS office occupies a single, unpartitioned room in the Old Senate Office Building. She has a close relationship with her staff, generally only [] people, including summer interns, and there is no question but that any contact by the Soviets of an unusual nature with her staff will be brought to her attention.

contacts followed the pattern of such contacts over the years
in that they visited her office infrequently, came alone, and
came for the apparent purpose of obtaining publicly released

It is noted that [redacted] previously reported
her impression, on August 10, 1970, that these Soviets had
intensified their interest in the Subcommittee's work. This
impression was based upon her observation that visits by the
Soviets had increased, that sometimes they visited the office
in pairs, and upon their apparent interest in determining the
identities of persons employed in the office. She stated that
at that time, however, any such intensified interest apparently
had terminated, since no contact of her office by any Soviet
representative had occurred for a period of two weeks or more.

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[redacted] advised that the first visit to her
office by a Soviet representative after the above mentioned
hiatus was by Vladimir N. Orlov, First Secretary, Soviet Em-
bassy, WDC. This visit took place on or about August 11, 1970.
Orlov stopped briefly in the office to ask if there had been
any releases by the Subcommittee which had not been picked up
by someone from the Soviet Embassy. She told him that there

had been none, and Orlov left without further conversation.

Based upon available information and investigation

[redacted] advised that [redacted] had visited the Subcommittee office twice since August 10, 1970. On his first visit he was seeking a specific publication, the nature of which was not recalled by [redacted] and which did not emanate from her office. She said that she directed him elsewhere for this publication. On his second visit, which took place during September, 1970, [redacted] asked for copies of some of the recent publications of the Subcommittee. When [redacted] told him that there were none that had not already been procured by other Soviet Embassy representatives, [redacted] stated that he is not on the regular Embassy staff, but is with the Soviet Military Office in WDC. He did not press the matter, however, and left her office after picking up a few publications from the stacks which are maintained there for the public.

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The July, 1970, issue of "Employees of Diplomatic Missions" published by the United States Department of State (USDS) lists [redacted] as an employee of the Embassy of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, WDC. On the basis of available information and investigation, [redacted]

[redacted] advised that [redacted] who has previously been a frequent visitor to the Subcommittee office, had recontacted her by telephone on September 10, 1970, and asked her if there were any new publications available. She told him that no new publications had been released since he last contacted her office.

She said that [] was apparently using this technique to avoid any personal responsibility for fulfilling a request which she had previously made of him. She had told him that he ought to furnish the Subcommittee with publications of equal substance and value prepared by the Subcommittee's Soviet counterpart in exchange for the ones he was receiving from the Subcommittee. This counterpart organ in the Soviet government, according to her understanding, would be the American Institute of the Institute of World Economy and International Relations of the Academy of Sciences in Moscow. She said that [] has never provided her with any such publications and told her that such documents would be issued by the Soviet Government in the Russian language only. He told her that he felt certain that translations of this material were available through some agency of the U.S. Government.

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[] said that [] also asked to borrow a copy of a book []

[] stopped at her office on the same day to pick up the book, but she found that she did not have a copy at the office. They agreed that she will bring a copy to the office and he will pick it up later.

Regarding [] interest in the functions of the Subcommittee, [] said that it is her understanding that he is doing a study for the Soviet government concerning U.S. international relations and is doing extensive reading and research on the subject.

The July, 1970, issue of "Employees of Diplomatic Missions" published by USDS, lists [] as an employee of the Embassy of the USSR, WDC.

who has held this position for approximately [redacted] years,
furnished the following information:

During this [redacted] year period staff members of the
Soviet Embassy and personnel from the various Soviet news
agencies having representation in Washington, D. C., have
shown some interest in publications issued by the SNSIO and
have made occasional requests for copies of these items.
She was of the opinion that visits by such individuals to
her office and requests for publications have increased during
1970. Being concerned by these developments, an account of

[] consulted with [] regarding this material which showed him to be knowledgeable in the field as well as a person of excellent academic background and intellect. [] visited [] office between eight and ten times from January, 1970, to the present. During this period, he requested copies of all of the remaining publications listed in the Attachment. Copies of those publications still available were furnished to him. [] was unable to recall which of these items might not have been available and thus would not have been furnished to him, but did know that none of these publications was subject to Government security classification.

During the course of his visits, [] presented both [] and [] with a bottle of vodka and a small wooden Russian doll. He extended an invitation to [] to attend a reception at the Soviet Embassy on May 8, 1970, which she accepted but did not attend. [] was accompanied by Igor D. Based on available information and/or investigation, Bubnov, [] and Orlov are considered to be connected with the Soviet Intelligence Services.

In addition to the above, persons whom she knows or believes to be Soviet correspondents assigned in Washington, D. C., but whom she could not identify by name or photograph have continued to visit the SNSIO office occasionally to secure publications and information releases. Visits such as this are routine occurrences for Congressional offices such as the SNSIO. Some of these visits have been by two Soviets. While one inquired about a publication, the other seemed to be trying to observe material which might be visible on the nearest desk. No information of a classified or sensitive nature is ever placed on desks in the office where she has noted such activity. She was unable to recall which Soviets have visited the SNSIO office under these circumstances.

[] has detected a definite effort on the part of some Soviets to determine the names of persons on her staff. Of particular interest was an effort by Orlov to engage one of the summer interns, [], in conversation. On that occasion, [] introduced herself to the Soviet and offered to assist him. Orlov showed annoyance and later apparently made a point of visiting the office during [] absence to secure a publication. On that occasion he spoke briefly with [] and determined her name, according to a subsequent account of the matter to [].

[] detected a similar incident involving Kuznetsov during July, 1970. The Soviet did not seem to have a definite errand but picked up routine publications and left without conversation. She gathered the impression that he might have been annoyed by her interruption of an attempted conversation with []. Her impression has been reinforced by the fact that none of the Soviets have visited the SNSIO office since this incident, which occurred two or more weeks previously.

The SNSIO occupies a single unpartitioned room in the Old Senate Office Building. [] maintains a close relationship with her staff, which generally numbers only [] people, including summer interns, and she felt certain that any contacts of an unusual nature by Soviets with members of her staff would be brought to her attention.

Because of the large number of institutions of higher learning in the Washington, D. C., metropolitan area, many of our legislators employ undergraduate or postgraduate students in various clerical capacities. Soviet diplomatic personnel in the Washington, D. C., area have frequently appeared as speakers before various groups at such institutions and appear interested and willing to develop a continuing rapport or relationship with individuals of this type. Our experience has shown that [REDACTED] apparently regard these persons as more susceptible to cultivation than the legislators themselves, possibly due to factors of immaturity or a desire for academic freedom existing in their younger student employees.

Johnson Got Political Information From FBI Wiretaps of Embassies

WASHINGTON—From March 1966 to January 1969 the FBI provided President Lyndon B. Johnson with reports on conversations by or about anti-Vietnam war congressmen overheard in wiretaps of foreign embassies, according to information obtained by the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence.

The practice of sending the White House the political byproduct of subnational security wiretaps continued in the Nixon Administration, according to the same information.

The original Johnson request, on March 14, 1966, asked for whatever current material the FBI could develop on congressmen and prominent citizens who opposed the war.

The embassy wiretaps, installed for national security reasons, were screened for political material. The first report, sent one week later, covered conversations overheard from July 1, 1964, through March 17, 1966, according to the Senate committee's information.

On March 22, 1966, FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover noted in his files that Johnson had been "very pleased with the material." Additional reports were prepared, and in May, according to the committee information, Hoover ordered that the material be supplied to the White House on a bi-weekly basis.

The material supplied to the White House dealt with conversations not only of members of Congress but of their aides.

According to a one-time Johnson aide, the former President often would speak of what Sen. J. William Fulbright (D., Ark.), then chairman of the Foreign Relations Committee, had been saying to the Soviet ambassador.

Ex-Sen. Fulbright recalled this week that he always sent the State Department a report on his visits to the Soviet embassy "since they (the FBI) knew if you went anyway because they watch the people who come and go."

Fulbright said he had no idea that his phone conversations with the embassy also had been overheard and reported to the White House.

According to an FBI spokesman, bureau policy today is to supply the White House with information from embassy taps only if it "refers to a threat to the President or a very significant internal security aspect."

Normally, the FBI is charged with the gathering of intelligence information internally for use in its own investigation or distribution to other federal agencies.

Attorney General Edward H. Levi and the Senate committee are studying the question of what laws or regulations should govern distribution of byproduct material gained from legally authorized FBI wiretaps.

The Johnson program was, according to former FBI officials, the first time that a President had sought information for political use from FBI wiretaps.

In a normal year, 50 taps would be in operation at embassies and other foreign government buildings in Washington under the national security program.

On July 27, 1970, according to the Senate committee material, H. R. Haldeman, President Richard M. Nixon's White House chief of staff, requested information similar to that which had been supplied to Johnson.

Two days later, the FBI supplied summaries of 3½ years of embassy conversations relating to congressmen, from Jan. 1, 1967, through July 1970.

On Aug. 4, 1970, according to the committee material, White House aide Tom Huston wrote to Hoover saying that Nixon had been pleased with the report.

The Senate committee first learned of the Johnson request last week when it received a summary of the operation from the Department of Justice.

That information has been supplied

to the attorney general as part of a broader report from FBI Director Clarence Kelley on past FBI practices, according to committee aides.

The Kelley report included several other political intelligence operations requested by the Johnson White House. "Johnson considered us his private investigative arm," one former FBI official said.

In 1966, White House aide Marvin Watson asked the FBI to monitor Fulbright's televised hearings on the Vietnam war and prepare memos that compared the statements of Fulbright and Sen. Wayne Morse (D., Ore.) with positions of the Communist Party.

Johnson and his aides also requested more name checks on individuals than previous administrations had. Early in Johnson's term, a White House dinner guest had been named in the press as the subject of a federal criminal investigation. Hereafter, all White House guests were the subjects of FBI name checks.
