This is our final response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of 17 December 2004 for the following:

- 1) The home page for the NSA Intranet Site.
- 2) Each of the pages connected to the home page by one click.

A copy of your request is enclosed. As you were previously advised, for purposes of this request and based on the information you provided in your letter, you are considered an "all other" requester. As such, you are allowed two hours of search and the duplication of 100 pages at no cost. Since processing fees were minimal, we are not assessing fees for this request. Your request has been processed under the FOIA, and the documents you requested are enclosed. Certain information has been deleted from the enclosures .

Some of the information deleted from the documents was found to be currently and properly classified in accordance with Executive Order 12958, as amended. This information meets the criteria for classification as set forth in Subparagraphs (c), and (g) and remains classified TOP SECRET, SECRET, and CONFIDENTIAL as provided in Section 1.2 of the Executive Order. The information is classified because its disclosure could reasonably be expected to cause exceptionally grave damage to the national security. Because the information is currently and properly classified, it is exempt from disclosure pursuant to the first exemption of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. Section 552(b)(1)).

This Agency is authorized by various statutes to protect certain information concerning its activities, as well as the names of its employees. We have determined that such information exists in these documents. Accordingly, those portions are exempt from disclosure pursuant to the third exemption of the FOIA which provides for the withholding of information specifically protected from disclosure by statute. The specific statutes applicable in this case are Title 18 U.S. Code 798; Title 50 U.S. Code 403-1(i); and Section 6, Public Law 86-36 (50 U.S. Code 402 note).

FOIA Case: 44786D

Subsection (b)(2) of the FOIA exempts from disclosure matters related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency. This exemption has been held to apply to matters that are "predominantly internal," the release of which would "significantly risk circumvention of agency regulations or statutes." Crooker v. Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms, 670 F.2d 1051, 1074 (D.C. Cir. 1981). The information contained within some of the documents meets the criteria for exemption (b)(2) protection as that statutory provision has been interpreted and applied by the Federal Judiciary.

In addition, copyrighted information that is privileged or otherwise confidential has been deleted from one of the documents, pursuant to the fourth exemption of the FOIA.

Finally, personal information regarding an individual has been deleted from the enclosures in accordance with 5 U.S.C. 552 (b)(6). This exemption protects from disclosure information that would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. In balancing the public interest for the information you request against the privacy interests involved, we have determined that the privacy interests sufficiently satisfy the requirements for the application of the (b)(6) exemption.

Since these deletions may be construed as a partial denial of your request, you are hereby advised of this Agency's appeal procedures. Any person denied access to information may file an appeal to the NSA/CSS Freedom of Information Act Appeal Authority. The appeal must be postmarked no later than 60 calendar days from the date of the initial denial letter. The appeal shall be in writing addressed to the NSA/CSS FOIA Appeal Authority (DJP4), National Security Agency, 9800 Savage Road STE 6248, Fort George G. Meade, MD 20755-6248. The appeal shall reference the initial denial of access and shall contain, in sufficient detail and particularity, the grounds upon which the requester believes release of the information is required. The NSA/CSS Appeal Authority will endeavor to respond to the appeal within 20 working days after receipt, absent any unusual circumstances.

Stop working immediately

- DO take time to secure and lock your desk and logoff computer equipment
- Proceed in a quiet and orderly manner to the nearest stair case or elevator and quickly exit the building.
- Follow any instructions from emergency personnel
- Once outside, proceed immediately to your vehicle and leave the campus via designated emergency routes

(U) **Supervisors** are responsible for seeing all duty-personnel (including contractors) within assigned workspaces have been evacuated. The supervisor should be the last person to leave the workspace, lock the door, and return the key to the AKAM or other designated key collection receptacle.





#### (U) Nanotube research

(U) The Nippon Telegraph & Telephone Corporation of Japan has developed a basic technology that promises to facilitate the use of carbon nanotubes as the wires connecting semiconductor elements in system circuits. Currently, the semiconductor elements in system chips are connected together using wiring made of copper. However,





(U) The NTT research team has developed a way to cut nanotubes, enabling long nanotubes to be laid down and cut as needed to form the wiring patterns. With the new technology, the nanotubes are cut using a beam of electrons. Previously, it was thought that a high voltage of approximately 100,000 volts was needed to cut nanotubes with an e-beam, but they discovered that just several hundred volts is sufficient if the nanotubes are allowed to react with the air after being exposed to the e-beam.

#### (U) Other items

- (U) Search engine. Cypress Semiconductor has started sampling its Sahasra 50000 algorithmic search engine, which is aimed at forwarding applications in networking equipment designs. The search engine chip combines logic with embedded SRAM memory and can achieve 250 million searches per second.
- (U) **Mobile users.** According to the International Telecommunication Union, by mid-2004, there were nearly 1.5 billion mobile phone subscribers around the world, representing about 25 percent of the world's population. The growth outpaced fixed lines, which totaled approximately 1.185 billion.
- (U) **Space travel.** The Federal Aviation Administration has released draft guidelines for commercial space travel. Pilots of reusable launch vehicles will need to have a FAA pilot certificate, meet medical standards, and be trained to operate the vehicle.
- (U) **Nicaragua**. Enitel plans to spend \$100 million to add 130,000 lines in a major expansion of basic telephony coverage, and will close the year 2005 with 300,000 total lines. They also plan to renovate 50,000 existing lines ahead of the planned opening of the Nicaraguan telecoms market in April, and will install a 435-mile fiber optic network
- (U) **Security.** Both Hitachi and Dell are adding stronger security features to some of their computer models. Users of Hitachi's Flora Se210 will use an integrated circuit card and password to identify themselves to access certain memory devices and printing capabilities from the computer. Dell is launching two PC models that feature fingerprint identification.
- (U) Wi-Fi BlackBerry. Nortel and Research in Motion have signed a memorandum of understanding under which BlackBerry handhelds will be equipped for VoIP over standard Wi-Fi. The companies are integrating RIM's BlackBerry enterprise platform and Nortel's model 5100 multimedia communications server.

- pair of microsatellites in about two years that may pave the way for operating a robot in the space. The team has been developing the microsatellites under the STARS-1 project to develop a pair of microsatellites equipped with solar panels. The two, a parent machine and a submachine, will be launched as Tethered Space Robots, tied by a tether to allow the team to test the maneuverability of the submachine in space by letting the parent machine tighten or loosen the tether attached to the submachine.
- (U) ADSL. Brasil Telecom ended 2004 with 535,500 users for its broadband Internet access service, Turbo, which represents a 90 percent increase to its base of 282,000 customers for 2003. The number of cities covered by the service grew nearly four times, and can reach over 1,100 cities.
- (U) **Kenya.** Telkom Kenya is in the process of building a fiber optic cable spanning 280 miles to enhance the security of key Infrastructure installations. The cable, which will connect Kenya and Uganda, would be used to install a security monitoring system to oil pipeline from the coastal city of Mombassa to its capital Nairobi.
- (U) W-CDMA. Lucent Technologies and eAccess of Japan plan to collaborate on the development of a 3G W-CDMA trial network to enable eAccess to evaluate mobile voice, high-speed data, and multimedia services. The network will incorporate High Speed Downlink Packet Access technology and Lucent's IP Multimedia Subsystem solution. The planned HSDPA-enabled network can initially offer peak data speeds of up to 3.6 Mbps, and ultimately can support peak data speeds of up to 14.4 Mbps.
- (U) Location-based services. Nokia is introducing their intelligent Gateway Mobile Location Center 4.0, a new platform for location-based services as part of the Nokia mPosition System. The Nokia iGMLC platform is highly flexible and simultaneously supports both GSM and WCDMA 3G LBS. The new iGMLC platform works with technology from Cambridge Positioning Systems.
- (U) **Indonesia.** The number of mobile phone users in Indonesia is expected to grow by 40 percent during 2005, according to the Secretary General of the Indonesian Cellular Phone Association. The country will have 41 42 million users by the end of 2005, up from 30 million for 2004.

- announced the world's first UMTS/EDGE smartphone reference design based on the Linux operating system. The reference platform showcases many advanced 3G and multimedia services.
- (U) Saudi Arabia. Motorola has won a contract from Etihad Etisalat to deploy a GSM Base-Station System network, including EDGE and PoC. Motorola will provide a turnkey Radio Access Network for GSM and EDGE, including Horizon II base stations. The network will cover parts of the western, southern, and northern regions of Saudi Arabia.
- (U) **HSDPA test.** Vodafone has obtained a license from Japan's Ministry of Internal Affairs and Communications to conduct field tests for High Speed Downlink Packet Access using experimental radio stations. Vodafone will begin field tests in the Tokyo Metropolitan area using the 2 GHz frequency band.
- (U) Telmex network. Global Crossing has signed an agreement with the Telmex Group of companies, which includes Telefonos de Mexico, Mexico's largest telecommunications company. The agreement enables the Telmex Group to interconnect its operations in South America, Mexico, and US, including its recently acquired assets in the region, Embratel, AT&T Latin America, Metrored Argentina, Techtel, and Chilesat, among others.
- (U) Plastics. Based on conductive polymers and flexible substrates, plastic electronics will change the face of electronics, according to NanoMarkets. The research firm forecasts that the worldwide plastic electronics market will grow to \$5.8 billion in 2009, and reach \$23.5 billion by 2012. Displays will account for 46 percent of the plastic electronics market, and memory will account for 38 percent in 2009.
- (U) **Merger.** Mexico's America Movil plans to merge its two Nicaraguan operations fixed line operator Enitel and mobile operator Alo PCS. The merger will create the largest operator in Nicaragua, grouping some 450,000 mobile and 220,000 fixed line users. Enitel has announced that it would be adding 130,000 fixed lines by the end of the year.
- (U) Russia. Mobile TeleSystems has reported a customer base of 35.94 million. In January, MTS consolidated subscriber base increased by 1.72 million subscribers, of which 1.36 million were added in Russia.
- (U) **Identity-based encryption.** Voltage Security has launched the first commercial identity-based encryption toolkit for securing communication applications and content. Four communications companies have signed on with the Voltage Technology Alliance Program to test the Voltage IBE

Toolkit. Charter partners include CipherTrust, Fujitsu, IMLogic, and Siemens.

- (U) **Seafarer ID.** The first global biometric identification system for issuing secure identity documents to 1.2 million seafarers in the world has come into force as of 9 February. All countries ratifying International Convention No. 185 will be required to issue new Seafarers' Identity Documents that conform to the requirements specified in the standard known as ILO SID-0002.
- (U) **Aussie DSL.** SP Telemedia plans to deploy a broadband DSL network in regional areas of the eastern states. The DSL service will connect to SP Telemedias regional infrastructure, which comprises over 190 interconnection points on the eastern seaboard, and will be able to service the growing ADSL customer base across its affiliate businesses.
- (U) **AEWAC.** India plans to make its indigenous airborne early warning and control system operational by 2011. The Center for Airborne Systems has revived the Airborne Early Warning system program that was scrapped following a crash of the rotodome radar-fitted Avro aircraft in 1999.
- (U) **SEA-ME-WE-4.** Pakistan has approved setting up of a landing station for the consortium undersea cable, SEA-ME-WE-4, in the port city of Karachi. Thirteen telecom companies are party to building the new submarine cable linking Bangladesh, Egypt, France, India, Indonesia, Italy, Malaysia, Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, Sri Lanka, and United Arab Emirates.
- (U) **Predictive text.** Zi Corporation has announced that its eZiText predictive text solution is shipping on the smallest 3G handset in the world from ZTE Corporation. The F808 handset weighs only 104 grams and measures 88.5 mm x 44.6 mm x 22.5 mm.
- (U) Secure IM. Two researchers at the University of California at Berkeley have created an addon to instant messaging that will enable the participants to identify each other and have a secure conversation without leaving any proof that the chat occurred. The result is a plug-in for the Gaim instant-messaging client that enables encrypted messages sans leaving a key, a sequence of characters, which could be used to verify that the conversation happened.
- (U) **Mini-memory card.** SanDisk has doubled the current capacity of its popular SanDisk miniSD card to 1-gigabyte. The miniSD card is used in a growing number of mobile phones with multimedia capabilities such as digital cameras, music players, video recording and playback, games and more.
- (U) Expanding. Bhutan Telecom has signed a \$21-million project with Alcatel Denmark to provide wireless telephone links in rural parts of Bhutan. The project will provide 2,544 lines in 88 blocks of

villages.

- (U) Fingerprint ID. UPEK has announced that IBM is incorporating its TouchStrip fingerprint authentication solution in select IBM ThinkPad T43 notebooks to help protect user identity and data. This is the first time that a fingerprint authentication solution has been offered in a notebook platform based on the new Intel Centrino mobile technology.
- (U) **Roaming.** Azerbaijan's mobile communication operator Azercell Telecom JV has signed a roaming agreement with South Korean KTF Company. Azercell has 223 roaming contracts with cellular communication operators in 102 countries.
- (U) **OFX specification.** The Open Financial Exchange Consortium has reported the public availability of the Automatic 1-Way OFX specification. OFX is a unified specification for the electronic exchange of financial data between financial institutions, businesses, and consumers via the Internet.
- (U) DSL ports. Fourth-quarter DSL Access Concentrator port shipments to Europe and the Middle East increased 38 percent over the prior calendar quarter, while DSL port shipments to Asia declined 32 percent during the same period, according to Dell'Oro Group. All of the major DSL manufacturers posted double-digit sequential increases for the quarter.
- (U) **Payments and ticketing.** Nokia has introduced a new product for secure mobile contactless payments and ticketing. The Near Field Communications product for payment and ticketing will be an enhanced version of its Nokia NFC shell for Nokia 3220 phone. Consumers can conduct local transactions with a mobile phone, simply by touching a point of sales device or ticket gate.
- (U) **Turkey UMS.** Turk Telekom, the fixed-line operator in Turkey, has signed a multi-million initial contract to supply Telenity's Canvas Unified Messaging System, integrated with the HP OpenCall Media Platform. The Canvas UMS supports email, voice mail, fax, SMS, virtual phone services, and message information services. The system will initially serve 4.1 million subscribers and will be expanded to support 18 million users.
- (U) Speech recognition. Fonix Speech has unveiled an upgraded version of Fonix VoiceCentral for mobile/wireless devices. Fonix VoiceCentral 3.0 is an interactive, software application for Windows Mobile, Nokia Series 60, and Symbian devices. Fonix VoiceCentral 3.0 supports Italian speech recognition, improved text-to-speech, SIM card access, and user-created commands.
- (U) **Kuwait.** Inmarsat's Kuwait service provider, Barrak International Center, has won a license that enables the launch of Inmarsat's full range of voice and data solutions in Kuwait. Its

lightweight mobile solution for reliable, high-speed data communications will expand the availability of high-speed data communications.

- (U) **Biotech federation**. Ten Asian countries have formed a federation to promote biotechnology in the region. The Federation of Asian Biotech Associations will promote biotechnology as a science as well as business, and will help in collaboration between the academia and the industry. The members are India, Pakistan, Malaysia, Sri Lanka, Singapore, Thailand, the Philippines, Israel, Iran, and Saudi Arabia.
- (U) Enhanced security. Hitachi will launch notebook computers with no hard disk drives, offering corporate clients a way to protect key business information from potential leaks. The new terminal does not store any data. All tasks are carried out by interacting with server computers or PCs at headquarters, protecting vital business information even when the computer is lost or stolen.
- (U) **German IT.** Medium-sized businesses in Germany vigorously endorsed the IT sector last year, spending \$15.38 billion, up nearly 11 percent over 2003 figures. Telecom investment of \$2.7 billion showed a surge in equipment spending, but a decline in services adoption. With midsize enterprises predicting that their revenues will increase an average of 8 percent over the next 12 months, IT expenditures are expected to remain strong.
- (U) **T-Mobile USA.** Alcatel has signed a 3-year agreement with T-Mobile USA. As part of the new deal, Alcatel will continue to deploy its Alcatel 5020 Spatial Atrium Distributed MSC solution for the upgrade and optimization of the operator's mobile core network. T-Mobile USA has 1 million ports installed with more than 500,000 ports carrying live traffic across the national next-generation mobile core network.
