Consistent with the National Guard and Reserve Equipment appropriation in the Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2007 (Public Law 109-298), Title III, I have enclosed a consolidated report summarizing the Reserve component Chiefs' acquisition plans for miscellaneous equipment to be purchased with \$288,835,000 in funding appropriated in the National Guard and Reserve Equipment appropriation. The enclosed "FY 2007 Summary Title III NGREA Acquisition Report" reflects the intended equipment acquisitions for all Reserve components. The equipment included in this summary report meets critical readiness and modernization requirements and reflects necessary operational and budgetary decision adjustments.

The Conference Report accompanying the appropriation provided that \$2.94 billion of the procurement funds provided in Title IX shall be available only for the Army National Guard and Army Reserve, and that \$500,000,000 of those funds shall be available for the purposes identified in House Report 109-504 under the heading "National Guard and Reserve Equipment" identified by the National Guard Bureau as "Essential 10 Equipment Requirements for the Global War on Terror." Given that the funds provided are a subset of the procurement tables enumerated in Title IX, the Department will execute those funds in accordance with Title IX and treat any changes as a reprogramming request.
