On 12/28/70, a news release reported that Fordham, President of the Association of American Law Schools, had stated the day before that there were signs that repressive measures like those in a police state may be threatening individual liberty in the United States. Fordham also made reference to Representative William R. Anderson of Tennessee challenging the testimony of the Director before a Senate Subcommittee concerning two priests jailed for destroying draft records. Fordham quoted Anderson as saying the Director had used "Tactics reminiscent of McCarthyism." Fordham said "It is appalling to reflect upon the repressive threat to freedom and justice in such a state of affairs. Meanwhile, I salute Representative Anderson. I associate myself with him."

RECOMMENDATIONS:

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I have the copy designated for me of the letter of March 4, 1971, to Mr. Scott J. Werner, Opecial Agent in Charge of our Denver, Colorado, field office, from Keith H. Asplin, Ph.D., Director of the Placement Office at your university, in which he alleged that this Eureau is violating the Government's equal employment opportunity regulations by vestricting our Special Agent position to males and advised that in the future the FEI will not be granted the privilege of recruiting on the campus of Colorado^o State University We take serious exception to his branding our policy as a violation and the purpose of this letter is to set the record straight.

In supporting his contention, Dr. Asplin referred to Section 1604.1, Chapter XIV, Title 29, Code of Federal Regulations. That citation represents regulations issued by the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission pursuant to Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1984 (42 U. S. Code 2000e--12). Under that statute the term "employer" does not include the United States. Equal employment opportunity for Federal employees and applicants stems from Executive Order 11478. Accordingly, the citation to which Dr. Asplin referred is not governing insofar as Federal employees and applicants are concerned.

The United States Civil Service Commission has basic responsibility for implementation of equal employment opportunity throughout the Federal service. This Bureau's policy of limiting our Special Agent position to males is in concert with Civil Service

Commission regulations on this subject appearing in the Federal Personnel Manual, Chapter 332, Subchapter 4, Item 5, which state that law enforcement positions requiring the bearing of firearms are exceptions to the basic policy that consideration of applicants for appointment shall not be restricted to one sex. The FEI is in full accord with the Commission's regulations.

Further, our policy is based on a careful, objective evaluation of all pertinent factors germane to the operations and effectiveness of the FBI, particularly those inherent in the broad range of challenges which Special Agents must satisfactorily meet to enable this Bureau to properly discharge the responsibilities entrusted to it and to do so with optimum return to the public trust. Our force of Special Agents is comparatively small considering the sparse deployment of it throughout the United States and Puerto Rico. Therefore, we must insist that each Special Agent be capable of performing all duties of his position whenever and wherever necessary. This means it is imperative that each Special Agent be qualified for the strenuous physical exertion required to effectively participate in arrests and raids which involve the use of firearms. physical subduing of dangerous criminals, and self-defense. Performance of these duties frequently requires work during any time of day or night and exposure to all kinds of adverse environmental conditions. Experience has demonstrated very clearly to us that our Special Agent position must be limited to males and our stand on this point is inalterable.

May I say, also, that a policy forbidding the FBI to recruit employees from the members of your graduating classes would be unfortunate for all concerned. The FBI needs, for public purposes, to continue recruiting well-educated employees. We have in the past hired many fine young people from Colorado and neighboring states and we should like to continue looking for their equal in all logical places. It is to the interest of the university to encourage opportunities for employment which the student finds

suitable The students who might want to work for the FBI must surely have some right to be informed of such opportunities in the manner usual to placement activities.

Would you kindly advise me whether Dr. Asplin is, as he states, speaking for your university and whether it is truly the policy of your university that we may no longer recruit on campus?

On January 25, 1971, Special Agents Eugene J. Coble and Douglas J. Williams visited the campus of Colorado State University for the purpose of recruiting graduating students for positions with the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Prior to their visit the Placement Office received informational literature to be distributed to interested students. With this literature was a page entitled "Jobs for Homen in the F.B.I." The opening statement begins as follows: "Although no woma can be an actual 'FBI Special Agent'... * Several of the girls on campus registered complaints with the office stating that this appeared to be a blatant case of discrimination on the basis of sex. The girls wore advised, however, to interview the agents if they were interested in such positions. It was pointed out that inasmuch as the material was a reprint from "Good Housekeeping," there existed the possibility that it was not an accurate statement of the facts.



When the agents arrived on campus, they were advised of the concerns of the office with regard to what appeared to be discriminatory Infring practices. I was assured at that time that this was not the case but that women were soldom interested in such positions. Following their interviews, however, several girls commonted that virtually the entire time period had been spent listening to a discourse on why they wouldn't be interested in applying for positions as special agents.

"This information along with the published statement that "... no woman can be an actual 'FBI Special Agent'...* leads me to believe that the FBI may in fact be utilizing discriminatory employment practices.

This practice is not only contrary to the University anti-discriminat policy (see attachment) but is a violation of Executive Order 11473. Lest it be argued that this discrimination on the Dasis of sex can be defended as a bona fide occupational qualification. I refer you to Section 1604.1. Chapter XIV, of Title 29 of the Cede of Federal Regulations. 

Bureau files contain no subsequent information of an adverse nature concerning Mr. Gillette. (157-14747-37,38,39,45) The Rules Governing Petitions for Executive Clemency specify that it is desirable that all applications for pardons V be accompanied by at least three character affidavits, and this 17 rule is closely adhered to by the Pardon Attorney. Therefore, interviews with affiants are an integral part of our APACS investigations. A United Press International news release dated 4/15/71 reported that Senator Norris Cotton (R-N.H.), decried the appointment of Dr. Thomas N. Bonner as President of the University of New Hampshire. Bonner was termed an associate of Senator George McGovern (D-S.D.) whom Senator Cotton charged was promoting disrespect for Congress and impeding the President's efforts to end the Vietnam War. Senator Cotton expressed "amazement and dismay" at this appointme In connection with this news item, the Director noted: "See that we make no contacts with Univ. of New Hampshire." In another UPI release of same date, Senator McGovern, who indicated Bonner had one worked for him, termed Cotton's speech, "one of the most preposterous and ill-mannered statements ever delivered in the U.S. Senate." Relative to this release, the Director noted: "What do we know of Bonner?"

The current "Who's Who" indicates that Thomas N. Bonner, born 5/28/23 at Rochester, New York, is an educator who holds a Ph.D. from Northwestern University, 1952. He served with Radio Intelligence Corps during World War II. A former Fulbright lecturer and Guggenheim fellow, Dr. Bonner Was Academic Dean, William Woods College, 1951-54, and Professor of History and Chairman of the Social Science Department at the University of Omaha, 1955-62 was a Democratic candidate for Congress in 1962 and a legislative aide to Senator McGovern, 1962-3. He was recently connected with the University of Cincinnati where he headed the History Department, 1963, and was Provost for Academic Affairs, 1967. He is married with children.

Bufiles indicate that in 1962, Bonner, who described himself as a candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives and a former Professor of Histor at the University of Omaha, wrote the Director seeking "advice" as to how he. Bonner, should answer questions during his campaign concerning the nature and extent of the communist menace in this country. By outgoing dated 7/17/62, the Director advised Bonner that as a matter of policy he did not furnish specific comments or criticisms such as requested. Bonner was furnished appropriate reprint material and was referred to the Director's book "Masters of Deceit."

Bufiles also indicate that in donnection with Bonner's unsuccessful candidacy to represent the Second Congressional District of Nebraska, in which he opposed Congressman Glenn Cunningham, we conducted an Election Laws relimination investigation at the request of the Department in 1962 relating to this campaign based on an allegation that campaign literature, subsequently identified as distributed by Bonner's campaign committee, did not have identifying data as to source. In connection with our investigation, Bonner was interviewed at which time he stated that he was responsible for some pieces of campaign literature being unlabeled as to source which merely solicited a vote for him and, in some instances, contained his photograph. He indicated that this failure was inadvertent and commented that it should have been obvious to anyone that he and his backers were responsible for the material. Results of our investigation were submitted to the Department and no further action was requested. It is to be noted that in connection with this investigation, it was reported that Bonner and Senator McGovern were classmates at Northwestern University, and that Bonner became McGovern's administrative assistant in early 1963.

A check of the files of the Identification Division disclosed no arrest record identifiable with Bonner.



(SAC has Top Ten TV programs in Syracuse, Schenectady and Burlington.) And if I observe any decrease in the cooperation and exchange of information of the FBI in the future, I'll go to my Congressman and Senator at that time."

SARDINO stated that he expected such cooperation, however, if he determined that he was not getting the cooperation he expected, he would have to go to the people he had to, to get the cooperation he expected.

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The conversation was terminated with Agent reiterating he was only interested in SARDINO citing specific instances in support of his allegations and would meet SARDINO at 3:30 P.M., on 5/3/71, to secure same.

The Syracuse "Herald Journal," evening newspaper, issue of 4/30/71, on Page 23, carried an article entitled -

"'OPEN MINDED' SARDINO HOLDS OFF ON OTB"

(The first five paragraphs of this article report upon Chief SARDINO's opinions on off track betting, then continues as follows:)

"The Chief also commented upon his criticism of the FBI last night in which he said they did not share enough information with the Police Department during investigations.

"Police sources said that the <u>Chief will be</u> meeting with head Syracuse area FBI Agent ______ Monday to b6 discuss SARDINO's criticism. _____ refused to comment b7C today.

"The Police Chief declined to say whether he favors FBI Director J. EGAR HOOVER's removal from the top post.

"Recently Hoover has come under fire from Maine Senator EDMUND MUSKIE and other prominent Democrats for alleged wiretapping and surveillance procedures.

"SARDINO said that HOOVER has been 'an outstanding public servant and I have high regard for him as a law enforcement officer.""

INTERVIEW WITH CHIEF SARDINO:

I, with SRA appeared at the office of Chief SARDINO on 5/3/71. SARDINO was accompanied by First Deputy Chief JOHN C. DILLON.

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I advised SARDINO that we were present to determine the basis for the remarks attributed to SARDINO in the news article and to secure specific instances of lack of cooperation, failure to disseminate and publicity seeking on the part of the FBI. I stated I had completely cooperated with all law enforcement agencies within the Albany Division during the three years I have been assigned to Albany and I had not received any complaints of this nature and desired to know why the Chief hadn't come to me or Agent if he had any complaints as reported in the newspaper.

Chief SARDINO advised he wanted to set forth the beekground and atmosphere in which the remarks had been mode. He stated he had been addressing a group of thirty journalism students at Syracuse University to give them experience in interviewing. He gave a talk of about fifteen minutes during which he commented upon the operations of the Syracuse Police Department and the problems associated therewith. At the end of his talk, during a question and answer period which covered many subjects, he was asked how he felt about the FBI and the degree of cooperation with his Department. His reponse included his high regard for the ability, integrity and esprit de corps of FBI Agents which he considers the best trained investigative agency in the world, that he considered the cooperation and relations at Syracuse to be good, but he felt the cooperation could be better. He stated the remarks were made in an academic atmosphere between instruccor and students and he did not suspect that he would be At one point, later in the discussion SARDINO quoted. said he resented my questioning him concerning comments he had made in an academic setting. I told him at that point that he had made the statements publically, that they appeared in the public press, and that I had a perfect right to question him concerning the basis of his statements.

I asked if the comments attributed to him in the news article were accurate and Chief SARDINO replied on this and several subsequent occasions, "In general, yes." However, he denied making any comments to the effect that the FBI was more interested in publicity than results. The other quotations in the news articles were read to him and he acknowledged that they were generally accurate and that was b6 how he did feel. When asked for specific instances in support of his statements, SARDINO stated he had been b7C busy over the weekend and had not prepared specific cases to cite although he acknowledged SA had requested such on April 30th. He stated that if he was pushed to do so, he could cite examples but at that time he was not prepared to cite a single example.

Persistent questioning elicited the same response on several occasions. Subsequently, after more than an hour's discussion, SARDINO advised that he could think of an "issue" but he did not care to cite it at this time because I would have to take administrative action against a well regarded Agent. He alleged the Agent had been personally told about a statement he had made, had not done it again, and he did not wish to discuss the matter any further. He would not expand or comment further in this regard. He inferred that this situation had occurred several years ago.

SARDINO repeatedly stated he was not proud or happy over the news article, that it had caused him a lot of flak and he had even been criticized by his family, that he was sorry the article had appeared and he had not intended his statements for publication. He acknowledged that he was in agreement with my stand of requesting specific instances be cited and that he would do likewise if he were in a reverse position. He agreed that differences between the agencies, if they existed, should have been resolved on a businesslike professional level by communication between himself and me or with Agent He still (reiterated he felt greater cooperation by the FBI could be exhibited. When I pressed for an example of where better current cooperation was needed, SARDINO's only example was that he believed the FBI in its Top Ten TV Program should tell the public to call the nearest local law enforcement agency as well as the FBI.

I explained to SARDINO that the Top Ten Program was nationally coordinated and involved continuous active investigation by each of fifty-nine Field Offices and that we considered it absolutely necessary to have all information funneled into the FBI so that proper coordination and planning could be effected. I pointed out to

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SARDINO that many Top Ten arrests are made with the cooperation and assistance of State, County and local law enforcement officers. SARDINO replied that he understood the FBI's official position but he was still entitled to his opinion.

I asked the Chief if he didn't feel he owed the FBI proof of instances supporting his statements or in the absence of same, a public retraction.

SARDINO advised that he wanted to "let the matter lay and become dormant," that he didn't want to continue the public controversy; also that if he wanted to state specific instances that he, and only he, would decide when and if he would do so. He stated that at some indefinite time in the future, if he deemed it necessary, and the matter did not drop, he might decide to make some public statement about specific instances as requested. He refused to set any time period for his reply or statement.

SA ______ advised Chief SARDINO that he had numerous instances of the FBI assisting the Syracuse Police Department and of disseminating valuable information to it. Chief SARDINO acknowledged that such was undoubtedly true and that he had good relations with local FBI Agents and he was sorry he had caused me, Agent _____ or any other local Agent the embarrassment which resulted from the news article.

Throughout the hour-and-a-half interview, repetitious demand for specific cases to substantiate the allegations or public retraction by SARDINO also only met with his reply that the matter was being blown out of all proportion under the circumstances, that he would like the matter to die without further public comment or controversy, that at some future date possibly, he might provide specific instances of lack of cooperation or he might make further public comment, but only he would decide when and if such explanations or statements would be made. and the comment that if there was any decrease in the cooperation received from the FEI or in the amount of information received from it, he would not hesitate to complain to the Director, the Attorney General or the U. S. Representatives and Senators from New York State.

It is my sincere belief that I, and the Agents of the Syracuse Resident Agency have been completely cooperative with the Syracuse Police Department and have disseminated in accordance with Bureau requirements and further, that the Agents at Syracuse have gone beyond what would be expected of them to assist Syracuse Police Department b7C Personnel and cement good police relations. It should be noted that in the current issue of the FBI Law Enforcement Bulletin, center fold, there is an article entitled "Experiment in Police Management - The Crime Control Team" by Chief SARDINO which was secured by SA from SARDINO after six months' effort and which has resulted in national publicity for his agency. COMMENDATION: "Hoge Strathan the methode and


In view of Chief SARDINO's refusal at this time to document his charges or to make a public retraction of his allegations, I recommend that no National Academy applicants be accepted from his Department and that no police training be afforded to his Department until there is a change in SARDINO's official attitude toward the Bureau. I also recommend that we deal circumspectly and at arm's length with SARDINO and officials in his Department.

Your denial of Justice Department surveillance of Americans of Irish descent on behalf of the British government conflicts with the facts and the contents of your own files. I have personally talked to many victims of this practice, some in the Buffalo area. In one case, I repre-sented a victim and found that Justice Department attorneys and it had sucher soon took off when it came time to face an attorney asking questions about this matter. F. B. I. cooperation with Scotland Yard has already been conceded to me by one F. B. I. official. You call my actions "irresponsible"; your actions in spying on black American groups and others in purely political affairs are "responsible" by your own private standards. The stolen Media papers have served to alert Congress and the public about your method of operations. You cannot exile me to the wilds of Montana and I cannot be intimidated, Mr. Hoover. Your letter concedes that you received my letter to Congressman Dulski and thereupon, sent two (2) F. B. I. agents to my office in what was an obvious effort to scare and intimidate me. Apparently a citizen can no longer petition a member of Congress without facing a visit from the F. B. I. Your letter labels my statements as a "false charge". 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
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tap on the phone of the late Martin Luther King to certain third parties. Many members of Congress seem satisfied that the F. B. I. has tapped their phones.

In acting as leg-man for the British government, you only demean the F. B. I. You serve neither the bureau or the public interest and only aid the communist conspiracy in this country. The SDS and Mafia operations, both in and out of the business world, apparently are relatively free of F. B. I. surveillance. American citizens criticizing the British government are not. I happen to believe that the : F. B. I. is a very necessary agency of the government but its present misuse in political matters is a clear threat to constitutional government. We are, and must remain, a government of laws, not of men. An Irish American's criticism of the British government happens to be none of your business. It is not yet a crime to exercise one's right of free speech. It grieves me to see my country being torn apart by officials who are supposed to maintain law and order and constitutional government. The sensitivity of the British government to public criticism and activities by American citizens over the Ulster situation is no basis to deny American citizens their rights of free speech and privacy. Scotland Yard cannot carry out surveillance in the United States. You are doing it for them. It would appear from your attitude that only congressional action or an order of the Federal District Court can stop these practices.

I would appreciate you not sending any more F. B. I. agents to my office. You could have denied the charges in a letter. Instead, you had 2 agents visit me. As you must know by now, you cannot intimidate me.





San Francisco has advised that Professor Raymond Wick of Mills College, April Fernandez's counselor, was dontacted during the investigation to verify her residence on ሳ/ the campus. At the conclusion of the interview, Wick stated he is opposed to this type of investigation and requested that he not be contacted in such matters in the future. San Francisco advised that, in view of his attitude, Wick will not be contacted in the future investigations by the San Francisco office. San Francisco files and Bureau files were checked and contain no record identifiable with Dr. Wick. dividuals whose statements or attitude, generally when contacted on official business, gave rise to doubts as to the advisability of contacting them again. When a person was placed on the Not To Contact list, the Field Office covering the residence or occupation or both was advised that this particular individual should not be contacted without prior Bureau authority. Thus, the Not To Contact list did not prohibit future contact, but specified it could be made only after clearance with the Bureau.

Examples of the type of individuals on this list are set forth below.

Dr. Vannevar Bush: Dr. Bush was placed on the Not To Contact list in June, 1964, at which time he was connected with the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He was so designated when he made derogatory statements concerning the Bureau when contacted on an applicant-type case.

<u>Rex Stout</u>: Rex Stout is an author who was designated for this list in 1965 because of his thennew mystery novel, "The Doorbell Rang." This novel presented a highly distorted and most unfavorable picture of the FBI in its operations as they relate to the plot of the book.
